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ABSTRACT

Student enrollment in New England institutions of higher education for the fall 1972 are reported. Following introductory material, New England enrollment, first time students, residence data, institutional data, and U.S. enrollment are discussed. Appendices include statistical enrollment data for Vermont, New Hampshire, Maine, Rhode Island, Connecticut and Massachusetts and enrollment statistics by institutional control and level. (MJM)

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

## HIGHLIGHTS

\* New England's degree granting institutions of higher education enrolled 597,208 students in Fall 1972, a 3.16% increase over the 578,905 enrolled in Fall 1971. Enrollment in the public sector increased 5.04% while that in the private increased 1.31%. These percent gains are all above the national gains between 1971 and 1972.

\* For the first time in the region's history, enrollment in the public sector (302,007 or 50.6%) exceeded that in the private sector (295,201 or 49.4%).

\* Overall, two-year colleges showed the greatest enrollment increase between Fall 1971 and 1972 (7.19%), four-year colleges the second largest (2.86%) and universities the least (1.85%).

\* While public institutions at all levels continued to show gains (2-year, 9.50%; universities, 4.28%; 4-year, 2.73%), enrollment decreased in both private two-year colleges (-1.60%) and universities (-0.43%) with only the private four-year colleges showing a gain (2.94%).

\* Analyses by level of student were again (as in Fall 1971) hampered by what appeared to be realignments in the categorization of these data for reporting to USOE.

\* Massachusetts continued to enroll a majority (53.7%) of the students attending a college or university in New England, together, Massachusetts and Connecticut for fully three-fourths of the region's student population.

\* Massachusetts showed the greatest gain (8,815) in enrollment in the sector in the region, but Maine showed the greatest percentage increase (7.36%). In the private sector, Vermont showed the greatest percentage (13.80%) and numerical (11,776) gain. Overall, Vermont showed the greatest percent gain (7.15%) while Massachusetts showed the greatest numerical gain (9,776).

\* Based upon data provided by institutions enrolling 95 percent of the region's first-time students, there were 131,657 first-time students in New England in Fall 1972. Of these, 118,826 enrolled for degree-credit and 12,826 non-degree students.

\* Fall 1971 and 1972 first-time degree enrollment data were available for 19 institutions which together accounted for 60 percent of the degree-credit enrollment in the region in 1972. Based upon this sample, first-time degree-credit enrollment dropped 1.19 percent between 1971 and 1972 while total degree enrollment increased 3.11% and undergraduate enrollment increased 4.28%. For degree students at public institutions only, first-time enrollment decreased by 3.79% while

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\* Massachusetts continued to enroll the majority (53.7%) of the students attending a college or university in New England. Together, Massachusetts and Connecticut accounted for fully three-fourths of the region's student population.

\* Massachusetts showed the greatest numerical gain (8,815) in enrollment in the public sector in the region, but Maine showed the greatest percentage increase (7.36%). In the private sector, Vermont showed the greatest percentage (13.80%) and numerical (1,410) gain. Overall, Vermont showed the greatest percent gain (7.15%) while Massachusetts showed the greatest numerical gain (9,776).

\* Based upon data provided by institutions enrolling 95 percent of the region's students, there were 131,651 first-time students in New England in Fall 1972. Of these, 118,825 were enrolled for degree-credit and 12,826 were non-degree students.

\* Fall 1971 and 1972 first-time degree-credit enrollment data were available for 190 institutions which together accounted for 89% of the degree-credit enrollment in the region in 1972. Based upon this sample, first-time degree-credit enrollment dropped 1.19% between 1971 and 1972 while total degree-credit enrollment increased 3.11% and undergraduate enrollment increased 4.28%. For degree-credit students at public institutions only, first-time enrollment decreased by 3.79% while the

total increased 6.08% and undergraduate increased 10.26%. For degree-credit students at private institutions, however, first-time enrollment increased by 2.03% while the total remained almost constant (+0.08%) and undergraduate decreased (-1.66%).

