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ABSTRACT Boca Paíon, *Plorida Atlantic University

Based on its conclusion that a unicameral senate woulf be both desirable and feasible, Florida Atlantic University's Committee on University Sovernance drafted a proposal to establish a "sinqle university-wide Senate, which truly represents Administration, raculty, and Stułents." The two parts of the proposal present (1) the composition of the Senate membership and procedures for selecting Senate members; and (2) the composition and number of Sonate committees. This report discusses both parts in detail. The prodosed 139 -member Senate would comprise 70 faculty members, 48 students, and 21 administrative officers, all of whom would serve one-year terms. Fifty faculty members would be elected by college and 20 others would be elected at-large. Four student members would be olected from each of eight colleges in the fall of each year; the three student officers and 21 student members-at-large would be electer in yearly spring elections. No election procedure would be required for the administrative officers, all of whom would be ex officio members. Senate committee members would serve one-year terms on 11 committees that would deal with the following matters: university budaet; steering and policy; promotion, tenure, and honorary degrees; academic freefom and due process; admissions and potitions; curriculum; research; library; publications; physical space; and cultural affairs and activities. The directive establishing the Comittee contains this charge:
"I, President Williams, wish the study to
determine the desirability and feasibility
of establishing a single university-wide
Senate, which truly represents Administra-
tion, Faculty and Students; said university-
wide Senate to replace the present Senate
composed of Administration and Faculty and
to replace the present Student Senate."

The Committee discussed the des'irability and feasibiifty of a Unicameral Senate; and it invited and received the views and suggestions of the President of the Student Body, the Vice Presidents for Academic, Administration, and Student Affairs and other interested persons. The conclusion reached was that a single university-wide Senate was both desirable and feasible.

The Committee met weekly over a period of six months; and with the aid of ad hoc Sub-Committees, a proposal was drafted
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which, in the Committee's opinion, would create a "single
university-wide Senate, which truly represents Administration,
Faculty, and Students."
The proposal consists of two separate but interrelated
parts:

1. The composition of the Senate membership, and the procedures for selecting Senators representing the Faculty, the Students, and the Administration.
2. The composition and number of Senate Committees.
The two parts will now be presented in sufficient detail to establish an overall view of our proposal.
The qualifications for membership, and the procedures for selecting members, are presented below.

## Qualifications for membership

Faculty: appointment as a full-time professor, associate professor, assistant professor, or instructor budgeted to the colleges or Ocean Engineering.
Students: current enrollment as a full-time student in good standing.

Faculty elected at large. The 20 faculty memers-at-large will be elected in a special election after the College (and O.E.) elections of apportioned members. There will be no college quotas.

Allocation of student members. The 3 student officers and the 21 members-at-large are to be elected in a general student election during the Spring of each year. The 24 college members (4 from each college) are to be elected in College elections in the Fall of each year.

Allocation of administration. All of the 21 memberships are ex officio so that no election nrocedure will be required.

Review of Senate membership. A review of Senate membership, and if necessary, a re-allocation of the 50 Faculty College memberships among the colleges, shall be done at the beginning of the Fall quarter every two years. The Steering and Policy Committee shall act as the review board and it shall present its recommendation to the Senate for approval not later than the second regular Senate meeting following the opening of the Fall quarter.

## Presiding Officers of the Senate

The presiding officers of the Senace shall be, in rank order:

1. The President of the University

## 2. The Student President (Vice Chairman of the Senate)

3. The Vice President for Academic Affairs
4. The Vice President of the Student Body

## Senate Committees

A11 Senate Committees shall be composed of Senate members. Sub-Committees of Senate Committees may be appointed by the Chairman of a Senate Committee with the advice and consent of a majority of the Committee; and Sub-Committee may be composed of Senate members and non-members, provided, however, that the chairman of each Sub-Committee shall be a member of the Senate Committee

The heads of campus publications who are not Senate members shall be ex-officio members of Sub-Committees of the Publication Committee

All Senate Committees except the Steering and Policy Committee shall be appointed by the President from nominees submitted by the Steering and Policy Committee.

Election to the Steering and Policy Committee shall be held at the September meeting of the Senate each year.
