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ABSTRACT

This report is based on a sample survey conducted as a supplement to the November 1969 Current Population Survey. An earlier report, based on the same survey, focused on persons of specific types of Spanish origin. The present report shows similar characteristics--mother tongue, language usually spoken in the home, educational attainment, employment status, occupation group, and income--for persons who identified themselves as of English, German, Irish, Italian, Polish, Russian, and Spanish origin. Characteristics are also shown for "all others" combined; this group consists largely of persons of other European origin (some of whom were identified as of more than one origin), Negroes, American Indians, and persons of Asian origin. The data in this report and in the report on persons of Spanish origin are the first that have been presented on the basis of questions that ask for self-identification of the person's origin or descent. Previously ethnic origin had to be inferred from information on place of birth, country of origin, mother tongue, surname, etc. The data shown in this report were derived from detailed tabulations of the replies to the questions on origin or descent, on birthplace, language, and literacy asked in the November 1969 Current Population Survey. 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

Characteristics of the Population by Ethnic Origin: November 1969

Introduction

This report is based on a sample survey conducted as a supplement to the November 1969 Current Population Survey. An earlier report, based on the same survey, focused on persons of specific types of Spanish origin. (See "Persons of Spanish Origin in the United States: November 1969," Series P-20, No. 213.) The present report shows similar characteristics (mother tongue, language usually spoken in the home, educational attainment, employment status, occupation group, and income) for persons who identified themselves as of English, German, Irish, Italian, Polish, Russian, and Spanish origin. Characteristics are also shown for "all others" combined; this group consists largely of persons of other European origin (some of whom were identified as of more than one origin), Negroes, American Indians, and persons of Asian origin.

The data in this report and in the report on persons of Spanish origin are the first that have been presented on the basis of questions that ask for self-identification of the person's origin or descent. Previously ethnic origin had to be inferred from information on place of birth, country of origin, mother tongue, surname, etc.

The following are some of the highlights of this survey:

About 75 million of the approximately 200 million persons in the United States reported that they were of one of the seven specific origin categories covered in this report. Approximately 20.0 million persons reported German origin; 19.1 million, English; 13.3 million, Irish; 9.2 million, Spanish; 7.2 million, Italian; 4.0 million, Polish; and 2.2 million, Russian.

About 11 million persons living in the United States at the time of the survey were foreign born. Two-thirds of them reported English as the language usually spoken in their homes. They were 23 years older, on the average, than the native population.

Persons of Spanish origin were less likely than were persons of other specific origin groups to report English as their mother tongue, or as their current language or to be

able to read and write English. They were also less likely to hold high-paying jobs. They were more likely to be young and to marry persons of the same origin.

Among persons of Russian origin, high percentages had some college education, were employed in high-paying occupations, and had high family incomes. They were, as a group, older than persons of other origin categories.

Notes

The data shown in this report were derived from detailed tabulations of the replies to the questions on origin or descent, on birthplace, language, and literacy asked in the November 1969 Current Population Survey. See page 28 for the wording of the questions.

The answers to the questions on ethnic origin produce results somewhat different from results based on inferred ethnic identification using such characteristics as place of birth, country of origin, language spoken in the home, or surname. Some respondents having a diverse ethnic background or having several generations of residence in the United States may have reported the ethnic association they felt most strongly and may not have had precise alternatives from which to choose.

The category "native" includes persons born in the United States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, outlying areas of the United States, and persons for whom country of birth was not reported. As the data were tabulated for this report, "native" excludes the small number of persons born abroad of American parents.

"Mother tongue" is the language reported as spoken in the person's home when he was a child. "Current language" is the language reported as the one usually spoken in the home at the time of the survey.

The numbers in this report are in thousands. The figures may differ slightly from table to table since individual numbers were rounded to the nearest thousand without being adjusted to group totals. Similarly, individual percentages were rounded and parts may not always add to 100 percent.

I TYPE OF ORIGIN

Among the seven specific origin groups identified in the survey, the most numerous were the English and German. Each of these two groups accounted for approximately one-tenth of the total population. Groups of intermediate frequency included the Irish, Spanish, and Italian.

