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ABSTRACT

A compilation of schedules of colleges and universities offering correspondence instruction to military personnel through USAFI, is presented. Eligibility and Enrollment

Eligibility

Members of the United States Armed Forces may pursue correspondence courses with colleges and universities through the United States Armed Forces Institute (USAFI). These courses are available in academic, technical, and noncredit areas at minimum costs to qualified servicemen, since the enrollment fee covers cost of course materials and administrative charge only. The United States Government pays the cost of lesson service provided the serviceman enrolls through USAFI as outlined below.

An additional charge for airmail service may be made by the individual school. To facilitate the return of lessons, the oversea students should airmail their lessons to the schools and request that they be returned by airmail. Special fees for airmail service are described in the instructions accompanying the course listing of each college.

Enrollment

Enrollment procedures provide that the application for enrollment be sent direct to the college or university offering the course desired. A money order, cashier's check, certified check, or personal check for the exact enrollment fee as quoted for the specific course requested should be made out to the appropriate college or university and mailed with two copies of the application form to the address as given in the preface preceding the schedule of courses. The college or university will notify USAFI upon their acceptance of enrollment.

The application form, DD Form 305 (Application for Independent Study Enrollment or USAFI Course Transfer), must be filled out completely, signed by the applicant and certified by the education officer or commanding officer, and forwarded to the college or university in question. The student's Social Security Number (SSN) and his Military Service Number (MSN) are used as a means of student identification. Therefore, it is important that the student's course application include in the spaces provided, both his Social Security Number and his Military Service Number. (See sample DD Form 305).

Twenty-four months are allowed for the completion of a course provided that no 12-month period of lesson inactivity has intervened. Any 12-month period of lesson inactivity results in disenrollment. Disenrollment also occurs if the course is not completed within 24 months from the date of acceptance of the student's enrollment by the university or college. If the student is actively enrolled at the time of separation from active duty, he may continue the course for a 12-month period provided this period does not extend beyond 24 months from the date of enrollment.

If a serviceman is planning to take a course for school credit, he should, before enrolling, write to the school concerned to determine whether credit will be granted for the desired courses.

It is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements with his education officer or test control officer for the administration of the final examination (or other examinations, if applicable) and request that it be sent to this individual upon completion of the course. All lessons prior to the point at which an examination is given must have been submitted, graded, and returned before the examination is taken.

ELIGIBILITY AND ENROLLMENT SUMMARY.

Eligibility

Who is eligible for PC&U courses?

All members on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States for 120 days or more.

Fees

How much is the fee?

Fees vary for each course and school. Check them carefully.

What does the fee cover?

Fees shown are for the course materials and administration charge only.

Are there any other costs to the enrollee?

Individual schools may charge an additional amount for airmail service. (Airmail service is recommended for overseas locations.) The instructions for each school contains this information.

How about lesson costs?

The Government pays all lesson grading costs. This is the advantage of enrolling through USAFI.

How may fees be paid?

Do not send cash. Money orders, cashier, certified or personal checks are all acceptable. Make the check or money order payable to the school. Pay only the exact amount shown in the catalog, plus fee for airmail service if desired.

Enrollment

How does a student enroll?

Complete two copies of DD Form 305, (Application for Independent Study Enrollment or USAFI Course Transfer), and mail both copies with the exact fee payment direct to the school.

Should the student send a copy of the DD Form 305 to USAFI?

No. See next question.

How does USAFI know the student is enrolled?

When an applicant is accepted, the school sends one copy of the application form to USAFI.

Is any special information required?

If the DD Form 305 is completed properly, no further information is necessary. Check to be especially sure the name, social security number, former service numbers (if any), course number and title are all correct.

The opportunities for study by independent study permit the earning of under-graduate credits applicable to degree requirements as specified by each school or college of the University. The maximum number of independent study credits allowed is 25 percent of University requirements for the student's degree, provided this allowance does not conflict with residence requirements or other restrictions that may be imposed by an individual school or college. Credits are transferable to other institutions, subject to the regulations of such institutions. Students desiring courses for their own information, not for degree credits, may apply for whatever they feel qualified to study profitably.

Enrollment in an independent study course does not constitute official admission to the University. The applicant should show, by appropriate entries on the application form that he is qualified for the courses desired, stating when and where he had prerequisite courses if prerequisites are listed. If a transcript of previous work should be needed it will be requested.

The enrollment fee is determined by charges for registration, materials, texts, and postage, with the total being leveled off at the nearest dollar above known estimates. Since prices of materials and services tend to increase frequently, this slight differential is provided to cover actual costs during the contract year. It is understood in case new textbooks are not available that used ones in good condition will be furnished. Graded lessons will be returned to overseas addresses via airmail at no additional expense to the student. If the applicant desires airmail shipment of the original course materials and books he should add \$6 to the enrollment fee.

Courses numbered from 1 to 49 are primarily for freshmen and sophomores.
Courses numbered from 50 to 99 are primarily for juniors and seniors.
Courses numbered from 100 to 199 are primarily for seniors.

Admission Requirements

Individuals registering in the Correspondence Study program will be classified as special students. To qualify for enrollment a student should have a high school diploma, or have successfully passed the High School General Education Development Test, or be over 21 years of age. A catalog is available on request to the above address.

Fees

The fee quoted for each course includes a basic \$9.00 registration fee and also the cost of textbooks and supplies. Fees are not subject to refund or transfer.

The courses are offered below cost to military personnel through a contract with the United States Armed Forces Institute (USAFI).

Credit

All correspondence courses offered in the program are fully accredited. A maximum of thirty-two (32) semester hours of correspondence study work will be accepted toward the requirements for a baccalaureate degree and fifteen (15) semester hours of credit toward an associate degree at the University of Alaska. Credit may be transferred to other colleges or universities on the basis of the respective school's acceptance of correspondence study work.

Grades

The quality of student work is measured by a system of grades consisting of A, B, C, D, F. The grade A denotes exceptional accomplishment; B, superior; C, average; D, inferior; F, failure.

Examinations

Students enrolled through USAFI are urged to take their examinations through their USAFI test control officers at their local education offices. The mid-term and final examinations are included in the number of lessons indicated for each course.

Airmail Textbook Charge

All students stationed outside Alaska, whether in Continental United States or APO or FPO addresses who desire their lessons returned by airmail should include an extra \$5.00 for this service. All textbook orders will be sent PAL mail.

General Information

Each correspondence course offered by The University of Arizona is designed to parallel, as nearly as possible, the same course offered on campus. Textbooks, assignments and examinations have been prepared accordingly.

Courses are prepared in such a manner that each assignment is equivalent to one week's work during a regular term. Generally there are five assignments including a final examination in a one-unit course, nine assignments and a final examination in a two-unit course, and fourteen assignments and a final examination in a three-unit course.

Some courses are designated as "Directed Study" courses. "Directed Study" courses are divided into one, two, or three parts depending upon the units of credit offered. The instructor prepares a separate syllabus for each unit of credit and sets forth the reading assignments and exercises required to attain the objectives of that unit. When the student feels he has made satisfactory preparation to handle an examination over the unit he has studied, he notifies the Director of Correspondence Instruction who then authorizes an examination over the unit. When examinations have been successfully completed for all units of a course, a final grade is recorded. In this type of program the student is not required to turn in assignments; he is given the option of working in any manner he desires to achieve the objectives of the course.

Registration

You may register at any time by completing the DD Form 305 in duplicate, as explained in Section I of the Catalog, and sending it with your check for the enrollment fee.

We prefer that you register for one class at a time. No more than two classes may be taken concurrently.

University of Arizona campus students must obtain the approval of the Dean of the College of their enrollment before they will be permitted to register.

Prospective students of other institutions are responsible for obtaining written authorization from an appropriate authority of their institution prior to enrolling in a Correspondence course.

Classification of Courses

In all colleges, the number by which a course is designated is intended to indicate the relative advancement of the course. Courses numbered 4001 to 4099, inclusive, are lower-division courses primarily for freshmen and sophomores. Courses numbered 4100-4199, inclusive, are upper-division courses for juniors and seniors. Courses numbered 4200 to 4299, inclusive, may be carried for upper-division credit by qualified juniors and seniors.

The prefix "4" has been designated to identify Correspondence courses. As an example, using the Biennial Catalog as a reference: Govt. 2 becomes Govt. 4002, Govt. 50 becomes Govt. 4050, and Govt. 100 becomes Govt. 4100.

Withdrawals

A student must withdraw from a course within 30 days of registration to be eligible for a refund. A full refund minus \$5.00 will be granted provided no lessons have been submitted and the course syllabus is returned intact and in satisfactory condition.

Change of Study

A student may change his course providing:

1. He has submitted no assignments.
2. He returns intact the original course.
3. He pays a \$5.00 Transfer Fee. (This fee will be waived if the course change is requested within 10 days from the date of registration.)

Completion Time

The basic time of completion is two years. Exceptions and minimum rates of achievement are outlined in Section I of the USAFI Catalog.

Time Extensions

Time extensions are not granted. We are convinced that the possibility of a time extension encourages procrastination. This works to the disadvantage of the student since it encourages poor study habits and erodes the self-discipline necessary to complete a course.

Enrollment Transfer

The transfer of enrollment from one individual to another is not permitted.

Credit

The credit granted is in semester hours or units. A maximum of sixty semester hours of correspondence work may be applied on an undergraduate degree at the University of Arizona.

Students who plan to transfer credit to another institution should determine if the credit will be acceptable to that institution. This should be accomplished before registration.

Graduate credit is not available for any correspondence course.

Grades

You will be sent a grade report upon the completion of your course. The University of Arizona's grading system is as follows:

- 1 - superior
- 2 - above average
- 3 - average
- 4 - below average
- 5 - failure

The grade you receive will not change your point average. However, it will become a part of your permanent record.

Textbooks

Required textbooks and necessary materials are furnished automatically and are paid from the enrollment fee. Should optional texts be desired or other materials they may be obtained by placing a C.O.D. order with: Park Bookstore, Park & 5th, University of Arizona, Tucson, Arizona 85721. If new textbooks are not available, used books in good condition will be furnished and a refund for the difference in price made to the student.

