ABSTRACT

This is the third in a series of annual reports on the participation of the Nation's predominantly black colleges and universities in programs funded by federal agencies. The report documents the recent expansion and diversity of federal program support to these colleges. In this report, federal program funds are reported by agency for all colleges and universities with a special breakout of funds going to predominantly black colleges. A tabulation of the sources of program funds is also provided for each black college by state. Three appendixes presents information on the distribution of federal funds to both two- and four-year public and private black colleges; a summary of support by each federal agency for all colleges and universities as well as the amount received by black colleges; and a list of the 115 predominantly black institutions included in the Federal Interagency Committee on Education survey for fiscal year 1971. FOREWORD

This is the third in a series of annual reports on the participation of the Nation's predominantly black colleges and universities in programs funded by Federal agencies. The report documents the recent expansion and diversity of Federal program support to these colleges.

During the past 3 years, both the proportion and amount of Federal higher education money going to black colleges have increased sharply and this support is expected to continue. The President, in his State of the Union message on January 20, 1972, stated that Federal funds reaching black colleges would exceed \$200 million in fiscal year 1972. Early estimates of fiscal year 1972 funding confirm this projection. Among some of the actions which were taken by the Administration during 1972 are the following:

- The Office of Education's Developing Institutions program increased its funding of black colleges by more than \$10 million, from approximately \$20 million in 1971 to over \$30 million in 1972.
- The Department of Agriculture increased its funding of the predominantly black, land-grant institutions more than sevenfold—from \$2 million in 1971 to at least \$15 million in 1972.
- The National Science Foundation, in addition to its existing programs, established new programs that provided \$6 million in support to black institutions during 1972.

The purpose of increased Federal funding of the predominantly black institutions of higher learning is to assist these institutions to meet more effectively the educational needs of their student populations. In helping them to realize these endeavors, President Nixon committed his Administration to strengthening the Federal Government's role in support of the predominantly black colleges. Federal agencies responded to the President's commitment by greatly expanding the scope, intensity, and variety of efforts to aid these institutions. Continued support from Federal agencies is

essential if they are to continue to develop the human and physical resources necessary for quality higher education.

This study was prepared under the general direction of Bernard Michael, Executive Director of the Federal Interagency Committee on Education (FICE). Edward M. Knudsen of the FICE staff wrote the 1971 report. He also conducted the interagency survey and analyzed the statistical data. Barbara Coates and Phyllis Stone assisted in preparing the several drafts of the manuscript and tables.

INTRODUCTION

Federal aid to the Nation's predominantly black colleges and universities increased almost 58 percent over the 3-year period from 1969 to 1971. This increase was the result of an intensive effort on the part of all Federal departments and agencies to bolster program support to predominantly black institutions. In 1969, black colleges received \$108 million; in 1970, they received \$126 million; and in 1971, they received \$171 million from 18 Federal agencies. These black colleges, enrolling approximately 2.5 percent of the Nation's college population, received 4.4 percent of all Federal agency program funds going to colleges and universities during fiscal year 1971.

Prior to passage of the Higher Education Act of 1965, with its extensive programs for undergraduate student aid, most black colleges received little or no support from the Federal Government. In 1963, the first year data were available, black colleges enrolled approximately 2.4 percent of the Nation's college population while receiving 1 percent of Federal funds or \$18 million. The \$171 million in Federal aid for fiscal year 1971 represents a funding level of over nine times that for 1963. Estimates of program funding for black colleges and universities are expected to show continued increases in fiscal year 1972, with funding estimated to exceed \$200 million.

The traditionally black colleges included in the fiscal year 1970 FICE survey were recipients of the great bulk of fiscal year 1971 Federal funds reported here. The 13 institutions enrolling a predominantly black student body, which were added to the 1971 FICE universe of black colleges, accounted for less than 5 percent of fiscal year 1971 funds going to black institutions or \$8.1 million. Most of these new institutions were established to meet the urgent needs of blacks in large urban communities. They include such institutions as Malcolm X and Kennedy-King in Chicago, Wayne County Community College in Detroit, and Compton College in Los Angeles.

Enrolling more than one-third of all black students attending college, the predominantly black colleges and universities are a major resource in the overall national effort toward achieving the goal of equal educational opportunity. Historically, these colleges have concentrated their efforts on preparing black students for teaching and for the ministry. However, these institutions are now con-

fronted with the expensive task of enhancing curriculums and expanding the career choices available to their students.

