ABSTRACT

Ways now exist for medical laboratory workers to advance up the educational career ladder, gaining credit for prior training and/or experience. A total of 369 Certified Medical Laboratory Assistant Schools, colleges with Associate Degree Medical Laboratory Technicians programs, schools of Medical Technology, and colleges with baccalaureate Medical Technology programs who grant such credit are listed in this directory. Three associate degree programs (two of them external degrees) helpful to laboratory technicians wishing to qualify for MLT (ASCP) certification are also included. With the exception of the simple CLA Schools chart, the other three portions of this directory follow a general format showing credit-granting methods, amounts of credit offered, options for use of that credit, and eligibility. Credit-granting methods shown in the first few columns of each chart include the CLCP examination, local tests made by each institution, and CASE (the Commission on Accreditation of Service Experience of the American Council on Education) evaluations. Another column in each of the three charts indicated whether a demonstration of actual performance is required of candidates in addition to the other methods indicated. Amounts of credit granted are generally shown in terms of semester hour(s) or quarter hour(s). (Author)

DIRECTORY INTRODUCTION

Ways now exist for medical laboratory workers to advance up the educational career ladder, gaining credit for prior training and/or experience.

Educational programs at all levels have begun to grant credit and advanced placement to those who have mastered portions of the course of instruction, according to a survey conducted by the National Committee for Careers in the Medical Laboratory in the winter of 1973-74. A total of 369 Certified Laboratory Assistant Schools, colleges with Associate Degree, Medical Laboratory Technician programs, Schools of Medical Technology, and colleges with baccalaureate Medical Technology programs responded that they do grant such credit, and their policies and practices are listed in this directory. Three associate degree programs — two of them external degrees — helpful to laboratory technicians wishing to qualify for MLT (ASCP) certification are also included.

This development has come about since the 1967 Conference on Manpower for the Medical Laboratory, sponsored by NCCML and the Public Health Service. Among the recommendations of that conference, that examinations should be developed to provide increased mobility between levels and categories of laboratory careers.

NCCML's follow-up study on equivalency and proficiency testing — for academic credit and job placement, respectively — found an interest among laboratory educators in granting credit, but identified the need for equivalency examinations by which students could demonstrate their mastery of the subject matter.

The report led to development of a series of four equivalency examinations funded by the NIH Division of Allied Health Manpower, and prepared by Educational Testing Service (ETS) for inclusion in the College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) of the College Entrance Examination Board. The National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences (formerly the Board of Schools) worked with ETS to gain support from Medical Technology Schools for the norming of the examinations, and published the resulting information in its newsletter.

CLEP laboratory tests are now available in undergraduate Microbiology and in the clinical fields of Chemistry, Hematology, and Immunohematology-Blood Banking. Other CLEP examinations in undergraduate subjects are accepted by some 1,600 colleges for credit and advanced standing.

NCCML has worked with ETS and CLEP to publicize the laboratory equivalency examinations and stimulate their use. To discover the extent to which the CLEP examinations have been accepted in the laboratory education field, NCCML undertook the survey which resulted in this directory.

In addition to the 369 institutions with policies included in the directory, another 270 of the 1,624 queried indicated they were studying the possibility of adopting such policies.

Individuals making use of this directory should remember that the policies shown here are subject to change. Some are in a developmental stage, and are difficult to fit into the narrow confines of a table of this kind. Only the institution involved can provide definitive detailed information on specific policies.

With the exception of the simple GLA School chart, the other three portions of this directory follow a general format showing credit granting methods, amounts of credit offered, options for use of that credit, and eligibility.

Credit-granting methods shown in the first few columns of each chart include the CLEP examinations, explained above, local tests made by each institution, and CASE evaluations. CASE, the Commission on Accreditation of Service Experiences, of the American Council on Education, has for nearly 30 years reviewed military service courses and made recommendations to college admissions offices on granting credit for military service courses. Early in 1974, CASE became the Office on Educational Credit, with an expanded role to include the measurement of other forms of nontraditional learning.

Another column in each of the three charts indicates whether a demonstration of actual performance is required of candidates in addition to the other methods indicated.

Amounts of credit granted are generally shown in terms of semester hour(s) or quarter hours (q). Where no maximum (NM) is indicated, that may mean no policy has been adopted, or that unlimited amounts of credit are given, or some policy in between those extremes.

Credit receivers are allowed either to spend a shorter time in the institution's program or to carry a reduced load during the full period of the course. Many institutions offer both of these options.

Eligibility is in many cases open to all students. At some institutions, it is restricted to military veterans, or to CLA or MLT graduates or those certified CLA(ASCP) or MLT(ASCP).

Most Schools of Medical Technology have not yet considered or answered the question of whether to grant credit or advanced placement for prior training and/or experience. Many apparently do not know they have the option to do so, despite the cooperation of the former Board of Schools (now the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences) in the norming of the CLEP examinations, and the support the Board evidenced for use of these examinations by publishing norming information in its Newsletter (#19) early in 1973.