Examinations

All correspondence courses require a final examination. Assignments must be completed before the final examination may be taken. Some courses may require more frequent examinations. Directed Study Courses require an examination for each unit of credit. In general the student must pass the final examination in order to pass the course and receive credit for the course.

Transcripts

All transcripts must be requested from the Transcript Desk, Registrar's Office, University of Arizona, Tucson, Arizona 85721.

Postage

The postage on textbooks and on graded lessons is included in the enrollment fee. Lessons will be returned to APO and FPO addresses Air Mail without extra charge. Students at APOs and FPOs should add \$1.00 to the enrollment fee for textbooks to be sent Air Mail (PAL) otherwise they will be sent SAM which will take longer.

Home Study courses are offered for the benefit of those who cannot take advantage of the training offered in residence at the University. These courses are prepared, corrected, and graded by regular members of the University faculty who are in charge of similar courses in residence.

Each course represents a definite amount of work corresponding to an equivalent amount of work done by students in residence. Credits are listed in semester hours. Each course has approximately eight assignments for each semester hour and a final examination. For example, there are generally 16 lessons and a final examination for a 2-semester hour course; midterm, and 24 lessons and a final examination for a 3-hour course. To receive credit the student must take a written examination on the completion of each course, unless otherwise specified. Mid-term examinations, term papers, book reviews, journals, etc., may be required according to the outline of lessons prepared by the instructor.

All courses offered are described in detail in the Brigham Young University Home Study Catalog. A free copy may be obtained by writing to: The Department of Home Study, Brigham Young University, Provo, Utah 84601. Your course should be selected with care, taking into consideration the catalog description of the course and the prerequisites required.

The courses are offered below cost to military personnel through a contract with the United States Armed Forces Institute (USAFI). The enrollment fee quoted is a flat registration fee of \$10 per course, plus the text or texts and postage. USAFI assumes the actual cost of instruction.

If the student wishes his course outline, books, and returned lessons sent via airmail, he should include an extra \$10 in addition to his enrollment fee. If the extra \$10 is not included, the course outline, books, and returned lessons will be sent by regular mail.

Transfers are allowed only under extenuating circumstances if no lessons have been completed. A fee of \$3.00 must accompany the request to transfer--after 90 days transfer fee is \$6.00. NO REFUNDS ARE GIVEN FOR USAFI COURSES.

A maximum of 24 semester hours earned in Home Study may be counted toward degree requirements at Brigham Young University.

Prerequisites

There are no special admission requirements for correspondence study, and no transcripts of previous academic work need be submitted. Any specific preparation required for a course is indicated after the title. It is important that you indicate completion of prerequisites in the space provided on the application form. If you are in doubt regarding your preparation, please write the Independent Study office for permission to enroll.

Enrollment will be accepted for no more than two courses at a time except with special permission from the Independent Study office. Submit duplicate application forms for each course.

Fees

The fee quoted for each course is composed of a \$15.00 registration fee and the cost of texts and supplies. The registration fee includes the course syllabus, and air and Special Delivery postage for the syllabus, texts, and return of assignments.

Upon receipt of your application, the course syllabus will be sent to you via airmail. Required texts are shipped separately by the Berkeley Book Store. (Do not purchase the texts separately; they are ordered for you when your enrollment is received.) Texts will be mailed to all APO and FPO addresses via PAL airmail service and to United States addresses via Special Delivery. All corrected assignments will be returned via airmail.

If you have already obtained the texts and supplies for a course, in most cases you may enroll for the basic fee of \$15.00.

Fees are not subject to refund or transfer. However, texts in their original condition may be returned for a full refund provided that their use is to be continued. Books should be shipped directly to the Berkeley Book Store, 2476 Bancroft Way, Berkeley, California 94704.

Time Limits

Twenty-four months from the official enrollment date are allowed for completion of a course, provided you do not allow twelve months to elapse without submitting an assignment. Disenrollment results from a twelve-month period of inactivity. The enrollment date appears in your address stencil. If you are actively enrolled at the time of discharge, you may continue your course for twelve months provided this does not extend beyond twenty-four months from the date of enrollment.

Course Numbers

Course numbers indicate the academic level at which work is presented. The numbering system is as follows:

- 1-49: Lower division (freshman and sophomore) courses. Some courses of this level are designated by letter rather than by number.
100-199: Upper division (junior and senior) courses.
300-399: Professional courses for teachers.
400-499: Professional courses in areas other than education.
800-899: Non-credit courses.

Credit

To receive credit for any course, you must take and pass a final examination. Military personnel may take final examinations under the supervision of Education Officers. If you do not wish to receive credit for a course, it is not necessary to take the final examination.

Courses in the 1-199 series are given for undergraduate credit which is accepted on all campuses of the University of California and at many other colleges and universities. Further information about the use of credit is given in the introductory section of the Independent Study bulletin.

Independent Study Bulletin

Full descriptions of the courses listed here appear in the university-level correspondence course bulletin, available without charge from: Independent Study, University of California Extension, 2223 Fulton Street, Berkeley, California 94720. The descriptions, along with other information given in the bulletin, are an important guide to course selection. It is recommended that you obtain a copy of the bulletin prior to enrollment.

General Requirements

If you have the background, desire, and ability, you may register for independent study courses. No credentials need be submitted. It is your responsibility to select courses for which you have the preparation. Independent Study will be glad to advise you in this selection.

Credit is given for independent courses under the same conditions which apply to courses taken in residence. You must assume the responsibility of insuring that credit will apply toward your degree.

Degree credit is credit which can be used, if it fits your degree plan, in meeting the requirements for a degree at the University of Colorado.

Three weeks before the time when credit is needed for any reason, all lessons, including the final examination, must be in the independent study office. This applies to credit needed for graduation, admittance or readmittance to any school for any semester, teacher's certificate or increase in salary, entrance to upper division, and eligibility in athletics.

Upon completion of the course, a final grade report is sent to you. An official transcript of credits is sent upon request. A \$1 charge is made for each transcript. Send your transcript order and the \$1 fee to Office of Admissions and Records, Transcript Clerk, University of Colorado, Boulder, Colorado 80302.

Reference Material

You should request required references from Continuing Education Librarian, 970 Aurora, Room 115, University of Colorado, Boulder, Colorado 80302. Books are loaned for two months, with privilege of renewal upon application, if not needed by another student. General Information

Credit courses taught by Correspondence Study from the State Universities of Florida are administered by the Division of Continuing Education under policies established by the Florida State Board of Regents.

As a general rule the numbers used for college courses denote the following levels: 100 Freshman level, 200 Sophomore level, 300 Junior level and 400 Senior level.

State Universities in Florida will accept college level courses completed by correspondence provided the courses are taken with a college or university which is accredited by the National University Extension Association.

Not more than one-fourth the total number of hours required for a baccalaureate degree may be completed by correspondence. There are certain other regulations restricting amount of work by correspondence and extension which may be taken during the junior and senior years. A person who has completed no college work might take 45 quarter hours of work by correspondence which could be applied toward a degree at a state university, provided the courses taken fit into the program to be followed at the university.

The enrollment fee quoted includes a registration fee of \$8.00 per course, plus the cost of required textbooks. It also includes airmail return of corrected lessons to overseas addresses. The contract fee includes the cost of new books. If used books are sent, any excess payment will be refunded. Contract fees have been adjusted slightly to compensate for the constantly changing prices of books.

If an applicant desires airmail shipment of course materials and books, he should include an additional amount of \$6.00. After determination of the exact mailing cost, necessary adjustments will be made.

- ¹ All courses are based on identical textbooks and if one course has been completed and enrollment is desired for another of the sequence, it will not be necessary to submit the full contract fee which includes all textbooks. In this case, only the enrollment fee of \$8.00 should be submitted.
- ² This is the second course of a two course sequence. If the first course has been completed by correspondence study, submit only \$8.00 for enrollment. The enrollment fee for the first course includes the cost of all required textbooks.
- ³ This three course sequence is based on identical textbooks and if one course has been completed, and enrollment is desired for the second and third part of the sequence, it will be necessary only to submit the \$8.00 for enrollment in each additional sequence.
- ⁴ This fee includes the amount of \$22.95 to cover a collection of reference books required for the course. If the student has access to a library, the amount of \$22.95 may be deducted from the contract fee leaving an enrollment fee of \$27.20 including \$19.20 for the textbooks.
- ⁵ If CEH 131 has been completed by correspondence study and copies of the basic textbooks are in the possession of the student, the amount of \$14.35 may be deducted.
- ⁶ The first two parts of GERMAN are based on one textbook with accompanying books for each course. The Georgia Center for Continuing Education is the administrative unit for all correspondence study in the University System of Georgia. The faculties of four of the senior colleges in the System participate in the program. Students are urged to seek the advice of the academic dean of the college from which they expect to graduate to learn what correspondence credit will be accepted.

Freshman and sophomore courses are numbered under 200; junior and senior courses are numbered 300 and above. Only students with at least two years of college work should enroll for 400 courses.

Textbooks and study material are supplied by the Center for USAFI students when requested. Students who already have texts should pay only a \$10 registration fee. It is well, however, to verify editions before assuming the student has the proper text. Reference material may be requested from the University of Georgia General Library but should be returned to the Library within two weeks. Examinations may be taken under the supervision of the Education Officer or Post Chaplain. Students may write the Supervisor, Independent Study, The Georgia Center for Continuing Education, The University of Georgia, Athens, Georgia 30601 for specific information.

Students wishing to use correspondence study for teachers' certificates in Georgia should address a separate inquiry to the Certification Division, Department of Education, Atlanta, Georgia 30303.

Dependents and other civilians may register by letter inclosing standard fees of \$55 for 5 quarter hour courses, \$44 for 4 quarter hour courses, \$33 for 3 quarter hour courses.

If the applicant desires airmail shipment of the original course materials and books, he should add \$5 to the enrollment fee. In the event that the airmail expense exceeds the \$5 fee, the student will be billed for the additional cost.

It is the policy of Independent Study in Georgia to return all papers to APO and FPO by airmail at no extra charge.

