ABSTRACT This publication is concerned with the number of pupils, teachers, and schools in California and the expenditures of public funds to educate the 4.4 million children attending schools in the state. The data are presented in the form of tables. The first section concerns school district type, average daily attendance, and participation and costs of school lunch and breakfast programs. Tables concerning teachers and pupils are the subject of the second section with data on teacher distribution, salaries, enrollment figures, and class size. The third section presents information about the state-published textbooks, sources of school support, disparities in assessed valuations among districts, school elections, and tax rates. The final section presents dollar amounts for the several objects of expenditure, the amount per unit of average daily attendance, and percent of total expenditures each amount represents. ## Foreword

What you hold in your hands is the most up-to-date and complete statistical picture of California education that we have available. It documents in numbers our students, the books they use, the lunches they eat, and the teachers and schools and money it takes to educate them. Over the years we have used the data in *California Public Schools Selected Statistics* to help us examine where we were and to develop a framework for where we were going.

My responsibilities as Superintendent and yours as legislator, school administrator, teacher, or concerned parent require us to orient much of our thinking to the future because we are educating children for another time. However, we who have the responsibilities for the education of a coming generation must have the data of the past to plan intelligently for that future. This publication presents many of the statistics that are so important in helping us do that important planning. It is not surprising, therefore, to learn that those involved with the *Serrano vs. Priest* issue also used this statistical document in presenting their cases in court, and others have turned to this publication for some of the important information they must have in carrying out the court order.

As you turn the pages of this annual statistical report, you begin to get an idea of the size, scope, and complexity of our public school system in California, and you begin to understand how difficult the issues of *Serrano* and school finance can be.

The concept of the *Serrano vs. Priest* decision, however, is not particularly difficult to understand. Basically, the court said that by 1980 a typical child in a typical school must have equal access to equal resources from an equal tax effort.

Of course, we have known for a long time that our present system of using local property taxes for the support of our schools is inequitable. This is true because some areas in California can raise a lot of money for schools using a low tax rate, while others impose a much higher tax rate that raises less money. Under our present system a child's educational opportunity is largely dependent upon wherever he or she happens to reside in the state.

If we want to concern ourselves merely with equity, the *Serrano* issue is not necessarily complex, but it does present some politically difficult problems to resolve. For example, one way to carry out the court order would be to level out the highs and the lows in the tax structure without regard for adequacy or quality of education; in other words take from the rich and give to the poor. However, viewing the problem from a sound educational perspective, I believe that as we resolve *Serrano*, we must take this opportunity to provide a quality education for every Californian. It is not acceptable to me to spread poverty equally among our schools.

It is my firm belief that providing equity, adequacy, and quality requires a comprehensive approach to the school finance issue. And to achieve a goal of quality education, we must answer three basic questions:

1. How much do we want to spend?
2. How do we want to raise the money?
3. What kind of education do we want to provide with our tax dollars?

However, a fourth question must also be answered: What will our actions do for the children?

It is time for all of us—educators, legislators, and parents—to come to agreement regarding the answers to these important questions, but most of all the parents and local citizens must answer the questions, because the schools belong to them. Yet, they cannot answer the questions very intelligently, if they do not have the facts nor understand the issues. I hope this issue of *California Public Schools Selected Statistics* will provide us with some of the facts that we must have to resolve Serrano—to provide quality education for all children.

## Preface

This publication is concerned with the quantitative aspects of the public school system in California; that is, with the number of pupils, teachers, and schools and the expenditures of public funds to educate the 4.4 million children who attended California elementary schools and high schools in the 1975-76 school year. Many of the items have been reported periodically to the Department from the beginnings of the California public school system. The trends, diversities, and disparities that are evident in these statistics are prerequisites to the determination of educational policy at the state and local levels.

