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ABSTRACT

The bibliography provides access to some of the latest research findings or developments in community education. Thirty-nine documents and 47 journal articles published between 1956 and 1973 (with the majority between 1969 and 1973) are cited. The citations and abstracts have appeared in "Research in Education" and in "Current Index to Journals in Education". Citations cover a variety of community education resource materials, including adult education, community action, community involvement, community schools, and school community relationships. A subject index facilitates locating documents in a specific area. Pricing information and document availabilities are also provided. (NQ)

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INTRODUCTION

The Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) is a federally funded national information system dedicated to the improvement of education through the dissemination of educational resources and research-related materials. ERIC aids school administrators, teachers, researchers, information specialists, professional organizations, students, and others in locating and using educational resources.

THE 1,496 CHANGES, WHEN PINPOINTED, COULD BE DISTRIBUTED INTO FOUR CATEGORIES: (1) INCREASED DECISION-MAKING, (2) GREATER EMPLOYMENT, (3) GREATER EDUCATIONAL EMPHASIS, AND (4) MODIFICATION OF HEALTH SERVICES. THE SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE OF THIS APPLIED RESEARCH PROJECT WAS TO EVALUATE PRACTICAL FORMULAS FOR COMMUNITY-GUIDED EDUCATION IN 5 NATIVE COMMUNITIES IN THE CANADIAN NORTH. THE PROJECTS, LAUNCHED AT THE MAN IN THE NORTH INUVIK CONFERENCE (1970), INVOLVED THE ADULTS OF THESE COMMUNITIES IN THE EDUCATIONAL PROCESS AS SPECIAL EDUCATION COMMITTEES AND COMMUNITY TEACHERS.
