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ABSTRACT

TO COLLECT AND DISSEMINATE INFORMATION CONCERNING
LAW ENFORCEMENT EDUCATION IN THE UNITED STATES, QUESTIONNAIRES WERE
MAILED TO 362 COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES WITH 257 RETURNING THE FORMS.
A TOTAL OF 261 LAW ENFORCEMENT PROGRAMS WERE OFFERED AT 234 SEPARATE
EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, WITH 199 ASSOCIATE, 44 BACCALAUREATE, 13
MASTER'S, AND 5 DOCTORATE DEGREE PROGRAMS OFFERED. TEN STATES DID NOT
PROVIDE ANY DEGREE PROGRAMS AT THEIR COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES. THE
NUMBER OF LAW ENFORCEMENT PROGRAMS INCREASED 306 PERCENT FROM 1961 TO
1968 AND ENROLLMENT IN THE PROGRAMS ROSE 147 PERCENT FROM 1964 TO
1967. FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS STUDY, SCHOOLS WERE CONSIDERED TO HAVE
LAW ENFORCEMENT PROGRAMS IF THEY OFFERED PROFESSIONAL COURSES
PROVIDING A REASONABLY COMPLETE CORE OF KNOWLEDGE IN THE AREA OF LAW

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FOREWORD

Myths die hard. Perhaps it is because at one obscure moment in history there was an incident upon which the myth was based. Within the field of police education and training, there continue to be myths which, like all others, exhibit vitality greater than their validity. A myth which appears to be under severe attack and which shows hopeful signs of being placed to rest, holds that "it takes a policeman to teach a policeman." While the value of this doctrine may be worthwhile in terms of developing the how-to-do-it skills of the job, its worth is severely limited as it relates to the creation of a sound educational foundation for individuals entering the police service.

Much of the growing concern about law enforcement education stems from the lingering impact of the adherence to the dogma of the myth. Two severe problems are looming, both related to the provincial concept of teacher selection. On the one hand, the myth creates the belief in the minds of students that they are wasting their time unless their course of study occurs within a program flying the police banner. On the other hand, the explosion in the demand for and creation of police education programs has tended to exhaust the supply of those few, rare persons who have mastered both the skills of the police practitioner and the techniques of teaching.

Our needs shift as conditions change. No longer can we clutch a dead myth to our breasts. The study reported here provides benchmarks and guidelines which we hope will enable the police executive and the educator to make quality the hallmark of the police practitioner's educational preparation.

INTRODUCTION

This study was initiated in an effort to collect and disseminate information relating to some of the basic quantitative aspects of law enforcement education in the United States. It was anticipated that such data would be useful to educators developing or conducting programs, students and counselors involved in planning for law enforcement careers and police administrators concerned with the current nature of the academic foundation of their profession.

In recent years the remarkable growth of law enforcement education has often been accompanied by an unfortunate tendency to exaggerate the number of law enforcement degree programs actually available. This tendency is the result of several factors, including the perpetuation of unreliable data, undisciplined enthusiasm, and the absence of a satisfactory working definition of what constitutes a "law enforcement" program. The latter difficulty has led to the listing of schools that offer a single criminology or corrections course and others that offer degree programs only in sociology or other fields which are certainly police related, but hardly definable as law enforcement majors.

For the purpose of this study, law enforcement programs were defined as experiences in formal education that terminate in the award of an academic degree and which contain a substantial number of professional courses that provide a reasonably complete core of knowledge relating specifically to the law enforcement or police function as contrasted with other components of the criminal justice system. While not precise, this working definition provided a useful criteria for identifying professional programs and presented very few problems in actual application.

As an initial step, questionnaires were mailed to 362 colleges and universities that have appeared on one or more lists of "law enforcement" programs circulated in recent years. Non-responding schools were mailed a second questionnaire with an appeal to participate in the survey. Two hundred and fifty-seven survey forms were eventually returned, with 63 of the respondents reporting that they did not offer law enforcement degree programs.

In addition to the responding schools, 40 other programs were verified through previous survey responses, records of the American Association of Junior Colleges, and personal knowledge of the IACP staff members. Non-responding but verified programs were tabulated separately and included in the survey wherever appropriate.

PROGRAMS AND INSTITUTIONS

As a result of survey returns and other verification processes, 261 law enforcement degree programs were identified in 234 separate educational institutions in the United States and outlying areas as summarized below and tabulated by state in Table I.

As a result of the converging influences of several dynamic factors, including an awakened interest in the potential of education on the part of the police profession and other developments, several of which are suggested in Figure 1, the decade beginning in 1960 has seen an impressive growth in the availability of degree programs. During the major portion of this period, new program development continued at an almost explosive rate in both community colleges and universities.

