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ABSTRACT

This revision of Ralph Perkin's "Book Selection Media" (1967 edition) expands by almost half that edition, with much of the material from the earlier edition being retained and updated. (See ED 017 506 for earlier edition entitled "Book Selection Media, A Descriptive Guide to 170 Aids for Selecting Library Materials.") In addition to general guides for all ages, also included are guides for specific age and interest groups. A number of the works included provide background for parents and teachers when selecting books. Lists of pamphlets usually are grouped according to the topics they cover. The annotations appear in the following format: Title, Author-Publisher, Publication Data, Purpose, Scope, Subject Headings, Similar Tools, Special Features, Usefulness, and Cost. There are seven indexes to this book, as follows: Aids to Making Selections for Children; Aids to Making Selections for Teenagers; Selection Aids for College Students and Adults; Selection Aids for Teacher-Parent Background; Selection Aids for Librarians; Title Index; and Author-Publisher Index. This revision of Ralph Perkins's *Book Selection Media* (1967 edition) is intended for all persons who need to choose from among the current profusion of books and educational materials. Librarians for public, elementary, and high school libraries, however, will probably find this guide most useful. The number of annotations in this volume expands by almost half the total in *Book Selection Media*, from which much material was retained and updated.

The variety of books and selection tools annotated here reflects the changing interests and current needs and demands of library patrons, as well as the wide range of material available today. Like its predecessor, this volume contains, in addition to general guides for all ages, guides for specific age and interest groups. Also included are a number of works which provide background for parents and teachers when selecting books for their children or students. Some books have been listed because they contain important bibliographies. In addition, catalog aids for verifying and ordering titles have been included.

Lists of pamphlets usually have been grouped according to the topics they cover; unbiased non-book media continues to be in short supply, however. Some government sources are annotated to alert readers to the extensive resources of government publications. There are also religious lists, included for use by both church schools and public libraries.

Price information has been checked against the most recent sources but the reader is reminded that publishers' prices are subject to change without notice.* The author realizes that some valuable lists probably have been overlooked and regrets that others were published too late to be included in this guide.
