

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F O R E W O R D

This section furnishes general information in a condensed form on the occupations and businesses that are licensed by the State of Ohio. The accuracy of this information has been verified by consultation with the various licensing boards, the chiefs of the divisions over which occupations and businesses they hold jurisdiction, and with the licensing commissions which determine and regulate various licenses issued. This material is effective as of February, 1968. We suggest contacting the appropriate agency or referring to the pertinent sections of the Ohio Revised Code for more detailed information.

In essence, Part III contains descriptions of state-licensed occupations and businesses that involve training, and/or significant legal requirements, and/or passing an examination. An outline of state-licensed businesses and the agency issuing such licenses is included at the end of this section. Authorities to contact for federal, county, and city licenses are also noted.

This edition of Part III has been revised to include the occupational code numbers as they appear in the third edition (suffix codes included) of the Dictionary of Occupational Titles (United States Department of Labor, Manpower Administration and Bureau of Employment Security, 1965 edition). The industry classification numbers were applied from the Standard Industrial Classification Manual (Bureau of the Budget, The Technical Committee on Industrial Classification, 1957 edition).

All aircraft must operate only on such landing areas as have been approved and registered with the Division of Aviation.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS:

Each applicant for a certificate of approval for an airport must conform to the Rules and Regulations of the Ohio Division of Aviation's procedures for licensing and to the chapters of the Ohio Revised Code listed above.

AIRPORTS, TEMPORARY FIELDS:

All airports, landing fields, and landing areas must secure a certificate of approval from the Division of Aviation prior to operation and/or construction of same.

Each above unit must meet F.A.A. standards where it is economically feasible.

Temporary certificates (15 day certification) are issued prior to permanent certification in order that that landing field may begin operation and applications must be filed seven (7) days prior to the requested date of operation.

COMMERCIAL AIRPORTS:

Commercial airports shall be certified biennially effective January 1, 1968.

Commercial airports are of three (3) types depending upon the extent of facilities and, in effect, the types of aircraft served: Class I, Class II, and Class III.

NON-COMMERCIAL AIRPORTS:

Non-commercial airports are classified as Class IV airports; such airports are for the use of the personal owner only.

An owner of such airport must file with the Division of Aviation the location, name, and specific extensions of his landing area.

The owners of such airports are not bound by any specific rules and regulations regarding the use and/or construction of such airport.

The Department requires all persons operating any aircraft in any form of navigation to hold a current airman's license (issued by the Civil Aeronautics Commission.)

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS:

Every hotel and restaurant must be licensed pursuant to Sections 3731.03 and 3732.03 of the Ohio Revised Code. All retail permit holders who serve food must obtain Food Service Operators Licenses from the City or County Board of Health. All permit premises must meet sanitary and other requirements of the Liquor Control Commission. (See: Title 43; Liquor, Ohio Revised Code Annotated).

Sections 4303.28, 4303.271, 4303.272, 4303.29, 4303.30, 4303.32 through 4303.41 of the Ohio Revised Code are especially explanatory, in addition to the many other Code Sections of the Liquor Control Act.

The Liquor Control Commission Regulation 12 requires the inspection of every retail permit premise and an investigation of every applicant for a permit. Each applicant is investigated regarding the existence of a criminal record and his past enforcement record providing he held other permits issued by the Liquor Control Commission (re: Liquor Control Commission Regulations 8-9, 12, 14-15, 17, 19, 21, 43-50, 52-53, 55-57, 59, 62, 64, and 72).

(A D-3-a permit may be issued to the holder of a D-3 permit. Such permit extends the hours of operation from 1:00 a.m. until 2:30 a.m.).

The rules and regulations cited in this brief represent only the more common regulations regarding the licensing procedure outlined for a retail alcoholic beverage dealer. An annual fee of twenty dollars (\$20) is assessed for each oven or other equipment having a capacity of one thousand pounds of bakery products per hour or less. In addition, an annual fee of twenty dollars for each one thousand pounds of bakery products per hour capacity or part thereof, in excess of one thousand pounds per hours, is assessed. The license fee for a home oven is \$4.00 per year regardless of capacity.

"Benevolent," non-profit, tax, or community supported day care centers are subject to certification. Day care centers or homes used by child welfare agencies for children for whom such agencies have casework responsibility and which receive any part of payment or other consideration from such agencies are required to be certified by the Ohio Department of Public Welfare. All distributors must insure before selling merchandise to any Ohio dealer that each item distributed has affixed a label indicating complete and accurate contents and that each item has on that affixed label the registration number of its manufacturer.

