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ABSTRACT

United States census data (1960) on urban American Indians have been prepared to assist those studying urban Indians in obtaining population figures and background information for research projects and reports. Tables are presented showing population totals from 1890 through 1960; distribution of Indians in cities of 10,000 or more; median age by sex; mobility from 1955 to 1960; number of school years completed; and median income in 1959. Data sources and a publications list of the Center for Urban and Regional Affairs at the University of Minnesota are appended. (JH)

A SELECTIVE SUMMARY OF 1960 CENSUS DATA**

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Compilers' Note

These 1960 United States Census data have been prepared for several practical reasons, among them the following: 1) to assist in the backgrounding of a dozen or so urban Indian reports currently being completed by the Training Center for Community Programs; 2) to provide population figures for a forthcoming volume on urban American Indians; and 3) to render a small data service to students of urban Indians (a category not meant to exclude Indians themselves).

Definitions and Explanations

All data in this report have been taken from the 1960 Census of the Population. The data are in shortened form to aid in the identification of the American Indian population as it relates to the total population. Complete references are given in the Appendix so that the interested reader will be able to turn to the unabridged forms if he so desires.

The first variable, "Population Distribution," is taken from Table 15 -- Race by Sex, for the State, by Size of Place, 1960, and for the State, 1890 to 1950 -- for the twenty-two states included in this report. This table gives the total population of the state, the total "nonwhite" population for the state, and the total "American Indian" population. To aid the reader in understanding these data, definitions of these terms as they are employed by the Census Bureau have been given below.

The concept of race as used by the Bureau of the Census is derived from that which is commonly accepted by the general public. It does not, therefore, reflect clear-cut definitions of biological stock, and several categories obviously refer to national origins.

The term "color" refers to the division of population into two groups, white and nonwhite. The color group designated as "nonwhite" includes Negroes, American Indians, Japanese, Chinese, Filipinos, Koreans, Hawaiians, Asian Indians, Malaysians, Eskimos, Aleuts, etc. Persons of Mexican birth or ancestry who are not definitely of Indian or other nonwhite race are classified as white.

American Indian -- In addition to full-blooded American Indians, persons of mixed white and Indian blood are included in this category if they are enrolled on an Indian tribal or agency roll or if they are regarded as Indians in their community. A common requirement for such enrollment at present is that the proportion of Indian blood should be at least one-fourth.

In the eastern part of the United States, there are certain populations of mixed white, Negro, and Indian ancestry. In censuses prior to 1950, these groups had been variously

classified by the enumerators, sometimes as Negro and sometimes as Indian. In 1950, an attempt was made to isolate these groups and include them in the category "All other" races. Because of problems in the identification of these groups in 1950 and the likelihood that they would not be distinguishable in self-enumeration, this effort was abandoned in the 1960 census. Generally, the number involved was small except in North Carolina, which had a heavy concentration of this mixed racial population (notably in Robeson and surrounding counties).

This first variable has several breakdowns, notably into "urban" and "rural" parts. The following definitions are in use when these breakdowns are made:

In general, the urban population comprises all persons living in urbanized areas and in places of 2,500 inhabitants or more outside urbanized areas. More specifically, according to the definition adopted for use in the 1960 Census, the urban population comprises all persons living in (a) places of 2,500 inhabitants or more incorporated as cities, boroughs, villages, and towns (except towns in New England, New York, and Wisconsin); (b) the densely settled urban fringe, whether incorporated or unincorporated, of urbanized areas; (c) towns in New England and townships in New Jersey and Pennsylvania which contain no incorporated municipalities as subdivisions and have either 25,000 inhabitants or more or a population of 2,500 to 25,000 and a density of 1,500 persons or more per square mile; (d) counties in States other than the New England States, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania that have no incorporated municipalities within their boundaries and have a density of 1,500 persons or more per square mile; and (e) unincorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more. The population not classified as urban constitutes the rural population.

Again, the breakdowns into total population, nonwhite population, and Indian population are continued.

The second part of the population distribution table concerns the totals given in the years since 1890. The figures reflect the gross shifts in the population makeup, but one note of caution is given by the Census Bureau:

The use of self-enumeration may have added to the accuracy of the 1960 count of the Indian population. Studies of the adequacy of the enumeration in the last several censuses have led to the conclusion that it was incomplete largely as the result of the failure of enumerators to identify off-reservation Indians.