Persons of Spanish origin were youngest with a median age of about 20 years, whereas persons of Russian origin were oldest with a median age of 46 years.

Among origin groups, the Russians had the lowest proportion (13 percent) of persons under 14 years of age and the highest proportion (18 percent) of persons 65 years and over. The Spanish origin group had the reverse relationship with 37 percent of its population under 14 and only about 3 percent 65 years old and over. Only about one in six Spanish origin persons was 45 years old and over, whereas approximately one-half the persons of Russian origin were in this category. The Spanish origin group had the smallest proportion of persons who were 14 through 64 years old, 59 percent.

Persons of Spanish origin reported English as their mother tongue and as their current language less frequently than did persons of other origin groups identified. About 29 percent of the persons of Spanish origin reported English as their mother tongue and about 50 percent reported it as their current language. A larger proportion of persons of German origin reported English mother tongue than any other group listed besides those of English and Irish origin.

In about three out of every four of the husband-wife households with a head of Spanish origin, the wife of the head was also of Spanish origin. At the other end of the scale, only about one-third of the heads of German or Irish origin were married to women whose origin was the same as theirs.

There were 60.6 million persons under 18 years of age who were related to the household head and were living in households in which both the head and wife were present. (About 95 percent of these were children living with both parents.) Where either the head or wife (or both) was of Spanish origin, two-thirds of the children were in households where both the head and the wife were of Spanish origin. This was twice as large as the corresponding proportion for any other specific origin group identified in this survey.

As expected, the native population was considerably younger than the foreign-born population--on the average, 23 years younger. About 85 percent of the native population reported English mother tongue; the median age of these persons was relatively young, 23 years. Three percent of the native population reported Spanish mother tongue, and their median age was also 23 years. Another 3 percent of the native population reported German mother tongue, but their median age was much higher, 52 years.

Among the foreign born, 26 percent reported English and 17 percent reported Spanish mother tongue. Again, these two groups were among the youngest.

Some 94 percent of the population reported English as the language usually spoken in their home. Within each of the origin groups identified, the great majority reported English, except for persons of Spanish origin, only about one-half of whom reported English as their current language.

About 96 percent of the native and 67 percent of the foreign-born population reported English as their current language. Native persons of French mother tongue reported English as their current language to a somewhat lesser degree than did the general population. Among native persons reporting Spanish mother tongue, the deviation from the average was quite marked, as only about 36 percent reported English as their current language.

The proportion of persons who reported English as their current language was particularly high for foreign-born persons of German and Yiddish (and, of course, English) mother tongue. Only about one in every five persons of Spanish mother tongue reported English as their current language.

Approximately 11 million persons were foreign born. Germany, Italy, Mexico, and the United Kingdom were the major contributing countries.

Males originating from most countries were of roughly the same number and average age as their female compatriots, but there was a range of differences in age from one country to the other.

Of the persons with foreign-born fathers, 14 million had fathers who were born in Germany, Italy, Mexico, Poland, and the United Kingdom. About a million persons reported that they were born abroad of fathers who were born in the United States.

The distribution by place of birth of the mother born outside the United States is very similar to the distribution by place of birth of the father (shown in table 10). However, about 3 million more persons reported that their mother was born here in the United States than reported that their father was born here.

About 95 percent of all persons 10 years old and over reported the ability to read and write English. Each of the origin groups approached or exceeded this proportion except the Spanish, for whom approximately four-fifths reported the ability to read and write English.

About one in every five persons 25 years old and over had completed at least one year of college. That the Nation is becoming better educated is evident from the finding that while about 19 percent of the population 35 years old and over had completed some college, about 30 percent of young adults 25 to 34 years of age had this much education.

Every origin group showed improvement in the percentage of persons completing at least one year of college in the age group 25 to 34 years compared to the age group 35 years and over. Persons of Russian origin reported the highest percentage of persons completing some college at both age levels, about 70 percent for persons 25 to 34 years and about 30 percent for persons 35 years and over.

The median family income reported for the year before the survey was about \$7,900. Families headed by persons of Russian origin had the highest median income, about \$11,600 or about half again as high as the median for all families. At the same time, those headed by persons of Spanish origin had the lowest, with a median income of approximately \$5,600 or 71 percent of the median for all families. (Data from another survey made in March 1970 by the Bureau of the Census show that the median family income of Negroes in 1969 was 64 percent of the median for all families.)

