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ABSTRACT
 A study of the demographic make-up of the students enrolled during Spring and Fall 1979 was conducted by East Los Angeles College (ELAC) to determine how student demographics vary from semester to semester. The data, collected for students who had at least one active unit in either full- or short-term classes, profiled students by: sex: zipcode residence: veteran status: new, continuing, or returning status: student academic background: day or evening attendance: ethnicity: age: and program of study. Major findings indicate that the typical ELAC student for both semesters was a 19-year-old, female, Chicana, day student carrying a business administration-related major. While there were no significant differences in day/evening ratios, ethnic breakdowns, and age distributions between the two semesters, there was a 159% increase from Spring to Fall in the number of students who had not previously attended college. The percent of students in each of ELAC's 25 academic programs varied from one semester to the next, but business administration, liberal arts, administration of justice, and nursing remained the strongest curriculum areas for both Spring and Fall. The study report presents a series of tables illustrating proportional demographic changes from one semester to the next. (JP)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

ELAC STUDENT PROFILES: SPRING AND FALL, 1979

Through accessing the Los Angeles Community College District Student Data Tapes, basic demographics of the Spring, 1979 and Fall, 1979 student bodies were obtained.

The typical East Los Angeles College Student in Fall, 1979 was a 19-year-old female Mexican-American/Chicana day student who lived within zipcode 91754 (same as ELAC) and who was here the previous semester, carrying a Business Administration-related major.

Most demographics remained essentially stable between Spring and Fall, 1979. Some Fall, 1979 figures were:

Male = 45.9% Female = 54.1%

Day = 44.5% Evening = 36.0% Day & Evening = 19.6%

New = 35.5% Continuing = 40.6% Returning = 23.9%

Amer. Indian/Alaskan = 1.1% Black = 5.0%

Other Noncaucasion = 0.8% Mexican-American/Chicano = 67.2%
Other White/Caucasion = 12.1%

EAST LOS ANGELES COLLEGE STUDENT PROFILES: SPRING AND FALL, 1979

PURPOSE

Since the demographics of East Los Angeles College students vary over time, it is important to maintain an updated/data base. The information is used in several ways, including applications for external funding, marketing, governmental reporting, administrative planning, and staff development. This report profiles the Spring, 1979 and Fall, 1979 East Los Angeles College student bodies along with their major demographic differences to assist in the above tasks.

METHOD

Through computer "programming" of the Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS) system, Los Angeles Community College District Student Data Tapes were accessed.* Selected variables were read for students who had at least one active unit in either full- or short-term classes at either first or second census week of the corresponding semester.

Age distributions were created on the Los Angeles Community College District APL computer system.

*Tape identifiers are: D.D0050B01.SPRING79; VOL=SER=(000542,000584)
and D.D0050B01.FALL79; VOL=SER=(001299,000824).

RESULTS

The typical Table in this section consists of six columns; they must be understood to make sense out of this Report. The first column (often called, "Category") simply gives the value (such as "Male" for sex or "Entering College" for student origin).

The second and fourth column give the adjusted percent of the Spring, 1979 and Fall, 1979 student bodies (respectively) manifesting that trait. An adjusted percent is one which ignores all students who have no data for that particular category (such as those lacking an Ethnic code).

The third and fifth columns give the actual numbers of students in each category as they appear on the data tape. Note that this number excludes any students within those categories who are not so identified on the data tape.

The sixth column gives the percent change of the actual numbers of students within each category from the Spring to the Fall semester. Realize that the student body sizes differ from one semester to another. The reader should therefore note that the sixth column does NOT indicate the overall, proportionate change in the student bodies, but rather the change in absolute numbers. To get the proportionate change, simply subtract column two from column four.

Many of the data are presented graphically as well! With the exception of the age distributions, these graphs are based on the Fall, 1979 semester only.








ETHNIC BREAKDOWN

FALL, 1979 AGE DISTRIBUTION








SOME DIFFERENCES BETWEEN SPRING AND FALL STUDENT BODIES

The Fall student, on whom most comparison data are based throughout the country, differs in several respects from the Spring student at East Los Angeles College.

A substantially larger proportion of new (as differentiated from continuing or returning) students attend in the fall; this is consistent with the typical June High School graduation time. In part as a result of this tremendous influx of new students (more than a 100% increase, in raw figures), there is about a 20% drop in the proportion of continuing students evidenced in the Fall.

Adding thrust to these conclusions is the 159% increase in raw numbers of students entering college in the Fall who have not attended another college earlier.

Day/Evening ratios, ethnic breakdowns, and age distributions remain essentially the same between the two semesters. The overall college sex ratio (46:54, male:female) is reflected with little alteration in most subgroups (student origin, attendance status, etc.); the major deviation is in students concurrently attending high school and East Los Angeles College where males account for 40%, females for 60%.

PROFILE OF THE TYPICAL ELAC STUDENT

The typical Fall, 1979 East Los Angeles College student was a 19-year-old female Mexican-American/Chicana day student who lived within zipcode 91754 (same as ELAC) and who was here the previous semester, carrying a Business Administration-related major.