Recognizing the unique contribution the predominantly black colleges can provide in helping to achieve the goal of equal educational opportunity for all citizens, Federal agencies have increased funding for many existing programs and have created others to increase black college participation in federally funded activities.

In this report, Federal program funds are reported by agency for all colleges and universities with a special breakout of funds going to predominantly black colleges. A tabulation of the sources of program funds is also provided for each black college, by State. Three appendixes present information on the distribution of Federal funds to both 2- and 4-year public and private black colleges; a summary of support by each Federal agency for all colleges and universities as well as the amount received by black colleges; and a list of the 115 predominantly black institutions included in the FICE survey for fiscal year 1971.

FEDERAL AGENCY PROGRAM FUNDS TO BLACK COLLEGES: FISCAL YEAR 1971

Support Sources

Of the \$171 million in Federal agency program funds received by black colleges during 1971, the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare (HEW) provided \$146 million or approximately 86 percent of the total Federal support. By contrast, other colleges and universities received only 66 percent of their Federal funds from HEW.

Of the \$146 million provided by HEW, the largest amount came from the Office of Education (OE). OE increased its assistance to black colleges by \$33 million, from \$85 million in 1970 to \$118 million in 1971. The next largest amount came from HEW's National Institutes of Health which provided almost \$15 million to black colleges during fiscal year 1971, an increase of \$6 million over fiscal year 1970. The Department's Health Services and Mental Health Administration doubled its funds to black colleges from 1970 to 1971, providing more than \$11 million to the black colleges.

Outside HEW, the primary sources of Federal aid to black colleges were the Office of Economic Opportunity (\$7 million), the Department of Housing and Urban Development (\$6 million), the National Science Foundation (\$3 million), and the Department of Agriculture (\$2 million). The Federal agency which allocated the largest share of its higher education budget was the Office of Economic Opportunity (OEO). The \$7 million provided by OEO in fiscal year 1971 represented 19 percent of its higher education funds, up from a 15 percent share in fiscal year 1970.

Of the \$171 million in Federal funds received by black colleges in fiscal year 1971, \$74 million or 44 percent was for student assistance. By contrast, only 26 percent of Federal funds going to other colleges and universities was for student assistance. The next largest category of Federal assistance to black colleges was general operating expenses. This category accounted for over \$41 million or about 24 percent of Federal moneys received by black colleges, compared to 12 percent of Federal funds received by other colleges and universities for this purpose. Federal funds for training grants and training programs at black colleges amounted to 15 percent of their Federal funds; funds for construction (plant expenses) amounted to 12 percent; and funds for research and

development (R&D) projects amounted to 5 percent. In dollar terms, almost all categories of assistance increased. The most notable increases, however, occurred in student financial aid, construction, and facilities programs. (See figures A and B, p. 5.)

The Nation's predominantly black colleges and universities, mostly private, are particularly beset by the financial constraints suffered by all American higher education. Most black colleges lack large endowments and rely heavily on student tuition as a primary source of income.

Student Assistance

Federally funded student financial aid programs at black colleges increased by almost \$15 million from 1970 to 1971. Of the \$74 million received by black colleges for student assistance, \$70 million came from the Office of Education and most of this was in the form of national defense student loans, educational opportunity grants, and college work-study funds.

Educational opportunity grants totaling \$21.4 million assisted 40,000 students enrolled in black colleges, or 19 percent of the estimated black college enrollment. Overall, educational opportunity grants assisted 3.4 percent of the 8.6 million students enrolled in institutions of higher learning.

College work-study grants totaling \$23.0 million supported 70,000 students in black colleges—34 percent of the black college enrollment. Work-study grants were awarded to approximately 600,000 students, or 7 percent of the Nation's college population.


National defense student loans provided \$14.7 million to 46,000 students in black colleges—22 percent of the black college enrollment. Nationally, the program aided 645,000 students, or 7.5 percent of all college and university students.

In addition to these OE programs which provide Federal funds to colleges for student assistance, the Veterans Administration and HEW's Social Security Administration provide substantial, direct support to students who are eligible for educational assistance benefits; and the Office of Education's guaranteed student loan program enables students to receive financial assistance through subsidized loans from private lending institutions. (See appendix B.)

