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ABSTRACT

Presented in outline form Wyoming's proposed long-range plan includes the following areas of concern: (1) continuation of present services to county libraries; (2) extension of services (to those not served, or served inadequately); (3) improvement of library service (increasing ability to provide service); (4) library training and demonstration (provided to librarians, trustees, county commissioners, and general public); (5) surveys, research and evaluation; (6) strengthening the state library; (7) legislative proposals; and (8) additional plan requirements.