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

The Division of Continuing Education is pleased to provide the opportunity for members of our Armed Forces to earn college credits by making available University of Idaho correspondence courses in cooperation with the United States Armed Forces Institute. These courses are prepared with the cooperating departments of the University of Idaho. Each course represents an amount of work equivalent to that done by students in similar courses on campus. Instructors in most cases are members of the University of Idaho faculty who are in charge of comparable courses in residence.

Applicants qualified by education, training, or experience are eligible to enroll. Transcripts of previous work completed are not required. Those who expect to apply the credit toward a university degree must satisfy all entrance requirements and prerequisites.

Credits

A maximum of 32 semester hours of credit (the equivalent of one year of undergraduate work) earned in correspondence, extension, or a combination of the two may be applied toward degree requirements at the University of Idaho. Students who expect to apply credits toward degree requirements at another institution are advised to have their selection of courses approved by the proper officials of that institution before enrolling.

Graduate credit is not offered through correspondence study.

Course Numbering System

Credit for correspondence courses is listed in semester hours. Lower-division courses primarily for undergraduates are numbered between 100 and 299. Upper-division courses primarily for advanced undergraduates are numbered between 300 and 499. Any required prerequisites are listed after the course titles.

Examinations

Some courses have more than one examination. To receive credit for correspondence work, the student must take and pass a supervised examination at the end of each course, where one is required. Education officers and superior officers will be approved to supervise examinations.

Enrollment and Time Limits

Application forms not properly completed and authorized will be returned to the applicant. Students are to observe all stipulated time limits in this section.

The Correspondence Study Office will accept up to three lessons at one time but no more than five lessons in one week. Enrollment transfers from one course to another course are not permissible. No refund of fees can be made.

Special Airmail Handling

Course syllabi and instructions are always mailed first class and are sent airmail to students who have APO or FPO addresses. Texts, however, are sent surface mail unless airmail is requested and prepaid. The airmail service for texts is \$4 in addition to the enrollment fee listed for each course. In all cases, the lessons will arrive considerably ahead of the texts.

Overseas students who do not have an APO or FPO address and who wish airmail shipment of the syllabus and instructions should submit \$4 per credit hour in addition to the listed enrollment fee. The extra \$4 for postage to airmail the textbook would also be required. These special handling fees should be included with the regular fee.

Graded assignments for military personnel with APO and FPO mailing addresses will be returned via airmail at no extra charge.

The University of Illinois offers correspondence work in many fields for students who cannot attend classes in residence. With few exceptions these courses are prepared and taught by regular members of the University faculty who have similar responsibilities with respect to comparable courses offered in residence.

The courses listed in this document do not contain descriptions of course contents. Prospective students and Educational Officers are encouraged to obtain free copies of the Correspondence Courses catalog from the University of Illinois for this and additional information.

Most courses carry regular college credit, which may be applied toward a degree from this Institution or transferred for similar purpose to other schools. If these courses are to be used toward a degree, a careful study should be made of the requirements of the institution from which the degree is to be taken. The maximum amount of credits which may be taken by correspondence and credited toward a degree at the University of Illinois is 60 semester hours. A limited number of non-credit courses are also being offered. Courses offered by correspondence at the University of Illinois are listed numerically with headings to indicate for whom they are designed. Courses for undergraduates (freshmen and sophomores) are numbered 100 to 199 and for advanced undergraduates (juniors and seniors), 200 to 399.

To be eligible for admission to these correspondence courses, it is necessary that the applicant be in good standing at the school last attended. If the applicant has attended another college or colleges of university grade, his combined grade point average must be at least 3.0 (based on A = 5.0, B = 4.0, C = 3.0, D = 2.0, E = 1.0), or otherwise has the recommendation of the dean of his college or the registrar of that institution. He must also be able to meet the specific prerequisites set for each course desired. For these reasons, it is essential that the applicant accept the responsibility for providing a complete transcript of his prior educational record. Specifically, the applicant should request, at the time he files his application, all colleges of university grade attended and the high school from which he graduated to send transcripts to the University of Illinois Correspondence Courses Office. In the case of USAFI applicants stationed overseas, the Correspondence Courses Office assumes the responsibility of obtaining transcripts and initiating requests for recommendations from his dean if a recommendation is required, provided the applicant supplies the name of the high school or college institution or institutions he has attended.

The final grade in a correspondence course is determined by the instructor in keeping with policies and standards observed by the academic department concerned. Although the relative weight given lessons or special assignments and the results of the final examination may vary from course to course, the examination grade tends to weigh heavily in assigning the final grade. Normally, a passing grade must be earned on the final examination in order to receive credit for a correspondence course.

All USAFI materials are sent special handling without additional charge both within and outside the continental limits of the United States.

Graded lessons will be returned by airmail to students in overseas areas having APO and FPO addresses at no additional expense to the student.

Members of the Armed Services are not required, however, to show evidence of their advancement in college to register in these courses and may, therefore, cross over lines of collegiate standing in pursuing these independent study courses for credit. Prerequisites (if any) for courses are given in parentheses following the course.

Airmail of Books and Supplies to APO, FPO, and other overseas addresses. An applicant with an APO or FPO address is strongly advised to have textbooks and materials sent by airmail, as surface mail may take from one to three months for delivery. If airmail is desired, he may so indicate by adding \$1 to his enrollment fee and write "AIR MAIL" by the course title. An applicant with an overseas address--not APO or FPO--may request that his textbooks be sent by airmail with the understanding that the amount of the airmail cost will be billed to the student (between \$5 and \$10).

The independent study student pays for incoming postage for his lessons. Postage for surface mail return of lessons to the student is paid for by Indiana State University. If airmail return of lessons is desired, \$3 should be added to the enrollment fee (add \$4 total--\$1 for airmail of material and \$3 for airmail return of lessons) for all U. S. and APO or FPO addresses. Overseas applicants, not APO or FPO, desiring airmail return of lessons are required to add \$10 to the enrollment fee.

Students may write for free course description publication which describes course content.

Indiana University independent study courses are offered as a means of study for those who cannot be in the classroom. Each course represents a definite amount of work equivalent to that of the same course in residence at the University. A 3-semester-hour independent study course, for example, represents an amount of work equivalent to that of a campus course which meets three times a week for one semester. Instruction is continuous throughout the year and courses may be started at any time.

If credit is desired, the student must satisfy the course prerequisites which are listed in terms of Indiana University courses. Those who plan to use independent study credit toward degree requirements are advised to consult the dean of the institution where the credit is to be applied.

Complete description of the courses available will be found in the independent study bulletin, a copy of which will be sent upon request without charge.

Final examinations are required in all independent study courses taken for credit and should be scheduled soon after the last written assignment is submitted. Successful completion of a supervised final examination is requisite to credit. Supervised midsemester examinations are required in most courses. Members of the Armed Forces take examinations under the supervision of the Education Officer.

Upon successful completion of a course, the student receives a grade report for his files. The report is also filed in the Indiana University Office of Records and Admissions where official transcripts may be obtained.

Students with APO and FPO addresses should add \$1.00 to the enrollment fee listed so that textbooks can be sent by PAL airmail. Students with APO and FPO addresses will have their lessons returned by airmail without any additional charge.

General Information

The University of Iowa is pleased to cooperate with the United States Armed Forces Institute in offering University courses to armed service personnel.

Courses available through USAFI are identical to the regular home study offerings, and credit so earned is accepted by the University of Iowa toward an undergraduate degree or a master's degree. Thirty semester hours of correspondence credit may generally be counted toward a bachelor's degree, and nine semester hours of graduate correspondence work can be accepted for an advanced degree.

Courses with numbers between 100 and 200 (note the number following the colon; for example, 27:103) are acceptable for either undergraduate or graduate credit while those with numbers above 200 are definitely graduate courses. Courses numbered below 100 are not acceptable for graduate credit.

If college credit is to be given, the student must take a final examination under an approved supervisor such as a commanding officer or an educational director. The student should send the name of the proposed examiner when he sends his request for the examination.

Other details concerning enrollments are found in our Bulletin which is mailed to anyone requesting application forms.

The books required for the course are supplied by the Bureau of Correspondence Study at the time of enrollment.

If the applicant desires airmail shipment of the original course materials and books, he should include in the enrollment fee a deposit of \$7.00. Our Bureau reserves the right to notify the student if there is a substantial cost beyond this amount.

The \$7.00 charge, referred to above, includes returning all graded lessons to the student by airmail. If the student does not request airmail shipment of the original course materials and books, but does want the graded lessons returned by airmail, he should add \$2.00 to the enrollment fee.

The University of Kansas, cooperating with the United States Armed Forces Institute, offers courses in independent study to persons in military service. All these courses provide college credit, although any of the courses listed may be completed on a non-credit basis. Check Center's catalog addenda sheet for any changes.

This list gives the number and title of each course, the number of lessons (including the mid-semester and final examinations) and the reduced rates for USAFI students. This amount includes enrollment fees, texts, syllabus, envelopes, paper and postage. These reduced rates are possible because USAFI will pay the instructional costs.

When the application is received by the University of Kansas, the texts and all materials for the course will be mailed to you--you are not to order the books because we will place the order with the book store at the time your materials are mailed to you. Course material by first-class mail might require three to four weeks in transit, books six to eight weeks. However, if you wish, you may request with your application that your textbook(s) and other materials be sent to your overseas base via the faster PAL or SAM air service, which should reach you within five to seven days or, at the most, in fifteen days. In this case, the center will bill you later for the extra expense--probably \$5 to \$10. Your books will be sent in a separate package and should arrive at approximately the same time as your course material. If they do not arrive within a reasonable length of time, please write us promptly and we will check into the matter.

You are to return your lesson reports directly to the Extramural Independent Study Center, Division of Continuing Education, the University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas 66044, in the envelopes furnished. **THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF WORK WHICH MAY BE DONE IN ANY 7-DAY PERIOD IS FIVE (5) LESSONS.** After the lessons have been checked by the instructor, they will be returned to you. Lessons will be returned by airmail to all APO and FPO addresses.

NOTE: All enrollment blanks must show serviceman's social security number, or an enrollment cannot be processed.

