ABSTRACT

This directory is part of a continuing effort to identify facilities actively involved in environmental education. Designed as a guide for the casual visitor as well as the professional person, it aims to stimulate interest in nature centers, improve communication among facilities, and encourage development of new and better ones. This third revision contains a listing of 558 facilities, including 41 in Canada. Directory entries consist of abstracted information from a questionnaire designed by the Nature Planning Division of the National Audubon Society. Arranged alphabetically by state or province, each entry includes the name, address, telephone number, and organization responsible for operation and maintenance. Those facilities primarily school-oriented are indicated with an asterisk. Other information includes facility size, program offerings, availability of self-guided tours, and time the facility is open. In addition, this directory provides a list of facilities primarily concerned with outdoor interpretation. Operation and maintenance are by the following federal agencies: Bureau of Reclamation, Forest Service, Fish and Wildlife Service, National Park Service, Soil Conservation Service, and Tennessee Valley Authority. Listed alphabetically, entries contain the name, address, telephone number, agency responsible for operation, and a brief description. For additional information, individual facilities can be contacted personally. (BP)

## Preface

The number of nature centers and related types of environmental education facilities continues to expand at an increasing rate both in the United States and Canada. In the first revision of the Directory, which was published in 1969, there were 356 facilities listed. In the second revision, published in 1971, there were 459 facilities. In the present revision, there are 558 facilities, including 41 for Canada, a growth of approximately 22%.

Among the reasons for the increase in the number of these facilities are the following: concern with environmental pollution, disappearance of open green space in and around urban areas, realization of the finite capacity of our natural resources, and growing awareness of the inter-relatedness of all living things. Hopefully, the encouragement and guidance provided the nature centers movement by the National Audubon Society's Nature Center Planning Division has also been instrumental in influencing this rapid growth.

One of the most effective ways to stimulate an appreciation of man's relationships with his environment is through the creation of the appropriate facilities where people have the opportunity for intimate contact with the natural environment. Regardless of whether these facilities are called nature centers, conservation education centers, environmental education centers, outdoor resident schools, outdoor school laboratories, outdoor education areas or wildlife preserves and sanctuaries, they all have a unifying purpose, i.e., to foster a better understanding of man's place in the ecological community.

This Directory is part of a continuing effort to identify those facilities which are actively involved in environmental education. It is designed for use as a guide by the casual visitor as well as the professional person. Hopefully, it will stimulate visitor interest in nature centers, improve communication among the various facilities and encourage the

development of new and better facilities.

The entries consist of data abstracted from a questionnaire designed by the Nature Center Planning Division staff. Limitations of time and finances have dictated the format of this Directory so that only a brief description of each facility is given.

Facilities are listed alphabetically by state or province and community. Individual entries contain the name, address, telephone number and the organization which is responsible for its operation and maintenance. Where there is no organization listed, it is implicit in the name of the facility. If a facility is exclusively or primarily school-oriented, i.e., having no or limited programs for the general public, it is marked with an asterisk. This information is followed by the size of the facility, the formal programs offered, special features (if any), whether there are guided or self-guided tours or an appointment is necessary, and the time a facility is open,

The Directory contains a new section which lists the major federal facilities that are engaged primarily in outdoor interpretation. They are grouped together for convenience, and are listed alphabetically by state and community.

The Nature Center Planning Division staff expresses its appreciation to all those who have assisted in the preparation of this Directory.

Behind this natural dam, Quake Lake was formed. A Visitor Center has been built on top of the earth and rock dam and acts as an observatory for the scarred face of the mountain. Inside the center the exhibits explain what happened, what an earthquake is, and what causes one. An outstanding feature of the center will be an operating seismograph--the instrument for recording earthquakes.


