
## ABSTRACT

Presented in the guide to resources for preschool handicapped children are information on selected Federal agencies, associations, and directories; program descriptions of regional, State, and local resources; and a list of agencies, organizations, and special projects in the 50 States and U.S. territories. Usually given are address; telephone number; and a summary of activities, objectives, purpose, and/or membership for the following organizations: six Federal agencies such as the Bureau of Education for the Handicapped; three generic social and health services such as Medicaid; and 27 national associations such as the American Association on Mental Deficiency. Listed by title are 20 directories such as "A Directory of Summer Camps for Children with Learning Disabilities", and given for listings are address, date of publication, pagination, and price (in some cases). Offered are 21 program descriptions of regional, State, and local resources such as the Special Education Instructional Materials Centers/Regional Media Centers network, the First Chance network, and State directors of special education. Listings of resources in each State are arranged in the same format as the program descriptions and include resource title, address, director's name, affiliation (if appropriate), and telephone number. ## INTRODUCTION

- The Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare shall establish policies and procedures designed to assure that not less than ten per centum of the total number of enrollment opportunities in the nation in the Head Start program shall be available for handicapped children [as defined in paragraph (1) of Section 602 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended] and that services shall be provided to meet their special needs. The Secretary shall implement his responsibilities under this paragraph in such a manner as not to exclude from any project any child who was participating in the program during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972. Within six months after the date of enactment of this Act, and at least annually thereafter, the Secretary shall report to the Congress on the status of handicapped children in Head Start programs, including the number of children being served, their handicapping conditions, and the services being provided such children.

### Economic Opportunity Amendments of 1972 (P.L. 92-424)

Public Law 92-424 makes at least 38,000 young handicapped children a Head Start enrollment priority. Head Start personnel have been vested with challenging responsibilities. These responsibilities relate not only to issues of staff expertise and sensitivity to the individual needs of newly enrolled handicapped children, but also to the fundamental issue of collaboration between Head Start programs and the array of institutions and individuals which constitute the handicapped services field.

Developing public policy in the handicapped services field has been overwhelmingly a history of Federal-state categorical program thrusts. The outcome of narrow-purpose, categorical policy adoptions is a crazy-quilt pattern of service delivery in health, educational, and social service commitment to handicapped children. To illustrate, consider the evolution of Federal policy toward one handicapping condition--mental retardation--over the past two decades.

In 1955 there was not a single, identifiable categorical mental retardation program or structure in the Federal government. The extensiveness of Congressional concern for mental retardation between 1956 and 1962 was expressed through legislative authorization and appropriations in support of mental retardation activities in mental health, vocational rehabilitation, education, maternal and child health, crippled children's programs, hospital construction, Social Security, neurological diseases, and health services development. Sources for this growth were protective mental retardation earmarks applied to HEW Appropriations Acts and administrative priority attached to HEW developmental activities in health and rehabilitation.

Categorical legislation at the Federal level specifically and solely devoted to mental retardation was first enacted in 1958 as Public Law 85-926, incorporating teacher training provisions. Between 1963 and 1966, policy expansion included categorical Federal entrance into health and educational commitments, facilities construction of Mental Retardation Research Centers, University Affiliated Facilities, and Community Facilities (P.L. 88-164). The 88th Congress had enacted Public Law 156, the Maternal and Child Health and Mental Retardation Planning Amendments of 1963; and Public Law 164, the Mental Retardation Facilities Construction Act. Escalation was firmly established now, and forthcoming enactments of "Great Society" health and educational programs provided legislative vehicles for increased Federal commitment to the mental retardation field.

In 1967, significant support for special education in the US Office of Education was inaugurated with statutory creation of the Bureau of Education for the Handicapped. Then came earmarkings of Congressional appropriations for Titles I and III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (1966); the Vocational Education Act (1968); and, with respect to the earmarking of enrollment opportunities, Head Start (1972).

Program developments for other handicapping conditions specified in P.L. 92-424 have followed similar narrow-purpose, categorical patterns. The result is the maze of program thrusts which constitute the handicapped services field.

Utilizing Resources in the Handicapped Services Field: A Directory for Head Start Personnel is a guide. It was prepared and distributed to national, regional, state, and local Head Start personnel to assist in the identification of existing resources for preschool handicapped children. Materials used in the preparation of the Directory which might be of additional assistance to the user are listed in the Appendix; and, the Directory enumerates many special purpose handicapped services directories previously compiled.

