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## I.NTRODUCTION

Knowledge of the population characteristics of rural youth in the Southwestern atates ${ }^{2 /}$-- sometimes referred to as "the Southwest"-- is necessarily required in order to locate these persons and deal with the isaues related to their education, migration, employment, voting behavior and general life style. One essential step in the direction of attaining such knowledge is the compilation of available information from the various sources containing it, such as the census reports prepared for the individual states.

This report represents an effort to bring together such scattered Information regarding the rural youth of the Southwestern states, and to offer a packet of data ready for the use of potential consumers -educators, policy makers, researchers and others.

By means of presenting a handy source of data relative to the age structure and ethnic and geographical distribution of rural persons under 25 years of age in five fouthwestern states, this effort aims to answer some of the demand for such relevant information existing throughout the region.

All data have been extracted from reports of the 1970 U.S. Census of Population. 3/
${ }^{2}$ The "Southwestern states" are defined as the five states of Arizona, California. Colorado, New Mexico and iexas because the U.S. Bureau of the Census adopted a special definition of the "Spanish heritaye" population that is used only in these five states. This is the largest area with the same basis of identifying this major ethnic group, variously known as Chicann, Mexican American or Spanish American.

## OBJECTIVE, CONIENT AND ORGANIZATION

The principal objective of thia report is to present selected data on certain population characteristics of persons under 25 years of age living in the rural areas ${ }^{4 /}$ of five Southwestern states -- Arizona, Californiz, Colorado, New lexico and Texas. For the purpose of the report, these persons will be referred to as the "rural youth" of these states. Among these youth, some were born during the decade of relatively high birth rates which followed the end of World War II, and others may reflect more recent changes in the characterlstics of the pupulation in the Southwestern region.

The data presenter here deal specifically with the distribution of rural youth by state, the various age groups by sex, and their racial composition. Some specific. information is provided regarding rural youth of "Spanish Heritage" ${ }^{\text {5/ }}$ in the Southwest, a sizeable component of the population in this specific region; and regarding rural "Native American"// youth in these states, who constitute a substantial proportion of the national Native American youth.

The data presented here have been extracted from the 1970 U.S. Census of Population reports. Compact tables were prepared from information contained in the Final Reports for the individual states (See References). Comparative figures were extracted from the tables of absilute numbers and reported here.

[^0]The report is organized into two basic sections. The first of these contains the analytical text, and the second section presents detailed tables of information by state. The analytical text concerns itself with (a) a brief treatment of the youth of the Southwest, (b) a brief atatement on the rural population of this region, (c) the rural youth -- persons under 25 years of age - - of the five Southwestern states, (d) some information regarding the rural Spanish Heritage youth of the region, which makes up a substantial proportion of all Southwestern youth and (e) a short review of available information regarding the distribution of rural Native American youth in the area. The tabular section assembles numerical data regarding rural youth by state, gex, racial or ethnic categories, and age groups. This tabular section comprises the detailed data packet which is fundamental to the objective of the report.

An appendix provides the definitions of technical terms used throughout the report.
analytical tlext

The following pages contain the analytical text of this report, organized into (A) a statement on the youth of the Southwestern region, (B) a short treatment of the rural population. (C) the rural youth proper - persons under 25 years of age - (L. some information on the general distribution of the rural Spanish heritage youth by state, and (E) the rural Native American youth of the Southwest. Tables are inserted to document the textual information. Part $F$ summarizes the findings reported here.

## A. THE YOITH OF THE SOUTHNEST

In 1970 there were more than 16.9 mil.1ion persons under 25 years of age in the Southwest. This total number represents almost half 46.8 percent - of the overall population of the region (See Tables A-1, A-2). Of all youth under $25,87.6$ percent were classified as "White"; 8.9 percent as "Rlack", and over a fifth of them were included in the "Spanish horitage" category: 2.1.2 percent.

Of the entire White population of the five Jouthwestern states, 46.0 percent is reported to be under 25 years of age. For the Black group, the corresponding proportion is slightiy higher: 51.7 percent, whereas for the Spanish heritage population, the figure rises to 57.9 percent, almost three-fifths of the total (See Table $\Lambda-3$ ).

A subdivision of these gronps of youth by more specific age levels reveals variations in the proportions of persons in each level by ethnic or racial background. Tn general, there tends to be a higher proportion of the total in each age level within the Spanish heritage population. There
is also evidence of difter:ences in these proportions by sex within each group (Sare Tahile A-3).

## B. THE RURMI POPULATION OF THE SOUTHWEST

The aggregate rural population of the five Southwestern states represented a total of $5,226,188$ persons in 1970. This figure corresgonds to almost a sixth of all persons in the region, and it represents 9.7 percent of all rural persons in the United States.

