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ABSTRACT

A booklet on legislation affecting the Office of Education is presented. It is divided into two parts. The first is a summary of pertinent legislation arranged by title and section. The second presents a brief description of the assistance or program offered, who may apply and how funds are disbursed. Program categories include undergraduate assistance, graduate opportunities and assistance, special programs for educational personnel, vocational opportunities and assistance, research, construction and remodeling, equipment and materials, and educational services.

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

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FOREWORD

The U.S. Office of Education administers a variety of legislative programs which may provide support for educational undertakings in the arts and the humanities. This publication, a revision of the December 1968 edition, was prepared by Diana Vogel song of the Arts and Humanities Program staff.

The booklet is divided into two parts. The first is a summary of pertinent legislation arranged by title and section. The second presents a brief description of the assistance or program offered, who may apply, how funds are disbursed, the Federal share of support, and the Office of Education source for additional information. It is arranged by program categories which include undergraduate assistance, graduate opportunities and assistance, special programs for educational personnel, vocational opportunities and assistance, research (including development, demonstration, and dissemination), construction and remodeling, equipment and materials, and educational services. Some programs may appear under several categories since legislation may provide support for a number of different programs.

It should be emphasized that none of the legislation cited provides support exclusively for arts and humanities programs or projects.

**Summary of Legislative Programs Administered by the U.S. Office of Education Which May
Provide Support for the Arts and the Humanities**

Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act of 1954 (Public Law 83-480)

Section 104 (7 U.S. Code 1704.) Authorizes the use of foreign currencies derived from the sale of surplus agricultural commodities abroad for research and dissemination and the promotion and support of educational and cultural development.

Cooperative Research Act of 1954 (20 U.S. Code 331., et seq.) (Public Law 83-531, as amended by Public Law 89-10 (see ESEA title IV) and by Public Law 89-750)

Section 2. Authorizes contracts or jointly financed cooperative arrangements with universities, colleges, State education agencies, and other public or private agencies and organizations for the conduct of research, surveys, and demonstrations in the field of education.

Education Professions Development Act (20 U.S. Code 1091., et seq.) (Public Law 90-35, amending title V of the Higher Education Act of 1965, Public Law 89-329)

Part B. Extends the Teacher Corps and adds a provision for attracting and qualifying teachers to meet critical teacher shortages.

Part C. Extends the Teacher Fellowship Program to include graduate education for preschool, adult, and vocational educational personnel.

Part D. Authorizes support for a variety of programs or projects, including those to prepare artists, craftsmen, scientists, artisans, or persons from other professions or vocations, or homemakers to teach or otherwise assist in programs or projects of education on a long-term, short-term, or part-time basis.

Part E. Provides support for improving training opportunities for personnel serving in programs of higher education.

Educational Television Broadcasting Facilities Act of 1962 (40 U.S. Code 390., et seq.) (Public Law 87-447; enacted as part IV of title III of the Communications Act of 1934)

Section 392. Provides for the acquisition and installation of transmission apparatus necessary for television broadcasting for educational purposes.

Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-10, as amended by Public Law 89-750)

Title I. Educationally Deprived (20 U.S. Code 241.a., et seq.).

Authorizes funds for special projects and activities to help meet the special needs of educationally disadvantaged children. Programs include supplementary cultural activities.

Title II. School Library Resources (20 U.S. Code 821., et seq.).

Provides for school library resources including textbooks, books, periodicals, documents, magnetic tapes, phonograph records, and other printed and published materials.

Title III. Supplementary Educational Centers and Services (20 U.S. Code 841., et seq.).

Authorizes funds for supplementary educational centers and services not available to the community, and provides for the establishment of exemplary elementary and secondary school educational programs.

Title IV. Educational Research and Training (20 U.S. Code 331., et seq.).

Strengthens and expands the Cooperative Research Act of 1954 by providing funds for national and regional research facilities and by broadening the range of participants to include individuals and non-profit institutions.

Title V. Strengthening State Departments of Education (20 U.S. Code 861., et seq.).

Authorizes funds for the development and expansion of a variety of programs and projects designed to improve the effectiveness of operations of State departments of education (sections 503 and 505).

Fulbright-Hays Act (Public Law 87-256; see **Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act of 1961**)

Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S. Code 1001., et seq.) (Public Law 89-329, as amended by Public Law 89-752)

Title I. Community Service and Continuing Education Program.

Appropriates funds to each State for strengthening community service and continuing education programs of colleges and universities.

Title II. Library Assistance.

Provides grants for (part A) increasing college and university library resources, and (part B) supporting librarianship training, library research, and demonstration projects.

