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The Office of Institutional Research at the University of Colorado sent annual faculty report forms combining the service report and the report on scholarly, professional and university activities to all full time faculty members in November 1967. A total of 907 replies was received. The report measured: hours per week of professional activity; hours per week of professional activity by rank; distribution of time spent for all professional activities; mean estimated percentages of time spent (mepts) for instructional activities; mepts for graduate thesis supervision; mepts for student advising mepts for instructional activity by rank; mepts for research, scholarly writing and creative work; mepts for research scholarly writing and creative work by rank; mepts for professional service other than instructional activity, research, scholarly writing and creative work; mepts for professional service other than instructional activity, research, scholarly writing and creative work by rank; comparison of mean hours per week spent in professional activity in 1961 and 1967; comparison of mean hours per week spent in professional activity by teaching faculty of the Boulder Campus by rank in 1961 and 1967; comparison of distribution of faculty time in 1961 and 1967; comparison of distribution of time by teaching faculty of the Boulder Campus by rank in 1961 and 1967; comparison of mepts for instructional activities, for research, scholarly writing and creative work; and for professional service other than direct instructional activity, research, scholarly writing and creative work in 1961 and 1967. 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SECTION I. GENERAL INFORMATION CONCERNING THE STUDY

Annual faculty report forms, combining the earlier annual faculty service report and the report on scholarly, professional and university activities, were sent to all full-time faculty members in November of 1967. A copy of page 1 of the faculty report form is located in the appendix. This study is based on information found in section IV of page 1 of this report, along with reported estimates of average hours per week of professional activity during the year.

A total of 907 faculty reports were received by the Office of Institutional Research. Of this number, 808 are from the Boulder campus, 71 from Denver Center and 28 from Colorado Springs Center. A few more were received too late for inclusion in the study.

Boulder campus faculty are classified according to their principal activities. The main group of 586 faculty members are called "teaching faculty" in this study. It is recognized that much teaching is also done by faculty not included in this classification. The "teaching faculty" are further classified according to school or college and faculty rank.

The following groups are excluded from the Boulder campus "teaching faculty" classification, but their responses are summarized separately in this report:

Department chairmen

Deans and directors of special programs

Faculty who spend 50% or more of their time in sponsored research supported wholly or largely from non-University funds

Faculty who spend 50% or more of their time in non-sponsored research or in sponsored and non-sponsored research activities combined (not including those listed above)

Faculty who spend 50% or more of their time in "other professional service"

Lecturers

Professors adjoint

Visiting faculty

Research associates

Joint Institute for Laboratory Astrophysics faculty

Bureau of Audiovisual Instruction faculty

Figures for the Denver Center and the Colorado Springs Center include all reporting full-time faculty.




Figure 1. Percentage of Faculty at Each Academic Rank

Figure 1 shows the proportion of Boulder Campus teaching faculty and all reporting faculty from the Denver Center and the Colorado Springs Center found at each rank.

SECTION II. HOURS PER WEEK SPENT IN PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITY

Faculty members were asked to estimate the average hours per week that they spent in professional activity of the type included in the three categories summarized in Section III: instructional activity; research, scholarly writing and creative work; and other professional service.




Figure 2. Ranges of Estimated Hours per Week of Professional Activity, by School and College




Figure 3. Ranges of Estimated Hours per Week of Professional Activity, by Faculty Rank

Figure 2 shows a variation in reports of individual faculty members from 34 to 85 hours per week. Ranges and median hours per week are compared by school and college in figure 2 and by faculty rank in figure 3.

Table I lists the mean, median and range of hours per week of professional activity reported by the teaching faculty of each school and college and by other classifications of faculty. An over-all mean of 56.2 hours per week is reported. Mean hours per week reported by the various schools and colleges vary from 51.7 to 65.0. Table II gives similar information according to faculty rank classifications. The mean hours per week reported by the various ranks of the combined teaching faculty vary from 54.6 to 56.8. More variation shows up among the ranks of the separate schools and colleges.


