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ABSTRACT

Based on the March 1973 survey for the Bureau of Labor Statistics by the Division of Labor Force Studies, the report shows that the proportion of workers employed full-time all year (1972) increased, mainly because of expansion in the service-producing industries. The survey provides information on the number of persons who worked at some time, the number of weeks they were employed, the industry and occupation at which they worked the longest, the number who were unemployed for a week or more during the year, and the number of weeks they were unemployed. In addition to the report, a 63-page appendix offers an explanatory note defining basic labor force concepts, sample design, estimating methods, reliability of data, supplementary tables detailing statistical information from the March 1972 survey, and 27 supplementary tables describing March 1971 figures. Topics dealt with include work experience and unemployment statistics by age, sex, race, and marital status. A major finding of the survey was that service industries accounted for the greatest proportion of the over-the-year increase in the number employed at year-round full time jobs--85 percent of the increase among women and 20 percent of the rise among men.

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

NINETY-SEVEN MILLION Americans worked at some time during 1972, according to the 1973 survey of the work experience of the population. This compares with the almost 82 million persons employed during an average month that year. Since the proportion of the population who worked in 1972 was the same as in 1971, the 2-million increase over the 1971 level reflected normal population gains.

The survey also showed that the number of workers who were unemployed at some time during 1972—15.3 million—was more than three times the number found unemployed in an average month during that year (4.8 million). The 15.3 million out of work at some time during 1972 were 565,000 fewer than in 1971, despite the large increase in the annual work force, reflecting the more robust performance of the economy in 1972.

The proportion of workers employed at least 50 weeks at full-time jobs increased, particularly for white men and for Negro men and women.¹ The increase in steady employment and the decline in unemployment among men resulted mainly from rapid growth in the service-producing industries, though there was some expansion in the goods-producing industries hardest hit during the 1970-71 recession.

This article is based on the March 1973 survey of the work experience of the civilian population in 1972—a unique measure of labor force activity during the course of an entire year.² The survey provides information on the number of persons who worked at some time, the number of weeks they were employed, the industry and occupation at which they worked the longest, the number who were unemployed for a week or more during the year, and the number of weeks they were unem-

ployed whether in one continuous period or in multiple spells.

Employment

Reflecting substantial increases in demand and output, the number of persons who worked at some time during the year increased by 2 million during 1972. The increase was concentrated among workers under 35 years old and reflected gains in population and in the labor force activity of men 20 to 24 and women 20 to 34. (See table 1.) On the other hand, 360,000 fewer persons 35 and over worked during the year, in part because of reduced labor force activity among men 55 and over.

While 2 out of 3 persons 16 years old and over worked at some time during 1972, the proportion varied widely among men and women, young and old, and whites and blacks. Among men, 80 percent worked during the year—rising from nearly 60 percent of boys 16 to 17 years old to 97 percent of men 25 to 44 years old. In each group over 44, the proportion declined as some men became physically unable to work or retired, reaching a low of 34 percent among men 65 and over.

Relatively fewer Negro than white men in each age group worked during the year, except among those 65 and over where the rates were not statistically different. (See table 2.) Among possible reasons for the lower proportion of Negro men with work experience are the greater incidence of disabling illness among Negro men³ and difficulties in the job market.

A smaller percentage of women than of men in each age group worked during the year and the pattern of the percentages was different from that for men. Slightly more than half of all women were employed at some time during 1972, with the proportion rising from about 44 percent for girls 16 and 17 years old to a peak of 73 percent for

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Occupational comparisons. During 1972, year-round full-time employment rose by almost half a million each among male managers or administrators and craftsmen. Steady employment among male operatives (except transport) also increased substantially. Women posted gains over the year in year-round steady work in the professional and technical field, as managers and administrators, and in service occupations.


Stability of employment differs widely by occupation. As might be expected, among men, managers and administrators were the most likely to have worked year round full time. (See chart 1.) Laborers had the lowest proportion of steady workers among their number.

The lower proportion of women than of men who worked all year at full-time jobs reflects to some extent the fact that many women choose to work at part-time jobs. Among women employed as managers or as professional and technical workers, well over half worked year round full time and less than one-fifth worked part time. On the other hand, in

six occupational groups—service (except private household), transport equipment operatives, non-farm laborers, sales, farm laborers, and private household workers—fewer than one-third of the women workers were employed all year at full-time jobs, and in the last four occupations, the proportion who worked part time was 2 to 3 times the percentage who worked all year at full-time jobs.

