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ABSTRACT

In January 1976, a letter and questionnaire were sent to undergraduate alumni of the classes of 1971 through 1975 to obtain information about post-graduation activities as they related to undergraduate majors. More than half the graduates who got jobs after graduating did so in areas related to their major and at a professional or semi-professional level. These graduates also continue to make satisfactory progress in that there is an increasing percentage in work areas related to their undergraduate majors. Data are provided for graduates' general discipline areas, for specific graduating classes, and for specific subject areas. (Author/MSE)

Introduction

In January of 1976, a follow-up letter and questionnaire was sent to undergraduate alumni from the classes of 1971 through 1975, to obtain information about post-graduation activities of our alumni, as related to their undergraduate majors. It was felt that this information would be useful in career planning and counseling with the present student body, as well as being of interest to Washington University administrators and faculty. While it is generally true that many Washington University graduates do go on to graduate or professional schools, those who do not often feel quite unsure about what possibilities are open to them. It also seems possible that some students go on to graduate school more out of a sense of now knowing other alternatives than out of a true interest in it. The results of this study will be shared with interested and concerned faculty and administrators at Washington University.

This questionnaire with an explanatory letter was sent to all graduates from the Colleges of Business Administration, Fine Arts, and Engineering and to one-half of the graduates from the College of Arts and Sciences. The questionnaire was in the form of a pre-paid return card, to encourage easy participation. (See Appendix A for a copy of the card.) Labels were acquired from the alumni files and envelopes were marked "Please Forward," to encourage a higher rate of return. Approximately 3850 letters and cards were sent out. Two hundred and twenty five (225) of the letters were returned as being non-forwardable and another 75 of the cards were returned

with insufficient or missing information and were not included in the study. There were 2177 usable cards returned by July, 1976, when the statistical analysis of the data was begun, a return of approximately 65%. No follow-up was sent to those who did not respond.

It is interesting to note that cards continue to be returned at this time, almost 10 months after the original letters went out. Respondents seemed very willing to share the information asked for, and the majority add "Comments" in that section on the card. The description of their activities usually included sufficient information to determine the type of further school pursued and/or the type and level of work they entered.

There is a great deal of information on these returned cards. This report will deal only with that which has been coded for statistical analysis with the computer. The author is indebted to the Washington University Computing Facilities for their assistance in this analysis.

During the next semester, additional studies will be made of data from these cards. It has been suggested that male and female students might be studied separately and this is possible from the data on the IBM cards. In addition, the comments and the explanations on the returned cards will permit a study of such areas as career patterns, professional schools frequently attended, special accomplishments, kinds of work situations different majors led to, etc., both for the larger groups (e.g., Engineering, Liberal Arts, etc.) and for specific majors.

Methodology

As the cards were returned, they were given numbers which were used as identification numbers when the data was coded for key punching. In May the system for coding and for key punching was set up, with the advice of the Computing Facilities. Information coded for each respondent included

sex, year graduated, college from which graduated, major(s), first time activity (school or work), whether this activity full or part-time and whether related or not to major, current activity with similar descriptive data, other activities since graduation with similar information, whether or not person ever went on to school and whether or not a degree was completed, as well as the type of degree program which was attempted. In addition, if the respondent noted any special achievements, this was indicated so that these individuals could be identified at a later date.

In addition to this data easily identifiable from the cards, the type and level of first time and current work was coded, using a system developed by Anne Roe in 1956. See Appendix B for a chart showing the types of job titles which fall in each type and level of work. This coding was done by this author since it required some familiarity with the Roe system.

The Computing Facilities then wrote and ran the program to provide the basic out-put partially presented on the tables accompanying this report.

Description of Tables

Tables 1 through 41, included with this report, present a statistical analysis of questionnaire results for a number of subgroups of respondents. In each case, the number of subjects in the subgroup is indicated but all other figures are percentages. It should be noted that some percentages (e.g., those working in areas related to their major) indicated by the asterisks, refer to percentages of a part of the subgroup (e.g., those who went to work), rather than to the entire sample with which the table is concerned.

The subgroups included are the graduates for each of the five years, graduates of 1971 and 1972 combined, graduates of 1974 and 1975 combined, graduates of each of the four colleges, and graduates of a number of particular majors. Statistics were not done on majors with less than 10 respondents. It should be emphasized that some of the subgroups of alumni with specific majors are too small to be the basis for any generalizations about post-graduation activities of students with those majors. The size of the subgroups also precluded analysis of work type and level in some cases.

Because there were comparatively few women respondents who were married and not working outside the home, this number was combined with those who reported that they were employed.

Discussion of Results

In general, persons who had been involved in planning this study, when they looked at the results expressed satisfaction that more than half of these graduates who entered the world of work after graduation did so in areas related to their major and at a professional or semi-professional level (See Table 1.) It also seems that these graduates continue to make satisfactory progress in that there is an increasing percentage in work areas related to their majors and at professional and semi-professional levels.

Tables 2, 33, 34, and 35 look exclusively at graduates from Liberal Arts, Business, Engineering, and Fine Arts Colleges, respectively. Similar results as noted for the entire group can be seen in these tables.

Tables 3 through 9 provide similar data for specific classes (e.g., classes of 1971 through 1975 and 2 combined groups) of graduates. Tables 10 through 32 present an analysis of the activities of those with specific majors in Liberal Arts. Tables 36 through 41 give similar results for Fine Arts majors. When the sample size is quite small, caution should be exercised in interpretation of the results.

These tables also permit an examination of types of further schooling and types and levels of work our graduates enter. Each college and each department will have particular interests in this data, so no attempt will be made to make any generalizations on these results. If further study of the data, including a more qualitative analysis of responses, is done, the statistical results will be included in these studies.

The comments on the cards are also available to interested persons. There are some indications that some of our graduates who went on to school did so because they were unable to get satisfying work in their field without further education; some, however, were able to combine this further education with working. There was also a feeling expressed that these graduates could have benefitted from a more career-oriented college experience, with an increased emphasis on activities and courses that would have contributed to their employability (e.g., business courses, field experience, career counseling, more contact with placement services, etc.) Many respondents expressed satisfaction with their Washington University education and negative comments were not common. The percentage of response also suggests a general satisfaction with Washington University.