A serviceman enrolling for credit must meet the prerequisites for each course, and if he is planning to take a course for college credit toward a degree, he should, before enrolling, write the school concerned to determine whether credit will be accepted for the desired courses. This approval should be included with his application form. Otherwise, the student may enroll as a special student and ask to have his credit recorded here at The University of Kansas until such time as he asks to have his credit transferred elsewhere.

It is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements with his education officer for the administration of the final examination (or other examinations, if applicable) and request that it be sent to this individual upon completion of the lessons. All lessons prior to the point

at which an examination is given must have been submitted before the examination is taken. The student may keep his graded lessons, and any outstanding lessons at the time of the examination will be returned to him when graded. Students are enrolled for a 2-year period.

NOTE: College courses numbered 1-49, are for freshman-sophomore credit; 50 and above, for junior-senior credit. Courses are based on semester hour credit.

Admission

There are no special admission requirements for independent study except that the student must comply with the conditions requisite to enrollment. Transcripts are not required of independent study students as a condition of enrollment.

Fees

The fee quoted for each course includes a basic \$5.00 registration fee and also the cost of textbooks, study guide and materials.

Prerequisites

It is the responsibility of the student to meet all prerequisites listed for a course. If there is any question concerning eligibility to enrollment, the request for additional information or clarification should be made directly to the Director of the Independent Study Program.

Credit

A maximum of 32 semester credit hours earned by independent study may be applied toward the baccalaureate degree at the University of Kentucky. Graduate credit is not granted for independent study work. However, credit earned through this method of instruction may be used when additional undergraduate courses are required as a prerequisite to graduate study or when additional work is needed to meet the requirements for certification in a major or minor area. A course taken on a noncredit basis cannot be transferred or used for credit.

Any course may be pursued on a noncredit basis. If credit is not sought for a course, then the prerequisites do not apply. Neither is the student required to write the final examination.

Course Descriptions

Complete descriptions of the courses available are in the Independent Study Program catalog, a copy of which will be sent upon request, without charge.

Lesson Assignments

Upon approval of the application for enrollment, with the payment of the enrollment fee, the Independent Study Program office will send the student complete instructions, a copy of the study guide, and a supply of envelopes and cover sheets. Textbooks and materials are available from the University Book Store and will be mailed from that office. The enrollment fee includes the cost of textbooks and related materials. Allow ample time for correspondence to reach its destination as it is sent regular first class mail. The student is required to furnish his own stationery for lesson preparation. Any standard stationery, 8-1/2" x 11", plain or lined, is satisfactory.

Generally speaking, each college course contains 10 lessons per credit hour. Assignments are corrected, graded, and returned within a 10-day period.

The minimum time for the completion of a 3-hour college course is 7 weeks. Students may submit four assignments per week, per course.

Airmail Service

A special charge will be made to the student who desires his lessons, course materials and textbooks handled by AIRMAIL. The fee per course for this service to any point within the United States is \$7.00 and should be added to the enrollment fee. This fee covers the mailing of returned assignments by airmail to APO and FPO addresses. To expedite completion of the course, you are advised to use the airmail service and pay the extra fee.

UNLESS THE STUDENT PAYS AIRMAIL FEE, HIS BOOKS AND MATERIALS WILL BE SENT VIA REGULAR MAIL AND AT LEAST THREE TO FOUR WEEKS SHOULD BE ALLOWED FOR DELIVERY.

Examinations

Students taking independent study courses for credit are required to take a final examination. Military personnel are required to write their finals under the supervision of their education officer. Examinations will not be authorized until all assignments for a course have been received by the Independent Study Program office.

Course Numbering System

The numbering system for independent study courses is as follows:

- 001 - 099.....Non-credit
- 100 - 199.....Open to freshmen
- 200 - 299.....Sophomore level
- 300 - 599.....Junior and senior level

A student must have a minimum of 28 semester hours to qualify for sophomore level courses; a minimum of 60 semester hours is required for upper division of junior-senior level courses.

HIGHWAY ENGINEERING

A series of independent study courses prepared by the college of Engineering for the training of employees of the Kentucky Department of Highways and others who may wish to study in the field of Highway Engineering. Each course consists of 12 assignments, each of which will require approximately 6-8 hours of preparation. Students should be high school graduates but others may enroll with special permission from the Director of the Independent Study Program. A student may enroll in any one of the 12 courses with approval of the Director, but it is recommended that those with little or no highway experience start with course I or II (depending upon their mathematics background) and continue throughout the series.

Those persons having the appropriate background and experience who plan to become a registered Highway Engineer in the State of Kentucky will find this series of courses very helpful in preparing for the registration examination as it is now constituted.

The credit for courses listed in this schedule is stated in semester hours. To receive credit, a student must satisfy the prerequisites and earn a passing grade on the final examination.

If a student desires to have an official LSU transcript sent to another institution, he should forward \$1.00 to the Office of the Registrar, Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge, Louisiana 70803. The request must state the address to which the transcript is to be sent.

Courses listed correspond to those offered in residence. The letter "c" after each course number designates "correspondence study" and has no other significance. Those courses numbered below 50 are for freshmen; courses numbered from 50-99 are for sophomores, juniors, and seniors; courses numbered from 100-199 are open to juniors, seniors, and graduate students.

The fee includes a charge of \$5.00 for registration, \$5.00 for airmail shipment of all course materials and return of graded lessons, and the cost of new textbook(s). In the event new textbooks are not available, the student will be sent used books and refunded the difference in cost. As a cooperating college of the United States Armed Forces Institute, Loyola University of Chicago will enroll in the Correspondence Study Division personnel of the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard in college correspondence courses. College courses taken through this division are granted credit by the undergraduate colleges of Loyola University under the usual conditions.

Each college course confers three semester hours of undergraduate credit and consists of forty lessons. Courses numbered 100 and 200 are lower-division courses and courses numbered 300 are upper-division courses.

The enrollment fee for each college course is seven dollars plus the cost of required texts. The fee for each lesson serviced is one dollar and fifty cents and is paid by the Government. Students must remit the cost of the required texts as listed on the attached sheets, unless they already possess the books. Texts are ordered by the Correspondence Study Division and are mailed parcel post insured; all correspondence concerning texts, should be sent to the Correspondence Study Division. If texts are to be sent overseas by air or by PAL this should be indicated on the application and the bill for air postage will be sent after the package is received.

The courses listed are offered in cooperation with the United States Armed Forces Institute and are the same courses as described in the Independent Study Bulletin. The credits for the courses are quarter credits; three quarter credits equal two semester credits. Courses count toward a degree UNLESS followed by the letter "x." Courses marked with an "x" may be applied toward an Extension Certificate at the University of Minnesota, but generally cannot be used in University of Minnesota degree programs.

Some colleges of the University of Minnesota limit the amount of credit earned through Independent Study courses; consult the Independent Study Bulletin. Students wishing to complete courses to be used in an educational program at another university or college should determine acceptance of such credit before registration. Many colleges and universities will accept credits earned through Independent Study, but the amount and application vary with each institution. At the University of Minnesota, Independent Study courses cannot be used for Master's or Doctor's degrees, except to satisfy the graduate language requirement. They may be used to complete undergraduate courses which the student may need in preparation for graduate work.

Complete course descriptions and other information appear in the Independent Study Bulletin, a copy of which will be sent on request, without charge.

Prerequisites

This refers to study that must precede the course you wish to take and is indicated on the schedule. It is essential to indicate prerequisites or equivalent courses on your application form.

Fees

Service personnel pay the enrollment fee, as listed; USAFI pays for all lesson service. The enrollment fee includes tuition and textbooks. The tuition is nonrefundable, but books that are in good condition and in current use may be returned to the Nicholson Hall Bookstore, Room 7, Nicholson Hall, University of Minnesota, for partial refund. Consult the bookstore before sending the texts.

Some texts and materials for certain courses are the same as those used in earlier courses in a sequence. These courses are identified by the symbol #. If you have completed part of the sequence at the University of Minnesota through Independent Study, consult the Department of Independent Study for fee.

Course Numbers

The University of Minnesota has instituted a four-digit course numbering system.

0-001 to 0-999	Certificate credit and non-credit courses
1-001 to 1-999	primarily for freshmen and sophomores
3-001 to 3-999	primarily for juniors and seniors
5-001 to 5-999	primarily for juniors, seniors and graduate students. Note: Independent Study courses will not be accepted for credit in the University of Minnesota Graduate School.

Quizzes, Examinations, and English Placement Theme

These must be written under supervision. An education officer or any commissioned officer of higher rank than the student is a qualified supervisor.

You must earn a passing grade on the final exam of your course in order to earn credit for the course.

Records and Tapes for Language Courses

Pronunciation records and tapes are available on an optional basis for most of the language courses. Consult the Department of Independent Study for prices. (Prices of optional records or tapes are not included in the enrollment fee.) Records will not be sent to APO-FPO addresses.

Airmail

Correspondence courses offered are the same as those scheduled on the campus of Mississippi State University. These courses are prepared and offered by members of the regular staff of the University in their respective fields of specialization.

Colleges and universities vary in policies governing correspondence study, including such areas as acceptance, applicability, and limitations. The prospective student is advised to know the policies of the institution which he plans to attend and to select courses which will fit into the institution's curriculum requirements.

Not more than 20 percent of the hour requirements in any curriculum may be earned by correspondence through Mississippi State University. No correspondence credits may be used to apply on degree requirements in engineering. Graduate work is not offered through correspondence study. The maximum period of enrollment is 24 months from the date of application.

Final examinations are required in all correspondence courses. Members of the Armed Forces may take examinations under the supervision of the education officer.

System of Course Numbers

All course numbers consist of four digits, of which the first (left) digit indicates the level of preparation required and the fourth (right) digit indicates the number of semester hours. The two middle digits are reserved for the departments to distinguish one course from another.

The correspondence courses of the University of Mississippi are prepared and taught by members of the faculty who teach the same courses in classes on the campus. Credit to one-fourth of the total number of hours required for an undergraduate degree is given for correspondence courses under the same conditions which apply to courses taken in residence. Members of the Armed Forces who expect to apply credit earned in correspondence courses toward a degree are urged to consult the bulletin or an appropriate official of the university or college from which they expect to graduate.