SECTION III. PERCENTAGES OF FACULTY TIME SPENT IN VARIOUS PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

The annual faculty report asks the full-time faculty to apportion 100% of their time into three main categories which have further subdivisions.

Figure 4 shows the distribution of percentages of time of the Boulder campus teaching faculty among these various categories. Table III indicates the breakdown for each school and college of this group of faculty, as well as other faculty groups and campuses. The teaching faculty reports an average of 66.5% of their professional time spent on instructional activity, 18.9% for research, scholarly writing and creative work and 14.7% for other professional service.




Figure 5. Percentages of Time Spent in (A) Instructional Activity; (B) Research, Scholarly Writing and Creative Work; and (C) Other Professional Service, by School and College

Variations by school and college can be noted from Table III and also from Figure 5. The Schools of Pharmacy and Journalism report the largest mean percentages of time spent on instructional activity, while the Graduate School and the School of Law report the least. Teaching faculty of the Graduate School, the University Department of Mathematics and the School of Law report the highest mean percentages of time spent for research, scholarly writing and creative work, and the Schools of Journalism and Architecture report the least. The Graduate School, School of Architecture and School of Business report the most time spent in other professional service. The Schools of Journalism and Pharmacy report the smallest mean percentages of time in other professional service.




Figure 6. Percentages of Time Spent in (A) Instructional Activity; (B) Research, Scholarly Writing and Creative Work; and (C) Other Professional Service, by Campus.

Table III and figure 6 show that the faculty of the Denver Center tend to spend more of their time on instruction, less on research and about the same on other service as those of the Boulder campus; while faculty at Colorado Springs spend less on research but more on other

professional service. The fact that some of the faculty groups excluded from the teaching faculty classification in Boulder are included at the Centers skews the results at the Centers toward more research and administrative activities at the Centers than would be the case if such exclusions were made there.




Figure 7. Percentages of Time Spent in (A) Instructional Activity; (B) Research, Scholarly Writing and Creative Work; and (C) Other Professional Service, by Faculty Rank

Figure 7 shows the variation of the distribution of time according to faculty rank. The higher rank faculty spend a larger percentage of their time on research and administrative work and a smaller percentage on instructional activities than faculty of lower ranks.

The faculty classed as teaching faculty tend to spend about two-thirds of their time in instructional activity. This includes 50.2% in direct instructional activity related to classroom teaching, 4.0% in curriculum and research planning, 4.6% in graduate thesis supervision, 5.9% in student advising and 1.7% in supervision of teaching associates and teaching assistants. Table IV shows that most of the total time assigned to instructional activity is spent in the classroom and in preparation for the classroom.

Curriculum and research planning account for averages of 2.1 to 10.0% of faculty time in the various schools and colleges. Time spent for thesis supervision ranges from 0.0 to 10.0%. Time spent for student advising takes from 3.4 to 10.8% and supervision of teaching associates and teaching assistants from 0.6 to 3.4 % of faculty time in the various schools and colleges. The faculty not included as teaching faculty tend to spend less time in all of these activities.

Table V shows that chairmanship of doctoral thesis committees takes more faculty time than any other activity connected with thesis supervision. According to information found on Table VI, the teaching faculty spend more time advising undergraduate students than graduate students. This is

reversed for some of the classifications of faculty not included in that category.

Percentages of time spent for instructional activity for each school and college according to faculty rank are summarized in Table VII.

The information shown on Tables VIII and IX indicates that about 5% of the time of those classified as teaching faculty is spent on sponsored research projects and about 14% on other research, scholarly writing and creative work. Even less time is spent at the Centers on both types of research activities. Faculty at professorial ranks spend more of their time in research than instructors do, but full professors do not spend more time in research than assistant professors. These relationships vary among the schools and colleges.

According to Tables X and XI, almost 5% of the time of the teaching faculty on the Boulder campus is spent in various University committee and council meetings. Another 2% is spent on other administrative duties and lesser amounts in professional organizations, public service and outside consultation. Almost 4% is spent on other activities that do not fit within the specified categories. Faculty of higher ranks tend to spend more time in administrative activities than those of lower ranks.