Year-round full-time employment within the various occupational groups also reveals some differences in the proportions of white and Negro men and women with steady employment. Among craftsmen, a somewhat higher proportion of whites worked year round full time, while among transport equipment operatives, almost three fourths of blacks compared to about two-thirds of whites worked all year at full-time jobs. Among nonfarm laborers, half of the Negro men worked year round full time compared to somewhat over a third of the white men. Among the women, a higher proportion of the blacks than of whites worked year round full time as professional and technical workers and in sales and

service occupations. The higher proportions for Negro women reflect to some extent their greater tendency to be in the labor force all year. For example, among women who worked in 1972, 64 percent of the Negro women but only 58 percent of the white women were in the labor force all year.

Unemployment

The 15.3 million persons who were unemployed at some time in 1972 was over half a million fewer than in 1971 even though the total work force increased substantially. (See table 3.) The total with some unemployment included 13.2 million who

worked for varying lengths of time and 2.1 million who did not work at all but did look for it at some time during the year. The lower number of total unemployed was the first over-the-year decrease in this category since 1968 and occurred almost entirely among white men 35 and over. Among women, a decrease in joblessness among those 35 and over was matched by an increase among those 20 to 34. Among Negro men and women, the number out of work at some time remained virtually unchanged between 1971 and 1972. The *numerical* decrease in persons unemployed at some time during 1972 was accompanied by a decrease in the *proportion* unemployed at some time during the year—15.4 per-

cent compared with 16.3 percent in 1971. About equal proportions of men and women were unemployed in 1972 and the rates for each age group generally were unchanged. However, 20 percent of women looked for work for at least a week during the year but did not find any, compared with 8 percent of men.

Among both men and women, those under 25 had the highest proportion experiencing unemployment in 1972. These young workers included many who had recently completed their schooling and were entering the job market for the first time on a permanent basis. Such new labor force entrants often go through periods of joblessness before finding suitable employment: 3 out of 10 of those 18 and 19 years old and over 1 in 4 of those 20 to 24 who worked or looked for work had some unemployment. However, the duration of unemployment among these persons tends to be shorter than among older workers.

Because of job tenure and seniority, workers over 45 years old are least likely to be jobless. However, when they do become unemployed, they are likely to be out of work longer than younger workers; for example, in 1972, 41 percent of all unemployed workers 45 and over who were unemployed were out of work for a total of 15 weeks or more, compared with 30 percent of workers under 45. Geographic immobility, employer biases, and obsolete skills of older workers may be factors that aggravate the problems of finding new employment.

Proportionately more Negro than white workers continued to experience unemployment in 1972. Of blacks who worked or looked for work, 22.3 percent were jobless at some time during the year compared with 14.6 percent of whites. Among young workers 16 to 19 and 20 to 24 years of age, the proportions with unemployment were half again as high for blacks as for whites, about 38 and 25 percent, respectively, in both age groups. Among older workers, proportions were lower for both whites and blacks and the differences between the two groups smaller for all age groups except women 55 to 64 years old.

Both the number and proportion of persons with 15 weeks or more of unemployment declined in 1972 compared with 1971, the first decline since 1968. The change occurred entirely among part-year workers; the number of those who never found a job but who looked for work at least 15 weeks was the same as a year earlier. The decrease was also

primarily among white men, although white women 25 to 44 years old also showed improvement. Among blacks, there was no change in the number of workers with 15 weeks or more of unemployment.

About one third of all persons with some unemployment in 1972 were out of work 15 weeks or more, a somewhat lower proportion than a year earlier but much higher than the approximately one-fifth with long-term unemployment in the late 1960's. Over two-fifths of blacks compared with a third of whites were out of work 15 weeks or more.

Industry and occupation. Among all industry groups, construction and lumber and wood products had the highest proportions of workers with some unemployment, 29.4 and 22.6 percent, respectively, while workers in public administration had the lowest, 6.4 percent. Within most industries, the proportion of workers with unemployment remained about the same in 1972 as in 1971. However, among workers in the primary metal industry, the proportion decreased by almost 6 percentage points to 16.3 percent as production in that durable goods industry increased rapidly over the year. Unemployment was also lower than a year earlier among workers in non-durable goods manufacturing. The two industries which include about half of all persons working at some time during 1972, trade and service, also accounted for half of persons out of work during the year. The proportions experiencing unemployment in these two industries, 16.2 and 11.6 percent, respectively, were not significantly different from a year earlier.

In almost every industry, at least a third of those with unemployment were out of work for a total of 15 weeks or more. The proportion was over 40 percent among workers in food and kindred products, business and repair services, and private households.