Of 773 Medical Technology Schools which received the NCCML questionnaire, 409 responded. The 34 with policies for granting credit or advanced placement are listed below. Another 129 indicated they are considering adopting such policies. These 34 schools which grant credit do so via several methods. 16 through the CLEP laboratory

examinations, 18 through tests made at their own schools, 6 through CASE recommendations for military courses, and a few through other means.

The majority (22) require a performance demonstration in addition to other methods of establishing credit.

At 21 of these schools, students may use the credit gained in such ways to shorten their time in the program. At 11 schools, this credit serves to reduce the class load for such students, but not to reduce the total training period. Several schools allow either option. Others give some recognition in the admissions process, but not afterward, to those with experience.

Seventeen of the schools which grant credit or advanced placement have no restrictions on eligibility, 9 others limit the opportunity to military veterans, to CLA(ASCP)s or MLT(ASCP)s, or in some other way

COLLEGES

Colleges with baccalaureate degree Medical Technology programs have begun to offer ways for those with laboratory training and/or experience to gain appropriate advanced placement.

NCCML surveyed 456 of these four-year colleges, and 331 responded. Included below are the 185 with credit-granting policies. Of the others, 101 indicated they are now considering such policies. Some say such a decision is "up to the affiliated hospital school," declining to take responsibility themselves.

Asked whether they accepted AD-MLT graduates as juniors, 107 said they did — 33 of them extending this policy to all AD-MLTs, 64 only to graduates of programs they are familiar with, and 10 not specifying. It was not always clear from the responses whether these associate degree holders are accorded junior status in the Medical Technology program specifically, or in the institution generally, without the opportunity to move directly ahead in two years to the baccalaureate Medical Technology

degree. AD-MLT graduates are not accepted as juniors at 62 of the colleges listed.

These institutions use all the major methods of granting credit: 93 of them, the CLEP laboratory examinations; 120, other CLEP examinations; 85, tests made on their own campuses; and 72, the recommendations of CASE for military training programs. Nine use other methods, mainly individual case-by-case evaluations.

The baccalaureate colleges are not as likely as the junior colleges to require a demonstration of performance in order to award credit — 50 do have such a requirement, while 106 do not.

The large majority of these institutions — 139 — make no restrictions on eligibility for such credit. Only 13 limit their policies to military veterans, or to CLA or AD-MLT graduates.

Eleven reported they have career ladder programs offering several levels of education with articulation between them.

The colleges with Associate Degree Medical Laboratory Technician (AD-MLT) programs have shown considerable interest in granting credit, perhaps because they see the problems their own graduates face when they try to go on to Medical Technology degrees. Of 186 AD-MLT programs known to NCCML, 142 responded to the questionnaire, 97 already have credit-granting policies and are included in the directory, while 40 are considering such policies.

The CLEP laboratory examinations are used to grant credit by 67 of these schools, while 39 use other CLEP examinations, 62 use tests made at their own institutions, 37 use the CASE recommendations for crediting military courses, and 22 name other methods, mainly the automatic granting of a certain amount of credit to those who are graduates of a CLA school or are certified CLA (ASCP)s.

Of these institutions, 54 require also a performance demonstration; 33 do not.

To make use of such credit, 72 colleges allow students a shorter time in the AD-MLT program, and 58 allow students to carry reduced loads without shortening the program. Many allow both.

While 60 offer this opportunity to all students, 32 limit it to military veterans or CLA graduates.

Graduates of these programs are apparently now finding it somewhat easier to gain acceptance in Medical

Technology programs if and when they want to go on to upper division work. Asked whether most graduates who wished to go on have become juniors in MT programs, 43 institutions said yes, unreservedly, and 16 others said at least some had done so. While 8 answered no, another 19 (indicated by "No*" in that last column) said no but they were negotiating with four year colleges to make such transfers possible. At least 16 have career ladder programs articulating CLA, MLT, and/or MT education in one institution.

Three Associate Degree programs listed in this directory are not Medical Laboratory Technician programs, but do offer a trained or experienced laboratory technician the opportunity to qualify for MLT (ASCP) certification by gaining the necessary two years of college. Baylor University has agreed to grant an Associate Degree to graduates of the U.S. Army Academy of Health Sciences 52-week Medical Laboratory Procedures course at nearby Fort Sam Houston. The External Degree programs of the Regents of the University of the State of New York and of New Jersey's Thomas A. Edison College offer Associate Degrees based on an individual's combination of courses, examinations, and experience, without any requirement of time spent on a college campus.

Of 209 CLA schools surveyed, 115 responded, and 53 have had at least some experience with credit-granting and are listed below. Most of them have not had occasion to grant credit to incoming students, only 17 indicated they had done so. More have had experience with credit-granting at the end of their programs; 47 indicated their graduates

have been accepted with at least some credit in Medical Laboratory Technician or Medical Technology programs. Of these, 26 have formal career ladder programs, offering upward mobility either within the same institution or in cooperation with other institutions which have agreed to accept students with transfer credit.