SECTION IV. COMPARISONS WITH 1961 FACULTY SERVICE REPORTS

Faculty service reports are collected annually and used for various purposes by different administrative offices. The last complete analysis of faculty load and distribution of faculty time was done by James I. Doi and Betty McMichael in a study called Faculty Workload, Fall 1961, University of Colorado. Some comparisons are made in this section between results of the study made in 1961 and the current one for 1967.

It should be pointed out that the two studies are not completely compatible for comparison purposes. The report form for fall 1961 includes curriculum research and planning in the category of "other professional service," while the 1967 form includes this under "instructional activity." This could make a difference of one or two per cent of total time spent in each of these two categories.

Classification of faculty for the two studies is similar, but not identical. Faculty spending most of their time on sponsored research projects are excluded from those classed as "teaching faculty" in both studies, but there may be a few more excluded from this group in the more recent study on the basis of spending at least 50% of their time in other research activities or administrative duties. These distinctions of faculty activity are not made for the Centers, but just for the faculty of the Boulder campus. No information was obtained in 1961 from the Colorado Springs Center, so no comparisons are made for it.

There were 144 more faculty reports turned in by full-time teaching faculty on the Boulder campus in 1967 than in 1961. Eighty-two of these are from the College of Arts and Sciences. Reports from the Denver Center faculty increased from 25 to 71. Decreases are found in the number of instructors and senior instructors on both of these campuses. The largest

increases are in numbers of assistant professors and full professors, with much smaller increases in numbers of associate professors.

The average number of hours per week of professional activity for all teaching faculty on the Boulder campus decreased by only six-tenths of one hour from 56.8 to 56.2 hours per week. Table XII shows that this average went up in some schools and colleges and down in others. It went down about three hours at the Denver Center. There tend to be smaller ranges of average hours per week reported in 1967 than in 1961, with fewer reports of work weeks in excess of seventy and eighty hours. According to information found on Table XIII, senior instructors and professors on the Boulder campus show some increase in time spent each week on professional activity, while the other ranks show a decrease. Instructors at the Denver Center show a marked decrease in hours per week spent in professional activity, while other ranks show increases.

Tables XIV and XV compare the mean percentages of time spent in the three main categories of professional activity in 1961 and 1967. The average percentage of time spent in instructional activity by teaching faculty on the Boulder campus remains the same as reported in 1961, while there is about a 3% increase in time spent in research activities and a corresponding 3% decrease in time spent in other professional service. Faculty at the Denver Center report some decrease in percentage of time spent in instructional activity and increases in both research and other professional service. The lower ranks report the largest increases in percentage of time spent for instruction. A slight decrease is indicated by full professors.

Tables XVI, XVII and XVIII give comparisons between 1961 and 1967 in the various sub-categories under instruction, research and other professional service.

There is a definite trend indicated toward spending a larger percentage of time in supervision of theses, advising of graduate students and supervision of teaching associates and teaching assistants. This increase in time spent with graduate students is evident at the Denver Center as well as on the Boulder campus.

The percentage of time spent on sponsored research by teaching faculty on the Boulder campus increased from 2.8% to 5.3%, while time spent on non-sponsored research increased from 13.3% to 13.6%. Instructors show a smaller percentage of time for research in 1967 than in 1961, while other ranks show an increase. The faculty of Denver Center show an increase of 2 to 3% in percentage of time spent in both sponsored and non-sponsored research.

The teaching faculty at all ranks on the Boulder campus report a reduction in the percentage of time spent for activities other than instruction and research, but an increase in the category of committee and council meetings. Faculty spending 50% or more of their time in these other activities, as well as all department chairmen, directors of special programs and deans are excluded from this group. Denver Center faculty report an increase in percentages of time spent in the various administrative duties.

The increase in time spent in activities related to graduate instruction reflects the growth in both student enrollments and program emphasis at the graduate level of the University of Colorado.
