ABSTRACT

A longitudinal study of student flow and persistence at Santa Ana College (SAC) was planned to generate data on student description, student outcomes, attrition trends, and student attitudes and satisfaction with college services. A total of 629 students responded to an entering student questionnaire placed in registration packets or mailed directly to them. A comparison of the sample to all new and new transfer students and to all active students indicated that the sample was most like the "new" student group. It differed little from the active student population in ethnic distribution, night or day status, and age, but did differ in educational objectives and sex distribution; the active group had significantly more students pursuing an associate degree and fewer attending for personal reasons. The sample contained approximately 45% males and 55% females, the direct opposite of the distribution for active students. Over 43% of sample students planned to attend SAC for three or more semesters, reflecting that they are "serious students", the majority aspiring for higher degrees. Preparing for a career was the most important reason for attending SAC (64.2%). Investigators intend to follow the entire sample for the next five years. Student characteristics data and a copy of the questionnaire are appended. (TR)

INTRODUCTION

In the summer of 1977 a longitudinal study of student flow and persistence patterns was initiated at SAC and was implemented in the Fall semester of 1977. The purpose of the study is to satisfy various informational needs in one consolidated and concerted study. The study will provide descriptive student data, student outcomes information, attrition trends and information regarding student attitudes and student satisfaction with college services. This will be done by tracking a sample of new and new transfer students through their educational careers at SAC and after they leave SAC. The data will be gathered from student files and from periodic questionnaires administered to the students in the study.

Following are the results of the first phase of this study, including the sample selection, methodology, comparison of the sample to the total population, and findings of the first questionnaire, the Entering Student Questionnaire.

Sampling Procedures and Methodology

A random sample of new and new transfer students entering SAC in the Fall semester of 1977 was selected by identifying and flagging every fourth new applicant. This ultimately provided a list of approximately 1300 students. Entering Student Questionnaires were placed in the registration packets of these students. Approximately 25 percent of the 1300 were lost because they failed to register. A total of 375 questionnaires were returned at registration. Questionnaires were mailed to the remaining 622 active students. The response rate to the mailing was 40.8%, or 254. The final sample size for the longitudinal study thus became 629. These students will be followed for the next five years.

