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## ERIC/AE SCOPE AND SUBJECT COVERAGE

The ERIC Clearinghouse on Adult Education (ERIC/AE) is sponsored by the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) of the U.S. Office of Education in cooperation with Syracuse University to provide information services to the adult education and training profession. ERIC/AE works in close collaboration with 19 other Clearinghouses as part of the national ERIC network of information analysis centers in education.

ERIC/AE acquires, processes and disseminates information about research studies and other literature of practical use to adult education agencies in business and industry, churches, the military, and other governmental and community organizations, as well as in schools and universities.

The ERIC information network as a whole covers the broad sweep of research and other literature in American education. Each Clearinghouse assumes major responsibility for a part of this literature in which it is particularly expert, but all ERIC services are based on the entire collection.

ERIC/AE is primarily concerned with documents related to the education and training of adults, especially the following core areas of this field.

1. The intellectual, psychological, social and physical characteristics of adults which affect their learning processes;
2. The career and personal interests and motives which influence the educational needs of adults;
3. The methods of instruction, independent study, program planning, and evaluation which are effective in the education and training of adults;
4. The system of institutional arrangements for providing adult education and training, as well as the economic, social and philosophical factors which govern the operation and growth of this system.

## HOW TO KEEP UP WITH THE LITERATURE OF ADULT EDUCATION

The ERIC Clearinghouse on Adult Education (ERIC/AE) publications listed here will help you obtain reports and a wide range of other documents more easily than we would have dreamed possible a few years ago. These special ERIC/AE publications range from subject bibliographies with abstracts, to substantial reviews, surveying large bodies of literature and prepared by subject experts. They may be obtained from the ERIC Document Reproduction Service. (Please see instructions and order form at the end of this publication.)

Adult Leadership, The Journal of Extension, the Training and Development Journal, the Mass Media Newsletter and several other adult education periodicals also carry regular announcements of new documents in the ERIC system.

Research in Education. This monthly abstract bulletin announces all documents entering ERIC each month from ERIC/AE and from the other 19 Clearinghouses. It has subject, author and institutional indexes, together with full information for obtaining documents. This standard abstract journal is widely available in education libraries, school systems and wherever educators are using the literature of the field. If you need to follow current publications in your work, you should insist that this resource be conveniently available to YOU. See page 10 for ordering information.

Current Index to Journals in Education. This monthly abstract journal covers more than 250 educational periodicals. Currently 36 periodicals important to the education and training of adults are covered by ERIC/AE. This, also, seems to me an indispensable resource for adult educators who keep up with best practice and thinking in their work. This service is necessarily somewhat expensive for individual subscriptions, so, if you need this resource, you should insist that your school system, university, company or other agency make it available to you in a convenient location. See page 10 for further information.

These two sources enable you to follow the best and most important literature on a monthly basis. They include many useful documents entered by the other Clearinghouses in the ERIC system. And they will always announce all the special publications of ERIC/AE and the other Clearinghouses.

THE KEYS TO ERIC USE ARE RESEARCH IN EDUCATION AND CURRENT INDEX TO JOURNALS IN EDUCATION.

ERIC Document Collections. Since standing orders to all ERIC microfiche documents are so inexpensive, these complete ERIC collections, with the cumulated indexes needed to use them, are now widely available in education libraries, regional and Title III centers and in other agencies.

This enables you quickly to locate documents by author or by subject, to inspect the microfiche document, and, usually, to copy parts of it. Since the subject indexing is detailed and somewhat different than the subject headings most of us are accustomed to use in libraries, you will want to

browse in the Thesaurus of ERIC Descriptors, for it will help you locate the exact terms we have used to index the concept in which you are interested. You will not find everything under "adult education," but will often need to use such terms as "adult basic education," "parent education," "correspondence study," "university extension," or others that make your search quicker and more direct.

We have included in this listing all special ERIC/AE publications from September, 1969 to September, 1970, and references to basic ERIC Catalogs.

PHYSICAL FACILITIES IN THE EDUCATION AND TRAINING OF ADULTS; MEMORANDUM ON SPARSE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT LITERATURE.

