ABSTRACT

THIS ISSUE OF "UNIVERSITY RESOURCES" PROVIDES INFORMATION ON DEGREES, COURSES, AND FACULTY IN THE FIELD OF LINGUISTICS. THE NUMBER OF INSTITUTIONS COVERED, 146, IS ALMOST DOUBLE THAT OF THE 1965 EDITION, WITH 64 SCHOOLS MENTIONED FOR THE FIRST TIME. ALSO NEW IS COVERAGE OF CANADIAN INSTITUTIONS. TEACHER TRAINING IN ENGLISH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE HAS BEEN OMITTED SINCE CURRENT INFORMATION CAN BE FOUND IN THE INSTITUTE OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION'S "ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND ORIENTATION PROGRAMS IN THE UNITED STATES," NEW YORK, 1969. (SEE AL 002 261.) INCLUDED IN THIS EDITION ARE THOSE INSTITUTIONS WHICH, ON THE BASIS OF AVAILABLE INFORMATION, OFFER AT LEAST THREE COURSES IN THE FIELD OF GENERAL LINGUISTICS OR LINGUISTICS AND RELATED DISCIPLINES. 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Introduction

This sixth revised edition of University Resources continues to present in a concise and comprehensive format, information on degrees, course offerings, and faculty in the field of Linguistics. The number of institutions covered in the present work, 146, is almost double that of the 1965 edition, and represents an increase of 48 over the 1966 edition, with 64 schools appearing for the first time. Also new in this edition is information on resources of Canadian institutions. Coverage of Teacher Training in English as a Foreign Language has been omitted from this volume, since current information can be found in English language and orientation programs in the United States (New York, Institute of International Education, 1969).

Coverage

Included in the present edition are those institutions which, on the basis of available information, offer at least three courses in the field of General Linguistics or Linguistics and Related Disciplines. The information listed for each college or university was supplied mainly by the institution itself, through a questionnaire prepared and mailed out by the Center for Applied Linguistics. In a few cases, this was supplemented by college catalogues. The academic institutions covered in this volume may still represent only a partial listing, since some of the questionnaires were not returned to the Center, and college catalogues could not furnish adequate information.

Arrangement

The colleges and universities are listed in alphabetical order, and under each entry is given all or part of the following information:

- Department, department chairman, degrees offered.
- Staff, with academic rank and field of specialization.
- Course offerings or course areas.
 - A: Courses traditionally offered in the field of General Linguistics or Linguistics and Related Disciplines, e.g. Morphology and syntax, Language and culture. A standard nomenclature has been adopted, though exact course titles and content may differ at various institutions. The number following an entry, e.g. Morphology and syntax, 4, indicates the number of courses offered at least once in a two-year period.
 - B: Courses with primary linguistic content, e.g. Thai structure, Romance linguistics. Here no attempt has been made to indicate the number of courses offered.
 - C: Courses in ancient languages or modern foreign languages, not commonly taught in the United States. (Classical Greek and Latin, as well as modern French, German, Italian, Russian and Spanish have not been included.)

The languages have been arranged according to geographical area: West European, Slavic and East European, Near and Middle Eastern, South Asian, Southeast Asian, East Asian, Oceanic, Amerindian, Caribbean, and Sub-Saharan African. The ancient languages appear in brackets. Again, the number of courses offered is not indicated.

- Summer workshops, seminars, institutes, etc.
- Institutes, language and area centers, research programs, etc.
- Name and address of the office from which to obtain brochures, catalogues, etc., which give full descriptions of programs and degree requirements.

Information on annual summer institutes, a tabular index of universities and their programs arranged by state, and an index of languages, appear at the end.

Course offerings usually include basic courses in descriptive, historical, and applied linguistics; more advanced courses on the theory of phonemic, morphological, and syntactical analysis, experimental and articulatory phonetics, semantics, lexicology, dialectology, language typology, and field methods. A series of courses on the structure of individual languages, both ancient and modern, general courses in comparative linguistics, and intensive language courses are also usually offered.

During the summer of 1970 the Linguistic Institute will be held at Ohio State University in Columbus, and during the summer of 1971 at the State University of New York at Buffalo.

Summer Institute of Linguistics. Founded in 1934, the Summer Institute of Linguistics, which is affiliated with the Wycliffe Bible Translators, was organized with the aim of putting unwritten languages into written form for Bible translation. Literacy campaigns are an important part of the activity. During the summer, students are trained in linguistic analysis at the Universities of Oklahoma, North Dakota, and Washington. There are also branches of SIL in England, Australia, and Canada.

In the linguistics courses the concern is primarily with immediate practical implications of descriptive linguistics rather than pure theory. While the majority of students are missionaries en route to or on furlough from pre-literate groups, other students are commonly enrolled.

NDEA Intensive Language Programs. Under Title VI of the National Defense Education Act, the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare supports language and area centers both during the academic year and during the summer.

Intensive language instruction in the "neglected" languages and related area studies is offered. Each of the host universities determines the standards for admission, academic credits, and fees for the programs it administers and selects the persons to receive NDEA graduate and undergraduate fellowships.