Law requires that the Division collect revenue from all distributors (renovators, manufacturers, and second-hand dealers included) in the form of stamps issued by the Division:

- 1¢ Ohio Bedding Stamps (affixed on smaller items such as pillows and cushions) sold at \$10.00 per thousand \*\*
- 2¢ Ohio Bedding Stamps (affixed on larger items such as chairs and mattresses) sold at \$20.00 per thousand \*\*

An alternate revenue plan, used instead of stamps, is available to all distributors, the Optional Privilege License Plan. The annual fee is \$25.00 for this program, renewable annually.

The above stipulations do not apply to dealers, distributors, and manufacturers handling, transporting, and/or in the process of manufacturing furniture on or before October 6, 1955, or to upholstered furniture which was in the process of being manufactured on October 6, 1955, and completed within thirty (30) days of that date.

The above stipulations do not apply to dealers and distributors handling and transporting upholstered furniture on or before October 6, 1955, and to upholstered furniture in the process of being manufactured on October 6, 1955, and completed within 30 days of that date.

A D-5 permit is issued to an applicant for a night club permit. A holder of a D-5 permit has full privileges as granted under a C-1, C-2, D-1, D-2, D-3, and a D-3-a permit. He may remain open until 2:30 a.m. He need not prepare food on the premises, but must have food available for serving upon request. Section 4301.01 requires habitual operation after the hour of midnight and that one or more forms of amusement be provided. If food is prepared on premises, holder must have a Food Service Operators' License. The holder of such permit must always have a Vendors' License.

In addition to the Ohio Revised Code sections listed above, Sections 4303.28, 4303.29, 4303.271, 4303.272, 4303.30, 4303.32, and 4303.33 through 4303.41 apply to the holders of night club permits. The Liquor Control Commission regulations 12, 14, 15, 16, 21, 43-50, 52-57, 59, 62, 64-65 are also applied to any holder of a night club permit.

Under Title 29 and in Chapter 4399. - of the Ohio Revised Code are listed several prohibitory provisions and crimes applicable to the holder of a night club permit. The pertinent health and safety provisions are listed in Title 37; the labor and industry provisions are listed in Title 41; and the taxation provisions are listed in Title 57.

The rules and regulations cited in this brief represent only the more common regulations regarding the licensing procedure outlined for a holder of a night club permit. Space precludes listing every Code section and Liquor Control Commission regulation. For additional information regarding these regulations, contact the Liquor Control Board.

The licensing statements contained herein pertain to "Owners" of gas and/or oil wells in the state of Ohio. "Owner" means the person who has the right to drill on a tract or on a drilling unit and to drill into and produce from a pool and to appropriate the oil or gas that he procudes therefrom either for himself or for others.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS:

A permit (requirements refer to Sections 1509.05 and 1509.06 of the Ohio Revised Code) shall be issued to the owner of an oil or gas well upon application to the Division of Oil and Gas. Unless an appropriate permit has been approved by the Chief and issued by the Division, no person shall drill, deepen, or reopen a well, or plug back a well to any source of supply different from the existing pool.

No person shall be issued a permit for any purpose unless he is an "owner" as defined above (and in Rule NRO-1-01 [10] of the Division of Oil and Gas) and unless there is attached to his application an affidavit that he is the owner of the subject tract or drilling unit.

A surety bond, provided for in Sections 1509.07 of the Ohio Revised Code, shall be executed by a surety company authorized to do business in the State of Ohio and shall be in the following amount for each applicant for such license above:

1. for an individual bond covering a single well having a proposed or actual depth of fifteen hundred (1500) feet or less, \$750.00; for a blanket bond covering all such wells operated by the principal, \$3500.00.
2. for an individual bond covering a single well having a proposed or actual depth in excess of fifteen hundred (1500) feet, \$1500.00; for a blanket bond covering all such wells operated by the principal, \$5000.00.

For rules and regulations regarding the spacing of wells, refer to Section 1509.24 and 1509.25 of the Ohio Revised Code. Voluntary pooling is covered by Section 1509.26, mandatory pooling by Section 1509.27, unitization by Section 1509.28, and exception tracts by Section 1509.29. Safety requirements regarding the operation of oil and gas wells are enumerated in Section 1509.23 of the Ohio Revised Code; see Section 1509.22 for the rules regarding the prevention of contamination and pollution by the operators of oil and gas wells.

Both "E" and "H" permits are issued to railroads for the operation of various car services. In addition to section 4303.22 of the Ohio Revised Code, regulations 25 and 26 of the Liquor Control Commission pertain to holders of "H" permits.

Section 4303.28 of the Ohio Revised Code describes conditions under which sale of services outlined above are prohibited to railroads.

The rules and regulations cited in this brief present only the more common ones regarding the licensing procedure outlined for a railroad. Space precludes listing every Code section and Liquor Control Commission regulation. Contact the Liquor Control Commission for more detailed information.