The second variable has been entitled, "Distribution of Indians in Cities of 10,000 or More (At Least 40 Indians)"; this is a condensed version of Table 21 -- Characteristics of the Population, For Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas, Urbanized Areas, and Urban Places of 10,000 or More: 1960. Again, the figures are given for the total population, for the total nonwhite population, and for the total American Indian population. Where applicable, the figures for the SMSA, the Urbanized Area, and the Urban Place are given. For the convenience of the reader, shortened definitions of these terms are given below:

Except in New England, an SMSA is a county or group of contiguous counties which contains at least one city of 50,000 or more, or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000. In addition to the county, or counties, containing such a city or cities, contiguous counties are included in an SMSA if, according to certain criteria, they are essentially metropolitan in character and are socially and economically integrated with the central city. In New England, SMSA's consist of towns and cities, rather than counties.

An urbanized area contains at least one city which had 50,000 inhabitants or more in 1960, as well as the surrounding closely settled incorporated places and unincorporated areas. . . . An urbanized area may be thought of as divided into the central city, or cities, and the remainder of the area, or the urban fringe. All persons residing in an urbanized area are included in the urban population.

The count of urban places in 1960 includes all incorporated and unincorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, and the towns, townships, and counties classified as urban. Unincorporated places are designated by "U" and urban towns and townships by "UT". Under the urban definition used previous to 1950, places of 2,500 or more and the areas urban under special rules were urban places.

The remainder of the variables refer to the Indian population only. These data were extracted from Tables 51 and 56 which detailed the social and economic characteristics of the Indian population for selected

areas. This part of the data, unlike the previous portion, is based on a 25% sample of the population, rather than 100%. Separate figures are shown for the total state Indian population, the total state urban Indian population, and for the Indian population in SMSA's of 250,000 or more, with 2,500 or more Indians.

The first table given for Indians only is entitled "Median Age." This table is broken down by sex, and gives the total number of Indians in this particular statistical cell as well as the median age of these persons. The age classification is based on the age of the person in completed years as of April 1, 1960. The median is the value which divides the distribution into two equal parts -- one-half of the cases falling below this value and one-half of the cases exceeding this value.

The second table given for Indians only is entitled "Mobility from 1955 to 1960" and is broken down by sex. This table is based on the comparison of places of residence on April 1, 1955 and April 1, 1960. The "Totals" figure gives the number of persons five years old and over who were reported as living in the area in question. The "Movers" figure indicates that percent of the relevant population who were living in a different house on April 1, 1955 from the one they occupied on April 1, 1960. This category was subdivided into three groups according to their 1955 residence. All those who lived in a different house which was located in a different county from that five years previous were described as "Migrants" -- those for whom the different county was in the same state were "Migrants within state" and those for whom the different county was in a different state were "Migrants into state." Naturally, the causes of the various patterns of migration are not indicated from these data and need to be sought elsewhere.

The third table given for Indians only is entitled "Number of School Years Completed" and is broken down by sex. The "Totals" figure gives the number of persons over fourteen; the following numbers refer to this population category. The percentages of persons over fourteen who had completed high school and the median number of years completed are given.

The fourth table for Indians only is entitled "Income of Persons with Income in 1959" and is broken down by sex. Again, the definition of the Census Bureau is helpful in understanding the figures given:

Information on income for the calendar year 1959 was requested from all persons 14 years old and over in the sample. "Total income" is the sum of amounts reported separately for wage or salary income, self-employment income, and other income. Wage or salary income is defined as the total money earnings received for work performed as an employee. It represents the amount received before deductions for personal income taxes, Social Security, bond purchases, union dues, etc. Self-employment income is defined as net money income (gross receipts minus operating expenses) from a business, farm, or professional enterprise in which the person was engaged on his own account. "Earnings" are obtained by summing wage or salary income and self-employment income. Other income includes money income received from such sources as net rents, interest, dividends, Social Security benefits, pensions, veterans' payments, unemployment insurance, and public assistance or other governmental payments, and periodic receipts from insurance policies or annuities. Not included as income are money received from the sale of property (unless the recipient was engaged in the business of selling such property), the value of income "in kind," withdrawals of bank deposits, money borrowed, tax refunds, and gifts and lump-sum inheritances or insurance payments.

The median income for the relevant population category is given. A plus (+) or minus (-) sign after the median indicates that the median is above or below that number. For example, a median of \$1,000- for income indicates that the median fell in the interval "less than \$1,000."
