ABSTRACT

This comprehensive guide to Italian study programs in American colleges, universities, specialized schools, and study abroad programs contains five major sections: (1) colleges, universities, and specialized schools offering introductory courses, minor, major, M.A., and Ph.D. programs; (2) colleges and universities offering graduate programs leading to M.A. and Ph.D. degrees; (3) colleges and universities offering undergraduate work toward major and minor programs, a complete listing of all course offerings, and graduate and study abroad programs; (4) American college and university study abroad programs in Italy; and (5) an alphabetical index of colleges and universities referred to in the guide. Bibliographic information and addresses of institutions and associations are included. (RL)

## INTRODUCTION

In recent years the Italian Culture Council has received repeated requests to provide a guide listing American colleges and universities that offer courses in Italian.

Students planning to take Italian find it difficult to obtain information concerning undergraduate and graduate programs. The information that is available is scattered in university catalogues, government publications and professional journals.

In this directory, "Italian in the Colleges and Universities of the United States", we have assembled all the information that should be made available to students. The following pages list the colleges and universities which offer introductory courses, undergraduate major and minor programs, graduate courses and degrees, and study abroad programs in Italy. The data was compiled from the information received on a questionnaire which was then checked against the latest available college and university catalogues.

Our object in assembling this material is to provide a rapid and practical guide to course offerings in Italian. Our aim is to serve many: students interested in earning a major or a minor, a Master of Arts or Doctor of Philosophy degree in Italian; teachers of languages; scholars of comparative literature and culture; people in the fields of Music and the Arts; lay persons interested not only in the language, but also in the literature and culture of Italy; people specializing in the fields of international and intercultural affairs.

We wish to express our special thanks to the department chairmen who provided information for this directory. Although data for this guide was compiled from many sources, the information received directly from the institutions was the most helpful in preparing complete and accurate descriptions. Aware as we are of the numerous demands on the time of university presidents and department chairmen, we are especially appreciative of their cooperation in helping us prepare this useful guide for students, counselors and the public in general.

## ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS and SUMMARY

This is the first time in the history of the United States, as far as I have been able to determine, that a guide as complete as this has been published in the field of Italian studies.

Antonio Striano, Director of Research for the Italian Culture Council, did an extraordinarily skillful job in compiling the data for this directory. Mr. Striano sent a letter and a questionnaire to 436 colleges and universities of which over 300 answered (the latest received was on January 9, 1969). The first and second questionnaires were sent out on March 10, 1968 and September 20, 1968 respectively. As late as February 8 of 1969, twenty-six questionnaires were sent out to check some conflicting data. All returned questionnaires were checked against college catalogues. Where no answer was received either to the first or second questionnaire, the information herein came from the latest catalogues available. Over 900 catalogues at Yale University and the New Haven Public Library were used in order to discover colleges and universities which had introduced Italian since 1965.

The following sources were used to set up a tentative list of institutions teaching Italian: the MLA's 1961, 1963, and 1965 publications "Foreign Language Enrollments in Higher Education"; Dr. Michael De Luca's 1965 survey in the June 1966 issue of *Italica*; a recent survey done by one of the directors of the Italian Culture Council, Dr. Giulio de Petra's "Fall 1968 Survey of Italian in California Universities and Colleges"; the college catalogues; and the announcements, messages, letters regarding new courses and programs received by the Italian Culture Council since March, 1963. From these sources, Mr. Striano and I drew up a tentative list of 436 colleges which offered Italian during the period 1960 to 1968.