\* Residence data were provided for 86.5% of the undergraduate students enrolled in New England's institutions of higher education in Fall 1972. In the public sector, 90.0% of these undergraduates were residents of the state in which the institution is located; in the private sector this figure was 46.6%.

\* Residence data were also provided 80% of the region's first-professional students (100% of those attending public institutions and 77% of those attending private institutions). Eighty-three percent of the first-professional students attending public institutions were from in-state; 45.9% of those attending private institutions were from in-state.

\* And residence data were provided 81.1% of the graduate students in the region. In the public sector, 68.9% of the graduate students were from in-state; in the private sector, this figure was 58.7%.

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## INTRODUCTION

The New England Board of Higher Education has been providing data on college and university enrollments in the region since 1957 as part of its now annual publication, *FACTS About New England Colleges, Universities, and Institutes*. In order to provide more up-to-date and more detailed information on the size of the higher educational enterprise in the region, however, NEBHE last year initiated an additional annual research report, *Student Enrollment in New England Institutions of Higher Education*. This report is the second in that series.

In order to ensure comparability with national figures and to avoid the needless duplication of questionnaires distributed to the region's colleges and universities, this report is based upon enrollment data provided routinely to the U.S. Office of Education as part of the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS). In compiling this annual enrollment report, copies of the HEGIS form "Opening Fall Enrollment in Higher Education" are obtained for each institution in New England. When collected by USOE, as this year, copies of the HEGIS form "Residence and Migration of College Students" are also obtained.

Because the Connecticut Commission on Higher Education, the Massachusetts Board of Higher Education, and the New Hampshire Coordinating Board of Advanced

Education and Accreditation provide copies of these and all HEGIS forms to the institutions in their respective states, these agencies have generously provided NEBHE with the appropriate data as they receive them. (This report is the duplication of requests for data from institutions in these states.)

In the State of Maine, the State Office provides the appropriate data to the constituent units of the public Maine system, and the remaining private institutions are contacted individually by NEBHE for copies of data. In Rhode Island and Vermont, NEBHE contacts every institution directly to obtain the necessary data.

This year aggregate data are available not only regarding enrollment figures, but also regarding the level of student enrollment, by level of student enrollment, but also regarding first-time students enrolled with comparisons with Fall 1968 enrollment figures. ### INTRODUCTION

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In the State of Maine, the Chancellor's Office provides the appropriate forms for the constituent units of the University of Maine system, and the remaining public and private institutions are contacted individually by NEBHE for copies of these forms. In Rhode Island and Vermont, NEBHE also contacts every institution directly in order to obtain the necessary data.

This year aggregate data are presented not only regarding enrollment by level of institution, by level of student and by residence of students, but also regarding the number of first-time students enrolled in the region -- with comparisons with Fall 1971 data, as available. In addition, these data are also presented by institution (Appendix A) in order that this report might be most useful to higher educational specialists in the region.

Because of the number of requests for information concerning enrollment in the Boston-area, NEBHE is this year instituting a brief supplementary report, *Student Enrollment in Institutions of Higher Education in the Boston SMSA*, which will also be prepared

annually henceforth. This new report is being mailed automatically to all institutions in the Boston Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area and is available on request to other interested parties.

The New England Board of Higher Education extends its thanks to all of those institutions and agencies without whose cooperation this report would not be possible.

## DEFINITIONS

USOE definitions are employed throughout this report. These definitions are:

### LEVEL OF INSTITUTION

*2-Year College.* Offering work extending at least 2 but less than 4 years beyond high school.

*4-Year College.* Offering work extending at least 4 years beyond high school. They comprise all institutions that grant bachelor's or higher degrees or some recognition equivalent to such degrees. They may also offer organized occupational programs of less than 4 years.

*Universities.* Four-year colleges that give considerable stress to graduate instruction and have at least two professional schools that are not exclusively technological.

### STUDENT CLASSIFICATIONS

*Degree-Credit Students.* Students are enrolled for work which is wholly or chiefly creditable toward a bachelor's or higher degree. They include the following five levels of students.

