### ABSTRACT

The bibliography lists 176 special education exemplary curriculum guides which were reported effective in the education of handicapped or gifted children as a result of a survey of state education agencies, universities, and special projects from over 40 states. Information provided for each guide includes title, publisher/vendor, copyright or development date, approximate price, number of pages, type of class, and level of class. The guides are listed alphabetically by title, and are also indexed by exceptionality. (DLS)

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### **PREFACE**

Hundreds of school districts devote thousands of man hours each year to developing special education curricula and curriculum guides. The first step in this process is usually the identification and examination of exemplary existing guides.

Unfortunately, there is no master directory or listing of existing curriculum guides. Most guides are developed by individual states, school districts or special projects and remain unknown and unused beyond these areas. Thus, an imperfect sampling is all that is available to developers.

The <u>National Special Education Curriculum Guide Survey</u> was conceived and developed to remedy this situation. The intent was to develop a practical and readily accessible directory of exemplary guides.

It was, and is, assumed that experts in the area of special education curriculum are located in university teacher training programs, state departments of education and special projects. Each of these purported experts is, hopefully, familiar with the strengths and weaknesses of scores of curriculum guides. Further, each probably recognizes one or more guides as exemplary. The problem therefore, is to develop an economical and responsible system through which these experts could report on exemplary guides and this data processed and disseminated.

The <u>National Special Education Curriculum Guide Survey</u> is an attempt to gather and disseminate this information on a national scale. Reporting forms and narrative explanatory information were sent to over 500 universities, state departments and special projects throughout the country. Over 175 reporting forms, from over 40 states, were completed and returned to our office. Most of the guides reported were developed between 1975 and 1979.

The <u>National Special Education Curriculum Guide Survey Final Report</u> is, essentially, a directory of 185 exemplary curriculum guides as reported by responsible authorities. Properly disseminated and used, this document can save thousands of man hours each year and help to assure that only quality models are examined. The intended results are more responsive curricula and curriculum guides with greater efficiency in searching exemplary models.

Many special education curriculum guides have been developed but, unfortunately, it is not uncommon for guides to remain unknown and unused beyond the agency, district or state which developed the respective guide. This situation creates monumental problems for others attempting to develop guides in that access to appropriate models is hindered. Also, it is believed that many guides could be used intact in other applications thus reducing the need for additional development in some situations.

The solution to the perceived problem appeared obvious: To develop a national directory of effective curriculum guides which have been reported effective by authoritive sources in State Education Agencies, Universities and special projects. Such a directory would be national in scope yet selective in reporting only those guides recommended by an authoritative source. Further, information collected should be appropriate and suitable for dissemination.

Copies of the National Special Education Curriculum Guide Survey Form were sent to over 450 locations throughout the country. All State Education Agencies, over 150 universities and over 250 special projects were recipients of survey forms and explanatory cover letters. Over 175 survey forms were completed and returned from over 40 states and territories. These broad based responses help to assure that the most effective guides from throughout the country are represented in the final report.

If a piece of information, such as Approximate Price, was not reported, this is reflected by the statement "None Given" in the listing.

Several guides were reported by more than one respondent. In such cases each report is listed. We felt this the most appropriate method of reporting the data because it provides a frequency count of the number of times a guide was reported and also permits the inclusion of varying exceptionality areas or types of classes. For example, one respondent may have recommended a guide for use with Trainable Mentally Retarded Children and another recommended the guide for use with Multiply Handicapped Children.

Some mention should be made of the abbreviations used for types of classes or exceptionality areas. Below, in the left column, are the abbreviations used on the reporting forms and contained in this

document. Following each abbreviation is the accepted terminology for the abbreviation.

EMR - Educable Mentally Retarded/Mildly Mentally Handicapped

TMR - Trainable Mentally Retarded/Moderately Mentally Handicapped

Sev. & Prof. - Severely-Profoundly Retarded

ED - Emotionally Disturbed, Severely Emotionally Handicapped

LD - Learning Disabled

SP, HR, Lang. - Speech, Hearing and Language, Communication Disorders

Deaf or HI - Deaf or Hearing Impaired

Blind or VI - Blind or Visually Impaired

Gifted - Gifted

Phys. Hand. - Physically Handicapped

Mult. Hand. - Multiply Handicapped
