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ABSTRACT

INTRODUCTION

Project grants for improvement in nurse training have been awarded by the Division of Nursing since 1965. Over the 13-year period from June 1965 to June 1978, covering four extensions of nurse training legislation, the emphases and the purposes were modified, the type of applicant and the terminology changed. The authority under which grants were made determined the categories of the projects. Some categories have continued since 1965; others were introduced more recently.

The Nurse Training Act of 1964 authorized project grants to assist schools of nursing to meet the additional costs of projects designed to improve, strengthen, or expand nursing educational programs.

Under Title II of the Health Manpower Act of 1968, the scope of the projects was broadened to include planning, developing, and establishing new programs. Eligibility was extended to public and nonprofit private agencies, organizations, and institutions.

The Nurse Training Act of 1971 provided broadened authority for special project grants and included authority for contracts for several purposes.

The Nurse Training Act of 1975 contained contract authority and provided grant authority for the eight purposes identified in the law.

This publication lists the special projects funded by the Division of Nursing for the period June 1965 to June 1978. The list is arranged alphabetically by State, city, institution, and project. The category of the project is indicated by a code in bold face letters to the right of the listed project. The key to the code is on page iv.

As a finding guide, an index to the projects is on page 165. The numbers refer to the page on which the project is found. The subjects listed were drawn from the title of the project or the abstract; however, they do not comprise a definitive listing of all the subjects that might have been included in any project.

This list is published periodically to inform schools of nursing and other interested groups about the kinds of projects being funded and to enable grantees and contractors to share information about project results. The index will help a prospective applicant or researcher to find projects which address specific subjects. A more comprehensive review of the projects may be obtained by writing to the schools and other sponsors.