It is pertinent to this book to note the following facts revealed by Dr. de Petra's "1968 Fall Survey of Italian in California Universities and Colleges". The results of Professor De Luca's 1965 survey were used for comparative purposes. The number of institutions in California offering Italian more than doubled from 23 in 1965 to 52 in 1968. At the same time, the number of students increased from 3,727 to 5,207 (even though some questionnaires omitted this point). The number of instructors of Italian rose from 56 in 1965 to 126 in 1968. These figures certainly seem to indicate a healthy growth in the field of Italian studies in California. Nationwide, one can see the same exciting growth. MLA's 1963 "Modern Foreign Language Enrollments for Higher Education" reveals on page ii the following comparative registers for Italian: 1960, 11,142; 1961, 12,769; 1963, 16,874; De Luca's survey, 1965, 19,923 (considering that out of 285 colleges contacted, only 222 reported). One is, therefore, struck by the continuous growth of Italian in the United States from 1960 to 1968. These increases pointed up the pressing need for a guide in the field of Italian studies.

The present guide lists 371 colleges, universities and specialized schools offering Italian; 366 of these have introductory courses. At the graduate level, 53 are offering M.A. and/or Ph.D. programs. At the undergraduate level, 170 offer a minor and/or major. Study abroad programs are offered by 86 colleges and universities.

This book is divided into five parts to provide an easy, rapid reference. Part I shows, at a glance, all the levels of instruction available in Italian at each institution. Part II is for graduate students interested in M.A. and/or Ph.D. programs; they should write to the graduate school for the catalogue. For the undergraduate minor and major programs in Part III, we thought it advisable to include the titles of all the courses offered in addition to schematic information regarding graduate and study abroad programs. It is recommended that persons write the university or college for its catalogue since course titles and credits change, new courses are added, minors and majors introduced, graduate programs instituted, and study abroad programs arranged. Part IV lists, alphabetically by cities in Italy, the study abroad programs. Part V contains an alphabetical index of the 371 colleges and universities with city and state noted. Due to the mobility of university and college presidents, chairmen and professors, the officers of the Italian Culture Council thought it best to omit all faculty names.

Two blank questionnaires have been included in the last pages of this directory. We would be most appreciative if non-listed colleges and universities currently teaching Italian would fill one out and send it to Mr. Antonio Striano, Jr., 49 Sherman Avenue, New Haven, Connecticut 06511. When your college expands its offerings, do please let the Italian Culture Council know.

The School for International Training, as part of the overseas program to Italy, normally includes a 110 hour intensive pre-departure course in Italian, or the equivalent of one year of study at the average institution. In the past three years they have taught Italian courses of this nature to 114 students in addition to placing many more students abroad for summer programs with Italian families.

Italian courses are regularly offered in February, June and September for groups which depart at those times of the year.

In addition, in the fall of 1967, the University of Vermont joined the Experiment in International Living (subtitle of above School) in a cooperative effort. The University of Vermont grants six semester credits to participants in the beginning courses of Italian.

The school also conducts an exchange program each year with the Italian Experiment program each year with the Italian Experiment office at Via del Cavallino No. 8., Asti, Italy. Italians come to the U.S. under the auspices of the School for International Training and study English as a second language.

Though this school does not offer the traditional college major and/or minor programs, its special courses and livingabroad program warrant inclusion in this section.

The following examples present a few of the problems one meets in trying to arrange an accurate indexing of colleges and universities. We have tried to reduce the margin of error and the understandable confusion in some university systems by indicating alternate entries in parentheses or by cross-reference.

1. New York City lists its municipally owned colleges under the general title of City University of New York. The official abbreviation is CUNY. Therefore, in Part III, Hunter College, Queens College, Brooklyn College and City College have been placed under CUNY.
2. Similarly, New York State uses the term State University of New York; SUNY is its official abbreviation. Some are SUNY at Albany, SUNY at Buffalo, SUNY at Stonybrook. Others are SUNY, College at Buffalo, SUNY, College at Oswego, SUNY, College at Potsdam, etc.
3. Long Island University:

4. College names undergo changes:
  - a. College of the City of New York (CCNY) has changed to City College (CUNY)

In two of them, Harvard and Columbia, Italian has been taught since the early 1800's. There are over 300 colleges and universities teaching Italian in the United States.

As far as the writer of the Bulletins has been able to determine, all institutions accept any language taught at an accredited secondary school.
