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INTRODUCTION

The original Guide to Curriculum Materials and Testing Instruments has been expanded to its present form to include four additional major categories: Cultural Materials; Education and Career Opportunities; Audio-Visual Materials; and Bibliographies and Catalogs. The cost of materials has been quoted, when available. Free publications have been included under one of the seven individual categories and are no longer listed as a separate section.