DeCrow, Roger

This is a critical review of adult education facilities in the realm of formal education (elementary and high schools, junior colleges, colleges and universities), as well as in business and industry, churches and synagogues, community organizations, government agencies at all levels, the armed forces, and proprietary schools (correspondence and other types of private, profit-making schools). It is emphasized that the formal system of schools and universities is not the chief provider of adult education, and that the problem of facilities must be considered in business and industry and a wide array of other organizations in which education is a vital instrumental function but not the primary purpose. Various implications and unanswered questions are raised. Also included are five general references and a 50 item annotated bibliography.

NEEDS--OF PEOPLE AND THEIR COMMUNITIES--AND THE ADULT EDUCATOR: A REVIEW OF THE LITERATURE OF NEED DETERMINATION.

Focusing on community education and development, this literature review analyzes the problem of determining community and individual needs; the issue of relevance to the community; the meaning of need (as opposed to interests or desires); and the use of community studies, listening posts, surveys, and power structure analysis as evaluation tools. The issue of relevance in particular is examined with respect to teaching versus action, disciplines versus the interdisciplinary approach, static programs, and the setting of program objectives. An 88-item annotated bibliography touches on adult basic education, vocational education, rural development, social change, professional continuing education, training design, participation, and other pertinent concerns.

EDUCATION FOR AGING: A REVIEW OF RECENT LITERATURE.

This literature review covers studies and reports on a wide range of behavior patterns relative to the aging process. While most of this work deals with education for aging in terms of adult problems and interests,

attention is also given to developments in early life experience and in attitudes which tend to set the pattern for later life characteristics. Respective chapters focus on learning characteristics and abilities of older adults; existing opportunities and remaining areas of need for education on aging in the educational system; job retraining and other kinds of informal educational opportunities; and factors germane to preparing for retirement. Annotated chapter bibliographies (a total of 237 items) also appear.

COMMUNITY SERVICE AND CONTINUING EDUCATION: LITERATURE REVIEW.

This review was undertaken to explore and analyze the literature in the ERIC Clearinghouse on Adult Education in terms of three important questions about Title I of the Higher Education Act of 1965. First, what is the relationship between community service and continuing education as revealed in the substance, audience, and methods of Title I programs? Second, to what extent are institutions of higher education responsible for community service, and what is their role? Finally, what are the essential ingredients for an effective statewide system of community service and continuing education? Trends are suggested, as well as areas in which universities appear to be standing still. An appendix with additional references to professional development, community development, and other forms of service is also included, along with 92 abstracts.

THE PREPARATION OF ADULT EDUCATORS: A SELECTED REVIEW OF THE LITERATURE PRODUCED IN NORTH AMERICA.

This literature review covers the leading areas of discussion and research as well as some conclusions reported. Six major preoccupations of research are outlined, followed by two chapters on adult education as a discipline and a profession, patterns of adult educational leadership, levels and categories of adult educators, and their learning needs. Chapter 4 covers the growth of graduate education in adult education, numbers of doctorates granted during the period 1935-69, theoretical models for the doctorate, learning objectives, program content, procedures and criteria for evaluating graduate study, and provisions for field work and inservice training. Conclusions touch on such aspects as the status (firmly established) of adult education as an academic field, the nature of professional education (essentially graduate and postvocational), and the need for research on roles and functions, evaluation of training program outcomes, and the development of suitable measurement instruments. Included is a 118-item bibliography.

The digests in this booklet are arranged alphabetically by author.

Three adult education conference papers, together with abstracts, are presented on adult education participation and self-concept. Propositions regarding behavior and motivation are discussed in the context of a theory of self-concept. Curiosity, enjoyment of learning activities, and pleasure in acquiring and/or possessing knowledge are among the reasons stressed in another paper for involving oneself in learning. Also considered are the ways in which conflicting psychological needs, role transition, and the attitude or sense of powerlessness affect adult learning.

Devoted largely to documents since 1965, this annotated bibliography on

adult basic education contains 261 entries, most of these are concerned with surveys, planning, and program descriptions at the national, state, and local levels (67 entries); curriculum materials, lesson plans, and related matters (41 entries); clientele groups (including military personnel, migrant laborers, American Indians, Spanish Americans, and prisoners); teacher manuals and guides for new careers training, reading instruction, and other types of programs; teachers and administrators; teacher training; and the broad category of recruitment, testing, counseling, and student characteristics. Historical reviews, information sources and research reviews, educational television, computer assisted instruction, and programmed instruction are also represented.

CONTINUING EDUCATION OF WOMEN. Current Information Sources, No. 32. September 1970. 76p.

