## ABSTRACT

Guidelines to the SPELLINGCLUES project are presented. This is a computer-assisted instructional program designed to help college students correct spelling errors by providing them with spelling drills. The booklet consists of two sections. Part I, the Instructor's Manual, covers four topics: 1) the type of student for whom the program is intended; 2) a recommended approach to the use of the program; 3) the length of time required to complete the program; and 4) A demonstration of a typical session at the computer terminal. Part II, the Implementation Manual, identifies and describes the program, discusses the computer terminal devices, provides a program flowchart and gives listings of programs and dialogue and parameter files. WHAT TYPE OF STUDENT WILL BENEFIT  
FROM USING THE SPELLING PROGRAM?

The Program has been designed with sufficient flexibility to meet the individual needs of students at the College and University level. The words to be spelled are those which are most frequently misspelled in written assignments by students at this level, and the Program has been tailored to enable the busy student with a tight schedule of classes and labs to perform needed drill efficiently, in a minimum period of time, and apart from regular classroom hours.

The Program provides the student with complete anonymity and privacy, and can be taken upon the recommendation of an instructor, or on a voluntary basis, or as a supplement to classroom instruction. It has been used successfully by adult students in Academic Upgrading courses, who may have been away from formal study for a period of several years.

Students for whom English is a second language have also used the Program successfully, since certain features of the Program have been designed to help develop their English vocabulary as well as their spelling skills.

The inability to spell correctly often constitutes a potential professional handicap, particularly to the student who has reached College or University level. Upon completion of his studies, regardless of his profession, he may often be called upon to present written submissions, position papers, memorandums, and reports. If his ability in one of the basic skills of written English has not developed by then, he may find himself passed over at promotion time. His period of study in College or University, then, may be a student's last chance to make up for this deficiency before entering professional life.

However, most students and instructors would agree that classroom drill in spelling at this level is not only an unrealistic and impractical venture, but a tedious and embarrassing prospect for the student as well. The individualized approach toward spelling provided by a Computer-Assisted Instruction Program might provide a welcome solution to this problem, enabling the student to progress at his own rate, to receive instant feedback from the computer assisting him in making his own corrections, and to obtain the specialized attention which an instructor would find very difficult to provide in classroom drill.

HOW TO USE THE PROGRAM:  
A RECOMMENDED APPROACH

This Program is intended to assist students in learning to spell one hundred of the most frequently misspelled words in the English Language. These words have been divided into 5 series of 20 words each, arranged in a progressive order of difficulty, and recorded on cassette tapes which the student will operate himself at the typewriter terminal. The Program permits the student to take the five series in any order and to try the words within each series in the order of his choice. Thus, the student may concentrate upon the words with which he is experiencing difficulty, and may, if he wishes, skip over those which he is already certain of spelling correctly. Problem words in each series can also be reviewed in subsequent sessions at the terminal.

After completing the sign-on procedures, the student receives the following introductory message, directing him to select the series he intends to try:

Computer: *HI THERE! WE ARE ABOUT TO BEGIN A PROGRAM WHICH WILL HELP YOU IN SPELLING THE MOST DIFFICULT WORDS IN THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE. WHICH SERIES DO YOU WISH TO TRY - 1, 2, 3, 4, OR 5? TYPE IN THE NUMBER.*

Student: 2 (inserts cassette for series 2 into the tape recorder).

The words in each series are numbered 1 - 20. After listening to the tape and selecting the appropriate series, the student then indicates the number of the word he wishes to try, and advances the tape to that word:

Computer: *WHAT NUMBER DO YOU WANT TO START AT? TYPE IN A NUMBER FROM 1 - 20. READY FOR WORD NUMBER --.*

Student: 5 (advances tape to word number 5).