*Undergraduates.* Students taking work creditable toward a bachelor's degree and who have not yet attained a bachelor's degree.

*First-Professional Students.* Students enrolled in a professional school program which requires at least two more academic years of college work for entrance and a total of at least 6 years for a degree. Students in programs requiring only 4 or 5 years beyond high school should be reported as undergraduates. All students enrolled in work leading toward a master's degree are to be reported as Graduate Students.

*Graduate Students.* Students who have completed the bachelor's or first-professional degree, or equivalent, and are taking work at the graduate level.

 degree are to be reported as *Graduate*.

*Graduate Students.* Students who hold  
 the bachelor's or first-professional  
 degree, or equivalent, and are taking  
 work at the graduate level.

*Extension Students.* Extension students are not defined uniformly in all institutions. Most commonly it means face-to-face instruction in centers or places away from the main campus or branch campuses. It may also include on-campus instruction offered by an extension division. Extension centers differ from branch campuses in that students are not counted as resident students. Note that only degree-credit extension enrollment is requested. Enrollment in interest courses, short courses, and other community-type programs not creditable toward such an award are to be excluded even though they may be offered under the auspices of the extension division.

*Unclassified Students.* Not candidates for a degree, diploma, or certificate, or equivalent award, although taking courses in regular classes with other students; this category also includes students who cannot be classified by academic level, as well as students with the bachelor's degree who are taking undergraduate courses (e.g., for teacher certification).

*Non-Bachelor's-Degree- Credit Students in Organized Occupational Programs of Less Than Four Years, not Chiefly Creditable Toward a Bachelor's Degree.* Students in vocational and technical educational programs which are normally terminal and result in a certificate, diploma, or similar award. NOTE: These students are simply called *Non-Degree Students* in this report to distinguish them from *Degree-Credit Students*.

*First-Time Degree-Credit* Degree-credit students who enter an institution of higher education the first time, and who have not previously attended any other institution of higher education. Ex

*First-Time Non-Degree* Non-degree students who are entering an institution of higher education the first time, and who have not previously attended any other institution of higher education. Exclude transfers.

## RESIDENCE

As determined by the institution. *In-state* students are those whose "home state" is the one in which the institution is located. *Out-of-state* students are those whose "home state" is in the United States and not the institution's state. *Foreign Students* are those whose "home state" is outside the United States and its territories.

*Students.* Extension students are defined uniformly in all institutions. Most commonly it means face-to-face instruction in centers or places other than the main campus or branch campus. It may also include on-campus instruction offered by an extension center. Extension centers are branch campuses in that they are not counted as resident centers. Note that only degree-seeking enrollment is requested. Non-degree interest courses, short-term and other community-type courses are not creditable toward such enrollment and to be excluded even though they are offered under the auspices of the extension division.

*Students.* Not candidates for a diploma, or certificate, or other award, although taking regular classes with other students. This category also includes students who cannot be classified by any other category, as well as students who have earned a Bachelor's degree who are taking graduate courses (e.g., certificate programs).

*Non-Degree-Credit Students in Occupational Programs of Four Years, not Chiefly Directed Toward a Bachelor's Degree.* Vocational and technical education programs which are normally completed in four years and result in a certificate, diploma, or similar award. NOTE: These students are simply called *Non-Degree* students in this report to distinguish them from *Degree-Credit Students*.

#### *First-Time Degree-Credit Students.*

Degree-credit students who are entering an institution of higher education for the first time, and who have not previously attended any other institution of higher education. Exclude transfers.

*First-Time Non-Degree Students.* Non-degree students who are entering an institution of higher education for the first time, and who have not previously attended any other institution of higher education. Exclude transfers.

## RESIDENCE

As determined by the institution. *In-state* students are those whose "home state" is the one in which the institution is located. *Out-of-state* students are those whose "home state" is elsewhere in the United States and its territories. *Foreign Students* are those whose "home state" is outside the United States and its territories.

