INTRODUCTION

This is the second in a series of bulletins designed to catalog the accessions of the Mantor Library at Farmington State College in the field of special education. During the school year 1966-1967 the Department of Special Education expects to issue the complete holdings of the library pertaining to special education study.

Behavioral Disorders consists of holdings in both social and psychological maladjustments. Some related sociological and psychological materials have been included in this listing. However, it is expected that the majority of materials which would be considered as related will be issued in a separate bulletin - Exceptional Children: Related Psychological and Sociological Materials.