This annotated bibliography of about 150 items on women's continuing education begins with descriptions of a newsletter and three bibliographies, followed by documents on sex differences in ability, achievement, and role perception. Four other sections cover employment related interests and needs, women's participation in programs by universities and voluntary organizations, guidance and counseling, low income and otherwise disadvantaged women, and homemaking education activities and needs. Finally, the state of women's education in France, India, Thailand, Tunisia, Australia, the Soviet Union, Chile, Peru, East Africa, and other nations and regions, is reviewed and evaluated. Also included are a list of ERIC/AE publications and instructions for ordering from EDRS.

CONTINUING EDUCATION IN THE PROFESSIONS. Current Information Sources, No. 24. September 1969. 100p.

Beginning with bibliographies, surveys, and other general works, this 225-item annotated bibliography on professional continuing education covers the following areas: engineering and technical education; chemistry and clinical psychology; medicine and health (including psychiatry); inservice education and retraining for lawyers, law enforcement officers, and military personnel; educational needs and programs for the clergy; academic and other forms of education for public administrators; the training of military and civilian personnel in the armed forces; and social worker education through group experience and other means.

MANAGEMENT DEVELOPMENT AND SUPERVISORY TRAINING. Current Information Sources, No. 26. November 1969. 77p.

Management development and supervisory training are covered in this 210-

Item annotated bibliography. Bibliographies and other information sources are listed, followed by studies on such background considerations as training needs and interests, career patterns, learning behavior and achievement, and program planning. Works on human relations training, group training, simulation, and other methods and techniques appear next. Program descriptions and evaluations, evaluation procedures, academic programs, surveys of training in the United States and abroad, and American and British course directories are also treated.

OCCUPATIONAL TRAINING FOR DISADVANTAGED ADULTS. Current Information Sources, No. 29.

This annotated bibliography contains about 260 entries on various aspects and areas of occupational training for disadvantaged adults. Bibliographies and information sources are listed first. These are followed by sections on problems of the disadvantaged, Federal programs, and national policies; job training and skills programs (including some program descriptions); paraprofessional and New Careers programs; trainee characteristics (demographic, psychological, motivational, social) and their influence on training; instructional materials, guides, and teachers' manuals; and evaluation studies of various types, including followup, prediction of success, and cost effectiveness.

PARENT, HOME, AND FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION. Current Information Sources, No. 30.

This 149-item annotated bibliography on parent, home, and family life education begins with descriptions of a number of periodicals and bibliographies, and several studies of trends in home economics education. These are followed by 27 surveys of role perception, needs, interests, and participation; 25 studies on the training of professionals and nonprofessionals for home management, parent, and family life education; 17 special programs for low income groups; nine reports on consumer education and money management; and 56 other items concentrating on parent education (including parent child relationships and the teaching role of parents).

PERSONNEL DEVELOPMENT IN ADULT EDUCATION, Current Information Sources, No. 31.

This annotated bibliography contains 192 items on program planning,

educational trends, legislation, and other matters within or relevant to the preparation of adult educators. General topics and national surveys appear in two brief opening chapters. The next two deal with formal education through graduate study and short courses, and with the training of volunteer adult educators, persons working with disadvantaged groups, and human services paraprofessionals. Other chapters cover personnel characteristics and data (eight items), role perceptions (36 items), educational and training needs of educators and other groups (16 items), staff recruitment and selection (eight items), staff evaluation (seven items), and instructional materials (18 items).

PROGRAMMED INSTRUCTION IN BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY. Current Information Sources, No. 28.

This annotated bibliography contains 113 entries, mainly 1964 or later and most with abstracts, covering the residential method; historical reviews (including the rise of the Scandinavian folk high schools); bibliographies on instructional methods and techniques and related aspects of residential education; directories of facilities, programs, and learning resources; conference planning and administration; program descriptions from such areas as professional education, management training, in-service training, sensitivity training, labor education, family life education, and the contemporary folk schools; proposals for continuing education centers; programs and institution surveys; clientele surveys; and foreign residential education.

This monthly index covers over 250 journals in the field of education and, in addition, important articles in periodicals outside the scope of education-oriented literature. It is a companion piece to Research in Education and is indexed with the same subject descriptors, taken from the Thesaurus of ERIC descriptors. It includes a listing of descriptor groups, a classified main entry section with citations and descriptors, a subject index, and an author index.
