ABSTRACT

A wide range of information services and publications are provided by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to inform the public of its activities. Services include daily news releases and a Public Reference Room where broadcast applications, station records, and Commission hearing proceedings are available for inspection. Publications contain information bulletins, transcripts of hearings, program information, and materials on legal and technical matters. Their availability and sources of contact for further information are listed. (SC)

INFORMATION BULLETIN

The Federal Communications Commission provides a wide range of publications and information services to inform the public of its activities. These range from twice-daily news releases and public notices to pamphlets on specialized communications subjects. Single copies of these materials are available free from the FCC Public Information Office, 1919 M Street, N.W., Washington, D. C. 20554.

GENERAL

In addition, numerous FCC publications on legal and technical matters, rules and regulations, etc., are available from the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. 20402. Pricing and ordering information are included in the section of this pamphlet dealing with such materials.

Releases consisting of news reports of Commission actions, notices of applications, petitions, and filings of general interest are made available in Room 207 of the Public Information Office at 11 A.M., and 3 P.M., each work day. The Commission does not maintain mailing lists. Representatives of organizations or individuals may pick up releases or arrange for commercial messenger services. Pick-up services make delivery in Washington, and mail materials to clients outside the city.

RELEASES

Room 257 is maintained for the working news media. The room contains typewriters, telephones and working space.

NEWS MEDIA
FACILITIES

A Public Reference Room (Room 232), equipped with desks, typewriters, and a copying machine, is open to the public. The room contains files of broadcast applications -- including any related petitions, oppositions, letters, replies, certificates, notices, etc., -- until the applications have been acted upon.

FILES AND
RECORDS

Broadcast

The material is retained for one year, unless the applicant is a permittee or licensee. Files relating to licenses are associated with the station files and are held for 10 years. For material no longer in the files, requests must be made in advance, and there is a 10-day waiting period to retrieve the files from Archives.

History cards on all filings by AM and FM station licensees, and the Commission actions taken, are available in the Broadcast AM-FM office (Room 242). History cards with similar information for TV stations are filed in Room 234.

In general, broadcast station ownership files are open to the public. (Confidential files in the Ownership Section are not available to the public.) Files earlier than 1970 have been sent to Archives, and requests for such material must be made in advance. There is a 10-day waiting period for retrieval. Files since that date are in the Ownership Section, Room 709.

Information on the status of Commission hearing proceedings is obtainable in the Dockets Division, Room 230, where history cards for all docketed cases are filed -- from the first Federal Radio Commission case in 1928. The cards for FCC hearing cases list all documents filed (except exhibits), beginning with the Commission action setting the case for hearing, and all FCC actions in the case. Information on petitions or requests for rulemaking and on rulemaking proceedings also is available from history cards.

Dockets
Division

Through the Public Reference Room (Room 232) the Dockets Division makes available for inspection complete records in hearing cases and in rulemaking proceedings for Broadcast, Common Carrier, Safety and Special Radio, and Cable Television services, as well as Field Engineering Bureau hearing cases involving licensing of station operators. All folders in docketed cases are retained for two years after the proceedings have been closed.

Also available for inspection in the Public Reference Room are transcripts of nondocket proceedings such as oral arguments and hearings, or various types of committee or group meetings.

Public files involving Cable Television matters are in Room W6218 at 2025 M Street, N. W. Cases designated for hearing by the Commission are transferred to the Dockets Division files in the Public Reference Room.

The Common Carrier License Branch (Room 541) maintains files of applications for Common Carrier radio, telephone and telegraph (wire) facilities, cables, and for international and domestic satellites. Also in the files are oppositions to applications or hearing designation orders, with copies of final Commission actions.

A work room for use by the public is maintained in Room 5317, at 2025 M Street, N. W., where Industrial, Public Safety, and Land Transportation Services files are available. Only basic records, including applications and exhibits, are on file, and are retained for a year. The license files are kept indefinitely. The Aviation and Marine Services files are available in Room 8302 at 2025 M Street, N. W.

The Commission does not license disc jockeys, announcers, or other broadcast performers. It cannot furnish vocational guidance material or advice on employment opportunities in the communications industry, or recommend schools or training courses. The FCC cannot recommend lawyers, engineers, equipment manufacturers, dealers, or servicers.

The Commission does not license receiving sets and cannot recommend receivers or advise about set construction, manufacture, sale, operation, or servicing. Technical publications on the market deal with these matters.

Equipment

Title 47 --- Telecommunications Chapter I, Federal Communication Commission, revised as of October 1, 1974