The Directory is divided into three sections: Selected Federal Agencies, Associations, and Directories; Program Descriptions of Regional, State, and Local Resources; and State by State Resource Entries.

Section I identifies national level agencies and organizations providing direct and indirect services to young handicapped children. Exposition relating to agencies and organizations having a central location and a national workscope appear in Section I along with annotated bibliographic entries of handicapped services directories.

Section II presents program descriptions of agencies, organizations, and special projects which operate within regional, state, or local jurisdictions.

Section III -- the bulk of the Directory--is a state by state identification of resource agencies, organizations, and special projects. This section should be particularly useful to Office of Child Development regional office staff, state training offices, and local Head Start staff.

The Council for Exceptional Children has promoted the advancement and education of handicapped and gifted children for over 50 years. We welcome Project Head Start to this community of interest, and to the challenges and responsibilities implied in the language of Public Law 92-424. We hope this Directory will be used as the currency of communication between two helping professions: Project Head Start and the handicapped services field. Together we seek a richer future for young children.

In February 1969, President Nixon called for "a national commitment to provide all American children an opportunity for healthful and stimulating development during the first five years of life." To fulfill this commitment, the Office of Child Development was established within the Office of the Secretary, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

The Office of Child Development has four major missions: (a) to operate such programs for children as Head Start and Parent and Child Centers; (b) to develop innovative programs for children and parents; (c) to serve as a point of coordination for all federal programs for children, youth, and their families; and (d) to act as an advocate for children by bringing their needs to the attention of government and the public. The Bureau of Education for the Handicapped serves as the Office of Education's principal agency for administering programs related to the education of handicapped children. The Bureau of Education for the Handicapped is comprised of three operating divisions -- Research, Training, and Services -- which have represented a broad spectrum of activities in the field of educating handicapped children during the last decade.

Bureau of Education for the Handicapped programs include: SEIMC/RMC Network, First Chance Network, Regional Resource Centers, Deaf-Blind Centers, Research and Demonstration Centers, and Child Service Demonstration Program Grants. The Office of Mental Retardation Coordination has replaced the Secretary's Committee on Mental Retardation and is responsible for duties formerly assumed by that Office. The functions of the OMRC include: to coordinate and evaluate the Department's mental retardation activities; to serve as a focal point for consideration of Department-wide policies, programs, procedures, activities, and other matters relevant to mental retardation; to serve in an advisory capacity to the Secretary in regard to issues related to the administration of the Department's mental retardation programs; and serve as liaison for the President's Committee on Mental Retardation.

The Office coordinates the Steering Committee, which consists of representatives from the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Health and Scientific Affairs, the Social and Rehabilitation Service, the Health Services and Mental Health Administration, the National Institutes of Health, and the Office of Education. The Steering Committee is responsible for advice and consultation in the implementation of the Office functions as stated above.

In addition, the Office also coordinates the Mental Retardation Inter-agency Committee, which consists of representatives of all mental retardation programs. Its functions are to provide a means of communication, information exchange, and program development for agency staff concerned with Federal mental retardation activities.

The National Institute of Child Health and Human Development is a focal point for a concerned research effort to find new ways to prevent, diagnose, and treat mental retardation.

Many of the research accomplishments which NICHD has supported have been achieved in the 12 Mental Retardation Research Centers for which NICHD has programmatic responsibility. These Centers, located throughout the country, are uniquely capable of carrying out research in the complex problems of mental retardation by calling upon the skills of investigators in many disciplines. In addition, the Centers provide training for future scientists. Some Centers conduct clinical studies and are thus able to make contributions to the community in which they are located. (See Section III T.)

5. National Audiovisual Center-General Services Administration

The National Audiovisual Center serves government, industry, educational institutions, and the general public as the central information, sales, and distribution point for most government motion pictures, filmstrips, audio and video tapes, and other audiovisual materials. The center, a division of the National Archives and Records Service, General Services Administration, provides three main services:

1. Information. The Center is the main contact the public has with the government regarding audiovisual materials available from Federal agencies and where and how they can be obtained.
2. Sales. The center functions as the central sales point for most US Government audiovisual items. Over 5,000 motion pictures and filmstrips are described in the sales catalog available from the center.
3. Distribution. The center provides a uniform, economical, and efficient loan and rental service of audiovisual materials, primarily 16mm motion pictures, deposited in the center by various US Government agencies.