While the total number of colleges and universities offering programs has grown significantly in recent years, the ten states listed below have not, as yet, provided for professional law enforcement curriculums in their systems of higher education.


The failure of these states to develop programs is especially notable in light of the availability of federal funding for this purpose in recent years. The Office of Law Enforcement Assistance of the U. S. Department of Justice initiated a special funding program in fiscal year 1967 to make law enforcement education available in states where programs had not previously been developed or where additional programs were needed to service population centers. Prior to the federal funding period, a Ford Foundation grant permitted the Professional Standards Division of the IACP to offer enforcement and field assistance to schools and law enforcement groups interested in the development of degree programs.

Assistance programs mounted at the national level to provide both funding and field consultation were instrumental in greatly accelerating the expansion of police education opportunities in the United States, but, as suggested by the program distribution reflected in Table I, much work remains to be accomplished.

1960-1968




ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAMS

In the fall of 1968, there were at least 199 associate degree programs in operation, with perhaps a dozen more in the advanced stages of development. No less than 17 of the existing programs were classed as part time in that a two-year degree could not be earned in two years or less attendance. Distribution of associate degree programs by state and operation is provided in Table II.

The rate of growth of associate degree programs over the last ten years is illustrated in Table III which indicates an increase in the number of programs available from 28 in 1958 to the current level of 199. Available enrollment figures also reflect an impressive growth pattern.

While the evolution of police education has been facilitated by the concurrent growth of the community college movement in the United States, Figure 2 clearly indicates that the growth rate of law enforcement programs and enrollment has far exceeded that of junior colleges in general.



BACCALAUREATE AND GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS

The development of baccalaureate and graduate degree programs had proceeded at a pace hardly characteristic of the traditional image of the established academic world. Although fewer in number than the associate degree programs, the post-associate degree offerings demonstrate an equally impressive growth rate, evidencing a 207.7% increase during the period 1958 to 1968.

In the fall of 1968, there were at least 48 colleges and universities offering a total of 62 programs leading to the award of bachelor's, master's and doctor's degrees in the law enforcement field. Table IV provides a summary, by state and level, of advanced education programs. Their growth pattern during the years from 1958 to 1968 is illustrated in Figure 3.

THE QUESTION OF QUALITY

With more law enforcement programs and larger numbers of police students, the educational outlook for the profession would appear to be optimistic. There is, however, a growing concern over the quality of many of the curriculums being offered and genuine doubt about the relevancy of such programs to the career needs of today's law enforcement students. While certainly not confined to associate degree programs, this problem is presently most acute at the community college level in the United States.

The issue of program quality was confronted by the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Justice in their 1967 Task Force Report: The Police, which states:

"The Commission's examination of these (Police) programs disclose that many of them are highly vocational in nature and are primarily intended to provide technical skills necessary in performing police work. College credit is given, for example, for such courses as traffic control, defensive tactics and patrol procedures. Although there is a need for vocational training, it is not and cannot be a substitute for a liberal arts education.

The wisdom of giving degree credit for technical courses, therefore, must be questioned. Training may be properly offered at college or junior college facilities but not as part of the school's basic program . . . When courses are offered for vocational training, however, they should be considered as such and not as degree credit offerings of the institution."

The complex demands made upon career policemen in modern society have been far too well documented in recent years, both through popular media and the findings of distinguished study groups, to require elaboration in this document*. At this point in time it should be possible to make reasonably accurate statements regarding the nature and quality of those educational programs that will best serve the long range career requirements of the police service. While such statements might conflict with current practice in many schools, they represent fundamental issues that have been too long ignored in the rush to create and expand a sufficient number of police programs to establish the right of law enforcement education to a place on the college campus.

The fear of offending vested interests should not be permitted to further delay the day when an increasingly sophisticated law enforcement community will join with conscientious police educators to define and provide the kind of educational experiences that are responsive to the real requirements of a professional career service. As a beginning, there are several very basic standards that can and should be considered. For example, a law enforcement program should be academically sound. It should be designed not to transmit basic entry skills, the traditional function of the police academy, but to provide the student with the broad educational background necessary for a lifetime career in public service. Since we have no way of knowing what levels of education will be required for upward mobility in the police profession in the years ahead, no educational program that purports to prepare for career service can logically be terminal in nature.

An associate degree program that will not "transfer" to a senior institution for at least 90% application toward a baccalaureate degree in the criminal justice field is not, in fact, career oriented and should be avoided by police officers and pre-service students seeking an education for professional police service. Experience has clearly shown that educational goals frequently change over a period

of time and all too many students find that after several years of effort, often involving personal and family sacrifice, they have earned only a "terminal" degree that cannot serve as a foundation for further education. Therefore, in-service and pre-service police students should ignore the "terminal" program in favor of curriculum that will earn credit that can be applied toward a degree in any accredited college or university.

