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ABSTRACT

This collection of articles combines feminist values with a sociological perspective of present-day marriage and family in the U.S. Sex roles

and family structure, racial and social perspectives on marriage and family, sex-role socialization, attitudes toward sex expression and birth control are discussed. Social and economic aspects of marriage, marital roles and alternatives, family functions and structural alternatives, and prospects for middle age are also examined.

Parameters of the newly emerging field, sociology of sex roles, are delineated. Differentiating gender and sex role, stereotypes and stigmas, childhood, educational and political institutions, and the new feminism are explored. Author prescribes essential changes necessary to alleviate present conditions.

Occupational Stress. Alan McLean (Ed.). Charles C. Thomas, Publisher, 301-327 East Lawrence Ave., Springfield, Ill. 62703. 1974. 111 pp. \$9.75. Most widely held concepts of occupational stress are surveyed. Theoretical concepts, research results and suggestions for coping with stress are covered. Psychophysiological, psychoanalytic and psychiatric considerations are detailed. Personality Theory and Role Theory positions are included. Off-the-job stress, as well as occupational behavior are examined.

Mythology and reality of drug addiction and its effect on societal concerns such as crime and race relationships are discussed. Specifics of starting and running a community drug program, including advice on organization, funding and administration are given.

Romeo Error, The: A Matter of Life and Death. Lyall Watson. Anchor Press, Doubleday and Company, Inc., Garden City, N.Y. 11530. 1975. 275 pp. \$7.95. This book provides an intriguing and original outlook on life and death. Occurrence of death as well as

psychological and social attitudes toward death and afterlife are examined. Varieties of reincarnation, activities of spiritualists, dissociation between body and mind, and possession within other bodies are scrutinized.

Various approaches to the Rorschach Test are considered. Principles of administration, scoring and interpretation are presented. Major interpretive postulates necessary for professionals to use the Rorschach in generating psychological descriptions of individuals are explored.

Systems and theories of psychology as they have developed through history are reviewed. New research and innovations are included. Perception, learning, language and motivation are examined. Feelings and emotion, physiological theories of behavior, personality, social psychology and other areas are analyzed.

Problems that follow in the wake of technology are considered. Changes presently being made in technology as an institution are examined. A program for the reform of technology, a social institution which must be changed in order to advance the human values it now seems to oppose, is proposed.

Approach of this book distinguishes and describes four basic aspects of child growth: physical, mental, emotional and social. Part One introduces basic principles of sequential growth. Heredity as an influence on

development is considered. Impact of family and community patterns is examined. Parts Two through Four trace stages of growth from prebirth forward. Characteristic reactions of children are described as they develop at different ages, and are seen as factors in adjustment to family members, children and adults outside the home, the community and special circumstances in a child's life. Part Five considers cooperation between home, school and community. Problem areas in child adjustment including poor socialization, rejection of authority, emotional disturbances, physical and mental handicaps, hyperactivity are examined.

We Mainline Dreams: The Odyssey House Story. Judianne Densen-Gerber. Penguin Books, Inc., 7110 Ambassador Rd., Baltimore, Md. 21207. 1974. 421 pp. \$2.95 (paper). The story of Odyssey House, the country's most successful program for curing drug addiction, is unfolded. Author's rigorous and often unorthodox methods are described. Child addicts, addicted mothers, and the battle with politicians and bureaucrats for an adequate response to the drug epidemic are discussed. Ex-addicts and professionals who run the program contribute autobiographical sketches, news clippings and photos, drawings and poems, etc. that capture the texture of day-to-day life at Odyssey.

This provocative study is an indictment of the mental health movement. Focus is on practitioners who make decisions concerning patients that may deprive them of freedom, infringe upon civil liberties and even change the nature of their philosophy of life.

Practitioners and society are urged to re-evaluate the many problems that afflict the mental health movement.