The Division offers library services, through cooperating regional libraries, to the blind and physically handicapped. Such materials as braille books, talking books, braille music, record players and cassette players are loaned out upon request. Two bimonthly publications, Talking Books Topics and Braille Book Review, are mailed free to blind and physically handicapped persons who use the services. The Library also offers a national reference

and referral service on all aspects of blindness and other physical handicaps, working closely with organizations having sources of information. Expansion of the library program resulted from the passage in July 1966 of Public Law 89-522, which authorized the Library of Congress to extend its books-for-the-blind program to persons who are unable to read ordinary print because of visual or physical impairment.

## B. Generic Social and Health Services

### 1. Medicaid

Medicaid is the state-option, grant-in-aid, vendor payment program established by Title XIX of the 1965 Social Security Act. It provides medical assistance to needy and low-income people qualifying categorically for public assistance programs for the aged, the blind, the disabled, and members of families with dependent children (AFDC--families with at least one parent dead, absent, or incapacitated, or at state option with an unemployed father). Other children and young people under 21 can also be included if a state so elects.

Medicaid varies from state to state. It pays for at least: inpatient hospital care, outpatient hospital services, laboratory and x-ray services, skilled nursing facility services, physician's services, early and periodic screening diagnosis and treatment of children; home health care services and family planning services.

In many states Medicaid pays for such additional services as dental care, prescribed drugs, eyeglasses, clinic services, and other diagnostic screening, preventive, and rehabilitative services.

The Medical Services Administration of the Social and Rehabilitation Service of the US Department of Health, Education, and Welfare is responsible for Federal aspects of Medicaid.

### 2. CHAMPUS

Under the handicapped program segment of the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed Services (CHAMPUS), a moderately or severely retarded or seriously handicapped spouse or child of an active duty member of one of the uniformed services may be provided training, rehabilitation, special education, institutional care, and related services and equipment. After approval of a management plan, the benefits are provided on a cost-sharing basis with the Government paying a substantial portion. The benefits normally terminate on the member's discharge, death, or retirement.

On July 29 the President approved Public Law 92-58 as an exception to the general rule. Under this exception, handicapped program benefits may now be continued after the member's death in the same manner as though the member were still alive, provided the member died while entitled to receive hostile fire pay or from a disease or injury which was incurred while he was entitled to receive hostile fire pay. The member must have died subsequent to January 1, 1967. The benefits terminate when the dependent reaches age 21. ### 3. American Academy of Pediatrics Technical Assistance Plan for the Handicapped

The American Academy of Pediatrics Technical Assistance Plan for the Handicapped and Title XIX (Medicaid) Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) complement and support the Office of Child Development Head Start programs.

A grant was awarded to the Academy for the continuation of medical consultation services to Project Head Start. Services are provided in three areas - general health consultation, services to the handicapped, and assistance in implementing the Head Start - EPSDT effort.

These services are inclusive and provide for the provision of consultants and local specialists; for the planning and implementation of improved health services for the handicapped; for periodic orientation and training programs for staff and consultants; and to assist the national OCD in the development of the EPSDT program.

## SECTION II

### Program Descriptions of Regional, State, and Local Resources

#### A. SEIMC/RMC Network

The Special Education IMC/RMC Network presently consists of 13 regional Special Education Instructional Materials Centers (SEIMCs), four Regional Media Centers for the Deaf (RMCs), the CEC Information Center on Exceptional Children (an ERIC Clearinghouse), the Instructional Materials Reference Center at the American Printing House for the Blind (APHB), and the National Center for Educational Media and Materials for the Handicapped (NCEMMH). All are funded by the Bureau of Education for the Handicapped, US Office of Education, and share the common purpose to effect improved and innovative practices in the education of handicapped children through more appropriate use of instructional materials and media. (See Section I for individual descriptions of these components.)

Each regional SEIMC/RMC presently shares its responsibility of providing direct services to teachers with state- and locally-funded associate special education instructional materials centers (ASEIMCs), who are much closer in geographical proximity to the users of media and materials. The regional SEIMCs now devote increasing attention to cooperative relationships with state departments of education; their purpose is facilitating the development of intra-state associate center networks. In addition, the regional centers provide assistance to the ASEIMCs through consultation services and the development of in service training and information packages. Other ongoing SEIMC activities include product development, training in the use of media and materials, information, delivery, and regional-state program delivery. The ASEIMCs provide the majority of the Network's actual contact with special education teachers. They loan instructional materials, give media demonstrations, conduct workshops, provide consultation regarding instructional materials, provide information services, and assist in instructional materials development.

