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
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ABSTRACT

This research memo provides a brief report of the status of women faculty and administrators in higher education based on three types of information collected in the NEA research biennial study of salaries in higher education in 1971-72. In addition to summarizing faculty salaries by sex, this memo reports the tenure status of faculty by sex and reviews the number of persons and their salaries by sex in administrative positions in higher education.

## THE STATUS OF WOMEN FACULTY AND ADMINISTRATORS IN HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS, 1971-72

THIS RESEARCH MEMO provides a brief report of the status of women faculty and administrators in higher education based on three types of information collected in the NEA Research biennial study of salaries in higher education in 1971-72. In addition to summarizing faculty salaries by sex, this Memo reports the tenure status of faculty by sex and reviews the number of persons and their salaries by sex in administrative positions in higher education. Information about the coverage and format of the biennial study, along with detailed tables of faculty salary information by sex, is given in the report of the 1971-72 study.<sup>1</sup>

### Faculty Salaries by Sex

**4-Year Institutions**—Salary information by sex was reported for 211,253 faculty, 96.7 percent of all for whom salary information was reported. NEA Research Report 1972-R5 contains summary tables which show the distribution of salaries of men and women faculty separately. The median faculty salaries of men and women faculty for all ranks combined, and the percent of salaried faculty who are women, in 4-year institutions grouped by type and region are at top right.

The proportions of faculty who are women are greatest in the medium and small nonpublic colleges, the small public universities, and the public colleges. Also, women represent a higher proportion of faculty in the Midwest and Southeast than in other regions.

For all ranks combined, the median salary of women is 82.5 percent of the median salary of men

faculty. Twelve years earlier, in 1959-60, it was 84.9 percent and six years later, 83.4 percent. The data for 1971-72 by rank are as follows:

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The largest proportions of faculty who are women occur in groupings of institutions and classifications of faculty in which salaries of all faculty are lowest. The existence of both of these situations contributing to the differences in median salaries of men and women faculty is shown in a comparison between the proportions of faculty in universities and in colleges at each rank who are women, as follows:

Information from earlier studies in the biennial series shows that during the preceding 12 years in the institutions reporting salaries by sex, the over-all proportion of faculty who are women has not changed significantly. However, the proportion of faculty who are women has increased by 10 percentage points at the instructor rank while it has decreased at each of the higher ranks over this period, as follows:

**2-Year-Institutions.**—Salary information by sex was reported for 41,517 faculty in public institutions and 2,196 faculty in nonpublic institutions. These represent 90.7 percent and 98.1 percent of all faculty salaries reported by these institutions, respectively. The median salary of women faculty in public institutions is 90.1 percent of the median salary of men faculty in these institutions. In nonpublic institutions the median for women faculty is 93.7 percent of the median for men faculty. Details about the distributions of salaries of men and women faculty in 2-year institutions are given in Tables 48 and 49, A and B, in Appendix D of NEA Research Report 1972-R5.

A review of the median salaries of men and women faculty and the percentages of faculty who are women in each region and enrollment classification of public 2-year institutions in 1971-72 is as follows:

Possible trends in the status of women faculty since 1959-60 in 2-year institutions may be estimated from a review of median salaries of women faculty as a percentage of median salaries of men faculty, the percentages of faculty who are women, and the percentages of all faculty salaries which are reported by sex, biennially between 1959-60 and 1965-66, and for 1971-72, as follows:

#### Tenure Status By Sex

The number of tenured faculty in 1971-72 was reported by sex by 821 4-year institutions (93.3 percent of the 880 institutions reporting the number of tenured faculty) and by 330 2-year institutions (92.4 percent of the 357 institutions reporting the number of tenured faculty). Tenure status by sex of faculty was reported by institutions employing 94.8 percent of the faculty whose tenure status was reported by 4-year institutions (180,811) and by 91.8 percent of those in 2-year institutions (33,447).

The percent of faculty having tenure in the institutions reporting sufficient data to assess the tenure status of faculty by sex is slightly different

from the total group of institutions reporting the number of faculty having tenure, as follows:

The summary in Table 1 shows that the percentages of women faculty having tenure are highest in the public institutions, particularly the medium and small public universities where almost half of the women faculty have tenure. The percentages of women faculty having tenure are lowest in the small nonpublic universities in the medium-size nonpublic colleges where less than one-third have tenure. The percentage of men faculty having tenure is more than 5 percentage points greater than

the percentage of women faculty having tenure in each classification of institution except public colleges, the smallest nonpublic colleges, and the nonpublic 2-year colleges.

The over-all pattern of tenure being held by a higher percentage of men than of women faculty is not observed among all institutions in a given classification. At least one institution in each classification (Table 1) reports a higher percentage by 10 or more percentage points) of women than of men faculty having tenure. However, in every classification of institution, except nonpublic 2-year colleges, the percentage of institutions in which a higher percentage of men than women faculty have tenure exceeds the percentage of institutions reporting the reverse pattern. The differences are smallest (between 2.4 and 3.9 percentage points) in the medium size nonpublic colleges and in the small public universities. The differences are widest in the large public and nonpublic universities, where the largest percentages of institutions have a higher percentage of men than women faculty with tenure.