Among the broad occupational groups, the proportion experiencing joblessness was unchanged for men over the year. About a fourth of male nonfarm laborers and operatives (except transport) were out of work at some time during 1972—the highest proportion among men—while a tenth of male managers and professionals—a high rate for such a highly trained group—had similar experience. Among women, those going through one or more spells of joblessness fell significantly only among operatives (except transport)—from 26 to 21 percent, still the highest proportion for all major occupational groups. The proportion of women profes-

sional and technical workers who were out of work during 1972 continued at the high level of 9 percent, to which it had climbed in 1971. However, that rate was lower than in most other occupational groups.

Spells of unemployment. In both 1972 and 1971, about a third of persons who worked and experienced unemployment had more than one spell of joblessness. Among those with 15 weeks or more of joblessness, half accumulated it in one spell. The decrease in the number of men out of work at some time in 1972 occurred among those with less than 3 spells of joblessness; the number with 3 spells or more was about the same as a year earlier. The highest proportions of workers with 3 spells or more were among men who worked as carpenters, other construction workers, and as farm and non-farm laborers, and among women who were operatives (except transport) or private household workers. The frequency of unemployment was unchanged for women.

Married women's work experience

The continuing significant change in the employment status of married women can be traced in this most recent survey of work experience. Over 23 million married women⁴ worked in 1972. They constituted almost one-fourth of all workers and three-fifths of women who worked. The proportion of married women who worked at some time during the year has risen from 48.3 percent in 1967 to 50.6 percent in 1972. (See table 4.)

Fifty-seven percent of mothers of children 6 to 17 years old worked at some time during 1972 compared with 45 percent of those with children 5 and under, demonstrating once more that the presence and age of children are major influences on whether

a married woman seeks paid employment and particularly on her availability for year-round full-time work. Women with older children are also more apt to work full time all year—41 percent compared with 26 percent. Regardless of age, married women who have no children under 18 are most likely to work during the year, but as a group their labor force participation rate is only about 50 percent because a large proportion are in the older groups where rates begin to decline.

White and Negro wives have, historically, had different patterns of employment and exhibit quite different trends in recent years. Since 1967, the proportion of white wives having some work experience has increased significantly, regardless of the age of their children. Among Negro wives, on the other hand, there has been no significant change in the proportion with work experience but the proportion was higher than that for whites in 1967 and remained higher in 1972.

When the extent of year-round full-time work is examined, a reverse pattern is found. In 1967,

roughly equal proportions (41 percent) of Negro and white wives with some work experience had worked all year at full-time jobs. By 1972, the proportion for Negro wives, at 51 percent, was 10 percentage points higher than that for white wives. The relative stability of the percentage among white women who did not want to work a full week all year may be explained by family responsibilities, better family financial position, or other reasons. Some of the increase in steady work among Negro women, whether married or not, undoubtedly reflects an increase in educational attainment and a rise in the proportion of young women in clerical and professional occupations in part because of an easing of racial barriers. Year-round full-time work for Negro women is much more prevalent among those who work as professionals or clerks than among those in private household and other service occupations. For example, in 1972, of the Negro women who worked in professional occupations, 65 percent worked all year full time compared with 29 percent of those in private household work.

Wives who worked in 1972 had median earnings of \$3,682. About one-third earned less than \$2,000, and one-third earned \$5,000 or more. (See table 5.) Among wives who worked year round full time, average earnings were much higher, \$6,005, and two-thirds of them earned \$5,000 or more. Women heads of family averaged \$4,144 a year, somewhat higher than the average for wives, but the proportions earning less than \$3,000, or \$5,000 or more, were about the same as for wives. Female heads working all year full time had about the same average earnings (\$5,964) as the comparable group of wives, and their earnings distribution was similar.

Wives who worked in 1972 contributed a median

of 27 percent to family income, compared with 64 percent by working women who were family heads. (See table 6.) Furthermore, while only about 1 in 10 working wives contributed 75 percent or more of her family's income, 4 out of 10 women family heads who worked in 1972 provided that much. The higher proportion contributed by women family heads is a function of the generally lower family income of families headed by women, not a reflection of higher earnings.

Employed wives of older workers were much more likely than those of workers under age 25 to have worked year round full time. Among wives who worked all year full time, those with husbands in the prime working ages of 25 to 54 contributed proportionately somewhat less to family income than did wives of younger or older workers, partly reflecting the higher income levels of men in the central age brackets rather than lower earnings of the wives.