All four Regional Media Centers for the Deaf (RMCs) provide the same kind of services as do the Regional Instructional Materials Centers. The primary distinction between IMCs and RMCs is that the RMCs tailor their services to the specific needs of the deaf population within their respective regions. Although the RMC/IMC regions are not co-terminous, they do share many responsibilities and the same delivery system.

A complete listing of Regional Instructional Materials Centers, Associate Instructional Materials Centers, and Regional Media Centers for the Deaf in the Special Education IMC/RMC Network is included by state in Section III A. These addresses are only valid through August 1974.

#### B. First Chance Network

In recognition of the critical need for prototype projects, Congress enacted the Handicapped Children's Early Education Assistance Act in 1968. This Act authorized the development and operation of model preschool projects for children who suffer from physical, emotional, health impaired, and/or mental handicaps. These projects which are now widely scattered

across the country, are commonly and collectively referred to as the First Chance Network. Today, there are nearly 100 First Chance projects. All are administered by the Office of Education's Bureau of Education for the Handicapped.

First Chance projects provide direct service to children and demonstrate effective intervention approaches in assisting handicapped children during their early years. Diversity among projects has been encouraged so that models will be developed which are applicable to as many different handicapping conditions and environmental settings as possible. As a group, the projects provide services for the mentally retarded, hearing impaired, deaf, speech impaired, visually handicapped, seriously emotionally disturbed, crippled and other health impaired children who require special education and related services.

In addition to promoting diverse day to day intervention services for the young, First Chance projects are urged to emphasize parent and family involvement, engage in information dissemination and demonstration activities, coordinate comprehensive ventures with other agencies, and participate in broad-ranged program planning and evaluation strategies. Finally, each First Chance Project must be structured in a way that enables other communities to replicate or adopt exemplary programs or program components to meet their own needs.

The Technical Assistance Development System (TADS) provides a mix of broad program support and consultative services to the network. This system is a component of the Frank Porter Graham Child Development Center at the University of North Carolina. This Chapel Hill based service was established by the Bureau of Education for the Handicapped in 1971. It offers assistance in the areas of intervention, program planning and evaluation, and media and information.

#### C. Regional Resource Centers

The Regional Resource Centers, administered by the Educational Services Division, Bureau of Education for the Handicapped, provide advice and technical services for educators in the region to draw upon to improve the education of handicapped children. The primary task of these centers is to provide diagnostic evaluations of individual children and to develop a prescriptive educational program to meet the child's particular requirements. The staffs of these centers work closely with the handicapped child's parents and teachers. The centers provide support to local school systems and other government agencies by sponsoring periodic re-examinations and re-evaluations.

#### D. Deaf-Blind Centers

Ten Regional Centers for Deaf-Blind Children, each headed by a regional coordinator and providing services for five to seven states, were established under the provisions of P.L. 91-230, the Education of the Handicapped Act. Their services are offered "to children who have both auditory and visual impairments, the combination of which causes such severe communication and other developmental and educational problems that they cannot properly be

accommodated in special education programs either for the hearing handicapped child or for the visually handicapped child."

In addition, these centers are responsible for seeking out those deaf-blind children who are not receiving services, for developing consultation and training programs to help both parents and teachers understand and work with these children, and for promoting the development of new programs and services for deaf-blind children.

The regional centers are required to provide the following basic services: comprehensive and continuous diagnostic and evaluative services; education, adjustment, and orientation programs utilizing all professional and allied services required; and consultation for parents, teachers, and others who play a direct role in the lives of deaf-blind children. This consultation is to enable these persons to understand the special problems of such children and to assist in the education, adjustment, and orientation processes.

#### E. Research and Demonstration Centers

The Research and Demonstration Center effort monitored by the Division of Research, Bureau of Education for the Handicapped, has as its major objectives research, demonstration, and dissemination. These programs bring about a systematic attack on major problems which are otherwise approached by isolated research on a piecemeal basis.

#### F. Child Service Demonstration Program Grants

The Learning Disabilities Program in the Bureau of Education for the Handicapped, US Office of Education, was developed in order to implement Part C of Title VI, Public Law 91-230 (Education of the Handicapped Act), which was signed into law on April 13, 1970. The two components of the program presently are (a) The Child Service Demonstration Program Grant which enables a local district, private facility, university, or any agency serving children with learning disabilities to enter into a cooperative effort with the state education agency to develop and implement an exemplary model demonstration program and multiply it throughout the state and (b) The Leadership Training Institute Grant for the purpose of providing technical assistance to model programs.