(in Millions of Dollars)



Institutional Assistance

Federal funds for construction of facilities and equipment increased from \$7.2 million provided in fiscal year 1970 to \$19.5 million provided in fiscal year 1971, even though nationwide Federal funds for this purpose are decreasing. In addition to this amount, black colleges, through the Department of Housing and Urban Development's debt service grant program, were able to obtain private market loans totaling \$10 million for college housing construction. Through the Office of Education's annual interest grant program (title III, section 306, Higher Education Facilities Act of 1963, as amended), black colleges were able to obtain \$24 million in construction loans. (See appendix B.)

A significant proportion of all Federal aid to higher education is in the form of research and development grants. Such grants frequently contribute to institutional assistance through supplementary payments for facilities and overhead. Because few black colleges have the graduate programs, laboratories, and other facilities to conduct scientific research, Federal funds received by black colleges for R&D—although increasing from \$5 million in 1970 to \$9 million in 1971—still represent a small proportion of the total.

The major single program source of institutional assistance has been the Office of Education's program for "Strengthening Developing Institutions." In fiscal year 1971, black colleges received \$19.7 million under this program. (The amount received in fiscal year 1972 was over \$30 million.)

Distribution of Funds

More than half (nearly \$89 million) of Federal funds going to black colleges during fiscal year 1971 went to 64 private, predominantly black colleges, these colleges enrolling approximately 24 percent of all students attending black colleges. (See appendix A.)

Sixty-six black colleges each received more than \$1 million including three which received more than \$5 million each during fiscal year 1971. Only 42 black colleges received more than a million dollars during fiscal year 1970.

Scope and Limitations of Data

Total Federal funding is reported by educational program and its contribution to each predominantly black institution of higher education. The categories of support are grouped in five major components:

- Student Assistance:** A loan or grant program designed primarily to defray students' personal educational expenses.
- Training Grants:** A grant provided to train selected students in an academic discipline.
- Plant Expenses:** Support for construction and equipment at institutions of higher education.

Operating Expenses: A grant for institutional program development costs other than student aid or construction.

R&D: Support for either basic or applied research.

Data were reported by 19 Federal agencies, including the Environmental Protection Agency (formerly the Environmental Health Service in HEW) which is now an independent Federal agency. With the exception of the Atomic Energy Commission, which reported in terms of costs, dollar amounts represent obligations incurred by the agencies during the fiscal year regardless of when funds were actually expended. Obligations data include total Federal funds awarded directly to colleges and universities including repayable Federal loans.

Excluded from this report are obligations to Federally Funded Research and Development Centers (FFRDC's). These are independent organizational units managed by universities and colleges or other nonprofit institutions which were established to meet the particular mission of a Federal agency.

Data were provided by Federal agencies for 115 predominantly black colleges and universities enrolling 208,000 students, or approximately 2.4 percent of total college enrollment. (These institutions are listed in appendix C). Thirteen institutions were added to the FICE universe of predominantly black colleges and nine institutions which either closed or were no longer predominantly black were removed from the universe. (See appendix C). Total Federal funds received by the 13 additional institutions amounted to \$8.1 million. The large increase in enrollment in black colleges can be attributed mainly to the 35,000 students enrolled in these 13 institutions.

Nationwide, approximately 1,170,000 students received an estimated \$1,583,200,000 in federally subsidized loans. The estimated amount of subsidy payments to lending institutions for students attending black institutions was \$4.5 million during fiscal year 1971.

⁴Not included in the Office of Education and Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) totals are private market loans obtained by colleges and universities with the help of Federal subsidies. Subsidies are included, however, since they are Federal funds received by colleges and universities. During fiscal year 1971, black colleges were able to obtain private market housing loans totaling \$9,660,000 through HUD's College Housing Debt Service Grant Program and private market construction loans totaling \$23.8 million through the Higher Education Facilities Act (HEFA) of 1963, as amended, Title III—Annual Interest Grant Program. Nationwide, colleges and universities were able to obtain a total of approximately \$600 million through OE's program and \$168.5 million through the HUD program.

⁵The vast majority of benefits provided by the Veterans Administration for educational purposes is in the form of educational assistance allowances paid directly to eligible veterans and other eligible persons. These benefits are not paid to the schools by the Veterans Administration. In fiscal year 1971, a total of \$1,651,424,000 in educational benefits was provided for 1,674,857 eligible veterans or other eligible persons. Included in these figures is approximately \$19,847,000 paid to 16,295 eligible veterans and dependents enrolled in predominantly black colleges.