Historically, data on community colleges in California have been incorporated with data for elementary schools and high schools. In last year's edition of *California Public Schools Selected Statistics*, however, community college data were segregated and placed in separate tables; and this year display of the information was discontinued. The change was brought about by the development of separate and unique reporting systems at the community college level. Questions concerning data on the community colleges should be directed to the Office of the Chancellor, California Community Colleges.

Users of this publication should be aware that major changes in school accounting procedures, which were mandated by the 1973 edition of the *California School Accounting Manual*, were implemented by the school districts in the 1974-75 school year. The changes significantly revised the existing school accounting system; procedures and accounts were established for the accounting of expenditures by object rather than by function as was the previous practice. The purpose of the revision was to provide flexibility in combining accounts to illuminate many different kinds of programs. Caution should be exercised, therefore, when comparisons are made between the expenditure data reported for the years prior to 1974-75 and those reported subsequently. Income accounts were expanded in 1974-75 also, but changes do not preclude comparisons with previous years as reported in this publication.

In 1973-74 legislation became effective that altered certain trends discernible in this publication and previous editions. Senate Bill 90 (1972) and subsequent related legislation represented a major change in the traditional approach to public school finance. The laws contained general property tax rollbacks and established district revenue limits to control annual changes in district income. Mechanisms were devised to lessen the disparities of expenditures between high-wealth, low-tax school districts and low-wealth, high-tax districts, a mandate of the California Supreme Court in the *Serrano v. Priest* decision. The school support formula developed in Senate Bill 90 and in subsequent legislation resulted in a flow of additional state funds and property tax relief to low-wealth districts. Most high-wealth districts were granted some relief from inflation; but some were required to increase local property taxes to maintain their previous expenditure levels.

Caution should be exercised when comparing second period average daily attendance reported in this edition (Table IV-14) with that reported in prior editions of this publication. A portion of the second period average daily attendance in 1975-76 was "capped." The Budget Act of 1975 and Senate Bill 220 in

1975. placed a "cap" or limit on the attendance of district-maintained adult programs and regional occupational centers or programs and on the attendance of county-maintained regional occupational centers or programs; attendance was limited, for apportionment purposes, to 105 percent of the 1974-75 second period average daily attendance in such programs. Because the attendance in these programs constitutes a portion of the second period average daily attendance reported in Table IV-14, the totals are affected. Annual average daily attendance, used as a divisor in per-pupil income and expenditure figures throughout the publication, was not affected, however, by the "cap."

This publication is the result of the special efforts of Richard L. Zeisler and Robert G. Oliphant, staff members of the Bureau of School Apportionments and Reports. However, without the aid of school administrators throughout the state and other units within the Department of Education, it would have been impossible to compile these data, which are so important in defining where we have been in public education, where we are, and where we hope to be.

## Part I / District and School Units

Public education in California is organized administratively into the following categories. (1) the State Department of Education, which is empowered to exercise regulatory, leadership, and service functions to implement the state program of education; (2) the intermediate units, and (3) the school districts, the operation and control of which have been delegated to the people within broad limits established by the Legislature. The quality of the educational program is largely controlled at the local level by the school district governing board.

### School Districts

Through the years, experience has shown that the maintenance of an effective education program requires that school districts have (1) an adequate number of pupils; (2) a tax base that includes all of the resources of the community; (3) a coordinated educational program, kindergarten through grade twelve; and (4) inclusion of an entire community within the district.

In the 1975-76 school year, approximately two-thirds of the average daily attendance in California's public elementary and secondary schools was registered in 254 unified school districts. (One new unified district was established through election and became operative on July 1, 1975.) The 792 individual elementary and high school districts served the remaining one-third of the students comprising the total state average daily attendance for kindergarten through grade twelve.