To accomplish this national replication strategy, one grant in each state has been funded until all states have had the opportunity to develop model programs. Currently 44 states have received grants.

#### G. State Directors of Special Education

A state director of special education is a person employed by a state department of education who serves at the state level (including the District of Columbia, territories, and protectorates of the US) who has state-wide responsibility for administration, supervision, consultation or management of programs for exceptional children and youth. The duties of the state director will vary from state to state.

## H. National Center for Educational Research and Development

The National Center for Educational Research and Development, HEW, Office of Education, is sponsoring two large-scale efforts focusing on handicapped children.

1. The Center for Research and Development in the Early Education of Handicapped Children is located at the University of Oregon. The research efforts of the Center include identification, intervention, and dissemination. The major foci are early intervention and continuous evaluation. Implicit in such an approach is full recognition of the need for more relevant identification and diagnostic procedures of behavioral-cognitive deficits. (See Section III H.)
2. The Central Midwestern Regional Educational Laboratory, Inc., one of 11 Regional Education Laboratories funded by the Laboratory Branch, National Center for Educational Research and Development, is developing instructional systems for students with learning problems -- psychotic autistic children and hyperactive-hyperaggressive children. (See Section III H.)

## I. Rehabilitation Research and Training Centers

Rehabilitation Research and Training Centers are unique organizational and physical units established at universities which have the expertise and resources for multidisciplinary research and teaching. They function within an environment including the facets of services considered essential in carrying out a comprehensive program of patient/client care and rehabilitation.

The purpose of these centers is to provide a continuing coordinated framework for applied rehabilitation research aimed toward alleviating disability, reducing dependency, and formulating more effective and efficiently integrated rehabilitation service delivery systems. Through training programs rehabilitation education is incorporated into all rehabilitation related university curricula. These training programs will also facilitate short and long-term, in service, and continuing education; assist in training and increasing the number of professional and nonprofessional rehabilitation personnel; and widely disseminate and promote utilization of new knowledge resulting from research findings.

## J. Programs on Reading and Language Development for the Disadvantaged - Preschool and Special Education

These institutions play vital roles in improving the quality of education for all children, particularly those overlooked in the traditional classroom. These include children from poor, migrant, or culturally different families; children with special learning disabilities; children who learn at a slower or faster rate than the average; and children isolated in rural or inner city schools. #### K. University Affiliated Facilities

The program of Federal assistance for the construction of university affiliated facilities for the developmentally disabled is authorized by Public Law 88-164, The Mental Retardation Facilities Construction Act, as amended by the Developmental Disabilities Services and Facilities Construction Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-517). This program includes provision of grants for the construction of university affiliated facilities with programs for the developmentally disabled.

The University Affiliated Facilities and Technical Assistance Program, administered by the Division of Developmental Disabilities, Social and Rehabilitation Services, assists university affiliated facilities for persons who are developmentally disabled in the construction of special clinical facilities capable of offering exemplary care, treatment, education, and habilitation of the developmentally disabled.

The primary purpose of the University Affiliated Facilities Construction Program is to provide facilities for the clinical training of professional and technical personnel essential for diagnostic services and the care, education, training, and rehabilitation of the developmentally disabled individual and his family. Each facility is encouraged to conduct a comprehensive interdisciplinary training program integrating and coordinating the full range of professional and technical personnel concerned with developmental disabilities. This is so each discipline will be fully familiar with its own contributions and with those of related disciplines to the total effort in the field.

A full range of individual and group services and demonstration of new techniques and concepts in services for the developmentally disabled are considered important elements in university affiliated facility programs. Research incidental or related to activities conducted with the facilities is authorized.

#### L. Health Services Administration

##### 1. Maternal and Child Health Service

The Maternal and Child Health Service administers Federal funds which help initiate new services to improve the health of mothers and children, and to reach more youth and their families with health care of good quality. Its grant programs support the efforts of the states to fund (a) maternal and child health services and crippled children's services; (b) special projects which provide high quality maternity and infant care for low income mothers and infants who would not otherwise receive it; (c) special projects which make available preventive, diagnostic, and treatment services to pre-school and schoolage children in low income families; (d) research projects to find ways of improving health services through better coordination of effort and through utilizing new knowledge; and (e) the training of health workers in many fields.

