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## INTRODUCTION

*DEFINITION OF SABBATICAL LEAVE.* A sabbatical leave is a leave given to personnel to permit them to up-date and improve their qualifications for their jobs. These leaves are usually granted to academic personnel but they may be given to holders of non-teaching professional positions. Although a sabbatical leave may not be compensated, almost all institutions do so. Such leaves are given only after a considerable period of service, traditionally seven years. Usually there is an additional requirement or obligation for a minimum period of service in the position held after completion of the leave.

*LEGAL PROVISIONS IN CALIFORNIA.* It is probable that California school districts could grant the equivalent of sabbatical leaves on the basis of Education Code Section 13454. If this were done, the length of service required, the amount of compensation, and the conditions to be fulfilled after the conclusion of the leave would be entirely within the discretion of the district. The only requirement would be that some benefit to the district could be shown to occur so that payment during the leave would not constitute a gift of public funds. However, the Research Department has not received any reports of districts granting sabbatical leaves or their equivalent under this provision of the Code.

When sabbatical leaves are granted they appear always to be under authority of Education Code Sections 13457-13461. These set forth the conditions which must be fulfilled by the individual before being given a leave, the methods and conditions of payment for the leave, and requirements for service subsequent to the leave. Leaves are restricted to once every seven years commencing after seven years of service in a district. Payment may be made during the leave or in two lump sum payments after the leave. Salary may not be less than the difference between the individual's regular salary and that of his substitute, but may range upward to full salary for his position. In general, the governing board of a district has a number of options in setting up a sabbatical leave policy under these Code provisions.

The study reported in this Bulletin was based upon the possibilities open to districts under the provision of the Education Code. To enable the reader to have ready reference to these, the relevant Sections of the Code are quoted below:

13457. The governing board of any school district may grant any employee of the district employed in a position requiring certification qualifications, a leave of absence for not to exceed one year for the purpose of permitting study or travel by the employee which will benefit the schools and pupils of the district. The governing board may provide that such a leave of absence be taken in separate six-month periods rather than for a continuous one-year period, provided that the leave of absence for both of the separate six-month periods shall be commenced and completed within a three-year period. Any period of service by the individual intervening between the two separate six-month periods of the leave of absence shall comprise a part of the service required for a subsequent such leave of absence.



If any leave of absence commenced upon within three years prior to the effective date of the amendments to this section adopted at the 1961 Regular Session of the Legislature was taken in one or more separate periods of less than one year, the period of service intervening between such separate periods shall comprise a part of the service required for a subsequent such leave of absence.

13458. No leave of absence shall be granted to any employee under Section 13457 who has not rendered service to the district for at least seven consecutive years preceding the granting of the leave, and not more than one such leave of absence shall be granted in each seven-year period. The governing board granting the leave of absence may, subject to the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education, prescribe the standards of service which shall entitle the employee to the leave of absence. No absence from the service of the district under a leave of absence, other than a leave of absence granted pursuant to Section 13457, granted by the governing board of the district shall be deemed a break in the continuity of service required by this section, and the period of such absence shall not be included as service in computing the seven consecutive years of service required by this section. Service under a national recognized fellowship or foundation approved by the State Board of Education, for a period of not more than one year, for research, teaching or lecturing shall not be deemed a break in continuity of service and the period of such absence shall be included in computing the seven consecutive years of service required by this section.

13459. Every employee granted a leave of absence pursuant to Section 13457 may be required to perform such services during the leave as the governing board of the district, with the approval of the county superintendent of schools, and the employee may agree upon in writing, and the employee shall receive such compensation during the period of the leave as the governing board, with the approval of said county superintendent, and the employee may agree upon in writing, which compensation shall be not less than the difference between the salary of the employee on leave and the salary of a substitute employee in the position which the employee held prior to the granting of the leave. However, in lieu of such difference, the board may pay one-half of the salary of the employee on leave or any additional amount up to and including the full salary of the employee on leave.

13460. Compensation granted by the governing board to the employee on leave may be paid in two equal annual installments during the first two years of service rendered in the employ of the governing board following the return of the

employee from the leave of absence. The compensation shall be paid the employee while on the leave of absence in the same manner as if the employee were teaching in the district, upon the furnishing by the employee of a suitable bond indemnifying the governing board of the district against loss in the event that the employee fails to render at least two years' service in the employ of the governing board following the return of the employee from the leave of absence. The bond shall be exonerated in event the failure of the employee to return and render two years' service is caused by the death or physical or mental disability of the employee. If the governing board finds and by resolution declares that the interests of the district will be protected by the written agreement of the employee to return to the service of the district and render at least two years' service therein following his return from the leave, the governing board in its discretion may waive the furnishing of the bond and pay the employee on leave in the same manner as though a bond is furnished.