Title III. Strengthening Developing Institutions.

Aids developing colleges through national teaching fellowships (section 305) and cooperative programs (section 304), such as the exchange of faculty members and students and the sharing of library and laboratory facilities.

Title IV. Student Assistance.

Establishes educational opportunity grants to help college students with exceptional financial need (part A), and provides for federally subsidized loans to college students through various institutions (part B), and for extension of the college work study program (part C).

Title V. Education Professions Development (see Education Professions Development Act.)

Title VI. Improvement of Undergraduate Instruction.

Authorizes grants to colleges and universities for acquiring laboratory and other special equipment, including audiovisual materials, closed-circuit television, and published material other than textbooks (part A).

Higher Educational Facilities Act of 1963 (20 U.S. Code 701., et seq.) (Public Law 88-204, as amended by Public Law 89-329 and Public Law 89-752)

Title I. Grants for Construction of Undergraduate Academic Facilities.

Provides grants to institutions of higher education for the construction, rehabilitation, or improvement of undergraduate academic facilities to enable colleges to cope with problems created by expanding enrollments. Undergraduate public community colleges, technical colleges, and other institutions are included.

Title III. Annual Interest Grants.

Provides for annual interest grants to institutions of higher education or to higher education building agencies for construction of undergraduate and graduate facilities.

Library Services and Construction Act of 1956 (20 U.S. Code 351., et seq.) (Public Law 84-597, as amended by Public Law 88-269 and Public Law 89-511)

Title I. Public Library Services.

Appropriate funds to States for the further extension of library services, including acquisition of library materials and equipment as well as operating expenses.

Title II. Public Library Construction.

Appropriates funds to States for the construction, expansion, remodeling, and alteration of public libraries in areas lacking facilities necessary for developing library services.

Title III. Interlibrary Cooperation.

Appropriates funds for the development of State plans to coordinate the resources of school, public, academic, and special libraries, and special information centers, for improved services of a supplementary nature to the special clientele served by each.

Manpower Development and Training Act of 1962 (42 U.S. Code 2570., et seq.) (Public Law 87-415, as amended by Public Law 87-729, Public Law 88-214, and Public Law 89-15)

Title II-A, section 204. On-the-Job Training.

Authorizes a program for the training of persons unemployed because of automation, shifts in market demands, foreign competition, and other economic changes and conditions.

Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act of 1961 (Public Law 87-256, as amended; known as the Fulbright-Hays Act)

Section 102(b)(6) (22 U.S. Code 2452.(b)).

Authorizes support of study abroad by teachers and prospective teachers in U.S. colleges and universities for the purpose of improving their skills in non-Western languages and their understanding of the people and culture of relevant areas. Also provides opportunities for qualified American teachers to teach for an academic year in elementary and secondary schools abroad and to attend summer seminars abroad in foreign languages or in social studies.

National Defense Education Act of 1958 (20 U.S. Code 401., et seq.) (Public Law 85-864, as amended)

Title II. Loans to College Students.

Provides for the establishment of funds from which able but needy students in the Nation's colleges and universities may borrow on reasonable terms to finance their education.

Title III. Science, Mathematics, Modern Foreign Languages, and other critical subjects, including the Arts and the Humanities.

Authorizes funds for laboratory, audiovisual, and other special equipment, and for the remodeling of space suitable for this equipment in elementary and secondary schools. Also provides funds to be paid to State education agencies for expanding or improving their "supervisory or related" services to public elementary and secondary schools in critical subjects.

Title VI. Language Development.

Authorizes funds to improve instruction in foreign languages and area studies through language and area centers, fellowships (section 601), and research and studies (section 602).

National Vocational Student Loan Insurance Act of 1965 (20 U.S. Code 981., et seq.) (Public Law 89-287)

Assists individuals preparing for careers in busi-

ness, trade, and other nonprofessional job areas requiring specialized training by setting up a program of loan insurance and a companion program of direct loans.

School Construction in Areas Affected by Federal Activities (20 U.S. Code 631., et seq.) (Public Law 81-815, as amended)

Provides assistance for the construction of urgently needed minimum school facilities in school districts which have had substantial increases in school membership as a result of new or increased Federal activities.

Vocational Education Act of 1963 (20 U.S. Code 35., et seq.) (Public Law 88-210)

Section 4(a).

Authorizes grants to States for a permanent program to assist them in the maintenance, extension and improvement of existing programs, and in the development of new programs of vocational education.

Section 4(c).

Authorizes grants to support research, training, and pilot programs for special vocational needs of youth:

Section 13.

Provides a program of part-time employment for youths who need earnings to continue their vocational training.
