FOREWORD

New legislation and manpower utilization programs of the past few years have stimulated widespread interest in manpower research and research findings. Such research has been initiated and closely followed by government agencies-- at the Federal, State and local levels--with administrative responsibilities for the implementation of these programs, and by civic and community organizations, social and welfare agencies, research groups, and universities.

In connection with its operating programs to match jobs and workers and to improve employability of long-term unemployed and disadvantaged, the U.S. Employment Service and affiliated State employment services are important users of manpower research studies. The Employment Service is also an important producer of manpower research in certain fields. The USES and affiliated State employment services have conducted research for many years in local job market conditions and developments, job opportunities information, job analysis techniques, employment counseling, aptitude and job performance testing, and related subjects.

To acquaint researchers in the employment security system and in other groups with the full scope of its studies, the Employment Service has prepared the following bibliography, categorizing its research activities over the past 10 years.

Included in this bibliography are reports and study guides prepared by the national office of the Bureau of Employment Security, by State employment security agencies, and by private organizations under the auspices or with the cooperation of State agencies.

Specific State studies may be requested from the particular State agency responsible for them. If the study is out of print and copies are no longer obtainable (indicated by an asterisk), the issuing office will advise where the publication is available for study. The inside back cover of this bibliography lists addresses of State employment security agencies.

Many publications issued by the Bureau of Employment Security are available on request; others are for sale only. The latter should be ordered directly from the U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20401.
