## ABSTRACT

Of all students enrolled in the six community colleges of Hawaii in Spring 1975, 65 percent are regular (credit) students, 17 percent are "other" students (COP, PREP, senior citizens, non-credit), 14 percent are apprentices/journeymen, two percent are special students (concurrent early admits and continuing education), and one percent are Hoomana and MDTA program students. The enrollment of regular students has increased four percent over fall 1974 and 18 percent over Spring 1974. Forty-nine percent of all students are general and pre-professional majors, 40 percent are vocational students, and 11 percent are unclassified; the proportions last Spring were 47 percent, 40 percent, and 13 percent, respectively. Continuing students constitute 69 percent and new students constitute 17 percent, compared to 73 percent and 13 percent last Spring. The mean age of the 1975 Spring enrollees is slightly higher (25.3) than the mean age in the previous Fall (24.4) and Spring (24.7) semesters. There are more part-time students and, as a group, the students carry lighter credit loads. Those students graduating from high school five or more years ago compose slightly over half of the new students. Tables presenting enrollment data from Fall 1970 to Spring 1975 and student characteristics data for the entire system and for each of the six community colleges are appended. (Author/DC)

Enrollment statistics continue to command a great deal of interest. Student characteristics appear to be relatively stable, but the variations from time to time are significant in assessing which groups are being attracted, whether "older" students are using the resources of the community colleges, how students persist, and the ways in which the major programs grow or diminish in terms of student enrollment.

The primary emphasis of this report is on regular students, classified and unclassified, in the credit programs. However, a registration count of students designated as "special" and of those enrolled in various other programs under the direction of the community colleges as well as those in the Hoomana and the MDTA programs is also included.

Highlights

Table I: Registrations

1. Regular students (16,418) comprise about two-thirds of the 25,106 student registrations in the various programs administered by the community colleges.
2. Registrants in "other" programs number 4,334. Over three-fourths of the registration count in this category is submitted by Honolulu Community College.
3. Apprentice/Journeyman total 3,409, with almost 2,900 attending Honolulu Community College.
4. Early admits number 349, concurrent registrants, 93, compared to 298 and 70, respectively, in the fall semester. About a third of the early admits are registered at Leeward Community College, almost half of the concurrent registrants at Honolulu Community College.

Table II: Classified and Unclassified Students in Regular Credit Programs, Fall-Spring, 1970-75

1. The enrollment of 16,418 regular students in the established programs is the largest recorded for the community colleges. It is 4 percent more than the enrollment for fall 1974 (15,794) and 18 percent more than spring 1974 (13,970).
2. As indicated in Figure 2 and Table II, the enrollment this spring reverses the usual phenomenon of lower enrollment figures during spring semesters.
3. While enrollment growth is noted at most of the community colleges, the numerical and proportionate increases are most dramatic at Honolulu and Leeward Community Colleges.
  - a. Honolulu: 281, 9 percent more than fall 1974 and 970, 38 percent more than spring 1974. The growth can be partially attributed to the offering of new options to existing programs at Honolulu.
  - b. Leeward: 250, 4 percent more than fall 1974 and 1,044, 21 percent more than spring 1974.

Table III: Selected Characteristics of Students, Spring 1975 (Refer also to Appendix A)

1. Sex: More males, generally, excepting at Kapiolani Community College. Males slightly outnumber females for the first time at Windward Community College.
2. Mean Age: 25.3, slightly higher than last fall (24.4) and last spring (24.7 years). The mean age is lowest at Kapiolani (23.1) and highest at Kauai (27.6), a pattern noted in previous semesters.
3. Age Distribution: Although 18-19 year olds comprise the modal group, system-wide, (varying from 19 percent at Kauai to 42 percent at Kapiolani), half of the students are older than 22. Those 60+ years old number 101, over half (58) of whom are at Honolulu.
4. Program: General and pre-professional (liberal arts) majors, 49 percent; vocational, 40 percent; unclassified, 11 percent. (The proportions last spring were 47, 40, 13 percent, respectively.)
5. Student Status: Continuing students, 11,380, 69 percent; new students, 2,712, 17 percent. (Last spring, continuing students, 10,210, 73 percent; new students, 1,877, 13 percent.) The proportion of new students is especially high at Honolulu Community College this spring (19 percent) compared to last spring (12 percent).