## NEW ENGLAND ENROLLMENT

Opening fall enrollment data for the academic year 1972-73 were obtained for 245 of the 250 degree-granting institutions of higher education in New England. A breakdown of these 245 institutions, by state and level of institution, is presented in Table 1.

Enrollment in New England's colleges, universities and institutes continued to increase in Fall 1972, with a new high point being reached -- 597,208, a 3.16% (18,303) increase over Fall 1971. Enrollment in the public sector increased 5.04% (14,477) between Fall 1971 and Fall 1972, compared to a 1.31% (3,826) increase in the private sector.

(Based upon preliminary data released by the U.S. Office of Education, enrollment growth in New England was, therefore, ahead of that for the nation. Between 1971 and 1972, enrollment at all institutions in the U.S. increased by only 2.0% compared to 3.16% in New England. For public institutions, the U.S. increase was 2.67% compared to 5.04% in this region; for private institutions, the U.S. total actually decreased 0.12% while the New England total increased 1.31%.\*)

As predicted in last year's New enrollment report, total enrollment in the public sector (302,077) surpassed that of the private sector (295,201) in Fall 1972 for the first time in the region's history. Thus public institutions accounted for 50.6% of the region's students in Fall 1972, compared, for example, to 49.7% in Fall 1971 and 47.8% in 1970.

## NEW ENGLAND ENROLLMENT

Fall enrollment data for the year 1972-73 were obtained for 150 degree-granting institutions in New England. Of these 245 institutions, by level of institution, is presented

### BY LEVEL OF INSTITUTION

The two-year colleges in New England showed the greatest increase in enrollment between 1971 and 1972 (7.19%), as they did in the nation. While the public two-year colleges in the region increased their enrollment by 9.50%, however, the private two-year college enrollment dropped 1.60%.

Enrollment in the region's four-year colleges showed the next highest increase at 2.60%, with the private sector showing a slightly greater increase than the public (2.94% and 2.73% respectively).

And while enrollment at the region's universities increased 1.85%, the number of students attending public universities increased by 4.28% while the number attending private universities decreased by 0.43%.

Thus among public sector institutions, universities showed the second highest rate of increase, behind the two-year but ahead of the four-year colleges. In the private sector, however, only the four-year colleges showed overall enrollment growth, while both two-year colleges and universities showed a slight drop in enrollments.

### BY LEVEL OF STUDENTS

If degree-credit and non-degree students are considered separately, it is seen that while the enrollment of the former increased 3.42% from 1971 to 1972 the latter decreased 1.54%. By control of institution, private institutions showed increases in both the number of degree-credit (1.10%) and non-degree (12.12%) students while the public institutions

showed an increase among degree-credit (5.94%) but a decrease among non-degree (-4.58%) students.

in the public institutions where extension enrollments dropped 40.61% (19,744) while unclassified and graduate increased by 84.74% (8,179) and 47.80% (9,226) respectively. Similar shifts, but of lesser magnitude, occurred in the private sector, except that graduate enrollment dropped slightly (-0.71% or 329).

Undoubtedly some of these changes are the result of natural expansion and contraction at these student levels. Much, however, again appear to be the result of shifts in the classification of those students being classified as extension students.

Undergraduate enrollment increased in both public (9.70%) and private (10.12%) institutions, with an increase of 4.92% in New England institutions. Similar gains in professional enrollment in New England increased 29.25% with both sectors showing gains, although the private institutions in particular show a sizeable increase (15.11% compared to 10.12%).

#### BY STATE

As the cover shows, Massachusetts continued to enroll the majority of students (53.7%). (Massachusetts is the only state in the region -- indeed the only one in the nation -- where enrollment in the public sector still exceeds that in the private sector. The percent of total enrollment in the public sector is gradually declining, however, standing at 58.13% in 1972 compared to 60.13% in 1971.)

Vermont showed the greatest increase in enrollment between 1971 and 1972 (7.15%) with Maine second (6.53%). The largest numerical gain was, however, in Massachusetts (9,776 or 3.14%).