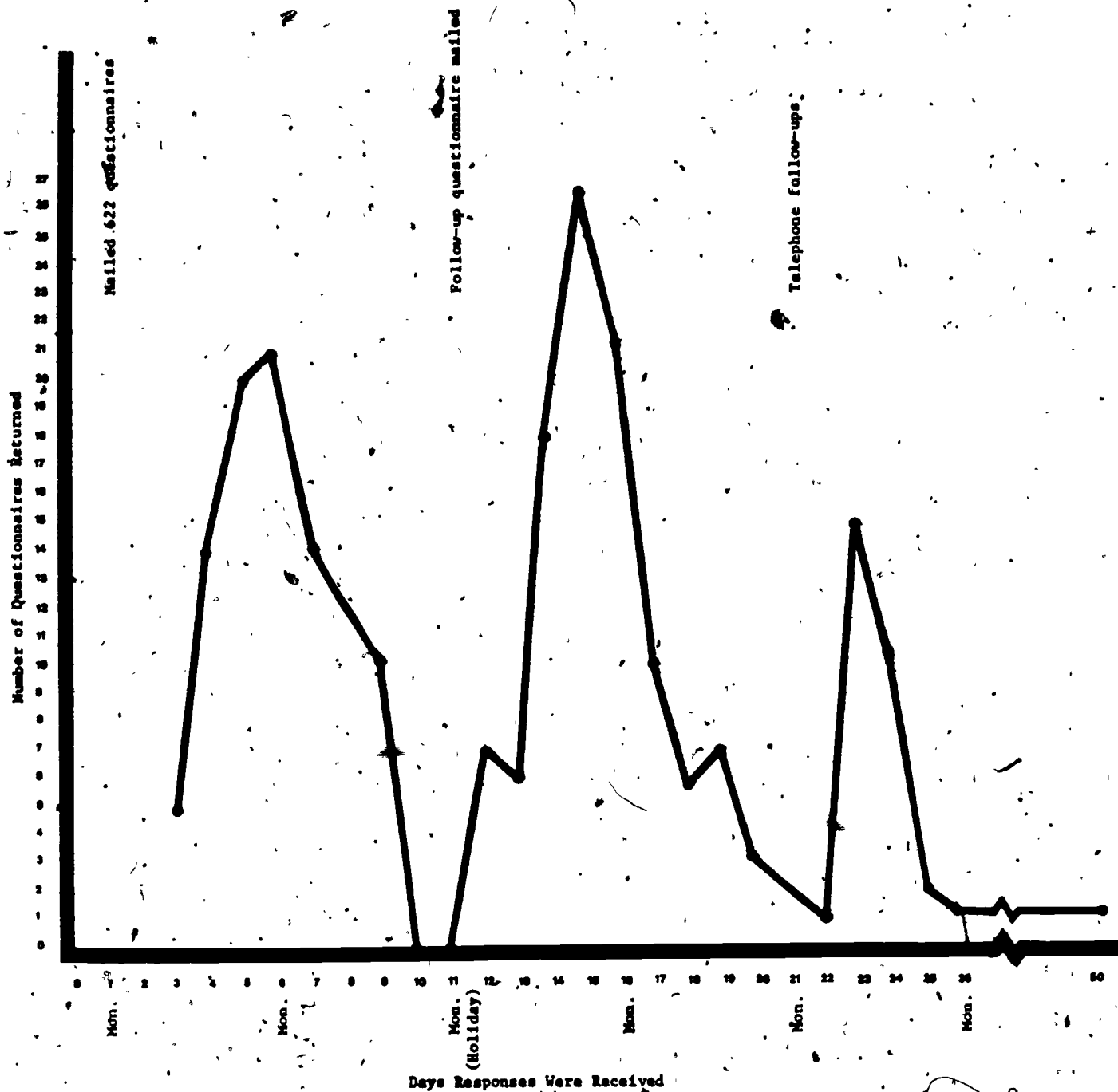
Graph I shows the rate of response to the questionnaire mailing. It can be seen that the response rate peaked at three different times, after the first mailing, after the second follow-up mailing, and after the telephone follow-up calls. The responses continued for a period of five weeks before trailing off. Two weeks after the first mailing and after 112 (18%) questionnaires had been returned, a second questionnaire and follow-up letter was mailed. The response during the two weeks following the second mailing was equally high, 100 more or a total of 34.1% by the end of the fourth week.

Telephone calls were made to 167 persons who had not yet responded. The response to the telephone calling is shown in Table I. It can be seen that when direct phone contact is made with the respondent, as opposed to leaving a message, the response rate is the highest, 45.5%. A third questionnaire was mailed to some who stated that they no longer had their questionnaire. Out of 36 who were sent a third questionnaire, 16, or 44% responded. Out of all calls made, including wrong numbers, no answers, and students who reported that they had dropped out of school, the response rate of persons telephoned was 33.3%. Approximately ten hours were required to place 167 calls. From this data it appears that if telephone calls are made at the same time as a mailing, and if the respondent is directly contacted, the response rate would be optimized.

FINDINGS

Comparison of Sample and Populations.

A comparison of student characteristics of the 629 students in the study sample to all active students and to all new and new transfer students is provided in Table II. The sample group is most similar in all aspects to the new and new transfer group, and differs little from the all active students group. Some extrapolation will thus be possible from the sample group characteristics and experiences to those of the total population.

The ethnic distribution of all three groups is consistently similar, with 23.22% of the students in the study group representing ethnic minorities, 24.7% minority students in the new and new transfer group, and 25.7% minority students in the total population.

In the study group there are 50.55% night students, 36.26% day students, and 13.19% day and night students. The total population and the new and new transfer group has the same representation.

New and new transfer students are somewhat younger in age than the total population. The average age of those in the study sample is 26.5 years, the new and new transfer group 26.6 years, and the total population 28.0 years.

There are slightly fewer part-time (less than 8 units) students in the total population than there are in the other two groups. Any departure in similarity between the sample group and the total population may be partly indicative of the fact that more "persisters" are included in the total population than in the new and new transfer group and the sample drawn from new and new transfers. "Non-persisters" have been screened out during their first semester of attendance. Thus, the total population is slightly more representative of persisters, while the study group and the new and new transfer group include many that will soon drop out of school.

