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
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**ABSTRACT**

This document is a summary of 1973-74 salaries paid to faculty and administrative offices in higher education. Highlights of the data indicate: (1) The median salary paid to faculty in a 4-year institution is \$14,373, up 11.1 percent above the median reported two years ago. (2) The median salary paid to faculty in public 2-year institutions is \$13,476, up 12.8 percent from 1971-72. (3) The median of the percents of increase 4-year institutions reported paying, on the average, to continuing faculty was 5.3 percent between 1971-72 and 1972-73, and was 5.5 percent between 1972-73 and 1973-74. (4) The median of the percent of increase public 2-year institutions reported paying, on the average, to continuing faculty was 5.7 percent between 1971-72 and 1972-73, and was 6.4 percent between 1972-73 and 1973-74. Tables provide a summary of annual contractual salaries for the standard academic year of two semesters, three quarters, or two terms of a trimester program. Included are salaries of full-time faculty whose major assignment is instruction, including those with release time for research; department chairmen without other administrative titles; faculty members on sabbatical leave; and faculty members of religious orders whose salaries are paid and determined by the same principles as those that apply to lay faculty. 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## SUMMARY OF SALARIES PAID IN HIGHER EDUCATION, 1973-74

THIS IS A SUMMARY REPORT of salaries paid to faculty, selected professional staff, and administrators in higher education in 1973-74.

Questionnaires were returned by 1,547 institutions, 52.3 percent of the 2,957 invited to participate. The rate of response is highest among public 4-year institutions (72.3 percent), next highest among public 2-year institutions (54.1 percent), third highest among nonpublic 4-year institutions (46.6 percent), and is lowest among nonpublic 2-year institutions (31.7 percent). Responses were received from 67.4 percent of the public and private universities and 49.2 percent of the 4-year colleges.

While the response rate is higher among public universities than among public colleges, it is lower among institutions in the category of large enrollment for a given type of institution than in the categories of smaller enrollments. As a result, the number of faculty in the responding institutions represents 59.1 percent of the estimated total number of faculty in 4-year institutions (68.4 percent in public institutions and 40.3 percent in nonpublic institutions). The percents of the estimated total number of faculty represented by the number of faculty in the institutions responding to this survey are 69.9 percent in public universities, 58.2 percent in public colleges, 44.7 percent in nonpublic colleges, and 34.9 percent in nonpublic universities.

### Salaries Paid to Faculty

- The median salary paid to faculty in 4-year institutions (all ranks combined) is \$24,373, up 11.1 percent above the median reported two years ago. The median salary paid to faculty in public 4-year institutions is \$14,827, up 11.6 percent over the median two years ago. The median salary paid to faculty in nonpublic 4-year institutions is \$12,714, up 5.9 percent over the median two years ago.
- The median salary paid to faculty in public 2-year institutions is \$13,476, up 12.8 percent

from two years ago. The median salary paid to faculty in nonpublic 2-year institutions is \$9,457, up 6.8 percent from two years ago.

- The median of the percents of increase 4-year institutions reported paying, on the average, to continuing faculty was 5.3 percent between 1971-72 and 1972-73, and was 5.5 percent between 1972-73 and 1973-74.
- The median of the percents of increase public 2-year institutions reported paying, on the average, to continuing faculty was 5.7 percent between 1971-72 and 1972-73, and was 6.4 percent between 1972-73 and 1973-74.

The attached tables are a summary of annual contractual salaries (excluding payments in kind for fringe benefits) for the standard academic year of two semesters, three quarters, or two terms of a trimester program. When contracts were for longer periods, the salaries were converted to a 9-month basis. However, no conversions were made for salaries for 9-10 month appointments which are paid in 10, 12, or more installments.

Included are salaries of full-time faculty whose major assignment is instruction, including those with released time for research; department chairmen without other administrative titles; faculty members on sabbatical leave; and faculty members of religious orders whose salaries are paid and determined by the same principles as those which apply to lay faculty.

Institutions were requested to report faculty salaries paid or committed to be paid for the 1973-74 academic year as of October 1, 1973.

Institutions are classified as university and college on the basis of the internal organization rather than the legal title. A university in this summary is a complex institution with three or more graduate or professional schools. All others are colleges.

The states composing the regional groupings are: *New England*: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont. *Mideast*: Delaware, District of Columbia, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania. *South-*

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*east:* Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia. *Great Lakes:* Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Wisconsin. *Plains:* Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota. *Southwest:* Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas. *Rocky Mountain:* Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Utah, Wyoming. *Far West:* Alaska, California, Hawaii, Nevada, Oregon, Washington.

The quartiles provide a brief summary of the distribution of salaries paid. The first quartile (Q1) is the salary level below which the salaries of 25 percent of the persons are reported, the median is the salary level below which (and above which) the salaries of 50 percent of the persons are reported, the third quartile is the salary level below which the salaries of 75 percent of the persons are reported.

Tables 1A and 1B provide quartiles of faculty salaries by rank in 4-year institutions grouped by type and by region. Table 2 provides quartiles of faculty salaries in 2-year institutions by institutional control, region, and size of enrollment.

The median of the percents of increase in average salaries paid to *continuing* full-time faculty in 1973-74 over salaries paid to them in 1972-73 was 5.5 percent in 4-year institutions and was 6.1 percent in 2-year institutions. Among 4-year institutions grouped by type this percent of increase

ranged from 5.8 percent in the two largest enrollment classifications of public universities, 5.7 percent in small public universities, 5.6 percent in both classifications of nonpublic universities and in public colleges, 5.5 percent in large nonpublic colleges, 5.4 percent in small nonpublic colleges, and 5.3 percent in nonpublic colleges enrolling 500 to 999 students. The median percent of increase for *continuing* faculty was 6.4 percent in public 2-year institutions and was 5.3 percent in nonpublic 2-year institutions.

#### **Salaries Paid to Persons in Administrative and Professional Support Positions**

The quartiles of salaries paid to persons in the major administrative and professional support positions are summarized in Tables 3 and 4. The tables show also the percent of these persons who were reported to have been in the same position in 1972-73 along with the percent of average salary of these persons which is represented by the average of the amounts of their salary increases from 1972-73. These are summaries of annual contract salaries exclusive of fringe benefits.

Table 5 contains a similar summary of salaries paid to persons in the positions reported most frequently in 4-year institutions with the information listed by type of institution. The characteristics of institutions in each stratum listed in Table 5 are shown in Table 1A.