Enrollment in a correspondence course does not constitute admission to the University of Mississippi.

Courses are numbered according to the following system:

C001-C099	Courses not offered for credit
C101-C199	Courses primarily for freshmen
C201-C299	Courses primarily for sophomores
C301-C399	Courses primarily for juniors
C401-C599	Courses primarily for seniors

Descriptions of courses may be found in the University of Mississippi Brochure for Correspondence Instruction, which will be sent free of charge in reply to requests addressed to the Director of Correspondence Instruction, The University of Mississippi, University, Mississippi 38677. On request the Director of Correspondence Instruction will also supply the names of textbooks used in any course and send sample lesson assignments to inquirers.

A final examination is required for students who desire credit. Members of the Armed Forces will write examinations under the supervision of USAFI test control officers.

The enrollment fees listed for University of Mississippi courses include the following: registration fee, textbooks, paper for writing lessons, postage for mailing books and materials by surface mail, and postage for mailing graded lessons to APO and FPO addresses by air. Books will be mailed by the University Book Store. Course syllabi, lesson cover sheets, and paper for writing lessons will be mailed by the Department of Correspondence Instruction. Materials and books will be shipped by PAL airmail to students at APO and FPO addresses upon payment of \$2 per course in addition to the enrollment fee. The two packages should reach the student within 10 to 15 days after they are mailed at the University of Mississippi.

Correspondence study courses are offered for the benefit of the individuals who find it impossible to secure their training in residence at the University. These courses are prepared, revised at regular intervals, and corrected by regular members of the faculty who are instructing in similar courses in residence. Credit is awarded in quarter hours, 48 of which may be applied toward an undergraduate degree. Credits are transferable to other colleges and universities, subject to the regulations of those institutions.

Enrollment in a correspondence course does not constitute official admission to the University. Students in college level courses are expected to be high school graduates or to have passed the high school level General Educational Development Test. Prerequisites for all courses follow the course titles. Transcripts of previous work are not required.

To receive credit the student must take a written examination upon completion of each course. Final examinations must be written under the supervision of the local education officer. In rare instances where an education officer is unavailable, it is permissible for the examination to be administered by the Post Commander, Post Chaplain, or a commissioned officer of higher rank than the student. It is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements for his examination supervisor and request that his examination be sent to this individual upon the completion of his course. The supervisor will mail the completed examination to the Correspondence Department of the University.

Fees quoted in this publication cover registration, texts, supplies, and return of corrected lessons. If the student has the necessary textbooks, he should submit only the registration and postage fee of \$8. If airmail shipment is desired, the applicant should add \$4 to the enrollment fee. If new textbooks are not available at the time of enrollment, used books in good condition will be provided. All textbooks become the property of the student.

General Information

University credit is counted in "hours," an "hour" meaning one recitation a week for one semester, or for a total of sixteen to eighteen periods for one semester. A total of 120 hours' work is required for the degree of B. S. in Education and 120 hours for the A. B. degree, exclusive of the credit earned in the required courses in physical education.

All college credit courses given by the Independent Study Department count for regular credit in the university. Most of these courses count for credit toward the A. B. degree or the B. S. degree in Education, but may not count toward the 90 hours required for entrance to the Law School. College courses in agriculture count toward the B. S. degree in Agriculture, but not more than 30 hours correspondence work can be counted toward any undergraduate degree. In general, correspondence credits in agriculture will not count for credit toward the A. B. degree. For regulations concerning the counting of electives from the College of Arts and Science in other divisions, or from other divisions in the College of Arts and Science, see the University catalog.

The departments in the School of Business and Public Administration offer by correspondence a total of 45 hours in regularly organized courses. Four courses are offered in Accounting; three in Economics; one in Finance; one in Marketing; and five in Political Science. Correspondence courses in related subjects are offered by other departments.

In the College of Engineering the correspondence courses in Mathematics 80, 175, and 201 will be accepted in lieu of the corresponding courses in the engineering curricula. The same is true of English 1.

The following correspondence courses will be accepted to meet a part or all of the twelve hours of humanistic-social studies required in all engineering curricula: all courses in History; English 30, 40; courses 1 and 5 in Philosophy; courses 1 and 55 in Political Science; course 1 in Psychology; course 110 in Religion; course 1 in Sociology; a five-hour course in French, German, Italian, or Spanish.

The school of Journalism offers only two professional courses in journalism by correspondence; namely, History and Principles of Journalism 100, and High School Journalism 380. Most journalism work requires laboratory facilities which are available only in residence.

A maximum of six hours' credit, approved in advance by the Dean of Journalism, may be earned by correspondence and accepted as partial fulfillment of the requirement for upperclass credits in the arts and sciences after entrance to Journalism; only three hours of the total, however, may be earned following the last term in residence.

Correspondence work is as thorough as that done in residence. Each field is represented by the fundamental courses, and, in most cases, by advanced courses also under the supervision of the faculty members who conduct the regular class-work. Undergraduate credit in correspondence courses can be transferred to other state educational institutions of Missouri and to most colleges and universities in the United States. Any request for the transfer of credit to other institutions should be sent to the Director of Admissions of the University of Missouri.

Regulations for Correspondence Students

- a. Students may enroll at any time during the year.
- b. Students eliminated from the University or from any other institution are not permitted to enroll for correspondence work during the time for which they are eliminated.
- c. Extramural work cannot be counted in lieu of the requirements of two terms in residence. In the College of Agriculture, students must do at least sixty-eight hours in residence.
- d. The University of Missouri has a regulation which states that the last twenty-four hours toward a degree must be done in residence except by special permission of the Dean. It is suggested that you check with the school or college from which you expect to obtain your degree to see whether or not it has a similar regulation. If so, you should secure permission for this course to count toward the degree for which you are working.
- e. Courses offered primarily for freshmen and sophomores are numbered 1-99 and courses 1-24 are regularly open to freshmen. Courses primarily for upperclassmen are numbered 100-199. Courses offered for both undergraduates and graduates are numbered 200-399 although students may not receive graduate credit for courses 200-299 offered in their departments of specialization. No restriction is placed on graduate credit courses 300-399. Courses offered for graduate credit only are numbered 400-499.
- f. A student will not be permitted to enroll in more than two correspondence courses at one time except in very special cases.

NOTE: The fees listed in the schedule include the cost of postage for the return of graded lessons via airmail. If the applicant desires airmail shipment of the course textbooks, he should add \$5.00 to the enrollment fee. Shipment by regular surface mail requires six to eight weeks for delivery to overseas addresses.

Textbooks which are furnished to students may be either new or used books, whichever is available.

Applicability of credit toward any particular educational goal should be verified by the student before enrolling, since no part of the enrollment fee listed in this schedule can be refunded if the student withdraws after completion of the enrollment. No exceptions will be made for any reason.

Time Limitations

Correspondence work is planned so as to provide the student with an opportunity to work at his own pace. The very nature of the work, however, makes too rapid a rate inadvisable since the student cannot be expected to work ahead to best advantage until he has profited from the corrections made in previous lessons.

In no case should Lesson 2 be sent in until Lesson 1 has been graded and returned. After having passed that point, the student may submit succeeding lessons without awaiting the return of previous lessons but must not submit them more frequently than one a day. In special circumstances the above rules may be waived, but they may not be waived except with the permission of both the University Extension Division and the department involved.

Airmail

The Extension Division pays the regular surface postage on instructional materials and supplies mailed to the student to any destination. It is advisable for students outside the continental limits of the United States to consider the use of air transportation for the original shipment and for the return of graded lessons. Students will be billed for air service costs. Students with APO and FPO mail addresses may request that their original course materials and textbooks be sent via PAL airmail service for a flat fee of \$1.00. For students in the continental United States, or in an area where the domestic airmail rate applies, and for students using an APO or FPO address, an added charge of \$3.10 per credit hour, payable in advance, is made for the air return of graded lessons. Air return rates for other students will be determined on an individual basis.

Examinations

The number of examinations required in any course is determined by the college department involved. These examinations are given under such rules and regulations as the chairman of the individual department concerned may require. All lessons preceding the examinations should be mailed to the University Extension Division before the examination is requested.

For men and women in the Armed Forces, an Education Officer will serve as a proctor.

The University of Nevada, Reno, through its Independent Study Division, offers college credit and non-credit courses to those students who cannot study in residence. All courses are designed and handled by regular University faculty members who are experts in their fields. Except for those specifically designated otherwise, all courses are college level and are the same as, or comparable to, the ones offered to resident students.

Admission

There are no special admission requirements for independent study except that the student must be a high school graduate OR 19 years of age. Since the courses are on a college level, it is assumed that the applicant will have the equivalent of a high school education.

Key to Course Listings

- 100-299 - Lower-division courses. The numbers 100 to 199 are used for courses primarily for freshmen. Usually, beginning courses in all subjects are designated 100, 101, and so on. The numbers 200 to 299 are used for courses primarily for sophomores.
300-399 - Upper-division courses, primarily for juniors.
400-499 - Courses primarily for seniors.

- I - Indicates first half of a course usually covered in two semesters in a course in residence.
II - Indicates a second half of a course usually covered in two semesters in a course in residence.

Prerequisites

It is the responsibility of the student to meet all prerequisites mentioned. If there is any question concerning eligibility to enroll, the request should be made directly to the Director, Independent Study Division.

Credit

The maximum of credit hours earned through independent study for graduation at the University of Nevada is 15. Graduate credit may not be earned through Independent Study; however, credit earned through this study may be useful when additional undergraduate courses are required as a prerequisite to the graduate field.

Lesson Assignments

After the application for enrollment with the payment in full has been accepted, the Independent Study Division will send the student complete instructions, all the texts and materials needed, and the syllabus for this course. Lessons must be submitted on the special stationery which is furnished with the other materials except in the few cases where the nature of the course plan requires the answers to be written directly on the assignment sheet of special forms.

Each course contains 10 lessons per credit. Each of the student's assignments will be corrected, graded and returned. In case of military personnel having APO or FPO addresses, these will be returned via airmail at no extra charge.