The consultants of the Maternal and Child Health Service are available to help states expand their efforts on behalf of mothers and children. They also work with universities and schools that provide training in health fields. Through consultation, conferences on a national and regional basis, and through its publications, the Service tries to keep information flowing to those who work for better health for mothers and children.

## 2. Crippled Children's State Agencies

It was not until the Social Security Act was passed in 1935 that the Federal government began providing annual grants to the states to help them "extend and improve (especially in rural areas and in areas suffering from severe economic distress)...services for locating, and for medical, surgical, corrective, and other services and care and facilities for diagnosis, hospitalization, and aftercare for children who are crippled or who are suffering from conditions which lead to crippling." Now every state has a crippled children's agency, usually located in the state capital. (See III L for complete listing.)

Every agency tries to locate crippled children (or those who may have conditions leading to crippling); see that their conditions are diagnosed; and then see that each child gets the medical and other health related care, hospitalization, and continuing followup that he needs. After a child is examined and the doctors, nurses, and others have learned what they can about his condition and his family situation, they advise the parents about the treatment that will benefit the child and help them, when such aid is desired, find the right kind of treatment and care.

In order to protect the interests of all children in this program, the states must follow certain policies set forth by the Maternal and Child Health Service:

1. The state must assure a reasonably high standard for personnel and facilities.
2. Health services of crippled children's programs must be under the direction of a physician.
3. When a state agency assumes responsibility for treatment of a child, it is expected to work out a well rounded plan of care.
4. Every state must provide diagnostic services without charge to the children who are brought to its crippled children clinics.

Since care of a handicapped child may be a financial burden greater than the parents can bear, the agency will help parents with financial planning and may assume part or all of the cost of care, depending on the child's condition and the family's resources.

## M. Community Facilities for the Mentally Retarded

The Community Facilities Construction Program was authorized under Title I, Part C of the Mental Retardation Facilities and Community Mental Health Centers Construction Act of 1963 (Public Law 88-164) and provided Federal grants to states to assist in the construction of specially designed public or other nonprofit facilities for the diagnosis, treatment, education, training, or personal care of the mentally retarded. This includes sheltered workshops which are part of the facilities providing comprehensive services. The Developmental Disabilities Services and Facilities Construction Act of 1970 (Title I, Public Law 91-517), replaces the authority of Title I, Part C, Public Law 88-164.

The Community Facilities for the Mentally Retarded Program is administered at the state level by an officially designated state agency. Participation in the program requires the development of a state plan for the construction of community facilities for the mentally retarded based on an inventory of needed additional services and facilities. Construction projects are approved in accordance with the provisions of the state plan.

N. Federally Funded Community Mental Health Centers

The Community Mental Health Centers Act (P.L. 88-164), as amended, authorized Federal grants for the construction of community mental health centers.

An operating community mental health center provides a comprehensive, coordinated program of mental health services located in one or more facilities in the community. Whether the services are offered at one or more locations, they comprise a unified program permitting continuity of patient care.

O. Executive Directors of State Associations for Retarded Children (NARC)

Executive directors of state associations for retarded children have primary responsibility for coordinating all statewide activities for associations for retarded children. They are also responsible for direct dealings with the responsible state agency that operates programs for mentally retarded individuals.

There are over 1,500 local associations for retarded children, many of which provide direct programming for retarded persons and employ professional staffs. To contact these organizations, please contact the state executive director in that state for names, addresses, and phone numbers. (These state NARC directors are listed in Section III.)

U. Developmental Disabilities Formula Grant Program

Part C of the Developmental Disabilities Services and Facilities Construction Act authorizes formula grants to states for planning, administration, services, and construction of facilities for developmentally disabled persons. The Act provides for the comingling of funds under this program with those of other state programs in health, welfare, education, and rehabilitation.

The formula grant program operates through two mechanisms: State Planning and Advisory Councils and Designated State Agencies. Use of funds for the support of services is designed to fill gaps in the existing service structure in the state and for expansion to groups of the developmentally disabled, including preschool children, not now receiving services.

"Services" means specialized service or special adaptations of generic services directed toward the alleviation of a developmental disability or toward the social, personal, physical, or economic habilitation or rehabilitation of the disability. Section III U of the Directory contains a state by state entry of the staff coordinator for the Developmental Disabilities Program.