Of all rural persons in the Southwest, 91.0 percent were categorized as "White," indicating siightly over 4.7 million persons, 5.2 peratiat were classified as "Black," and 16.5 percent were included in the "Spanish heritage" category (See Tables $B-1$ and $B-2$ ). For information on the Nat:lve American sector, see Tables VIII and XI.

The geographtc distribution of the aggregate rural population of the Southwest. by state, reveal.s the following features: 43.4 percent of the total. or 2.26 million persons, resided in Texas in 1970; 34.8 percent - 1.8 million persons - restided in rural California. These two segments combined made up nearly four-fifths of the total rural population of the region - 78.2 percent (See Tables B-1 and C-1 to C-18). The remaining persons were distributed thus: New Mexico, 5.8 percent of the total; Colorado, 9.0 percent; and Arizona, 6.9 percent (See Table I).

There are noticeable variations in the proportion of persons included in each age level by state, when further subdivisions are made within the various rural groups. Also, there are variations according to sex differences (See Table B-3). For detailed presentations of varlations by age and sex and state, see the profiles shown in Figures $\mathrm{B}-1, \mathrm{~B}-2, \mathrm{R}-3, \mathrm{~B}-4, \mathrm{~B}-5, \mathrm{~B}-6$.

Almost a half of the total rural population of the Southwest was reported to be under 25 years of age in 1970: 45.8 percent, or 2.39 million persons. These youth represent 14.1 percent of all persons under 25 in the region.

The proportion of White persons among the rural Southwestern youth is quite substantial: 89.2 percent. Blacks make up less than six percent of these youth. Roughly, a fifth of them are classified as having a "Spanish heritase": 21.4 percent. There are slight variations in these proportions by more specific age groups within the "under 25" category (See Tables II, III, and B-2).

Geographically, the distribution of rural Southwestern youth shows the following features: two-fifths of the total reside in Texas, and roughly a third of the total reside in California. These two states comprise 86.5 percent: of all rural youth in the Southwest. The remaining rural youth are mevenly distributed among Arizona, Colorado and New Mexico (See Tables II, IV, and Figure I). Of ali rural white persons in the Southwest, 44.9 percent are reported to be under 25 years of age. The proportin of rural Blacks under 25 is 52.3 percent. Almost three-fifths of the mural Spanish heritage population is reported to be under 25: 59.4 percra: (See Table 33). These rural youth display considerable variation in "wir distribution by state: the White portion tends to show concintration in California and Texas, and so do Black youth. Spanish heritape youth display substantial concentration in Now Mexico, as well as $i$ " these two states (See Table IV). These general characteristics ar detailed by specific age groups and sex differences in Tahles $C-1$ to $C-15$.

## D. RURAL SPANLSH HERITAGE YOUTH IN THE SOUTHWEST

There were, in 1970 , over 3.5 million youth of Spanish heritage in the Southwest (See Table A-1). This number represents almost 60 percent of all persons of Spanish heritage in the region (See Table A-3). At least one of every four youth under 25 in the Southwest is of Spanish heritage. Sinilar comparisons at more specific age levels, by sex, can be estimated from information contained in Tables A-1, A-2, A-3.

Twenty-one percent of all rural youth in the Southwest are of Spanish heritage, a figure representing over half a million persons (See Tables V, B-1, B-2). In Texas, California, Arizona and Colorado, these youth make up around a fifth of all youth under 25 , with slight variations by state. In New Mexico, the proportion of all youth who are classified in the Spanish heritage category is well over 40 percent.

Roughly 70 percent of all rural Spanish heritage youth reside in Texas and California (See Table VI). Of all Spanish heritage youth in the Southwest, 15 percent are rural residents, a figure which shows considerable variation by state.
E. RURAL NATIVE AMERICAN YOUTH IN THE SOUTHWEST

The total number of Native American youth in the Southwest was over 160,000 in 1970, exclusive of the state of Colorado (See Table VIII). These youth made up roughly 58.0 percent of the total Native American population of the region, (See Table VIII), and included more than 99,000 rural youth (See Tables II, VIII). It is estimated that at least one of every three Native Americans in the Southwest is a rural youth under 25 (See Table VIII). This proportion varies by specific States and age sub-groups, as shown in Tables $\mathrm{C}-1, \mathrm{C}-4, \mathrm{C}-10$, and $\mathrm{C}-13$. Information on variations by sex is also presented.

[^1]Of all rural youth in the Southwesi: an estimated 4.15 percent are Native imericans (See Table íIt). In Arizona and New Mexico, however, the proportion of all rural jouth who are classified as Native Americans is above 20 percent; for Arizona, the estimate reaching over 27 percent.