To have course materials sent via airmail a deposit of \$7.50 should be added to the enrollment fee. The student will be refunded or billed for any difference to actual cost.

Examinations

Students taking independent study courses for credit are required to take progress tests or a mid-course (in most cases) and final examinations. Military personnel may take these under the supervision of his education officer. All lessons prior to the point at which the examination is to be given must have been submitted, graded and returned before the examination can be taken.



Nonresident courses are given for the benefit of those persons who cannot take advantage of the training offered in residence at the university. These courses are prepared and taught by the regular members of the university faculty who are in charge of similar courses in residence, or by qualified persons appointed by the department chairmen.

Each course represents a definite amount of work corresponding to an equivalent amount done by students in similar courses on campus. Credit for correspondence courses is listed in semester hours.

A maximum of 30 credit hours earned in nonresident instruction (1 year of undergraduate work) may be counted toward degree requirements. As a rule our students are advised to carry only one course at a time, and it is suggested that they keep in mind the course numbering system at The University of New Mexico in order that they may not enroll in a course too advanced for their educational background:

Courses numbered from 001 to 099---subcollege, no credit
Courses numbered from 100 to 199---lower division, normally open to freshmen
Courses numbered from 200 to 299---lower division, normally open to sophomores
Courses numbered from 300 to 499---upper division, normally open to juniors and seniors

The following regulations should be observed:

1. No person may enroll for university credit unless he is a high school graduate, or over 21 years of age. No transcripts are required.
2. A student who failed a course in residence or by extension at The University of New Mexico is not permitted to enroll for the same course by correspondence unless first approved by the Entrance and Credits Committee.
3. No student who is under suspension by any college or university may enroll in correspondence work until the expiration of the sentence.
4. Students will not send in more than six lessons at one time, and will wait until the previous lessons are returned before submitting more. If lessons are not returned within two weeks, an additional six lessons may be sent in.
5. To receive credit, the student must take a written examination on the completion of each course (with the exception of English 269C, The Short Story). Other examinations may be required from time to time at the instructor's direction. Education officers are qualified to administer the tests.

Included in the stated fee is a \$5 enrollment fee plus an additional amount to cover the cost of textbooks and materials. This latter figure is slightly adjusted to anticipate fluctuating book prices. It is understood that in case new textbooks are not available, used copies in good condition will be provided. A flat fee of 50¢ is also included to partially cover mailing of supplies and airmail return of lessons to oversea students. Postage charge on all lessons is paid by the students except this airmail return postage for those with APO or FPO addresses.

Note: Lesson syllabi and return envelopes are mailed first class, so they usually arrive considerably ahead of the books, which are sent by parcel post by the Associated Students Bookstore, The University of New Mexico. If a student wishes to have the texts and original course material sent via airmail, he should include an additional \$5 in his enrollment fee, and indicate this on his application.

All courses with the exception of Mathematics cNA, Mathematics cNR, and English cO are on the college level. These courses were written and are taught by members of the University faculty. Students wishing credit at the University of North Carolina must send a record of their previous work, unless it is already on file. The University accepts one year's work by correspondence for credit toward a bachelor's degree, provided the entrance requirements are met. At least the last year's work for a degree must be taken on campus. Those who have no college credit and wish to study for credit at the University of North Carolina will be advised to begin their study by taking such freshman courses as English c1, c2; Math c15. Correspondence courses are not accepted for graduate credit at the University of North Carolina.

In general, courses numbered one through twenty-nine are on the freshman level; courses in the thirties, forties, and fifties are at the sophomore level (notable exception: Business Administration c71, which is on the sophomore level); courses in the sixties, seventies, and eighties are at the junior level, while courses in the nineties are on the senior level. Courses numbered in the one hundreds are on the advanced undergraduate and graduate levels.

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill maintains a policy of equal educational opportunity.

Those interested in studying for degree credits at another college are advised before enrollment to consult the authorities of that college about the selection of courses.

If a student wishes to enroll for his own pleasure and profit, he may do so, with the understanding that a transcript of any credits earned will be sent wherever he indicates. Those who wish to study without regard to earning credit may enroll and secure the same attention as credit students.

When an application has been approved, the course material including texts will be forwarded to the student with instructions. Servicemen with APO or FPO addresses should submit an additional \$1.00 with their course fees and request that these materials be sent via PAL airmail service. Each assignment consists of assigned readings, lecture notes or discussion of the material under consideration, and questions to be answered or problems to be solved by the student and sent to Correspondence Instruction for correction. Assignments should be submitted one at a time. No more than 4 assignments in a course may be submitted within a 7-day period. The student should arrange, if possible, a definite schedule for studying. Graded assignments will be returned by airmail without extra charge to APO and FPO addresses.

In most courses, an examination will be required upon the completion of all assignments. It may be taken under the supervision of an education officer or at an accredited college or university.

Correspondence study courses at Oklahoma State University are designed for students who cannot attend resident classes. Most of the courses are written and the assignments graded by instructors who teach equivalent courses on campus.

Credit, in college courses, is listed in semester hours. The first digit of the course number indicates the year in which it is normally taken (1, freshman; 2, sophomore; etc.). The last digit indicates the credit hours and the two middle digits are departmental numbers which have no significance to the student. Most of the courses require only one examination, a final, which will be sent to the USAFI student's education officer for supervision. To receive credit a student must satisfy all prerequisites for a course, requirements for admission to the University, and making a passing grade--70 or above--on the final examination.

All correspondence work is on the undergraduate level. One-fourth of the work required for a degree may be taken through correspondence work. A student is required to take the last 18 hours of work toward a degree in residence (32 hours in the College of Business); however, exceptions are sometimes made by application to the Academic Council.

The high school course covers approximately the same material taught in high school classrooms. The one-half unit correspondence course is equivalent to one semester of attendance in a high school class. Those who plan to apply this correspondence course toward high school graduation should consult the principal of the high school to which the credit is to be transferred.

All course materials and texts will either be sent by PAL or SAM air mail to APO and FPO addresses.

All graded lessons will be returned to oversea addresses via airmail at no additional expense to the student.

Independent study may be begun at any time. No preliminary examination is required for admission. The courses given in independent study will meet the same University standards of prerequisites, sequence, etc., that are required in residence work. Information concerning admission to the University of South Carolina may be obtained by contacting the Office of Admissions and Registrations. Information concerning acceptance of credits earned at other schools or through USAFI should be requested directly from the Office of Admissions and Registrations.

Prerequisites

This refers to study which must precede the course and is indicated on the schedule. It is essential to indicate prerequisites or equivalent courses on your application form. The approval of the application may depend on this information.

Fees

The courses are offered to military personnel through a contract with the United States Armed Forces Institute. The enrollment fee stated includes a registration fee of \$8.00 in addition to the cost of textbooks. FEES ARE NOT SUBJECT TO TRANSFER OR REFUND. All textbooks are mailed by the Campus Shop, University of South Carolina.

Airmail

The original course materials and books will be sent by air parcel post for an additional fee of \$6.00. Submit this amount with your application and mark your form accordingly. Corrected assignments will be returned by airmail to students in overseas areas with APO and FPO addresses at no additional charge.

Examinations

Final examinations are required in all courses. Military personnel may take the final examination under the supervision of the Education Officer. All assignments must be submitted and should be graded and returned before the examination can be taken. The student must make a passing grade on the final examination before credit can be given for an independent study course. He is expected to maintain a passing average on all written assignments, but the assignment grades will not count toward his final grade for the course unless he passed the examination.

Credits

Correspondence courses are designed to meet the needs of the following groups:

1. Students who for any reason are unable to attend campus classes.
2. People in business or the professions who want to prepare themselves more fully for their work.
3. Adults who want to broaden their interests and improve themselves through independent study.
4. Members of the Armed Services.

A maximum of 12 semester hours of work by correspondence may apply toward a degree from the school of Humanities and Sciences and from the School of Business Administration of Southern Methodist University. Only 6 hours of correspondence work may be done in the senior year. Correspondence work is not accepted for graduate credit nor by the Southern Methodist University School of Law; however, deficiencies which have occurred in undergraduate programs often may be made up by correspondence with approval of the Dean of the Graduate School.

The four-digit number which precedes the title of each course is the course number. The first digit indicates the class level of the course as follows: 1, freshman; 2, sophomore; 3, junior; 4, senior; 5, senior or graduate. Elementary (1) and intermediate (2) indicate lower division courses; while 3, 4, 5 indicate upper division (advanced) courses.

The second digit represents the number of semester hours of credit the course carries. The semester hour is the unit of credit used in the University. Most courses carry three semester hours of credit.

The third and fourth digits make the course number a unique number within the department.

Enrollment fees from members of the Armed Services registered through USAFI include the cost of registration and textbooks. Postage charges on all lessons are paid by the student; the student includes a stamped, self-addressed envelope with each lesson for its return. A student who wishes his books airmailed should enclose with his registration check a money order of \$2.50 for this service. He will be billed for the balance if postage exceeds this amount.

Each assignment of work corresponds roughly to a week of campus work. A student may not complete a 3-hour correspondence course under 45 days, and this time is to count from the day the first lesson is received in the office of the Correspondence Division. Lessons are expected to be submitted with a reasonable degree of regularity, with a maximum of three assignments at one mailing (unless otherwise specified in the syllabus); lessons submitted in excess of this maximum will be returned. PAL and SAM services are used to keep mailing costs as low as possible.

If a student is a candidate for a degree, he must meet prerequisite requirements and should consult the institution where credit is to be applied. A supervised 3-hour final examination is required at the end of all courses if a student expects to receive credit. It is assumed that the serviceman's commanding officer or his education officer will be willing to supervise the examination without charge. In addition to the final examination, some professors give tests in the form of assignments at certain points throughout their courses. The same arrangements for proctoring these tests should be made.

A final grade will be made out by the instructor and reported to the Director of the Correspondence Division and the Registrar's Office of the University. An official transcript must be secured by the student from the Registrar's Office of the University.

General Information

The enrollment fee includes: (1) registration fee \$3.00; (2) cost of textbooks and instructional materials; (3) airmail fee of \$5.00 to send supplies, texts, and graded assignments. In case airmail costs exceed the above amount the student will be billed for the additional amount. A student within the continental United States not desiring airmail service may deduct \$5.00 from the quoted price of each course he takes.