The concept popular in some circles that a law enforcement degree program must be "modified" in order to fall within the intellectual grasp of policemen is not only an insult to the intelligence and ability of the average police officer, but is a perversion of the philosophy of professional education. For those personnel who may be unable to do college level work, the need is for remedial and supportive education – not an "easier" degree program.

Beyond holding the potential for transfer, the law enforcement program should contain no more than 1/3 professional courses, (21-24 semester credits for associate programs) with the remaining course work concentrated heavily in the behavioral sciences and communications. If included, such skill courses as first aid, defense tactics, and firearms should meet physical education requirements and not be considered as part of the professional content.

The criteria of transferability of credit should eliminate the present corrosive practice of granting academic credit for prior police training or experience. Although not widespread, this practice has no sound logical or academic basis and has no place in a serious law enforcement education program. If complete college courses meeting all academic standards are taught by college staff members are included in recruit training programs, the granting of credit is acceptable. Unfortunately, however, this is rarely the case and in most instances "credit" is given as a device to attract students, with college and universities some times attempting to outbid each other by offering police students a greater number of "free" credits.

Quality is a product not only of curriculum but of instruction. All law enforcement course work should be presented by personnel who are fully qualified in terms of formal education and the requisite knowledge and experience. As an absolute minimum, all part-time and full-time instructors should hold a baccalaureate degree from an accredited university as well as the professional background appropriate to the subject instructed.

From these limited observations it is possible to suggest criteria for sound law enforcement programs:

- At least 90% of the program must transfer to a senior institution toward a baccalaureate degree in the criminal justice field.
- No more than 1/3 of the program should be made up of professional courses.
- The balance of the program should be heavily oriented toward the behavioral sciences and communications.
- Skill courses should not be included in the professional content, but may be used to meet physical education requirements.
- No credit should be allowed for police training or experience.
- All instructors of professional content courses should hold at least a baccalaureate degree in addition to other qualifications.

While this list of criteria may be incomplete in scope, its adoption would certainly make a major contribution to the improvement of law enforcement education in this country. Regrettably, the possibility of universal acceptance of such minimum standards for police education programs is precluded by the strangle hold imposed in some states on career programs by the various departments of vocational education that establish curriculum requirements incompatible with the demonstrated needs of the police service. In such states the only alternative is for individual community colleges to forego vocational funding and develop programs that will reflect a concern for the best interests of the police student and the welfare of the community.

Early in 1968 the American Association of Junior Colleges moved a first step in the direction of establishing standards for program development when it assembled its National Advisory Council on Law Enforcement and Education. The Council recommended a law enforcement curriculum fully compatible with the recommendations discussed above and that program, which is summarized in Figure 4, is strongly endorsed by the IACP.¹

STUDENTS AND GRADUATES

During the fall term in 1967 a total of 31,992 students were enrolled in law enforcement programs in 178 reporting institutions, a response representing about 85% of the 209 schools identified as offering such programs. Enrollment statistics, by state and student status, are provided in Tables V and VI and summarized in Figure 5.

The reliability of enrollment data is influenced by the fact that for the 13 universities that offer both associate and post-associate degrees it is frequently difficult to identify what portion of the enrollment should be classed as involved in an associate degree program. Consequently, post-associate program enrollment contains, for 13 schools, some students who could be more accurately tabulated as associate degree enrollments.

Of the reporting institutions, 167 furnished information regarding graduates. A total of 11,882 law enforcement graduates were reported, with the total divided almost equally between the associate and the higher degree programs. While it was obvious that records regarding the future of law enforcement graduates were incomplete, the information reported is summarized in Figure 7.

INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF

One hundred and ninety-three institutions provided information on the educational achievement and criminal justice experience of personnel instructing in their law enforcement programs. For associate degree programs, information was also tabulated on part-time instructional staff members and their primary occupational groups. This data is displayed by state in Tables VII, VIII and IX and summarized in Figure 8.

CAMPUS BASED POLICE TRAINING

It has long been recognized that colleges and universities are in an excellent position to assist law enforcement agencies in the development and presentation of a wide range of training programs. As long as it is recognized that such activities are vocational in nature and not part of the liberal arts education program, campus based training courses can provide a valuable service to the community and to law police administrators concerned with the constant need to improve personnel performance.

While police training is offered at some colleges and universities that do not also house a law enforcement education program, this survey attempted to collect information on only those training activities conducted in conjunction with degree programs. The information provided by 194 institutions is contained in Tables X and XI and summarized in Figure 9.

TEXTBOOK SURVEY

In an effort to determine what, if any, consensus might exist regarding textbook preference, all institutions surveyed were asked to provide a list of texts required in law enforcement courses. As indicated in Table XII, 183 institutions provided the requested information.

A total of 375 titles were reported and the 66 books reported in use as required texts in 4 or more institutions are listed in Figure 10.
