ABSTRACT

RHYTHM INSTRUMENT BASIC SET, Carl Van Roy Co. This variety of rhythm instruments teaches coordination of eyes, ears, muscles and memory while it develops participation skills. A teacher's manual is available.

M-0003

SIMPLIFIED FOLK DANCE FAVORITES FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN, Educational Activities. Lili Marlene, Oh! Susanna, Virginia Reel, and La Raspa are repeated at slow, medium, and regular tempos with verbal instructions at slow and medium speeds. The verbal instructions are repeated on the record jacket.

SONGS FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS, Volumes 1 - 3, Stanley Bowmar Company. This is a collection of songs with uncomplicated rhythms and verses for the special child.

MUSIC ROUND ABOUT US, Follett. 6 records, classroom pictures, and teacher's guide. This variety of recordings provides interesting and rewarding listening experiences for children and constitutes a natural and helpful audio aid for musical learning. The pictures supplement the music, aiding visually the learning of each song.

THRESHOLD TO MUSIC, by Mary Richards, Harper and Row, Records, charts, teacher's manual and songbooks. The Kodaly method of teaching music is used in this presentation for elementary music education, providing a number of supplementary materials for the teacher to work with in developing her class program.

HEADSTART WITH MUSIC, Systems for Educ. Co. This program for music in early childhood includes two records, sixteen large easel cards with illustrations, music and words, and a resource manual.

THE MAGIC OF MUSIC, Ginn and Company. This music program, intended for normal children, begins on the kindergarten level with simple songs, and progresses to theory, composition, musical plays, and instrumental music in the four books that follow.

CLASSROOM RHYTHMS: RHYTHMS FROM THE LAND OF MAKE-BELIEVE, Classroom Materials, Inc. The purpose of this record is "to help teachers give children successful experiences with a kind of rhythmic movement which encourages use of imagination and creative powers. Through an introduc-

tion to music that suggests the people, animals, and things from the world of make-believe they so much adore, presented in a way which helps them feel the mood and pulse of the music BEFORE attempting to interpret it, children are give rhythmic experiences that have a wealth of growth potential."

MUSIC FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN, Summy-Brichard Company. Two albums and teacher's manual. The combination of guide and recordings, suggesting how various types of children might use such instruments as the drum and music box, with scores especially appropriate for each instrument, makes this a useful tool for the special education or music teacher. Descriptions of potential use by the educable and trainable mentally retarded, and the visually, aurally and orthopedically handicapped child are included.

RHYTHMS AND SONGS FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN, Classroom Materials, Inc. This record was created to help the teacher of the child with exceptional needs introduce experiences in singing and rhythms which will give the maximum amount of enjoyment and feeling of success. Methods used to teach the songs include use of clapping, tapping and playing rhythm instruments, repetition of phrases and choruses, clear instructions, low pitches, use of songs of contrasting moods, and songs which are easy to learn. Teacher's manual included.

CLASSROOM RHYTHMS: RHYTHMS OF COWBOYS AND INDIANS, Classroom Materials, Inc. Imaginative rhythms to depict Indians creeping, cowboys galloping, and moving like wheat in the wind are presented to help children achieve successful experiences with rhythmic movement. A Teacher's Manual is included and contains helpful hints on introducing the material and group follow up activities.

CLASSROOM RHYTHMS, Classroom Materials, Inc. This record was created to help children have successful experiences in rhythmic movement and encourages the children to hear and clap the basic beats before moving. Tiptoeing, running, skipping, and swaying are some of the movements presented.

SONGS FOR CLASSROOM ACTIVITY AND SINGING, Classroom Materials, Inc. Nine selections are played and sung by Mary Scott. A teacher's manual suitable for the early elementary grades is included.

COLOR ME MOVING, Michigan Recreation and Parks Association. This recording of marches, exercises and body image movements is designed primarily for the mentally and physically handicapped. Vocal instructions are included on the record, but the teacher's guide is no longer available.

BASIC SONGS FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN, Volumes 1 - 2, Concept Records. The songs on these records have been chosen specifically for their effectiveness in contributing to the building of the exceptional child's sense of personal identity, his concept of his body, and in assisting him to develop basic, meaningful concepts of his relationships to his environments. Record one emphasized songs in the following groupings: body concepts and self identity, relationships and sequences, and environmental experiences, while record two places emphasis on cleanliness and good health habits, food and its importance, and exercise and rest for the child.

PROGRAMMED ENRICHMENT SONGS FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN, Concept Records. This series functions as a music curriculum for handicapped children, and is geared to daily classroom needs through the continued development and reinforcement of every-day concepts in children who need continued training in these areas.

BASIC CONCEPTS THROUGH DANCE - POSITION IN SPACE, Educational Activities. Slow, medium, and regular tempos are used with simplified dance patterns. Verbalization of movements appears on record case and on records at slow and medium tempos. Music at regular speed has no vocal presentation and is suitable for class dance use.

