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ABSTRACT

Volume I of this 4-volume report contains the research instruments used in an 18-month project which was designed to understand the rural poor in terms of their information-seeking and information-utilization behavior patterns. Randomly divided into 3 groups, 840 families from 7 target counties in northwestern Florida were studied by a group of trained research investigators who had rural backgrounds. Treatment groups one and two of the population sample were issued information packages which contained descriptions of federal and state programs for low income families, and group one received explanations of the information, followed by visits to determine the use of the programs. No information was given to the control group (group three). All groups were administered bench-mark questionnaires, three pre-tests and three post-tests. A follow-up questionnaire was developed and administered to respondents in five of the counties. All data were coded for analysis purposes. Instruments included in this document are: the bench-mark survey questionnaire, a record sheet for information package follow-up visits, the three pre- and post-tests, and the follow-up questionnaire. The appendix presents lists of the programs included in each of the three information packages. (JD)

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Introduction

This publication is composed of the research instruments used in the investigation entitled "Information Consumption by the Low Income Families to Reduce Rural Poverty." This project, funded by the Cooperative State Research Service, United States Department of Agriculture, extended over a period of eighteen months and was completed in April 1975.

The purpose of this publication is to meet the requests received from social science researchers asking for a set of these research instruments. In the spirit of cooperation and exchange of information, those social scientists who would want to replicate this study or to design similar studies are encouraged to make use of these instruments. Depending upon the design and objectives of the particular studies, modifications may have to be made.

All the questionnaires under reference were pre-coded. Separate coding instructions, therefore, have not been included in this publication. The data collected through these instruments are being analyzed. A series of reports dealing with various aspects of the study will be available later this year. Also, the bi-monthly newsletter--DECODER--will disseminate major findings of this study.

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Information Consumption by Low Income Families
to Reduce Rural Poverty in Florida

Introduction

An individual's operant behavior is strongly influenced by the information he received in the past and is currently receiving from his immediate environment. Informational sufficiency or deficiency of the environment significantly affects his knowledge, attitudes, and skills - the three basic ingredients of human behavior. Through increasing the informational content of the environment and making it available to him in a comprehensible and relational form, his knowledge, attitudes and skills can be improved. This, in turn, would produce changes in his information-seeking and information-consuming behavioral patterns.

Deficiency of functional information in the environment of the rural poor in the United States of America does not require any documentation. Relative geographical, social, and political isolation has lead to this information deficiency. This has negatively affected the information-

seeking behavior of rural poor and thereby contributed to their low level of knowledge, less favorable attitudes, and less-functional skills.

In a study conducted by Dr. Dhillon in 1970 in Leon County, Florida, it was found that 83% of the rural poor did not have specific information about most of the anti-poverty programs. Several other researchers have obtained similar findings.

There is, therefore, a great need to understand the behavior of rural poor and study their information-seeking and information-utilization behavioral patterns. Empirical evidence is needed to answer questions like the following: To what extent information consumption by the rural poor can reduce the impact of poverty? What type of information is utilized more effectively by the rural poor? What are some of the personal variables of the rural poor which are positively associated with information consumption? What affect does informational setting have on the consumption of information by the clients?

Objectives

The central objectives of this study are as follows:

1. To study the effect of information consumption by the rural poor on the reduction of the impact of poverty.
2. To identify the antecedent variables which are significantly and positively/negatively associated with information consumption.

3. To classify various types of information on the basis of their consumption value from the point of view of the rural poor.
4. To study the affect of informational setting on the consumption of information by rural poor.
5. To study the feasibility of multi-agency linkage service delivery model.
6. To compare the work performance of and acceptance by the clients of professional versus para-professional research investigators.
7. To develop a model of maximum information consumption for the reduction of rural poverty based on the findings of this study.
8. To study the feasibility of experimental method under realistic field situation with the rural poor.

Procedure

1. Expermental Design:

The basic experimental design used in the study is illustrated in Table 1. The sampling frame consisted of twenty-two counties in Northwest Florida. (Page vii)

2. Sample Selection:

Starting from the extreme western part of the state, seven blocks (each with three counties, except the last one which had four counties) were formed. This was done to maximize external generalizability of findings based on the incidence of rural poverty. One county with highest incidence of poverty was selected from each of the seven blocks. Seven counties, therefore, constituted the target counties from which final



sample was drawn.

Three communities in each county were selected keeping in mind factors like size, distance from major cities and general similarity on socio-economic dimensions. At the next sample selection stage forty families from each community were selected in trying to achieve parity in the composition of sample in the three communities. Factors like farm - non-farm, race, location (open country and village), willingness to participate in the program, determined selection of families. The assignment of treatments to communities within each county was done randomly. Breakdown of sample is given below:

3. Development of Research Instruments:

All the relevant Federal and State Agencies which had meaningful programs from the point of view of rural low income families were identified. Information about such programs, including publications if any, put out by the agencies were obtained. After abstracting the information, three information packages (see Appendix A1-3 for list of programs in each information package) were developed. Analyses of the difficulty level of publications of agencies pertaining to the selected programs were made. New publications with low difficulty level

were developed for those programs for which no agency publications were available or such publications were not suitable from the readability point of view.

The publications finally selected and/or developed were put in the pocket folders for delivery to the respondents.

In addition, a bench-mark survey questionnaire and three pre-tests and three post-tests pertaining to the selected programs were developed.

4. Selection and Training of Research Investigators:

In all eight research investigators (six professional and two para-professional) were hired to do the field work. Each professional research investigator had at least a bachelor's degree, whereas each para-professional had education up to high school. Rural background of investigators was one of the essential qualifications.

All the research investigators were exposed to pre-service training of one week at the beginning. Thereafter, one day's training was conducted before the delivery of next information package.

Additionally, a battery of tests was administered to all investigators at the beginning and at the end of the field work. This was done to identify the psycho-attitudinal changes the research investigators went through during the period of study.

5. Administration of Research Instruments and Delivery of Information Packages:

As already stated each of the three communities in each county was randomly assigned to one of the three groups. Group I community constituted of families to whom not only the information packages were delivered, but also each publication was explained. Subsequently the research investigators made at least two follow-up visits to these families and tried to motivate them to use information contained in the publications. The families in Group II community only received information packages, and were told to read the publications or get them read in case they could not read. The families in the third community constituted Group III, the control group. No information was passed out to families of this group.

All the three groups were administered benchmark questionnaire, and the three pre-tests and three post-tests.

The entire field work lasted one year.

Coding and Data Analysis

All the research instruments were mostly pre-coded. Electronic scanning sheets were used to transfer the data from the questionnaires, except in benchmark survey, in which case regular coding sheets were used.

All the data have been coded and are currently being analyzed. It is hoped by the middle of June '76, analyses will be completed.

Follow-Up Study

To identify the residual effect of information consumption, a follow-up questionnaire was developed, and administered to respondents in five counties. These data are presently being coded.

Initial drafts of reports based on data from benchmark survey are being written out and hope to be finalized by the end of August '76. The final reports should be ready by the end of 1976.