Other Procedures

After the application has been accepted by The University of Tennessee, you will be sent the textbook(s) and other materials you will need to begin your studies. If you already have the necessary textbook(s) or other materials from a previous course, attach a note to your application describing the book(s) you have--title, author, edition, year, volume--and/or itemizing other materials you have. The University will omit these items if still usable and will refund you the cost of the items we do not send.

If your enrollment is not approved, we will notify you and refund your fees in full. If you are permitted to enroll in more than one course, you may apply for an additional course before finishing the one you are working on, so that you will not have to wait for the new course materials to arrive.

As you complete your assignments, mail them directly to The University of Tennessee. The assignments will be returned to you after they are graded by instructors.

To maintain the close working relationship with your instructor that is desirable in correspondence study, submit assignments regularly, adhering as nearly as possible to the minimum time of eight weeks for completing a course.

College Credit

You may earn up to one-fourth of the credit required for a Bachelor's degree at The University of Tennessee through correspondence study. Not more than nine of the last forty-five hours necessary for graduation may be earned in this way, and none during the last forty-five hours if you are a transfer student.

If you plan to enter the University after leaving military service, you should request a copy of The University of Tennessee General Catalog so that you can check the entrance requirements and determine which correspondence courses apply toward the degree in which you are interested. If you plan to use the credit at another university, you should write to the registrar there regarding acceptance of correspondence credit.

College credit courses offered through correspondence bear the same number as those listed in the University of Tennessee General Catalog.

College courses are designated by course number as follows:

1000-1990 Freshman courses	3000-3990 Junior courses
2000-2990 Sophomore courses	4000-4990 Senior courses

Normally, a high school graduate should not enroll beyond the freshman level, and so on; otherwise, he might select a course which is too difficult. If you are not interested in college credit, you may enroll in a non-credit course from the list.

The quarter hour is the unit of credit at The University of Tennessee. A three-quarter-hour course is equivalent to a two-semester-hour course.

The courses listed below are standard courses taken from the Texas Tech University Bulletin of courses offered to other students. Prerequisites for the courses are the same as given in the general College Bulletin, and are usually the same as are required for a similar course in any college or university.

A student desiring college credit from Texas Tech University should check with the dean of his school to be sure that the course will be allowed toward his degree. A student who failed a course in resident study at Texas Tech University may not get credit for that course through correspondence study. Students expecting to transfer credit to another college or university should have the advance approval of that school to insure acceptance by that school.

College courses use numbers with the following significance: The first digit gives the grade placement, and the second digit indicates the number of semester hours credited for the course. For example, the course English 132; the "1" indicates that this is a first year, or freshman course; the "3" indicates that 3 semester hours of credit will be earned; the "2" shows that the course should be second of a series--that English 131 should be taken before 132 is attempted.

If academic credit--college or high school--is not desired, courses may be taken without meeting course prerequisites.

Textbooks and other course materials will be sent airmail to enrolled students located in oversea areas with FPO or APO addresses at no additional cost to the student. If the original textbooks and materials are lost or destroyed, there will be an additional fee charged the student.

Note: A self-addressed envelope should accompany all lessons sent to the University.

General Information

Correspondence Study Courses offered by The University of Texas at Austin through the United States Armed Forces Institute are listed on the following pages. Each correspondence study course which carries college credit includes the amount of work required in the equivalent number of semester hours taken in residence at the University.

Each correspondence study course will follow as closely as possible the same course offered to resident students, and will count toward a bachelor's degree in the same manner as if it were taken in residence (see the general Catalog of the University), subject to the following restrictions:

1. Not more than ten percent of the semester hours required for any degree in the college of Fine Arts and not more than thirty percent of the semester hours required for any other degree in the University may be done by correspondence, and no degree will be conferred without a residence of at least two long-session semesters or an equivalent period of residence at the University.
2. At least sixty semester hours of the courses required for admission to the School of Law must be done in residence and not by correspondence. For requirements for admission to the School of Law, see the General Information bulletin.
3. Correspondence courses may be counted for degree credit only on undergraduate degrees and then only in the amount specified in each undergraduate catalog.
4. Work completed for credit through this Bureau is usually recognized wherever correspondence work is accepted for academic credit or certification. Some colleges and universities do not accept correspondence study credits, or grant only limited recognition. Students planning to take correspondence study courses for credit should obtain the approval of their respective deans before registering.

Course Numbers

The unit of measure for credit purposes is the semester hour. The number of semester hours credit is indicated by the left-hand digit of a number; e.g., the "two" in a 200 to 299 course indicates two semester hours credit, the "three" in a 300 to 399 course indicates three semester hours credit, etc. A 600 to 699 course would have an "a" or "b" as a suffix, the letter "a" indicating first semester and the "b" indicating second semester. Completion of either "a" or "b" would give three hours credit, but completion of both "a" and "b" would give six semester hours credit.

The two digits on the right of a course indicate the rank of a course; if 01 to 09, the course is freshman rank; if 10 through 19, sophomore rank; if 20 through 59, junior rank; if 60 through 79, senior rank.

Two courses in the same department whose numbers have the same two right-hand digits may not both be counted for credit unless the number is followed by a capital letter other than "Q".

Type of Instruction

Correspondence study courses are prepared for individual instruction. Students enrolling for these courses must be prepared to exert much self-discipline when working on the course. The student may never see the instructor; however, a very close relationship may be built through letters, notes, and other communication between the two. Each instructor is a regular University faculty member and is teaching or has taught the course on the campus.

With a few exceptions there are five lessons per semester hour and a final examination in each course. In general each lesson will contain (1) a definite assignment in the text and reference books; (2) directions and suggestions concerning the study of the assignment; and (3) questions or work projects to test the student's knowledge of the lesson assignment.

In preparing the lesson the student must follow the directions given. Any difficulties encountered in the lesson should be clearly stated and mailed with the lesson to this Bureau. When the instructor receives the completed lesson, he will correct the work, answer questions, and return it to the student.

Cost

The costs for the courses vary, depending upon the price of the textbook(s) and the number of credit hours of the courses. The enrollment fee given is the total cost for each course. This fee includes the tuition fee, which is set at \$3.00 per semester hour, and the cost of the textbook(s) and other materials when necessary. Anyone stationed in Texas must pay the 5% sales tax on textbook(s) and materials. Students stationed overseas with APO or FPO mail addresses wishing to have textbook(s) and supplies sent Parcel Airlift (PAL), should add an additional fee of \$1.00 to each enrollment fee given.

Time Limit

A student may proceed with the course at the rate he wishes with the following provisions:

1. He may not complete the course within less than 15 days per semester hours from the date of registration.
2. He may not submit more than three lessons within a week's time.
3. He may not allow 12 months to pass without sending in a lesson.
4. He may not continue a course after 24 months from the date of his enrollment.
5. If the student is actively enrolled at the time of separation from active duty, he may continue the course for a 12-month period provided this period does not extend beyond 24 months from the date of enrollment.

Preparing the Lesson

All lessons should be written in ink or typewritten on one side of the paper. Each page of the lesson should be numbered in the upper right-hand corner, and the papers arranged in proper order. The student's name and course number must be written on the upper left-hand corner of each page of the lesson. The cover sheet, in the back of the lesson outline, must be filled in and placed on the front of the lesson sheets. The student serial number must be placed on the cover sheet.

Integrity of Correspondence Study

Each student must do his work independently. Should it be discovered that a student is getting unfair assistance in his work, the instructor has the privilege of closing out the student's course with a grade of F. In general, the decision of the instructor that a student has made use of dishonest or unfair methods in preparing lessons or in writing his examination will be considered final. If however, the student desires to appeal the instructor's decision, he may do so through the Dean of the Division of Extension, in which case a trial will be held at Austin by the regular discipline committee of the University.

The lesson sheets and papers belong to the student, but no student is expected to display the material promiscuously or to allow other students to use the questions or lesson paper in any way. The evidence that a student has not done his own work or has allowed other students to use his completed material will be sufficient grounds to give such student an F on the course.

Mailing Lessons

Lessons are to be mailed to the Correspondence Study Section, Extension Teaching and Field Service Bureau, The University of Texas at Austin, Austin, Texas 78712. Postage on all lesson materials returned to the student is paid by the University. Airmail postage on returned lessons is provided by the University to all APO, FPO, and overseas addresses.

Grading

The standing of a student in his work is expressed by grades. There are five grades: A (excellent), B (above average), C (average), D (pass), F (failure). To pass in a course, it is necessary to secure a grade of at least D both on lessons and on the final examination considered separately.

Grades earned in correspondence study courses count at The University of Texas at Austin in computing a student's over-all grade point average on the same basis as grades earned in residence.

The symbol R is recorded for a student who has been permitted a re-examination (see "Re-examination").

The symbol Q (Quit) indicates that the student has been dropped from the course either by request or for failure to comply with the time limits. Also given on completion of non-credit courses.

A grade report will be sent to the student upon completion of each correspondence study course. Grades are reported to the Registrar of the University once each month.

Examinations

A final examination is required for any course in which a student expects to receive credit. We strongly recommend that the final examination be taken within two months from the date the last lesson is submitted. We urge that USAFI students take the final test for their course through their USAFI test control officers at their local education offices.

The examination application, enclosed in the study guide, should be mailed to this Bureau at the same time the last lesson is submitted.

Correspondence examination papers will be graded according to the standards applied in grading semester examination papers handed in by resident students. If a student opens the sealed envelope containing his examination questions, but does not take the examination, he will receive a grade of F on his course.

Re-examinations

If a student has failed to pass the final examination in a course, the instructor may report the symbol R and give him a second examination, subject to the following provisions:

1. The symbol R may be recorded only if the student has at least a C average on all work other than the final examination.
2. Upon re-examination, the minimum passing grade shall be C.
3. If the student passes the re-examination, the grade received thereon shall be substituted for the original final examination grade in determining the final course grade.
4. If the student does not make a grade of at least C on the re-examination, the final course grade shall be reported as F, and the course must be repeated if credit for the work is desired.
5. If the re-examination is not taken within the specified time limit, the symbol R shall be changed to a grade of F on the official records.
6. Subject to the preceding provisions, the use of the symbol R shall be entirely at the discretion of the instructor.