The learning strategy of the Spelling Program stems from the reasonable expectation that, in most cases, student misspellings will very likely correspond to certain predictable pitfalls. Accordingly, for each of the one hundred words in the Program, a separate list of anticipated spelling errors has been assembled, based upon those errors which have been found by English Instructors to occur most frequently in written assignments. An appropriate dialogue, devised to accompany each anticipated spelling, enables the computer to inform the student whether his spelling is accurate or whether and in what manner his attempted spelling should be corrected. In order to avoid discouraging the student and also to mitigate the usual tediousness associated with spelling drill, the dialogue has been designed so that a student who types the correct spelling will receive an appropriate congratulatory response, while a student making an incorrect attempt will receive an encouraging (sometimes mildly humorous) hint as to where he is in error, and will then be given another chance at spelling the word. For example, if a student selects the word

*ARGUMENT*

and spells it correctly, he will receive the following response:

*THERE IS NO ARGUMENT. YOU ARE BRILLIANT.*

If, on the other hand, the student should type

*ARGJEMENT*

the computer will respond by typing

*OOPS! YOU HAVE AN EXTRA VOWEL IN THE MIDDLE OF THE WORD.*

Rather than presenting students with an arbitrary set of spelling rules, or grouping sets of words according to spelling conventions, the approach here is to guide the student progressively through words which have been frequently misspelled, and to encourage the student, at the same time, to locate and correct his own errors. However, if a student's error should result from his forgetting or neglecting to apply a particular rule of English Spelling, the computer will respond by reminding him of that rule.

Thus, if the target is

*RECEIVE*

and the student types

*RECIEVE*

the computer will respond by advising the student to

*REMEMBER THE RULE: "I" BEFORE "E" EXCEPT AFTER "C" ... ETC.*

Similarly, should a student fail to recognize an exception and attempt to apply an appropriate spelling rule, he will be advised accordingly. In other words, if he is attempting to spell the word

*WEIRD*

and types

*WIERD*

the computer will remind him that

*THE "I" BEFORE "E" RULE DOES NOT APPLY TO THIS WORD.*

However, should a student misspell a word in such a way that it does not correspond to any anticipated error, the computer will respond by informing him that he is off the track and by asking him to try again:

*THAT WAS AN UNEXPECTED ANSWER. PLEASE TRY AGAIN.*

In cases such as these, even though the computer does not identify the exact letter or portion of the word requiring correction, the student is still directed to examine his spelling in an attempt to locate his errors and to correct them.

The Program will also accept alternate spellings for a word, and in such cases will indicate to the student that an alternate spelling exists. For example, the student who types either

*CRITICIZE*

or

*CRITICISE*

will receive the following response:

*RIGHT - BUT THERE IS AN ALTERNATE SPELLING. DO YOU KNOW IT?*

A student is permitted a maximum of three attempts at spelling a word. If his difficulty persists, the computer will then type the correct spelling, ask him to memorize it, and direct him to re-type it correctly. Only after correcting his spelling may the student proceed to the next word of his choice in the series. He may not, however, repeat a word which he has already attempted in a particular series at the same session. If he chooses such a word, the computer will ask him to make another choice:

*YOU HAVE ALREADY DONE THAT ONE. PLEASE TRY AGAIN.  
READY FOR WORD NUMBER --.*

This lock-out feature has been devised in order to prevent students from simply making a practice of obtaining from the computer the correct spellings of words and then re-typing them. Words which a student is finding difficult to master may be reviewed at a later session at the terminal.

As an additional feature of the Program, the student has the option of requesting up to four sentence examples of each word, illustrating the correct usage of that word in a variety of different contexts, before attempting to spell it. Thus, if the student should select the word

*EXAGGERATE*

the computer will ask him

*DO YOU WANT AN EXAMPLE?*

If the student should reply in the affirmative, the computer will respond by typing the following sentence example, indicating the position of the word to be spelled:

*HOW CAN ONE ..... THE DIFFICULTY OF TURNING AN EGG INSIDE OUT?*

Combining this approach with helpful spelling hints has proved beneficial for certain students, particularly those for whom English is a second language and who appreciate additional assistance in vocabulary building and word usage.

If the student has attempted all 20 words in the series, the computer will instruct him to sign off:

Computer: *YOU HAVE COMPLETED THE SERIES. PLEASE SIGN OFF NOW.*

Student: *SIGNOFF.*

However, the student may stop at any point within the series by simply typing

*STOP*

after the

*READY FOR WORD NUMBER --*

instruction, and then signing off. In this way, work partially completed at one session can be resumed at a later session at the precise point at which the student stopped. Furthermore, this feature has proved particularly useful if a student wishes only to review a number of words with which he is experiencing difficulty, and does not need to repeat the entire series. He can thus concentrate on selected words, and sign off upon completing his review.