Earnings of married women employed all year at usually full-time jobs varied widely by occupation as shown in table 7. Three out of four women who were professional or technical workers earned at least \$7,000. Although, in most occupations, median earnings of married women were about the same as for single women if both worked year round full time, married women who were managers earned over \$2,500 less than single women pursuing a career in management. One reason for the difference could be that the single women have been on the job longer and therefore may have more responsible positions.⁵ The largest proportion of married women who worked all year full time were in clerical jobs, 38 percent, and had median earnings about midway between those of women professional and women blue-collar workers. Those who were private household workers had the lowest median earnings. □

¹Data for the category "Negro and other races" is used to represent Negro workers though the data include other minority races. Blacks constitute about 89 percent of the larger group.

²The annual survey of the work experience of the population during a given year is made in March of the following year. The information obtained relates to the civilian work experience of all persons 16 years old and over in the civilian noninstitutional population as of the March date. Thus, the work experience of persons who were in the civilian labor force during 1972 but not in the civilian noninstitutional population as of March 1973 is not included; similarly, data on persons who died during the course of 1972 or in 1973 before the survey date are also not reflected. On the other hand, those persons who reached 16 during January, February, and March 1973 are included. The data are compiled from supplementary questions in the March 1973 monthly survey of the labor force, conducted for the Bureau of Labor Statistics by the Bureau of the Census through its Current Population Survey.

This is the latest in a series of reports on this subject.

Data from the March 1971 survey were published in the *Monthly Labor Review*, December 1971, pp. 35-44, and reprinted with additional tabular data and explanatory notes as Special Labor Force Report 141. 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Explanatory note

ESTIMATES in this report are based on supplementary questions in the March 1973 Current Population Survey conducted and tabulated for the Bureau of Labor Statistics by the Bureau of the Census. Basic labor force concepts, sample design, estimating methods, and reliability of the data are described briefly in the following sections.¹

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Population Coverage . Each month trained interviewers collect information from a sample of about 47,000 households in 461 areas in 923 counties and independent cities with coverage in each of the 50 States and the District of Columbia. Estimates in this report are for persons 16 years of age and over in the civilian noninstitutional population during the calendar week ending March 17, 1973. The civilian noninstitutional population excludes all members of the Armed Forces and inmates of institutions, such as homes for the aged and correctional institutions. All persons were asked how many weeks they worked and whether they looked for work during 1972. Persons who worked less than 50 weeks were asked detailed questions on reasons for part-year work and whether they had more than one period of unemployment.

Work Experience . Persons with work experience are those who worked as civilians at any time during the year at full-time or part-time jobs.

Part-Time and Full-Time Jobs . Persons are classified as having worked at full-time jobs if they worked 35 hours or more per week in a majority of the weeks worked during the year. They are classified as having worked at part-time jobs if they worked 1 to 34 hours per week in a majority of the weeks worked during the year. In tables E-1 and E-2, persons are classified as full-time or part-time workers in accordance with the number of hours they usually work each week at the job held during the survey week in March 1973.

Weeks Worked . Persons with work experience are classified according to the number of weeks in which they did any work during the year as civilians for pay or profit (including paid vacations and sick leave) or worked without pay on a family-operated farm or business.

Year-Round Full-Time Workers . Year-round full-time workers are persons who worked primarily at full-time jobs for 50 weeks or more.

Part-Year Workers . Part-year workers are persons who worked either full time or part time for 1 to 49 weeks.

Major Reason for Part-Year Work . Part-year workers are classified by major reason for part-year work on the basis of what they were doing most of the weeks in which they did not work. Their reasons are reported as unemployment or layoff from a job, illness or disability (not including paid sick leave), taking care of home, going to school, retirement, in the Armed Forces, and other reasons. The "going to school" category was restricted to persons under 30 years of age, "taking care of home" was restricted to women, and "in the Armed Forces" was restricted to men.

Nonworkers. Nonworkers are persons who did not work during the year. They are asked whether they looked for work during the year and, if they looked, for how many weeks. Nonworkers are classified according to the main reason for not working. Their reasons are reported as illness or disability, taking care of home, going to school, inability to find work, retired, in the Armed Forces, and other reasons.

Longest Job. A person's longest job during the year is the one at which he worked the greatest number of weeks. For most wage and salary workers, a job is defined as all the time worked for the same employer. The only exception is work for private families (domestic service, babysitting, odd jobs and the like) which is counted as a single job regardless of number of employers. Self-employment and unpaid work in family-operated enterprises are also designated as jobs for purposes of this survey.

Occupation, Industry, and Class of Worker . The data on occupation, industry, and class of worker refer to the job held longest during the year. Persons who held two jobs or more are reported in the job at which they worked the greatest number of weeks.