### Salaries of Administrators by Sex

The numbers of persons in administrative and professional positions for whom the salary and the sex were reported for 1971-72 are shown in Tables 2 and 3. These tables contain all positions for which salary information was requested with the following exceptions: (a) in 4-year institutions head football coach, head basketball coach, and in universities the deans of separately organized schools and colleges; and (b) in nonpublic 2-year institutions all positions having fewer than 10 persons reported. For the deleted positions in 4-year institutions salaries were reported for 2,391 men and 159 women. As may be expected, 81.1 percent

of these 159 women officers were in the following positions: dean of the school of nursing, 85; dean of the school of home economics, 37; and 7 were deans of schools of education. For the two positions in which salaries of more than 20 women officers were reported, the number of men officers was not large enough to allow a comparison of the median salaries.

Comparison of the sums of columns 2 and 5 of Tables 2 and 3 shows that overall administrative position information by sex is reported for 97.5 percent of the officers in 4-year institutions and for 95.6 percent of those in 2-year institutions.

The percentage of persons in these administrative positions who are women averages 14.9 percent in 4-year institutions and 14.0 percent in 2-year institutions. In only the following positions are more than one-fifth of the officers women in 4-year institutions: Dean of Women (96.5 percent), Registrar (31.3 percent), Chief Librarian (31.2 percent), Director of Alumni Services (24.6 percent), Director of Student Placement (23.5 percent), and Director of Student Financial Aid (20.8 percent). In only the following positions in public 2-year institutions are more than one-fifth of the officers women: Dean of Women (100.0 percent), Chief Librarian (24.9 percent), Director of Student Test-

ing and Counseling (35.5 percent), Registrar (24.9 percent), and Director of Public Relations (24.0 percent). In only the following positions in nonpublic 2-year institutions are more than one-fifth of the officers women: Dean of Women (100.0 percent), Chief Librarian (76.9 percent), Registrar (55.1 percent), Director of Guidance (39.1 percent), Dean of Students (27.6 percent), Director of Public Relations (27.0 percent), and Director of Admissions (23.6 percent).

The differences in median salaries of men and women in the same position range from \$321 (for Chief Librarian in nonpublic 2-year institutions) to \$11,319 (for Executive Vice-president in 4-year in-

stitutions). The median salary of women is shown in column 9 as a percent of the median salary of men in the same administrative position. Because of the wide range in median salaries this percentage is more useful than the dollar differences as an indicator of the relative status of salaries paid to men and women.

An investigation of the possible influences of the type and location of the employing institution upon these salaries is not feasible for several of the administrative positions because of the very small numbers of women employed. To minimize possible differences in salaries which may result from professional characteristics of an individual where small numbers of persons are involved, a further review is made of only the positions in which 20 or more women are employed.

In the 27 positions in which salaries are reported for 20 or more women and at least 15 men, the percentages that women's median salaries are of men's for the same position range from 63.1 to 109.4 percent with a median of 75.5 percent. In the 19 positions in 4-year institutions the percents range from 63.1 to 109.4 with a median of 73.9. In the 8 positions in 2-year institutions the percents range from 68.7 to 106.2 with a median of 82.8.

Salary information for 4-year institutions grouped by type is listed in Table 4 for 18 positions having salaries reported for 20 or more women. Information available to NEA Research is not sufficiently detailed to allow a similar review of salaries in 2-year institutions. The remaining 4-year institution position for which salaries of 20 or more women are reported (Director of Institutional Research) is not included because no classification of institutions reported the salaries of five or more women in this position.

The level of faculty and administrative salaries tends to be lower in small than in large institutions. The information in Table 4 indicates the relative status of administrative salaries by sex where there is a reduction of the differences in salaries attributable to a disproportional number of women officers employed in institutions where salaries typically are lower than the national average. The data do not allow a review of the possible differences in the distribution of men and women officers among geographic regions within each classification of institution, a possible additional factor contributing to differences in salary of persons having a given administrative title.

Table 4 shows the median salaries of men and women administrators in the 18 positions by type of institution (a total of 75 institution positions) for institutions reporting five or more women administrators. The number of women in four of

these institution positions (5.3 percent) is larger than the number of men. The median percent that the number of women officers is of the number of men officers in these 75 institution positions is 22.2 percent. On the other hand, the number of women officers represents less than one-fifth of the number of men officers in the same position in 45.3 percent. The percentages of institution positions having the number of women officers amounting to 70.0 percent or more of the number of men officers or below 20.0 percent of the number of men officers are as follows:

The preceding shows that only in the nonpublic colleges does the number of women administrators with these 18 administrative titles range at or above 70 percent of the number of men administrators, the number needed to be consistent with the over-all proportion of men students represented by women students (72.2 percent). However, at best, this is observed among only two-fifths of the incidences in this classification of institutions.

Also shown in Table 4 are the salaries of women officers as percents of the median salaries of men in the same position in a given type of institution. These percentages range from 65.7 (for Dean or Director of Student Testing and Counseling in small public universities) to 133.0 (for Director of Information in small public universities).

The percent of median men's salaries represented by median women's salaries for the same position does not seem to be related to the type and size characteristics of the employing institution. The following summary shows, by type of institution, the range and median of the information listed in column 8 of Table 4 (median salaries of women officers as percents of the median salaries of men in the same position in a given type of institution):
