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# Reading in Marine Science

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## Preface

The recent rapid growth in the field of marine science has led to an accelerated production of books on ocean-related topics. Information on published materials is limited. A recently published list of books on oceanography entitled "Oceanographic Books of the World—1957-1966" was prepared by K. O. Emery, Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, Woods Hole, Massachusetts, and Evelyn Sinha, Oceanic Research Institute, La Jolla, California. Such lists are invaluable to the nonprofessional as well as the professional.

To further assist the nonprofessional reader and the teacher in the Pacific coast areas, we have compiled a partially annotated list of mainly nontechnical books in the field of marine science. These have been classified by subject as follows:

1. *General References*—Books in this category have fairly good coverage of two or more broad areas of oceanography or are on general topics not covered in the other categories.
2. *History and Exploration*—The beginning of oceanography is closely tied to early voyages of exploration. Books about such explorations, as well as about specific oceanographic expeditions and underwater diving, are included in this group.
3. *Biological Oceanography*—This category includes books principally about living organisms in the oceans. Some books are devoted to specific groups of plants or animals, while others are more general.
4. *Chemical Oceanography*—The chemical nature of seawater and processes for extracting elements from seawater are the topics generally covered in this classification. The extraction of fresh water from seawater is included.
5. *Geological Oceanography*—Books on undersea topography and geologic processes are included in this group. Topics include seamounts, submarine canyons, trenches, mid-oceanic ridges, and deposits on the sea floor.
6. *Physical Oceanography*—Topics generally covered in this group concern physical processes involving waves, tides, currents, ocean weather, and the distribution of temperature and density in the oceans.

Comments have been included where practical. If a book was not readily available, the information was obtained from book reviews, publisher's comments, and other book lists prepared by such professionals as Drs. June G. Pattullo and Joel W. Hedgpeth of the Department of Oceanography, Oregon State University.

This list naturally has certain limitations. It is not inclusive even at the date of publication, as new books are continually being published. Emphasis has been placed on listing books concerned with the Pacific coast rather than the Atlantic coast. Very few of the books included are technical in nature. Prices listed are subject to change, and should be used only as a general guideline.

Many books are available in either paperback or hard cover; in such cases, the paperback edition is usually listed. For simplicity, only one publisher is listed for each book. Books may go out of print without notice, while some books previously out of print may now be back in print. Many older books, even though out of print, will still be available in libraries.

Magazines supply readers with many interesting articles in the field of marine science. Many publications are easy to read and full of beautiful color illustrations or photographs. Some such magazines are *Sea Frontiers*, *Oceanology International*, *Ocean Industry*, *Underwater Naturalist*, *Scientific American*, and *National Geographic*. Because of their volume, we have not included any articles in this bibliography.
