READING: SUPERMARKETS

Americans buy most of their food at the supermarket. Supermarkets have many different kinds of foods, drugs, magazines and other products. You can buy almost everything you need in one store. Supermarkets are divided into sections, and things which are alike are in the same section. Even so, they are sometimes hard to find. Sometimes it is necessary to ask for help.