This difference is most noticeable in the educational objectives and sex distribution statistics. The study sample and the new and new transfer group have similar distributions of educational objectives. However, both of these groups differ from the total population on this variable. The total population includes markedly more students pursuing an A.A. degree and less students attending for personal interest and employment reasons. This may be attributable to the fact that students pursuing A.A. degrees remain enrolled longer to accomplish that goal than do students who enroll for personal interest reasons.

Also, while the study sample group consists of 44.99% males and 55.01% females, the distribution is reversed in the total population. This suggests that more females are entering college today than did in past years. The sex distribution of the sample group differs considerably, however, from the new and new transfer group, suggesting that more females than males responded to the questionnaires.

Profile of Students in Study Sample

A descriptive profile of the entering student as provided by the first questionnaire results is presented graphically and in narrative form on the following pages. The sample group for this study consists of 629 new and new transfer students who completed the Entering Student Questionnaire. These students will be tracked for the next five years. A sample of the Entering Student Questionnaire is included at the end of this report. Question numbers 5 and 8, regarding number of dependents and high school college preparatory classes, were omitted from the analysis. These questions may have been misinterpreted, and the results are questionable. Following are the highlights of the survey results:

1) A majority of students (54.2%) in the study sample work at full-time jobs, and close to half (45.8%) are working in "the vocation of their choice." An additional 20.5% work part-time.

2) Most students live either with their parents (33.2%) or with their spouse (33.6%). Fewer live alone or with friends (27.5%).

3) Annual income of students and their families is not high; 45.5% of students' incomes fall below \$10,000 per year, and 64.9% fall below \$15,000 per year. This is lower than the average family income for Orange County (\$19,420).

It is also interesting to note that this question received the highest rate of no responses (6.7%), indicating perhaps that some felt that this information should remain confidential.

4) In regard to educational background of students' parents, 47.8% reported that their parents had completed a variable number of years of college and 36.4% had completed high school. Only 15.8% had completed 10 years or less.

5) The students in the study sample present a profile of being "serious students" in that 43.2% intend to attend SAC for three or more semesters continuously; the majority are aspiring for higher degrees, 27.3% for B.A. or B.S. degrees, 14.9% for an M.A. or M.S. degree, and 19.1% for an A.A. degree; 35.1% expect that they will study three or more hours a week per class and 34.8% plan to study two to three hours per class; 93.4% agree that good grades are either important or very important; and 50.1% expect that they will receive mostly A's and B's.

It is likely that students' expectations may be slightly inflated as they first enter college and particularly when they are filling out a questionnaire.

At a later time it will be determined whether or not students' expectations for grades, continuous attendance, and degrees have been met and what, if any, relationships exist between influencing variables.

6) Students were asked if they had friends who also attended SAC. Evidence exists in the literature which supports the contention that having friends on campus increases the students' degree of involvement and thus reduces attrition. This theory will be examined further on in this study. At present, 62% of the students responded that they had friends attending SAC.

7) The most important reasons given for attending SAC included "to prepare for a career" (64.2%), "to be able to get a better job or promotion" (51.9%), and "for personal development" (49.9%). The least important reason given was "to receive veterans or social security benefits".

8) Students were asked if they felt that they required any special remedial or tutorial help. 19.4% responded to the affirmative, and the subjects of Math and English were the most often reported deficient areas.

9) A self-rating measure was included in this questionnaire and will be included in future questionnaires for the purpose of monitoring change in student's self-perceptions as a result of attending and not attending SAC. On the first questionnaire students rated themselves highest on "ability to get along with others" and lowest on "public speaking ability" and "mathematics ability". Generally, the students rated themselves more on the higher side of average than on the lower side.

At the beginning of the Spring 1978 semester more data will be gathered, analyzed, and correlated with the descriptive data presented above. Student Experience Questionnaires will be administered to students still in attendance, and Non-Returning Student Questionnaires will be sent to those who did not return. Longitudinal trend data will then begin to emerge.
