ABSTRACT

A survey was conducted of teacher education institutions in the state of Arkansas to determine the present occupation of students who graduated in 1976-1977. Graduates were classified as elementary, secondary, and special education teachers; male and female; and by the institution they graduated from. Six areas of occupation were examined: (1) teaching in state; (2) teaching outside of state; (3) otherwise employed; (4) continuing formal study; (5) military service; and (6) homemaking. Results of the survey are presented in tabular form. The rank of each institution in each of the six categories explored is presented.

THE TEACHER EDUCATION CLASS OF 1977  
IN ARKANSAS INSTITUTIONS

Fifteen of the sixteen Arkansas teacher education institutions reported that 2354 persons graduated from teacher education programs in 1976-1977. What happened to these persons?

Only about 1109 (47%) of the graduates were known to be teaching in the state on November 1, 1977. Approximately 192 (8%) were known to be teaching outside the state on that date. Thus, a slight majority (55%) were known to have entered the teaching profession immediately after graduation.

About 12 per cent (293 graduates) were known to be employed in positions other than teaching on November 1, 1977. Another 8 per cent (193 students) were known to be continuing their formal education on that date.

Only 26 students (1%) of the graduates were known to have entered military service immediately after graduation, and only 53 students (2%) were known to have become full-time homemakers.

Seventy students (3%) were known to be seeking a teaching position on November 1, 1977, and three students (0.1%) were known to be seeking a non-teaching position.

However, no information was available from one of the institutions (a small one, though) and, among the other fifteen institutions, no

information was available for 415 (18%) of the graduates. The data from which these calculations were made are found in the Appendix.

To what extent does this distribution of the graduates of the teacher education class of 1977 hold up by classification of elementary/secondary/special education, by male/female, and by institution?

Rankings which partially answer this question are given in the tables that follow.

#### Source of Data

Each year each of the sixteen teacher education institutions submits to the Arkansas Department of Education JS & D Form II, "Occupation on November 1, 19--, of Graduates Completing Preparation in 19-- - 19-- with qualifications for Standard Teaching Certificates in Arkansas." This form asks for the "Occupation on November 1, 19--" of the graduates classified by teaching in state, teaching outside state, otherwise gainfully employed, continuing formal study, military service, homemaking, seeking a teaching position, seeking a non-teaching position, no information and total. The forms which were submitted to the Department of Education in the spring of 1978 included actual figures for the 1976-1977 academic year.

Each of the sixteen institutions was asked to furnish to the author a copy of the form that had been submitted to the Department of Education. Eleven of the institutions provided this information. Henderson State University provided instead a copy of the "Placement Service Annual Report." From this document, it was possible to

complete a portion of the TS & D Form II for that institution, but it was not possible to make the totals agree.

After several requests did not produce the forms from the remaining four institutions, the Department of Education was asked for copies of the forms from these institutions and they were supplied. However, Arkansas College had furnished no information on this form to the Department of Education. In summary, the data in this report were taken directly from the TS & D Form II reports submitted by the institutions, with the two exceptions. It must be noted that despite instructions to the contrary, the number of teachers reported by several institutions on TS & D Form II did not agree with the numbers of teachers reported on TS & D Form I for the same period of time.

#### Teaching in State

Table 1 presents a ranking of the institutions by the number of graduates who were known to be teaching in the state on November 1, 1977. Table 2 presents the same information for male elementary graduates. Table 3 presents the same information for female elementary graduates, and Table 4 presents the same information for all elementary graduates.

Table 5 presents a ranking of the institutions by the number of male secondary graduates known to be teaching in the state on November 1, 1977. The same information for female secondary graduates is presented in Table 6, and the same information for all secondary graduates is presented in Table 7.

In Table 8 may be found a ranking of the institutions by the number of male special education graduates known to be teaching in the state on November 1, 1977. Tables 9 and 10 present the same information for, respectively, female special education graduates and all special education graduates.

Although the University of Arkansas is the state's largest producer of teachers, it ranks at the top for graduates known to be teaching in the state only in the categories of male secondary and total secondary. It is tied with Arkansas State University in the number of female secondary graduates known to be teaching in the state. Arkansas State University leads in the total number of graduates, male elementary, female elementary, total elementary, male special education, female special education, and total special education.

Quachita Baptist University generally ranks considerably ahead of the other non-public institutions in all categories, and it ranks near the top among all institutions in the state in all categories.

Teaching Outside State

Table 11 presents a ranking of the institutions by the number of graduates who were known to be teaching outside the state on November 1, 1977. Table 12 presents the same information for male elementary graduates, Table 13 presents the same information for female elementary graduates, and Table 14 presents the same information for all elementary graduates.

One might expect the state's largest teacher education institution to also be the state's largest exporter of teachers, and the tables above show this to be generally true. The University of Arkansas leads in the number of graduates known to be teaching outside the state and in the categories of female secondary, total secondary, female special education, and total special education. However, the University of Arkansas is tied with Harding College in the category of female elementary and with John Brown University in the category of male secondary.

Arkansas State University leads the state in the number of male elementary teachers known to be teaching outside the state. Harding College leads the state in the number of elementary teachers known to be teaching outside the state, and the University of Central Arkansas had the only male special education teacher known to be teaching outside the state.

There seems to be some tendency for those institutions located near the borders of the state to rank relatively high in the number of teachers known to be teaching outside the state, including the University of Arkansas, Arkansas State University, and John Brown University. The reverse is also generally true, with the institutions located near the center of the state often reporting few, if any, graduates teaching out of state, especially Philander Smith College, Hendrix College, Arkansas Tech University, and the University of Central Arkansas.

Otherwise Gainfully Employed

Table 21 presents a ranking of the institutions by the number of graduates who were known to be otherwise gainfully employed on November 1, 1977. Table 22 presents the same information for male elementary graduates, Table 23 presents the same information for female elementary graduates, and Table 24 presents the same information for all elementary graduates.

The University of Arkansas leads the state in the number of graduates known to be otherwise gainfully employed, and the University of Arkansas ranks at the top in the categories of female elementary, total elementary, male secondary, female secondary, and total secondary. Arkansas State University and the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff rank at the top in the numbers of special education graduates otherwise gainfully employed.

Considering the national publicity about the difficulty of finding teaching positions, it is important to note the relatively small number of graduates who were reported as being unable to find positions. Arkansas State University reported the largest number of graduates seeking teaching positions in almost all categories. The reader's attention is directed to the fact that a number of institutions reported very few or no graduates seeking teaching positions.

No male elementary graduates were reported as seeking teaching positions, and the number of male secondary graduates reported is considerably less than half of the number of female secondary graduates reported. The number of elementary graduates reported seeking teaching positions is much smaller than the number of secondary graduates.

#### Seeking Non-Teaching Position

Only three graduates were reported as seeking a non-teaching position as of November 1, 1977. These included one female elementary graduate from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, one female secondary graduate from Harding College, and one male special education graduate from Arkansas State University.