Transcripts

Transcripts of credits are issued only by the Registrar at the University. Requests for transcripts should be sent directly to the Registrar and should state clearly what courses are involved and to whom the transcripts should be sent. Requests for transcripts should be made at least two weeks before transcripts are due in the office of another institution.

Transfers

Courses may not be transferred from one student to another. A student may transfer only once from one course to another, provided that he has not submitted any lessons.

Refunds

A total refund of the enrollment fee will be made only in cases where the instructor is unavoidably prevented from continuing the course or offering the work promptly, or where some mistake in the grade of classification of the student has been made.

Utah State University of Agriculture and Applied Science welcomes students of the United States Armed Forces Institute to its Independent Study Division. Courteous, personal attention is always given to the special needs of members of the armed forces.

Utah State University accepts a total of 45 credit (quarter) hours in Independent Study toward filling the requirements for a Bachelor of Science degree. This represents one-fourth of the total credits required for graduation from this institution.

College courses are designated by course number as follows:

- 100-279 Lower Division courses (ordinarily taken either the freshman or sophomore year)
- 300-479 Upper Division courses (ordinarily taken either the junior or senior year)
- 500-599 Advanced Upper Division courses
- 600-799 Graduate courses

As a general rule, graduate level courses are not offered by Independent Study.

A student is advised to carry no more than one Independent Study course at a time, although there are exceptions to this rule. Before a student may obtain credit for a course, he must complete all assignments and take a final examination and any other examinations that may be required by the instructor.

Independent Study courses are prepared by resident faculty members who teach the same or similar courses on campus, and all assignments are corrected by faculty members. Approximately 5 lessons are required for each hour of credit. Each course represents a definite amount of work corresponding to an equivalent amount of work required of students on campus.

The course syllabus and all completed assignments are sent by air mail at the expense of the University to the students at overseas installations. Course materials for students in the United States are sent by third class mail, assignments by first class. If a student wishes to receive the textbook as quickly as possible, he may request on his application that it be sent by air mail, in which case he should include \$2.50 per course for the extra charge. Students stationed within the United States who wish to have their course syllabus and completed assignments sent by air mail should include an additional \$3.00 per course with their registration fee.

To enroll, students should consult the Education Officer on base and fill out the Institute application blank supplied by the officer. THE NAME AND LOCATION OF THE HIGH SCHOOL LAST ATTENDED AND THE STUDENT'S COMPLETE BIRTH DATE SHOULD BE INCLUDED in addition to the other information requested.

It is believed that students receive some of the finest learning experiences of their educational program through Independent Study courses.

We invite members of the Armed Forces to enroll in independent study courses at The University of Utah through USAFI, for many service men and women have found this a ready, convenient means of self-improvement, advancement in their service assignments, preparation for future employment, and earning of credits toward their college graduation.

The University of Utah measures credit in quarter hours rather than semester hours, and our courses are planned to coordinate closely with campus offerings. College courses numbered from 100 to 199 are on a freshman or sophomore level, while those numbered 300 or above carry upper division (junior or senior) credit. A maximum of 45 quarter hours of correspondence study is accepted toward graduation at The University of Utah; of the last 45 hours, a maximum of 15 hours may be earned by home study. Though our University of Utah correspondence credit is transferred direct to our registrar, it is suggested that those intending to transfer correspondence credit from one institution to another check for approval in advance with the registrar of the university from which they intend to graduate, to which they intend to transfer credits.

If the overseas applicant desires airmail shipment of the original course materials, lessons (on onion skin paper), and examinations, he should add \$5.00 to the enrollment fee. Oversea registrants requesting airmail handling of texts will be billed for the actual charge.

For a free Correspondence Study Bulletin and more specific information about your course of study, write to the Director, Correspondence Study Department, The University of Utah, Division of Continuing Education, P. O. Box 200, Salt Lake City, Utah 84110.

The Credit/No-credit (otherwise known as Pass/Fail) option is available to college independent study enrollees, who should write about the latest regulations and for applications for this option to the Correspondence Study Department.

The General Extension Service of Washington State University offers college-level correspondence courses to personnel of the Armed Forces in cooperation with the United States Armed Forces Institute. These courses, plus any new courses, are described in detail in the Correspondence Course Catalog available without charge from the General Extension Service, Washington State University, Pullman, Washington 99163.

The USAFI enrollment fee for each course includes all required books, charges for airmail shipment of course materials and return of corrected lessons by airmail. Fees are not subject to refund or transfer.

The unit of credit in correspondence courses is the semester hour (equal to about 1½ quarter hours). A maximum of 25 percent of the credits required for an undergraduate degree from Washington State University may be earned by correspondence study. Graduate credit may not be earned by correspondence study at Washington State University.

Where required, specific prerequisites for a course are listed. The following is an explanation of the course numbers which appear in this schedule:

Courses numbered 100x - 199x inclusive are normally taken by freshmen.

Courses numbered 200x - 299x inclusive are normally taken by sophomores.

Courses numbered 300x - 399x inclusive are normally taken by juniors and seniors.

Courses numbered 400x - 499x inclusive are normally taken by juniors and seniors.

The student intending to take any of these correspondence courses for college entrance or degree credit should inquire about the acceptability of the credits from the admissions officer of the school he expects to attend after discharge. He should also request assistance from that institution in planning his correspondence program.

Men and women on active duty with the Armed Forces may enroll in most of the University of Washington's correspondence courses through the United States Armed Forces Institute (USAFI).

Courses follow the University numbering system. Those numbered in the 100's and 200's are lower-division (freshman and sophomore) courses, and those numbered in the 300's and 400's are upper-division (junior and senior) level courses. The enrollment fees quoted include the basic registration fee and the cost of textbooks and supplies. Reference materials are not furnished.

All courses listed carry University credit except Mathematics N101. If you desire to use the credits for these courses at some other institution, the Registrar of that institution should be consulted as to their acceptability.

As soon as we receive your application and fee, we shall complete your registration and mail the course syllabus and materials to you. Textbooks are included in the registration fee but will be sent separately from the University Book Store. The enrollment fee for each course also includes charges for airmail shipment of course materials and textbooks and for return of corrected lessons by airmail.

A minimum of 180 quarter credits is required for graduation from the University of Washington. Of this, a maximum of 90 extension and/or correspondence study credits may be accepted. However, in no case can more than 45 quarter credits earned through extension or correspondence courses of other institutions be applied toward a University of Washington degree, including any credit allowed from Armed Forces Training Schools and for USAFI college-level courses.

Western Washington State College offers college-level Independent Study courses to enlisted and officer personnel of the Armed Forces in cooperation with the United States Armed Forces Institute (USAFI). All courses offered are described in detail in the Independent Study Bulletin. (A free copy may be obtained by writing to: The Center for Continuing Studies, Western Washington State College, Bellingham, Washington 98225.) The credits for the course are quarter rather than semester credits. Three quarter credits equal two semester credits.

The USAFI student who is taking an Independent Study course in order to have the credit transferred to a college in which he was enrolled before entering service would be wise to have the course checked with the dean of his college in order to be sure both that the course itself would be credited on his record and that the time in which he takes the course with reference to his graduation requirements is also acceptable.

Generally, a student is advised not to carry more than one Independent Study course at a time, although there are some exceptions to this rule. Before a student may obtain credit for his course, he must complete all assignments and take a final examination.

Independent Study courses are prepared by resident faculty members who teach the same or similar courses on campus, and all assignments are corrected by faculty members. Each course represents a definite amount of work corresponding to an equivalent amount of work done by students on the campus.

Normally, a few lessons will be submitted at a time and are to be returned with the instructor's comments and suggestions before others are submitted. Normally no more than one-fourth of the lessons of a course will be accepted at one time.

When it is necessary for a student to complete a course by a certain date, at least 1 month should be allowed to have all lessons and final examination submitted before completion date.

A maximum of 45 quarter hours of Independent Study is accepted toward graduation at Western Washington State College. A maximum of 12 quarter hours by Independent Study may be applied to the fifth year of study if approval is secured in advance from an official adviser. Enrollment as a correspondence student does not constitute admission to Western as a regularly-matriculated student.

The freshman courses are indicated by 100 numbers; sophomore courses, 200 numbers; junior courses, 300 numbers; and senior courses by 400 numbers. Members of the Armed Services are not required, however, to show evidence of their advancement in college to register in these courses and may, therefore, cross over lines of collegiate standing in pursuing these correspondence courses for credit. Prerequisites (if any) for courses are given in parentheses following the course title.

The University of Wyoming offers independent study courses to members of the Armed Services in cooperation with the United States Armed Forces Institute. All courses are on the college level and are prepared and taught by members of the University faculty who supervise equivalent courses on campus.

FEES

The enrollment fee listed for each course includes the assignment booklet and all textbooks and study materials required. USAFI students should not order textbooks.

CREDIT

A maximum of 24 semester hours may be earned through independent study instruction. No graduate courses are offered. The last semester, prior to the awarding of a degree, must be spent in residence on the Laramie campus unless special permission is granted by the college dean and the registrar.

PREREQUISITES

The student must satisfy the required prerequisites for each course, if such are stated, if he expects to receive college credit upon its successful completion. Occasionally circumstances warrant the waiving of a prerequisite, but special permission must be obtained for such exceptions prior to enrollment in the course. Students enrolling in a course on a non-credit basis may usually waive prerequisite requirements.

EXAMINATIONS

The student must successfully complete the examinations specified in the assignment booklet. The examinations must be taken under the supervision of the education officer.

GRADING

The common grading system (A-B-C-D-F) is used on most lessons and examinations.

TRANSCRIPTS

Upon the successful completion of a course, an official card is sent to the student certifying the grade and credit earned. An official transcript of college credits earned will be sent to any institution designated by the student upon request without charge.

POSTAGE

Assignment booklets and lessons will be returned to the student having an APO or FPO address via airmail without additional charge. Textbooks will be mailed to all APO and FPO addresses via PAL airmail service.
