AN INDEX TO YOUNG READERS' COLLECTIVE BIOGRAPHIES: ELEMENTARY AND JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL LEVEL. Bowker, 1970. \$12.75.

Section one contains an alphabetical listing of biographies; section two is a subject listing. Indexes of subject headings and books by title are included. This volume provides a good reference lesson for children, offering practice in library skills, how to use an index, and preparation for using *The Reader's Guide*.

THIRD BOOK OF JUNIOR AUTHORS. Wilson, 1972. \$10.50.

Continues the work of **THE JUNIOR BOOK OF AUTHORS**, 1951, and **MORE JUNIOR AUTHORS**, 1963. Articles are written by authors and illustrators themselves, with personally signed photographs. Sound selection of 255 entries made based on careful reviews. Index includes entries in first two companion volumes. Library should have all three if size of collection and budget allow.

DICTIONARIES

AMERICAN HERITAGE SCHOOL DICTIONARY. American Heritage Pub. and Houghton, 1972. \$4.50. (Grades 3-9.)

Has interesting introductory sections on how the dictionary was put together and how to use it. The pronunciation guide is exceptionally lucid. Down the center of each page is a yellow panel with pictures (unfortunately, not always useful), extended definitions or short discussions of the words.

THE CHARLIE BROWN DICTIONARY. Based on the **RAINBOW DICTIONARY**. World Publishing: Times Mirror, 1973. \$6.95.

New in both illustration and definitions, but vocabulary remains same as in **THE RAINBOW**

DICTIONARY. All the "Peanuts" characters are aboard. The 2,400 entries based on popular usage have pictures illustrating meaning, simple explanations, use of words in sentence with additional facts given to clarify meaning such as a synonymous word, or the use of the word with its antonym. Youngsters will enjoy using this dictionary.

WEBSTER'S INTERMEDIATE DICTIONARY; A NEW SCHOOL DICTIONARY. American Book Co., 1972. \$6.50.

Based on citation files used for **WEBSTER'S THIRD NEW INTERNATIONAL DICTIONARY** and **WEBSTER'S SEVENTH COLLEGIATE DICTIONARY**. Contains 58,000 entries including new words such as dashiki, skyjacker, ecosystem; and conversion tables for the metric system. Two-color format used in illustrations and pronunciation guide in blue on each page enhance the format.

XEROX INTERMEDIATE DICTIONARY. Grosset and Dunlap and Xerox, 1972. \$7.95. Also published as **GINN'S INTERMEDIATE DICTIONARY**.

The Xerox dictionary has readable introductory articles, with an especially effective explanation of the parts of an entry in the dictionary. The lack of word derivations is not corrected by the inclusion of a general article on Latin and Greek roots, however well written. But entries are up-to-date and include regionalisms, always fun to come upon while browsing.

This set is primarily for browsing and reading aloud, stimulating interests, stirring imaginations, and providing enriching experiences.

Chronologically arranged verses written for children, spanning 500 years from Chaucer to Ogden. Authors and sources are given in Appendix. A useful reference for teachers, rather than for children but teacher might use contents with children.

Fifty sports are presented with history, rules, tips on playing, and illustrative material. Good companion volume to **THE JUNIOR ILLUSTRATED ENCYCLOPEDIA OF SPORTS** reviewed below.

Bessie Jones and Bess Lomax Hawes. **STEP-IT DOWN: GAMES, PLAYS, SONGS AND STORIES FROM THE AFRO-AMERICAN HERITAGE.** Harper, 1972. \$10.00.

Annotations, notes to scholars, selected bibliographies and discography add to value of this collection for parents and teachers. Recommendation not limited to inner-city uses.

This volume, containing over 1,000 entries on plants, animals, and earth science, is designed for early elementary grades with simple language, narrative style, large type, and colorful illustrations.

Profusely and extravagantly illustrated, the photography is superb, the print and paper quality superior. Maps are simple but colorful, contemporary but clear.

THE ILLUSTRATED ENCYCLOPEDIA OF THE ANIMAL KINGDOM. 20 vols. Grolier, 1972. \$99.50.

Offers one whole volume (v. 20) on endangered species, information not available in other encyclopedias examined. Some sections, such as the one on Mammals and Reptiles, have helpful geographical map inserts locating species on projection and information on natural habitat.

SCIENCE YEAR: THE WORLD BOOK SCIENCE ANNUAL 1974. Field, 1973. \$5.95.

Provides "Special Reports," an in-depth treatment of timely scientific topics; "Science File," briefer articles on recent advances alphabetically arranged by subject matter; and a section on

"Men and Women of Science." A Special Feature on "How Dogs Communicate" includes an insert of two stereo records on the sounds that canids make — a novel feature which may present maintenance problems.

SOCIAL SCIENCE

Lavinia Dobler. **NATIONAL HOLIDAYS AROUND THE WORLD. II.** and designed by Vivian Browne. Fleet, 1968. \$6.50.

Arranged chronologically by month of year then by country. Gives dates on which various nations won their independence, location of each, title of national anthems, description of flags explaining meaning of colors and symbols. Brief statement is made about struggle for independence of each nation and its important leaders.

Robert B. Konikow. **DISCOVER HISTORIC AMERICA.** Rand, McNally, 1973. \$8.95.

Sub-title: New, complete directory to America's most precious landmarks — historic sites, battlefields, homes, museums, shrines in all 50 states. Latest Rand McNally Road Maps are included. Arranged by section of country, states within sections. The illustrations, in color, reproduce early paintings, drawings, and photographs. Maps are indexed. An attractive, colorful volume with brief text.

William Lerner. **POCKET DATA BOOK, U. S. A. 1971.** U. S. Government Printing Office, 1971. \$1.75.

Handily condensed data from the Statistical Abstract of the United States, Summary Section, are given in graphic form. Statistical data such as population, vital statistics, area and climate, government, elections, manufacturers, money, transportation, communications and foreign commerce are included. Convenient, small size and reasonable price plus wealth of information add up to recommendation for purchase.

Robert J. Myers. **CELEBRATIONS: THE COMPLETE BOOK OF AMERICAN HOLIDAYS. II.** by Bill Greer. Doubleday, 1972. \$8.95.