BASIC CONCEPTS THROUGH DANCE - BODY IMAGE, Educational Activities. Simplified dance patterns are repeated in tempos from slow to medium to regular. Verbal instructions are given for slow and medium tempos as well as being written on the record case. Regular speed is suitable for class dance use. (No voice).

JOHNNY CAN SING TOO, Volumes 1 - 3, Classroom Materials, Inc. This series is based on the proposition that Johnny can learn to sing, given experiences related to singing that are enjoyable and meaningful. Songs were selected for these albums that were short enough to be learned easily, were understandable and related to his interests, had strong rhythmic and melodic appeal, were funny or pretty, were dialogue and finger play songs, were action songs and singing games, and were songs which he created with his peers. Special help aids are noted and follow up activities suggested.

CREATIVE MUSIC FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN, Classroom Materials, Inc. The songs on this record were selected to help the child explore and express his own feelings through music and include, "Oh! Susanna" and "America, the Beautiful."

M-0027

GRADE TEACHER FINGER PLAYS, ACTION SONGS AND CHORAL SONGS, Grade Teacher Magazine. This useful collection of music activities was developed for normal elementary school children, but is readily adaptable for the handicapped.

LET'S LISTEN, Classroom Materials, Inc. The purpose of this record is to introduce children to planned and directed listening, with suggestions of games and activities that should be part of a basic ear-training program. Sounds are presented, received and presented again to be imitated.

M-0029

FIRST LISTENING EXPERIENCES, Classroom Materials, Inc. The aim of this album is to help children hear and respond to some of the elements of music (melody, rhythm, tempo, dynamics, and pitch) that make it an expressive medium.

M-0030

ECHO SONGS AND RHYTHMS, Classroom Materials, Inc. This record has been created to give children experience in one of the most elementary types of part-singing - the echo song. Successful participation in the songs on this record will help prepare children for the more advanced types of part-singing.

EAR TRAINING FOR MIDDLE GRADES, Classroom Materials, Inc. The stated purposes of Ear Training are: to introduce the child to sounds and correct listening; to suggest games and activities that will improve and enrich the child's listening habits; and to develop the sensitivity to sound, its pitch and quality, that forms the basis of music study and appreciation. Street sounds, singing sounds, farm sounds, voice sounds, musical scale sounds are included.

"UNE CANTATE DE NOEL" and "GLORIA", Perkins School for the Blind. The upper and lower school choruses of Perkins School for the Blind perform with the Arlington Philharmonic Orchestra these traditional pieces in tribute to Anne Sullivan on the centennial of her birth.

CLASSROOM RHYTHMS: MACHINE RHYTHMS, Classroom Materials, Inc., 1967. Children have the opportunity to hear, clap, feel and move to the rhythms associated with machines.

POPULAR FOLK TUNES FOR DANCING AND RHYTHMIC MOVEMENTS, HECTOR Dance Records. The music included is effective in initiating movement, stimulating group response, developing conscious body control, and developing a conscious response to music, as tested in actual therapy situations. Suggestions for activities and movements are included.

STORY OF SILENT NIGHT, Jam Handy. This color, captioned filmstrip tells the story of how Father Josef Mohr and Franz Gruber came to write the Christmas carol, "Silent Night."

BOY SCOUT SONGBOOK, Boy Scouts of America. While the 150 songs contained in this book are intended for normal children, they are suitable for use with handicapped children. A short section on song leading is included.

CUB SCOUT SONGBOOK, Boy Scouts of America. The Cub Scout Songbook includes 110 songs suggested or submitted by leaders and scouts from all over the country. While they are intended for normal children, the songs are suitable for use with handicapped children. A song leader's guide is included.

FUNDAMENTALS OF MUSIC, Mast Development Company. This course teaches note names and their relationship to the piano keyboard (both treble and bass clef), properties of major scales, note values (including beamed, tied and dotted notes), rests and their values, time signatures, key signatures, and dynamic markings. The course can be taken by anyone who can read elementary English. It is intended for ages 10 and up, and must be used with the Mast Teaching Machine (E0025). The course is contained on 908 frames in 2 Mast cartridges.

PRIMER OF THE LANGUAGE OF MUSIC, Music Color-tone Educational Systems. This system of teaching music through color includes a cassette, a 4 note, color-coded tone bell, book and teacher's guide.

RHYTHMIC ACTIVITIES, Burgess Publishing. These three sets of file cards contain rhythmic dance activities for children from kindergarten through ninth grades. In series 1 and series 2, the accompaniment is provided as well as the name and producer of a recording of the music for each dance. Series IV (a later edition) doesn't provide accompaniment, but does provide record source. It includes dances for holidays during the school year in varying degrees of difficulty.
