**BASIC UNDERSTANDINGS BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA AT GREENSBORO AND THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF THE COVENANT, GREENSBORO in relation to use of church property for operating the UNC-G Demonstration Nursery Center.**

Copy of the agreement specifying use of church facilities by another agency. Includes: church space made available to the Nursery Center, hours of occupancy, responsibility for cleaning and maintenance, sharing of equipment, storage of equipment, UNC-G responsibility for church property, and miscellaneous matters agreed between the UNC-G Nursery Center and the church. 6 pages.