### Schools

Few school districts can maintain a consistent pattern of grades in all of the elementary or secondary schools they operate because of obsolete buildings or population shifts within the districts. The predominant patterns for elementary schools are kindergarten through grade eight or through grade six. But these patterns may be modified into primary schools (kindergarten through grade

three); middle schools (grades four through six), and intermediate schools (grades seven and eight) or junior high schools (grades seven through nine). Typically, secondary schools are junior high schools and senior high schools (grades ten through twelve) or high schools having grades nine through twelve. Continuation high schools provide compulsory education programs for students sixteen and seventeen years of age who are required to attend schools for three hours a day unless employed. If employed, students may attend continuation high school classes for a minimum of four hours a week.

### Child Nutrition Programs

*National School Lunch Program.* In 1975-76 approximately 6,590 public and private schools participated in the National School Lunch Program and served 1.5 million lunches daily. Almost 58 percent of the meals were served free or at a reduced price.

*Special Milk Program.* The Special Milk Program provides midmorning or midafternoon nourishment for kindergarten pupils and for pupils who bring lunches from home. In 1975-76 the milk provided amounted to more than 160 million half-pint equivalents in addition to the 314 million half-pint equivalents provided through the school lunch program.

*School Breakfast Program.* In 1975-76 the rapidly growing School Breakfast Program involved 1,707 schools that served over 261,000 breakfasts daily to children in low-income areas. Free breakfasts were provided for those unable to pay even a nominal amount.

Federal support for child nutrition programs was very evident in 1975-76. The U.S. Department of Agriculture distributed to schools foods with a fair market value of \$23.9 million and charged \$2.4 million for such food. Federal cash reimbursements were increased from approximately \$108 million in 1974-75 to more than \$170 million in 1975-76.

## Part II/Teachers and Pupils

### Teachers

In the fall of 1975, approximately 187,670 full-time teachers were employed in the California public elementary schools and high schools. The number of reported teachers increased 220 from the number reported in the fall of 1974. One-fourth of the elementary teachers and high school teachers were paid less than \$13,070, and one-fourth were paid more than \$17,891. The median salary of elementary teachers was \$15,065, and the median salary of high school teachers was \$16,440.

### Full-Time-Equivalent Employees

In the fall of 1975, California school districts employed approximately 14,400 full-time-equivalent administrators, 13,400 full-time-equivalent pupil personnel services employees, 203,300 full-time-equivalent teachers, and 132,600 full-time-equivalent classified employees. These numbers translate into ratios of 7.0 administrative employees, 6.6 pupil services employees, and 65.2 classified employees per 100 teachers. (Full-time-equivalents include full-time, part-time, and prorated portions of employee time.)

### Pupils—Public Schools

The total enrollment in public elementary schools and high schools in the fall of 1975 increased 71,638 from the fall of 1974; however, an enrollment increase of more than 79,500 in classes for adults masked the major decrease occurring in other enrollments. Enrollments in the elementary grades declined 0.9 percent, and enrollments in the high school grades increased 1.2 percent. A decline of 10.8 percent occurred in enrollments in special classes for the educable mentally retarded. This decline can be explained at least in part by the use of new procedures in establishing pupil eligibility for enrollment in such classes.

### Pupils—Private Schools

Enrollments in private elementary and high schools in California increased 9,303 from spring, 1974. In the spring of 1975, a total of 421,647 pupils were enrolled in 2,668 nonpublic schools. Of this number, 331,011 (79 percent) were enrolled in church-affiliated private schools.

### Class Size; Pupil-Teacher Ratios

In 1975-76 the average class size in grades one through three increased from the 1974-75 average of 25.3 to 27.5; the pupil-teacher ratio in grades four through eight decreased from 27.1 to 27.0. This pupil-teacher ratio is the lowest reported during the past seven years.

### Days of Instruction

A minimum of 175 days of instruction must be offered by school districts in California unless some unusual circumstance intervenes. In 1975-76 one district offered 180 or more days of instruction, and over half of the districts operated at the minimum of 175 days.

### Summer Schools

In 1975-76 more than 841,800 elementary school pupils attended summer school at least 200 minutes a day, five days a week, for four consecutive weeks. This attendance represented 32 percent of the state's fall enrollment in kindergarten through grade eight. Students representing about 37 percent of the state fall enrollment in grades nine through twelve attended summer school at least 240 minutes a day, five days a week, for six consecutive weeks. Typically, high school students enrolled in two subjects of their choice for the summer session.

