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ABSTRACT

AS part of a nationwide study coordinated by the American Council on Education, Los Angeles City College (LACC) conducted a survey of incoming Fall 1979 students to determine their characteristics and opinions. Data collected from 788 students were compared with nationwide findings and with results of similar surveys conducted annually since 1970. Results indicate that 313 respondents (40%) had taken college work previously and that 111 (14%) were not full-time students. Major findings concerning the remaining 364 full-time, first-time entering freshmen reveal that 55.2% were women and that 80% were members of a minority group (compared to 12% nationwide). Opinion questions demonstrated that the LACC freshmen were more conservative than their counterparts of ten years ago; the percent who agreed that grades should be abolished dropped consistently from 42% in 1970 to 17% in 1979, while the percent that agreed that there is too much concern in the courts for the rights of criminals increased from 45% in 1970 to 55% in 1979. Two-thirds of the LACC freshmen expected no financial aid from their parents, compared to about 40% nationally. Three-quarters indicated that the objective "to be very well off financially" was essential, the highest percentage of students to indicate so in years. LACC findings are compared with nationwide results and LACC data are presented for each year since 1970. (JP)

PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

Accepting an invitation, for the tenth successive year, from the American Council on Education, Los Angeles City College agreed to administer to incoming students the "1979 Student Information Form," prepared by the A.C.E. This study reports on the analysis of student responses to that instrument, and compares responses with other two year college entrants nationwide and with previous LACC entrants.

PROCEDURE OF THE STUDY

The A.C.E. Research Office forwarded to LACC 2000 copies of their "1978 Student Information Form*", which were issued to students taking the Guidance Examination. Students were invited to complete the form if they so desired and were encouraged to do so with the observation that it permitted them the opportunity to express opinions about current issues and that the information would permit us to compare some of their characteristics and attitudes with other students throughout the country. Completed forms were then returned to the A.C.E., where tallies and analysis were performed by them. The nationwide analysis by A.C.E. is available in their document "The American Freshman: National Norms for Fall 1979," a copy of which is available in the LACC Research Office. Computer printouts of the LACC data were furnished by the A.C.E. These data form the basis for the findings of the next section.

FINDINGS

788 students completed the questionnaire. Of these, 313 students (40%) indicated they had taken college work previously, and 111 (14%) indicated they were not full-time students. Analysis of responses in this study is limited to the remaining 364 full-time entering freshmen. Table 1 indicates numbers of respondents in the various categories over the ten year period.




FIGURE 2 - LACC Full-Time Freshman Entrants 1970-79: % Male

Table 2 summarizes the responses to the various items on the questionnaire. Included are responses of the 1979 LACC entrants, 1979 National Norms for full-time first-time freshmen at two-year colleges, and responses of LACC full-time first-time students entering in each of the past nine fall semesters. Figure 1 indicates percentage distribution of respondents in the various categories over the ten year period. Figures 2 through 7 present graphically selected items which appear to indicate significant trends.




FIGURE 3 - LACC Full-Time Freshman 1970-79: Ethnic Distributions




FIGURE 4 - LACC Full-time Freshman Entrants 1970-79: % Age over 25




FIGURE 5 - LACC Full-Time Freshman Entrants 1970-79. Percent Who Agree that Grades Should Be Abolished.




FIGURE 6 - LACC Full-Time Freshman Entrants 1970-70: Political Orientation (Mean Response)





Figure 7 - LACC Full-Time Freshman Entrants 1970-79: Religious Preference=None



SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

This study reports on LACC participation in the American Council on Education Cooperative Institutional Research Program (CIRP), sponsored jointly with UCLA and directed by Dr. Alexander Astin. The project consists of collection and analysis of nationwide college student responses to the Student Information Form, an instrument designed to identify characteristics and opinions of today's college students.

LACC has participated in this project for the past ten years, a timespan long enough to reveal possibly significant trends in student characteristics and opinions. The project involved 788 students who completed the questionnaire at the time of taking the college Guidance Examination. Analysis of the data is provided by the A.C.E., which furnished response summaries for three separate groups: first-time full-time freshmen, first-time part-time entrants, and transfer students. Also furnished are nationwide junior college figures.

Following are some observations on the data: (unless otherwise indicated comments pertain to first-time full-time entrants).

- (1) 364 first-time freshmen, 111 part-time students, and 313 transfer students completed the questionnaire at LACC in 1979. Over the 10 year period the percent of part-time entering freshmen has remained fairly constant. The percent of transfer students, however, has doubled while the % of full-time entering freshmen has dropped sizably.
- (2) Comparing sex, ethnic, and age characteristics over the 10 years that LACC has participated in this project reveals that:
 - (a) the proportion of women increased sizably until 1978; women still constitute a majority although the rate of increase seems to have been reversed.
 - (b) proportion of Caucasians has dropped sizably; that of Blacks and Chicanos has risen slightly; that of Orientals

has risen significantly. LACC's percent minority is now over 80% compared with 12% nationwide.

- (c) proportion of entrants over 25 years of age has risen significantly and is over five times that of nationwide entrants.
- (3) Opinion questions showing significant change in response over the ten years include:
- (a) the percent who agree that grades should be abolished has dropped consistently from 42% in 1970 to 17% in 1979.
 - (b) political orientation has shifted in the conservative direction, although the mean response is still on the "liberal" side of "middle of the road".
 - (c) while over two thirds of respondents agree that the government is not doing enough to control pollution, this percentage has declined from 91% in 1970 to 81% in 1979.
 - (d) about 55% now agree that there is too much concern in the courts for the rights of criminals, an increase from about 45% in the early seventies.
- (4) 35% of LACC entrants compared with 33% nationally agreed that the death penalty should be abolished, a question asked for the first time in 1978.
- (5) Median estimated parental income is \$10,300 for 1979, a rise of \$1,600 over 1978 but still \$3,600 below the national median.
- (6) Two thirds of LACC entrants expect no parental financial aid, compared to about 40% nationally.
- (7) 30% of LACC entrants admit to needing remedial work in English, 37% in mathematics.
- (8) Areas of clear agreement over the years, both at LACC and nationwide, are that more consumer protection is needed, the Federal government needs to do more to discourage energy consumption, women should receive the same salary and opportunities for advancement as men in comparable positions, wealthy people should pay larger share of taxes than they do now, college officials have no right to regulate student behavior off-campus, a college should use the same performance standards in awarding degrees to all students, and students should participate in faculty evaluations.
- (9) Three fourths of LACC 1979 entrants considered the objective "be very well off financially", to be essential, the highest percentage in the ten years. In a press release (copy appended), the Study Director highlights students' increased interest in money-making as the most significant finding in the national study.

- (10) LACC entrants differ from their national counterparts in agreeing that all public colleges should have open admissions and that students from disadvantaged backgrounds should be given preferential treatment in college admissions, although the difference on both of these items appears to be narrowing.
- (11) LACC students are less enthusiastic about legalizing marijuana (43% to 49% agree) than their national counterparts.
- (12) In activities engaged in over the past year, LACC entrants differed from their counterparts very little with the exception of beer drinking, in which activity less than 35% of LACC students participated as compared with over 70% nationally. Both groups had few regular cigarette smokers (less than 20%) and few (5% or less) admitting taking tranquilizing or sleeping pills. About a third played a musical instrument, over 60% attended a religious service (80% nationally), over half took vitamins and less than half wore glasses or contact lenses.

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