6. Local Address: As in previous semesters, half of the students have Honolulu addresses, over a third, Leeward addresses, 13 percent, Windward addresses.
7. Year of Hawaii High School Graduation (New Students, Only): Students who graduated from high school 5 or more years ago have been the dominant group for the past few spring semesters. (Details in the SER computer report show that the most recent graduates are the second largest group.) This spring, however, those graduating 5 or more years ago compose slightly over half of the new students from Hawaii high schools. (They range from 34 percent at Kapiolani to 74 percent at Kauai Community College.)

#### Summary

This year's spring enrollees are slightly older than their counterparts in the previous fall and spring semesters. Compared to students in the spring semesters of earlier years, there are numerically and proportionately more "new" and "transfer" students. There are more part-timers and as a group the students carry lighter credit loads. In terms of citizenship, permanent home address, and resident status, however, the data indicate little change: well over 90 percent are U.S. citizens with Hawaii permanent home address, and with resident tuition fee status.

What factors have attracted so many more students to the community colleges this spring? What programs are the "new" and "transfer" students entering? What are the program implications for meeting the needs of the older groups the colleges are attracting?

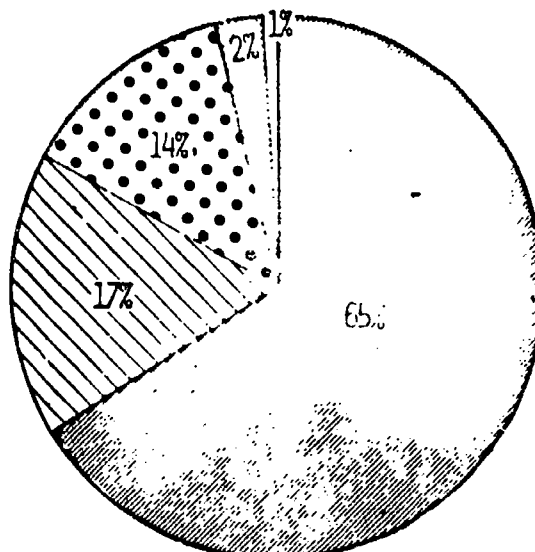

TOTAL REGISTRATIONS: 25,106

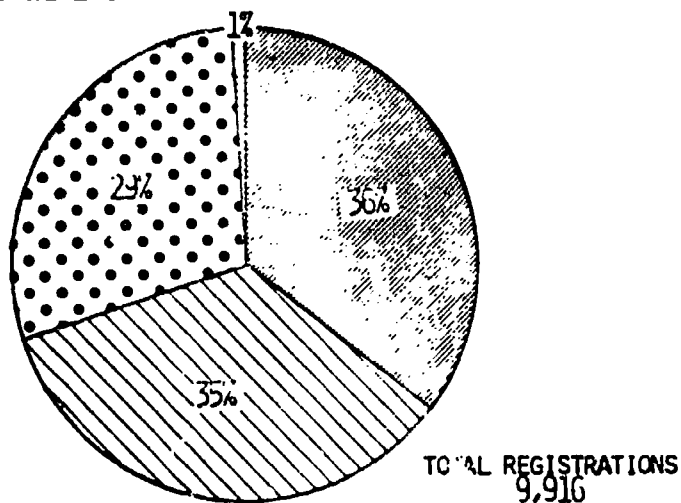

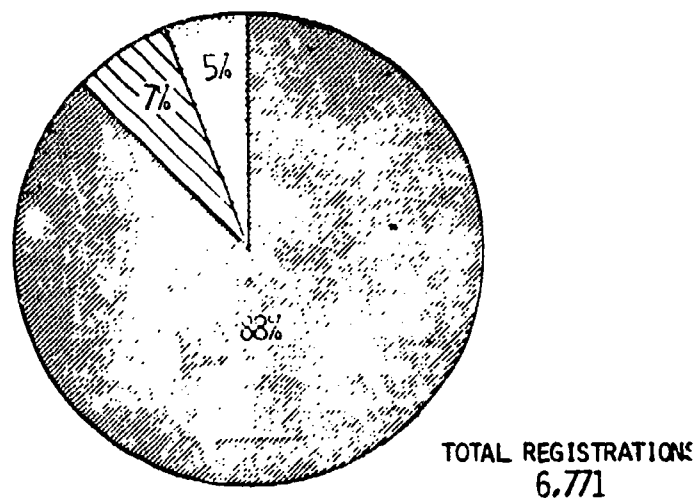

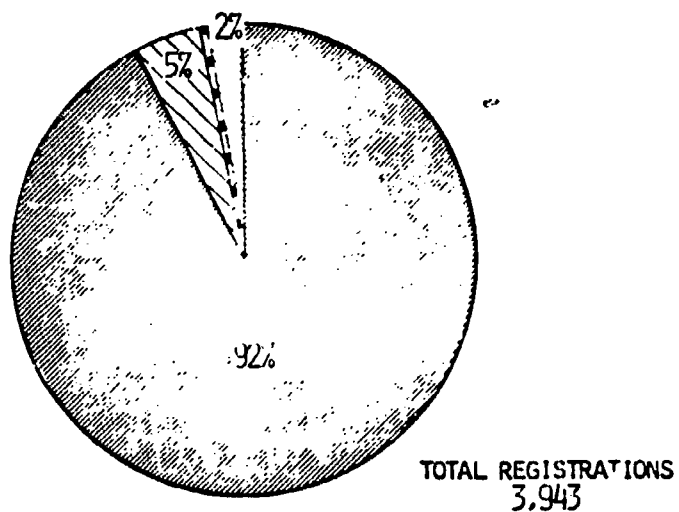

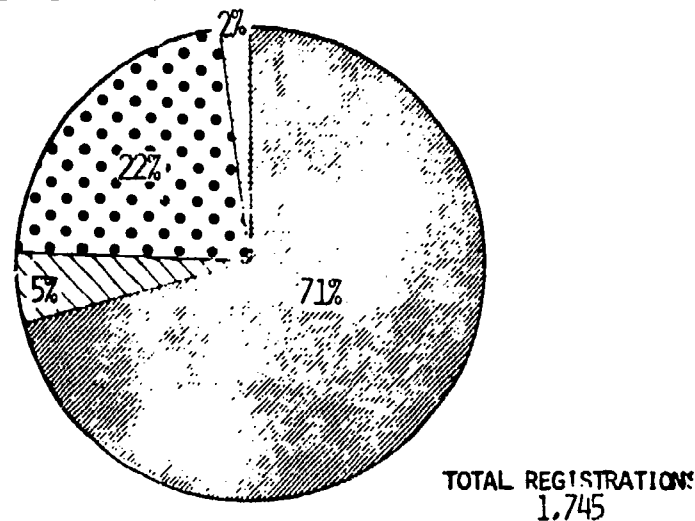
LEEWARD CC



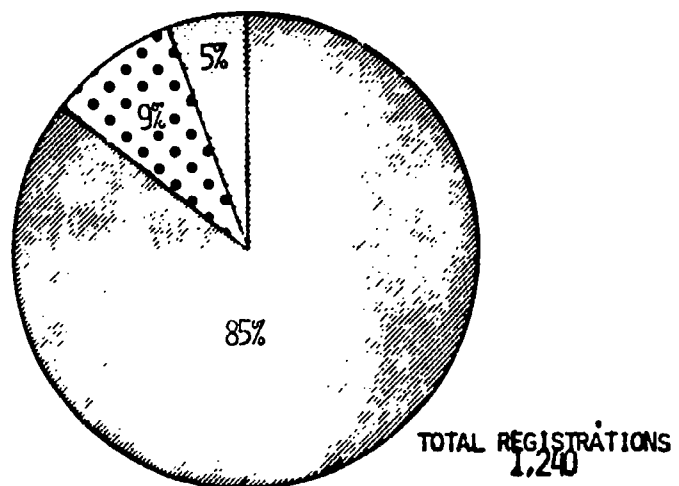
KAPIOLANI CC

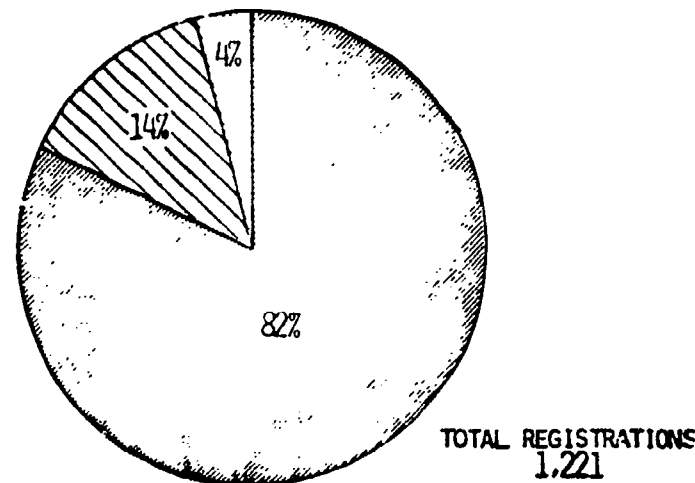

FALL 1970 - SPRING 1975

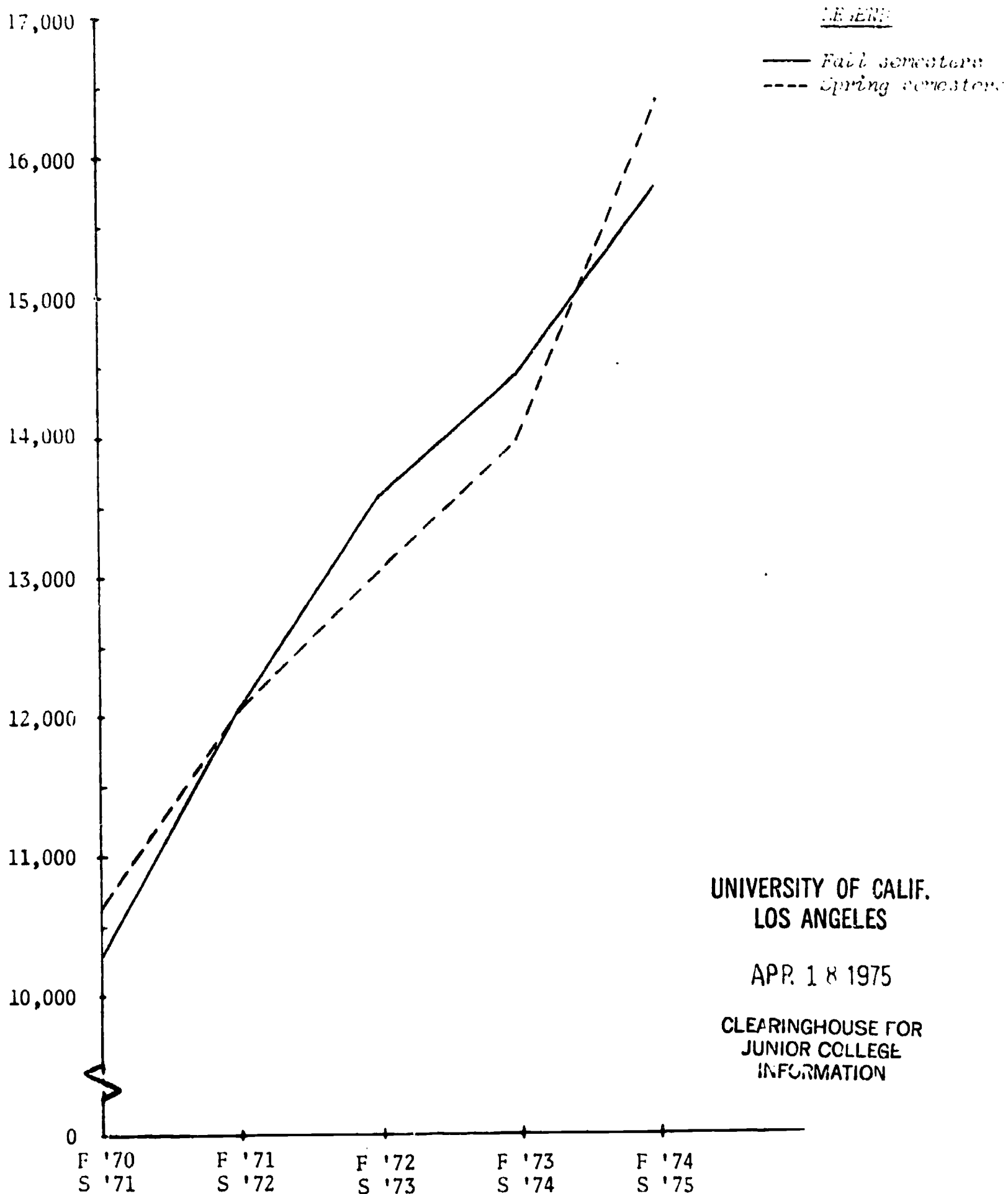