In the public sector, Maine showed the greatest percent increase (7.36%) with Massachusetts close behind (7.02%). In the private sector, Massachusetts showed the greatest numerical gain (11,603 or 3.14%) in the public sector (8,815).

## NEW ENGLAND FIRST-TIME ENROLLMENT

A total of 218 institutions provided information regarding the number of first-time degree-credit students enrolled in Fall 1972. These 218 reporting institutions together account for 95% (539,997) of the 567,095 degree-credit students in New England in 1972. They reported a total of 118,825 first-time degree-credit students. (See Table 12)

In addition, another 12,826 first-time non-degree students were reported by 46 institutions. Together these institutions account for 84% of the total non-degree enrollment in the region. (See Table 13.)

Thus, 131,651 first-time students were reported for New England for Fall 1972 by institutions which together account for 565,236 or 94.6% of the region's enrollment.

Table 14 presents the total, undergraduate and first-time degree-credit enrollment for Fall 1971 and Fall 1972 for those 190 institutions providing first-time enrollment both those years. These 190 institutions

account for 89 percent of the credit enrollment in the region.

First-time degree-credit enrollment in this sample of institutions dropped 3.79% between 1971 and 1972 at the same time that the total degree-credit enrollment in the region increased 4.28% and that undergraduate enrollment increased 2.03%.

Among the 69 public institutions which provided the necessary data, first-time undergraduate enrollment decreased 3.79% while first-time degree-credit enrollment increased 6.03% and first-time graduate enrollment increased 2.03%. Among the 121 private institutions in the sample, first-time degree-credit enrollment increased 2.03% while total degree-credit enrollment remained almost constant (0.08%) and first-time graduate enrollment decreased 2.03%.

Since the percent variation in first-time degree-credit and undergraduate enrollment in this sample of institutions do not differ exactly with those for all New England institutions (see previous section), the data on first-time enrollment cannot be generalized to the entire region. More data are needed on which institutions did not provide first-time enrollment data. (See Appendix A.)

First-time degree-credit enrollment at this sample of institutions dropped 1.19% between 1971 and 1972 at the same time that total degree-credit enrollment increased 3.11% and that undergraduate enrollment increased 4.28%.

Among the 69 public institutions supplying the necessary data, first-time degree-credit enrollment decreased 3.79% while total degree-credit enrollment increased 6.08% and undergraduate enrollment increased 10.26%. At the 121 private institutions included, first-time degree-credit enrollment increased by 2.03% while total degree-credit enrollment remained almost constant (0.08%) and undergraduate enrollment decreased 1.66%.

Since the percent variations in total degree-credit and undergraduate enrollments for this sample of institutions do not correspond exactly with those for all New England institutions (see previous section), these shifts in first-time enrollment cannot be generalized to the entire region. More detailed information on which institutions did and did not provide first-time enrollment data appears in Appendix A.

## RESIDENCE OF STUDENTS ATTENDING COLLEGE IN NEW ENGLAND

Two hundred and twenty-nine institutions provided data on the "home state" or residence of their students in Fall 1972. These data are presented in aggregate form in Table 15 and by institution (for undergraduates only) in Appendix A.

Residence data were provided for 353,530 or 86.51% of all (408,655, see Table 7) undergraduates reported in the region. For public institutions only, residence data were provided for 184,475 (91.49%) of the undergraduates reported (201,628) for Fall 1972. For private institutions, residence data were provided for 169,055 (81.65%) of the undergraduates reported (207,027). (See Table 15. Appendix A also presents a more detailed look at which institutions did and did not provide undergraduate residence data.)

Based upon this sample, 90.0% of the undergraduates attending college in the state in which the institution in Fall 1972. In the private sector, 46.6% of the undergraduates were residents of the institutions in which they were attending. These percents vary greatly by institution as shown in the above table.

Residence data were provided for 11,603 or 79.96% of all (13,061) first-professional students reported. For public institutions, residence data were provided for all first-professionals reported (1,458). For private institutions, residence data were provided for 10,145 of the first-professionals reported (11,603).
