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ABSTRACT

This publication presents results of a survey that sought to identify significant educational needs as perceived by school officials in the states of Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Washington. Data were gathered through questionnaires mailed to the school board chairman and superintendent of each local school district, as well as the principal and one teacher in each school of each local district. Respondents were asked to indicate types of people with a particular problem or need not being met, administrative and management functions needing improvement, curriculum areas needing improvement or expansion, and instructional methods needing improvement or expansion. Survey responses are first briefly summarized and described for the entire Northwest region and then presented in detail for each individual state. A sample of the survey questionnaire is also included. (JG)

GENERAL IMPLICATIONS AND SELECTED COMMENTS

I. People with a particular problem or need not being met

1. Nearly half of all respondents felt the needs of the gifted and talented are not being met. It was the top priority in all states except Oregon, where it was second. Nearly twice as many people identified this group as any other.
2. Low ability students and dropouts were ranked as second and third priorities with the exception of Alaska.

II. Administrative and management functions needing improvement

3. Evaluation was the first priority for improvement in all five states. This need was about evenly split between evaluation of staff and evaluation of programs.
4. Finance was the second priority in four states, but drops to 12th in Montana. This was most often expressed as a current critical need, as opposed to a future anticipated need. There may be a significant relationship between this and designation of Cost Effectiveness as a future need.
5. Staff development is ranked as a higher need in Alaska, Idaho and Montana than in Oregon and Washington.
6. Facility needs are of much more concern to educators in Idaho than in the other four states.
7. Student Discipline--ranked 5th to 7th in each of the states--may be an even more significant problem because it usually is designated as critical rather than important or an anticipated future need.
8. Graduation Requirements and Grading Systems ranked higher in Oregon than other states, presumably because of the State adoption of new competency based requirements. This is supported by high Oregon rankings of Curriculum Change, Competency Based Programs, Alternative Programs and Individualized Instruction.
9. Educators who indicated a need for Citizen Involvement and Participation tended to indicate it as a future anticipated need rather than being critical or important currently.

III. Curriculum areas needing improvement or expansion

10. Basics--lead by Reading and Math--received highest rankings. If English/Language Arts were combined with Reading, this priority would be even more marked.
11. Vocational Education, although ranking 6th regionwide, ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd in Montana, Alaska and Idaho. Career Education, which ranked at least 5th in each state, was 2nd in Oregon. Any confusion or differences in the definition of these terms cannot be determined from the data. If Career and Vocational Ed were combined as a single category, this would be the No. 1 priority.

12. The Fine Arts (Creative Arts-Music) received a relatively high ranking across the region. However, the data do not indicate the type of need in this area.
13. Physical Education/Athletics, ranked 7th to 13th in each of the five states, seems to reflect separate needs: improved physical education for elementary students, modification of athletic programs to provide increased opportunities for women, and perhaps refocusing of physical education program on leisure areas such as hiking.
14. Despite the reputation of the Northwest for its environmental consciousness, Environment/Energy ranked only 11th.

IV. Instructional methods needing improvement or expansion

15. Student Motivation received top ranking, being 1st or 2nd in each state.
16. Accelerated Courses and Enrichment Activities ranked 2nd, which is consistent with the ranking of Gifted and Talented students as the No. 1 group with unmet needs. Interestingly, this need ranked 1st in four states, but 7th in Washington State.
17. The 3rd ranking of Home-Parent Instruction also is consistent with the ranking of Early Childhood as the No. 4 group with unmet needs.
18. Although indicated as an area needing improvement by 116 respondents, only in Alaska and Idaho did Bilingual/Bicultural Instruction rank in the top 16 instructional areas needing improvement or expansion.