The occupation and industry categories used here are those used in the 1970 Census of Population. The class-of-worker breakdown specifies "wage and salary workers," "self-employed workers," and "unpaid family workers." Wage and salary workers are persons working for a wage, salary, commission, tips, payment in kind, or at piece rates for a private employer or any government unit. Self-employed workers are persons working in their own unincorporated business, profession, or trade, or operating a farm for profit or fees. Unpaid family workers are persons working without pay on a farm or in a business operated by a member of the household to whom they are related by blood or marriage.

Spell of Unemployment . A spell of unemployment is a continuous period of unemployment of at least one week's duration. A spell is terminated by employment or withdrawal from the labor force.

Duration of Unemployment . The number of weeks accumulated in all spells of unemployment represents the total number of weeks of unemployment during the year.

Employed in March 1973 . Employed persons are all those who during the survey week (a) did any work at all as paid employees or in their own business or profession, or on their own farm, or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in an enterprise operated by a member of the family or (b) did not work but had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent because of illness, bad weather, vacation, labor-management dispute, or personal reasons, whether or not they were paid by their employers for the time off, and whether or not they were seeking other jobs.

Unemployed in March 1973. Unemployed persons are all those who did not work during the survey week, made specific efforts to find a job within the preceding 4 weeks, and were available for work during the survey week or would have been available except for temporary illness. Also included as unemployed are those who did not work at all, were available for work, and (a) were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off, or (b) were waiting to report to a new wage or salary job within 30 days.

Civilian Labor Force in March 1973 . The civilian labor force comprises all civilian persons classified as employed or unemployed according to the above definitions.

Not in Civilian Labor Force in March 1973 . Persons not classified as employed or unemployed are defined as not in the labor force. Persons doing only incidental unpaid family work (less than 15 hours) are also classified as not in the labor force.

Age . The age classification is based on the age of the person at his last birthday.

Race . The population is divided into three groups on the basis of race: white, Negro, and "other races." The last category includes American Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and any other race except Negro and white.

Marital Status . Persons are classified into the following categories according to their marital status at the time of interview: Single, married, spouse present, and other marital status. The classification "married, spouse present" applies to husband and wife if both are reported as members of the same household even though one may be temporarily absent on business, vacation, on a visit, in a hospital, and the like at the time of interview. The term "other marital status" applies to persons who are married with spouse absent, widowed, or divorced.

Sums of Distributions. Sums of individual items, whether absolute numbers or percentages, may not equal totals because of independent rounding of totals and components. Percentage totals, however, are always shown as 100 percent.

RELIABILITY OF THE ESTIMATES

Estimating Procedure. The estimating procedure used in this survey inflates weighted sample results to independent estimates of the civilian non-institutional population by age, sex, and race. These independent estimates were based on statistics from the 1970 Census of Population and other data on births, deaths, immigration, emigration, and strength of the Armed Forces.

Variability. Since the estimates are based on a sample, they may differ somewhat from the figures that would have been obtained if a complete census had been taken using the same schedules and procedures. As in any survey, the results are also subject to errors of response and reporting. These may be relatively large in the case of persons with irregular attachment to the labor force.

The standard error is primarily a measure of sampling variability, that is, of the variations that might occur by chance because a sample rather than the entire population is surveyed. As calculated for this report, the standard error also partially measures the effect of response and enumeration errors but does not measure any systematic biases in the data. The chances are about 2 out of 3 that an estimate from the sample would differ from a complete census by less than the standard error. The chances are about 19 out of 20 that the difference would be less than twice the standard error.

Tables 1 and 2 show approximations of the standard errors of various characteristics and should be interpreted as providing an indication of the order of magnitude of the standard error rather than a precise standard error for any specific item.

The following examples illustrate their use. An estimated 15,287,000 persons 16 years old and over were unemployed at some time in 1972. Table 1 shows the standard error on this estimate to be approximately 162,000. The chances are about 2 out of 3 that the difference between the sample estimate and a complete census count would be less than 162,000. The chances are 19 out of 20 that the difference would have been less than 324,000.

The 15,287,000 persons represented 15.4 percent of the 99,029,000 people 16 years old and over in the labor force at some time in 1972.

Table 2 shows the standard error of 15.4 percent with a base of 99, 029, 000 to be about 0.2 percent. Consequently, the chances are 2 out of 3 that a complete census would have disclosed the figures to be between 15.2 and 15.6 percent, and 19 out of 20 that the figure would have been between 15.0 and 15.8 percent.

The reliability of an estimated percentage that is based on sample data for both numerator and denominator depends on both the size of the percentage and the size of the total upon which the percentage is based. Estimated percentages are relatively more reliable than the corresponding absolute estimates of the numerator of the percentage, particularly if the percentage is large (50 percent or greater).