About 33 percent of the families headed by a person of Russian origin had an income of \$15,000 or more compared to only about 4 percent of families headed by a person of Spanish origin.

About 4 out of 5 males 16 years of age and over were in the civilian labor force, and this proportion did not vary widely from one origin group to another. The overall unemployment rate for males was 2.8 percent, but that for males of Spanish origin was above this level, with a rate of 5.1 percent.

A greater proportion of Russian origin males and a smaller proportion of Spanish origin males were in the better-paying professional and managerial positions than was true of the total male population. On the other hand, males of Russian origin were less likely, and those of Spanish origin were more likely, to be employed as lower-paid laborers.

Less than half of all females 16 years old and over were in the civilian labor force. The unemployment rate for these women was about 4.8 percent. Females of Spanish origin experienced greater unemployment with a rate of 7.5 percent.

Females of Russian origin were employed as professional, technical, and kindred workers to a greater extent, and those of Italian and Spanish origin to a lesser degree, than were females in the total population. Conversely, females of Russian origin were underrepresented as operatives whereas those of Italian and Spanish origin were overrepresented.

Source and Reliability of the Estimates

Source of data. The estimates are based on data obtained in November of 1969 in the Current Population Survey of the Bureau of the Census. The sample is spread over 449 areas comprising 863 counties and independent cities with coverage in each of the 50 States and the District of Columbia. Approximately 50,000 occupied households are eligible for interview each month. Of this number, 2,250 occupied units, on the average, are visited but interviews are not obtained because the occupants are not found at home after repeated calls or are unavailable for some other reason. In addition to the 50,000, there are also about 8,500 sample units in an average month which are visited but are found to be vacant or otherwise not to be interviewed.

The estimating procedure used in this survey involved the inflation of the weighted sample results to independent estimates of the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States by age, race, and sex. These independent estimates were based on statistics from the 1960 Census of Population; statistics of births, deaths, immigration, and emigration; and statistics on the strength of the Armed Forces.

Reliability of the estimates. Since the estimates are based on a sample, they may differ somewhat from figures obtained if a complete census had been taken using the same schedules, instructions, and enumerators. As in any survey work, the results are subject to errors of response and of reporting as well as being subject to sampling variability. (See further, "Notes," page 1.)

The standard error is primarily a measure of sampling variability, that is, of the variations that occur by chance because a sample rather than the whole of the population is surveyed. As calculated for this report, the standard error also partially measures the effect of response and enumeration errors but does not measure any systematic biases in the data. The chances are about 68 out of 100 that an estimate from the sample would differ from a complete census figure by less than the standard error. The chances are about 95 out of 100 that the difference would be less than twice the standard error.

The figures presented in tables A through F are approximations to the standard errors of various estimates shown in this report. In order to derive standard errors that would be applicable to a wide variety of items and could be prepared at a moderate cost, a number of approximations were required. As a result the tables of standard errors provide an indication of the order of magnitude of the standard

errors rather than the precise standard error for any specific item. Tables A, B, and C contain the standard errors of estimated level for various types of items.

relatively more reliable than the corresponding estimates of the numerators of the percentages, particularly if the percentages are 50 percent or more. Tables D, E, and F contain the standard errors of estimated percentages.

Illustration of the use of table of standard errors. Table 9 of this report shows that 1,006,000 people were born in the United Kingdom. Table C shows the standard error on an estimate of this size to be approximately 67,600. The chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimate would have been a figure differing from a complete census by less than 67,600. The chances are 95 out of 100 that the

estimate would have been a figure differing from a complete census by less than 135,200 (twice the standard error).

Of these 1,006,000, 560,000, or 55.7 percent are women. Table F shows the standard error of 55.7 percent on a base of 1,006,000 to be approximately 3.3 percent. Consequently, chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimated 55.7 percent would be within 3.3 percentage points of a complete census figure, and chances are 95 out of 100 that the estimate would be within 6.6 percentage points of a census figure; i.e., this 95 percent confidence interval would be from 49.1 to 62.3 percent.
