This publication is a selection of reports by GSA regional trainees who have participated in the exercise. The reports are unedited in order to reflect the differing points of view and experiences of the trainees. An increased sense of awareness of the human problems of government employees with handicaps was achieved. For persons with sight disabilities, uniformity was found to be important—for example, in stairs, location of dispensers in bathrooms, and textures (such as brick) of curb cuts. An architectural checklist is included, with items frequently overlooked in design, such as dining halls, libraries, and theaters.