## Part III / Textbooks, Public School Revenues, Assessed Valuation, Revenue Limit and Bond Elections, and Tax Rates

### Textbooks

California is the only state in the United States that prints its own textbooks and provides them without cost to school districts operating kindergarten or grades one through eight. High school textbooks are purchased locally. The State Board of Education determines which elementary textbooks will be used and makes the required adoptions. However, in determining which textbooks it will adopt, the Board gives full consideration to the recommendations made by the Curriculum Development and Supplemental Materials Commission. Established by law in 1927, the commission is composed of outstanding educators appointed primarily by the State Board of Education but also by the Legislature and the Governor.

Originally, the state provided a single textbook in each subject for each grade; later, supplementary textbooks were added. Most recently, a variety of both basic and supplementary textbooks has been provided to accommodate pupils of varying abilities and social backgrounds. Special materials also have been provided to help teachers utilize the textbooks effectively.

Recent legislation authorizes the issue of instructional materials consisting of such items as films, tapes, flash cards, kits, phonograph records, graphs, charts, and multimedia systems in addition to the textbooks authorized by previous legislation. School districts were permitted to order such items for use in the 1974-75 school year and in following years. Tables III-1A through III-1C present data on textbooks.

### Revenues

The three sources of revenue for public school support are characterized as "local," "state," and "federal." Property taxes provide most local revenues. State revenues are apportioned to school districts for general use and for categorical or specified use. In addition, state revenues are committed to teacher retirement

benefits, liquidation of state school building aid bonds, and the purchase of elementary school textbooks. Federal revenues are largely directed to categorical use in support of specific programs (Table III-3) and may be transmitted directly to school districts or indirectly through the State Department of Education or through offices of county superintendents of schools.

### Assessed Valuation

The ability of a school district to provide local revenues can be measured by the amount of assessed valuation that exists for each unit of average daily attendance. California is moving toward uniform assessment among the 58 counties. So that more uniform assessments for public school purposes can be achieved, the assessed valuation in individual counties is modified by the "Collier factor," which takes into account the relationship of the county assessment level to the statewide average assessment level.

Some state revenues are apportioned to all school districts as "basic aid," and additional state revenues are apportioned to some districts as "equalization aid" to compensate for low assessed valuation per unit of average daily attendance. Table III-6 presents data on assessed valuation per unit of a.d.a. for the elementary school and the high school levels, these data are used for apportionment purposes. Tables III-7, III-8, and III-9 present the assessed valuation per unit of a.d.a. for unified, elementary, and high school districts to illustrate the disparities in assessed valuations among districts as highlighted in the *Seprano* case.

### Revenue Limit Elections

A major feature of Senate Bill 90 (1972), which establishes a new school finance program for California public schools, is the imposition of annually computed revenue limits on the school districts. Thus, the general-purpose tax rate intended to produce the local portion of revenues supporting schools is controlled.

School district governing boards must receive voter approval to increase the computed revenue limit. The ballot proposition presented to the voters for their approval must include the estimated increase in the general-purpose tax that would be caused by the proposed increase in the revenue limit. In 1975-76 a total of 123 elections were held in which voters were asked to approve increased revenue limits. A total of 31 (25.2 percent) were successful.

### Bond and State Loan Elections

California is one of very few states that require more than a simple majority vote to incur long-term indebtedness. In a statewide referendum, however, California voters approved the use of a simple majority to approve state bonds and loans for the specific purpose of replacement or rehabilitation of school buildings that fail to meet earthquake safety standards. This special authorization expired in 1975.

The impact of the two-thirds requirement for regular bond elections is dramatically illustrated by the outcome of the 58 elections held in California school districts in 1975-76. Of the 58 issues voted upon, 27.6 percent were successful, under a simple majority requirement, 83 percent would have been successful. Two bond elections were held to replace unsafe school buildings; both were approved by the authorized simple majority vote.