After each session at the terminal, it is recommended that the student's progress be evaluated by his English instructor who might then be in a position to advise the student either to undertake further review or to proceed to a more advanced series. The instructor can thus utilize the computer as a means of providing the student with a palatable and relatively painless method of drill outside the classroom, while at the same time availing himself of the opportunity of maintaining that personal contact with the student which is so essential at this level. In this manner, it is hoped that the implementation of the Spelling Program will result in providing both student and instructor with a combination of ideal situations - a stimulating and fully individualized means whereby the student can perform necessary drill apart from the classroom, and an opportunity for the instructor, during office consultation, to offer more personalized advice to individual students on the progress of their work.

Since the Program has been designed to enable students to work at spelling outside of class hours, it is important to schedule terminal time in a way that corresponds conveniently with free periods in students' timetables. For this purpose, it has been found that by making terminal time available in the evenings as well as for certain periods during the day, students have been able to work out satisfactory times for their terminal sessions.

The average time required at the terminal to complete a series of 20 words is a half-hour. In order for students to achieve maximum benefit from the Program, it is recommended that they attempt more than one series at each session, and that they undertake no more than one complete session per day. Prolonged sessions lasting more than a half-hour appear to be unproductive and leave the student with little chance of retaining what he has learned.

Completion time for the Program varies widely with individual students. While a student could conceivably complete the five series in five half-hour sessions, most students will require more than one attempt at some of the series before proceeding to the next series. Some students, on the other hand, may find that they do not require drill in all the five series. Furthermore, the length of time required by each student might also depend to some extent upon his English instructor's advice and recommendation. It is important, therefore, that each student be able to arrange individually for the optimum amount of time which he requires to complete the Program.

2.1 PROGRAM IDENTIFICATION

Program Name : SPELLINGCLUES(FIRST EDITION,1973)  
Authors : J. Thorhallsson, F. MacDonald, Red Deer College,  
Red Deer, Alberta. Canada.

2.2 TERMINAL DEVICES

The program is designed to be used with any conversational terminal with a line length of at least 72 characters, e.g. Teletypes and IBM 2741's.

2.3 PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Source Language : FORTRAN IV (IBM 360 FORTRAN G)  
Subroutines used: None  
Purpose : To manage a dialogue between a student practising spelling and a computer.

Description:

The program manages the dialogue by using a strategy presented in the accompanying flowchart, whereby most of the control over the dialogue lies in the hands of the student, and the role of the computer is reduced to providing appropriate responses and guiding when control appears to get out of hand, e.g. student trying the same word more than once during the same session, an excessive number of unsuccessful tries to spell the same word, etc.

The program assembles the computer part of the dialogue from prerecorded dialogue fragments for presentation to the students, with the dialogue fragments falling into the following five categories:

- 1) the words to be spelled
- 2) several frequent misspellings for each word to be spelled
- 3) appropriate congratulations for the successful spelling of each word, with the level of praise depending upon how quickly the student produced the correct spelling
- 4) appropriate hints and suggestions for each frequent misspelling mentioned under 2)
- 5) sentence examples showing each word to be spelled in context.

While the number of appropriate congratulations is kept constant (equal to three), the number of the frequent misspellings for each word, the number of sentence examples for each word, and the number of tries the student is permitted for each word are treated as parameters set by the designer of the dialogue. These dialogue parameters are stored on a separate parameter file (assigned the unit number 5) along with 20 words selected to form the student's part of the dialogue, while the fragments of the dialogue are stored organized word by word on a dialogue file (assigned unit number 4). From the series number and the word number selected by the student, the program retrieves the dialogue parameters for that particular word from the parameter file, and using these parameters retrieves the dialogue fragments for the selected word from the dialogue file. This information is used to build the part of the dialogue between the student and the computer pertaining to this particular word.