13461. Where one governing board serves as the governing board of two or more separate districts, an employee may fulfill the service requirements provided in Section 13458 or in 13460, or both, by service in any one or more of the districts under the jurisdiction of such governing board. At the option of the governing board the provisions of this section may apply in whole or in part to service rendered prior to October 1, 1949.

*SOURCE OF INFORMATION.* In the Spring of 1967 a joint study of personnel policies and practices was made by the California Association of School Administrators and the Research Department of the California Teachers Association. Policies and practices with respect to sabbatical leaves were included. Reports were received from 746 districts representing 94.3 percent of the average daily attendance of California. This Research Bulletin summarizes these reports.

To aid in comparative studies of policies, districts are grouped by size ranges according to A.D.A. These are as follows:

10,000 A.D.A. and over	91 districts reporting
1,000 to 9,999 A.D.A.	383 districts reporting
Under 1,000 A.D.A.	272 districts reporting

To facilitate study and comparison of sabbatical leave policies on a regional basis, appendices are included which contain the individual policies of districts, grouped by CTA Sections.

#### Limitations on Leaves

In those districts reporting limitations on the number of leaves which may be granted, the two most common methods reported were either a fixed percentage of the staff or a fixed number of staff members.

In districts of 10,000 ADA and over, 55 districts (60.4%) reported using the percentage method. In these districts the percents ranged from 1 percent to 8 percent with 31 of the districts reporting a 1 percent. Thirty-two districts in this size range (35.2%) set a maximum on the number of staff members who could be on leave. These ranged from one to 28 staff members with a median of eight.

One hundred nineteen districts in the 1,000 to 9,999 ADA range (31.1%) used the percentage method for determining the maximum number of staff members that could be on sabbatical leave at one time. The range was 1 percent to 22 percent with a mean of 2 percent. Forty-five districts used this maximum of 2 percent. In this ADA level, 77 districts (20.1%) set a maximum on the number of persons on leave, ranging from 1 to 9 persons with a median of 2 persons.

In the smaller districts under 1,000 ADA only 18 districts (6.6%) set percentages, ranging from 1 percent to 25 percent with a median of 4 percent of staff members on sabbatical leave at any one time. Sixteen of these small districts (6.0%) reported fixed maximums of persons permitted to be on leave. Fourteen districts reported this to be one person and two districts reported two persons.

It was reported by 14 of the districts over 10,000 ADA that their fixed maximums had been reached during the last three years. Thirty-four districts with 1,000 to 9,999 ADA had reached their maximumx during that time, and only six districts under 1,000 ADA had reached their limit during the last three school years.

#### Number of Staff Members on Sabbatical Leaves

The number of staff members who were actually on sabbatical leave in each of the past three school years 1964-65, 1965-66, and 1966-67 are reported in Table VI.

### Requirements for Posting Bonds for Sabbatical Leaves

The Education Code (Sec. 13460) states that compensation granted by the governing board to the employee on leave may be paid in two equal annual installments during the first two years of service rendered in the employ of the governing board following the return of the employee from the leave of absence. The compensation shall be paid the employee while on the leave of absence in the same manner as if the employee were teaching in the district, upon the furnishing by the employee of a suitable bond indemnifying the governing board of the district against loss in the event that the employee fails to render at least two years' service in the employ of the governing board following the return of the employee from the leave of absence. The bond shall be exonerated in the event the failure of the employee to return and render two years' service is caused by the death or physical or mental disability of the employee. If the governing board finds and by resolution declares that the interests of the district will be protected by the written agreement of the employee to return to the service of the district and render at least two years' service therein following his return from the leave, the governing board in its discretion may waive the furnishing of the bond and pay the employee on leave in the same manner as though the bond is furnished.

In districts of 10,000 ADA and over responding to this survey, 54 (59.3%) required the posting of a bond. In two of these districts the bond was paid for by the district. One hundred nineteen districts (31.1%) with 1,000 to 9,999 ADA required a bond to be posted. Three of these districts paid for the bond. Only 12 districts with under 1,000 ADA (4.4%) required a bond and in none of these districts was the bond paid for by the district.