The aggregate number of rural Native American youth for the four states of Arizona, California, New Mexico and Texas displays a substantial proportion of persons in the younger age subgroups, with a peak of 25.33 percent in the " 5 to 9 years of age" category (See Tables IX, X). This general pattern is also illustrated in its variations by specific states.

## F. SUMMARY

Almost half of the total population of the Southwest was reported to be under 25 years of age in 1970. A majority of these youth were classified as White, and, in general, their geographical concentration is focused in Texas and California. Of all rural persons in the Southwest, over 90 percent are categorized as "White," which. includes most of those persons identified as having "Spanish heritage." A similar pattern of geographical concentration is evident in the rural population: 78.2 percent of them resided in Texas and California. Rural youth represent 14.1 percent of all persons under 25 in the Southwest, and display patterns of geographical and racial or ethnic distribution comparatively similar to those of the total rural population. Rural Spanish heritage persons tend to be generally younger than other groups, i.e., slightly higher proportions of youth are found in the younger age groups when compared with the age distributions
within other groups. A similar finding is reported for the rural Native American youth. At least in one state - New Mexico - rural Spanish heritage youth represents over 50 percent of all rural youth. Although the data presented here on rural Native American youth does not include the state of Colorado, it is estimated that over two thirds of all rural Native American youth in the region reside in Arizona and New Mexico - See Table II. Information regarding the detailed age structure of rural youth, by sex, racial or ethinic group, and state, is presented in tabular fashion below.

## APPENDIX

## Glossary of Definitions

Throughout the text certain key terms have been employed with consistent technical definitions, generally those used by the United States Bureau of the Census, with the exception of the "Southwest." Definitions are found in the relevant Census Reports as part of the appended textual notes. Quotations included helow are from the 1970 Census of Population, Final Report PC(1)-C1, "General Social and Economic Characteristics," pp. App. 1-App. 8. ${ }^{\text {: }}$
Race. (See also Spanish Heritage) As used in census statistics the word race "does not denote clear-cut scientific definitions of biological stock. Rather it reflects self-identification by respondents." The "White," and also others who wrote in such answers as Mexican, Puerto Rican, or responses suggesting Indo-European stock.

The "Black" category used here corresponds to the Census definition of "Negro," which comprises persons who checked the st.andard response "Negro or Black," and also persons witt. write-in designations of Jamaican, Haitian, Afro-American, etc.
"Nonwhite" in this report includes the aggregate of all persons who were not classified as "White."

The category "Native American" corresponds to the definition given by the Bureau of the Census of "Indian" persons. It jnciudes "persons who indicated their race as American Indian or who did not indicate a specific category but. reported the name of an Indian tribe. ${ }^{16: \% s}$

RURAL RESIDENCE. (See also Urban Residence.) All persons living outside of areas classified as "urban" are considered to be "rural" residents. There is no substantive definition of rural, but the category includes those wh, live in recognized places and town under 2,500 in population, ar well as those who live in the open country.

The "rural farm" population is that portion of the rural population which had its residence on a farm of 10 acres or more with sales of $\$ 50.00$ or more in 1969, or on places under 10 acres when sales were $\$ 250.00$ or more in 1969. The remainder of the rural pepulation is designated as "nonfarm."

SOUTHWEST. The Census rureau does not report its data for the "Southwest" as a region. The def 'nition used here is operational, and refers to the region comprised by the states of Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico and Texas.

SPANISH HERITAGE. In the five Southwestern states for which data are presented here, the Spanish heritage population inciudes (a) persons of "Spanish language." (That is, persons of Spanish "mother tongue" -the language spoken in the home when respondent was a child -- and all other persons in families in which the head of household or the spouse of the head reported Spanish as his or her mother tongue), and (b) all persons who had Spanish surnanes but who did not meet the Spanish language criterion. The United States total figures for the Spanish heritage category include persons from every state, but the definition of "Spanish heritage" varies: (1) in the Southwest (5 states) it is defined as stated above; (2) jn New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania the Spanish heritage group consists of persons of Puerto Rican birth or parentage instead of either Spanish Janguage or Spanish surname; while (3) in che other 42 states and the Nistrict of Columbia the Spanish heritage group includes only the persons of "Spanish language."

URBAN RESIDENCE. (See also Rural Residence.) The basic division of population into rural and urban residence categorias is accomplished by defining the urban zones. In the 1970 census "the urban population comprises all persons living in urbanj.zed areas and in places of 2,500 inhabitants or more outside urbanized areas. More specifically, the urban population consists of all persons living in (a) places of 2,500 inhabitants or more incorporater as citi.es, villages, boroughs (except Alaska), and town (except. in the New England States, New York, and Wisconsin), but excluding those persons living in the rural portion of extended cities; (b) unincorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants r more; and (c) other territory, incorporated or unincorporated, included in urbanized areas. The population not classified as urban constitutes the rural population."