### Tax Rates

Senate Bill 90 eliminated a large number of the permissive tax rates available to school district governing boards to finance specific programs. Those levies associated with various recoupments, with employee benefits, or with special pupils were absorbed within the general purpose tax, and those levies associated with capital outlay or debt service were allowed to remain as permissive overrides. A given parcel of property may be subject to an assortment of elementary school, high school, and community college district taxes. Table III-1 C presents various tax rates for individual school districts.

NOTES *Total tax rate* is the sum of rates levied against the assessed valuation of the district to provide local revenue to support the current operations of the district, to meet long-term debt obligations, and to finance certain programs or services initiated at the discretion of the district governing board.

*General Purpose tax rate* is the rate levied in conjunction with the district revenue limit plus the areawide tax levied, where appropriate. (In 1975-76 nine high school, ten unified, and 620 elementary districts were subject to areawide taxes.) Currently, the General Purpose tax rate of a school district is determined annually to provide local revenues sufficient to complement state apportionments in meeting the district revenue limit amount. However, the district governing board may choose to operate with a revenue limit lower than the authorized revenue limit and consequently will levy a General Purpose tax that is lower than that authorized.

*Capital Outlay and/or Debt Service tax rate* is the sum of district tax rates levied to liquidate long-term debt that includes the principle and interest of outstanding bonds and/or the principle and interest on state construction loans. Rates associated with the leasing of facilities and with earthquake safety correction measures also are included. All rates except those associated with earthquake safety correction measures and the Regional Occupational Centers or Programs result from voter approval. The latter rates are levied at the discretion of the local governing board within statutory maximum rates.

## Part IV / Public School General Fund Expenditures

School district budgeting and accounting systems include a variety of funds, but the General Fund is common to all operating school districts. Additional funds maintained by some school districts include the Bond Interest and Redemption Fund, the Building Fund, the Special Reserve Fund, the State School Building Aid Fund, the Cafeteria Fund or Account, the Child Development Fund, and the Development Center for Handicapped Pupils Fund. *The California School Accounting Manual* provides for the uniform identification and classification of all expenditures of school districts and is consistent for the several funds.

This publication presents General Fund expenditures only. The State Controller's publication, *Annual Report: Financial Transactions Concerning School Districts of California*, includes income and expenditure data for all funds.

The 1973 edition of the *California School Accounting Manual*, implemented in the 1974-75 school year, incorporated extensive revisions in the school accounting system. The previous practice for accounting of expenditures by function was overhauled in favor of accounting by object. This approach allows greater flexibility because object accounts may be combined in any number of ways to illuminate many different kinds of programs.

The accounting manual provides for seven major General Fund object of expenditure classifications: (1) 1000—Certificated Sal-

ries; (2) 2000—Classified Salaries; (3) 3000—Employee Benefits; (4) 4000—Books, Supplies, and Equipment Replacement; (5) 5000—Contracted Services and Other Operating Expenses; (6) 6000—Capital Outlay; and (7) 7000—Other Outgo. Each of these major classes has several subordinate classes.

The Total Current Expense of Education as amended by the 1973 manual is the sum of major object of expenditure classifications 1000 through 5000, excluding expenditures in each of the classifications for community services, food services, and facilities acquisition and construction. Food Services, Community Services, and Capital Outlay are not considered part of Total Current Expense of Education because of the variation of expenditure in these classes among school districts; however, such expenditures are added to the Total Current Expense to yield a Total Expenditure amount.

The tables in Part IV present dollar amounts for the several objects of expenditure, the amount per unit of average daily attendance, and the percent of total expenditures each amount represents. Table IV-14 presents similar and related data for individual school districts. Tables IV-8 through IV-12 illustrate the manner in which the new objects of expenditure may be combined to yield expenditures by program.
