Introduction

In the past, data on course registrations and faculty workload for the community colleges were combined in one report called the "Course Registration and Faculty Teaching Report." This fall semester, there have been several changes:

1. Data on course registration and faculty workload are now published in separate reports. This report contains course registration data only. Faculty workload data (e.g., analytical FTE faculty, average semester hours taught, productivity ratio, student/faculty ratio, etc.) will be published in a subsequent report and so are excluded from this report.
2. This report summarizes course registration data down to Level V (e.g., Humanities, Natural Sciences, Social Sciences) while previous reports summarized data down to Level VI (e.g., Humanities - Art, Communication, Dance, Drama, etc.; Natural Sciences - Biology, Botany, Chemistry, etc.). Later reports will summarize data to Level VI in much the same detail as in previous course registration and faculty teaching reports.
3. Additional data have been added to the report:
  - ... course FTE for each campus, with system totals.
  - ... five-year historical data on SSHs and course FTE for each campus, with system totals.
  - ... five-year historical data on number of classes and average class size for each campus, with system totals.
4. Equivalent credits were not computed for Directed Studies classes (variable credit classes with catalog numbers 099, 199, 299) and semester hour totals were not adjusted to include these classes, as they had been in previous reports. All historical semester hour totals were re-adjusted to exclude Directed Studies classes, so totals in this report may differ from those appearing in previous reports. (Note: As they have been in the past, equivalent credits were computed for Cooperative Education classes, and semester hour totals were adjusted to include these classes. See Appendix A, Definitions.) Semester hour data, including equivalent credits for Directed Studies classes, will be available in a later report.

## Sources of Data

SIS Computer Reports 3010 and 3011, which provide detailed and summary data on course registration were used as the primary documents for this report. Computer Report 3030 (Schedule of Classes) was used as reference. The deans of instruction were also consulted for information regarding the schedule of classes, low-enrolled classes, and cross-listed and concurrently taught classes. All data are as of mid-October.

## Population

Information for this report is based on registration data in regular credit programs at the six community colleges under the Chancellor for Community Colleges: Honolulu, Kapiolani, Kauai, Leeward, Maui, Windward. (Course registration information for Hawaii Community College, under the Chancellor for the University of Hawaii at Hilo, is reported in the UH-Hilo Course Registration Report.) The following groups of students were included: classified and unclassified students, early admittees, concurrent registrants and other special students whose registration records were processed through the Student Information System (SIS).

## Organization of this Report

Tables 1, 2, 3 in this report summarize historical data by campus totals. Tables 4, 5, 6 summarize data by program (Level V) for the system. Tables 1a to 1f, 2a to 2f, 3a to 3f, and 4a to 4f summarize data for each campus.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- All course registration measures (courses, classes, semester hours, student registrations, student semester hours, course FTE, instructor and student contact hours) are at their highest level in 5 years (Table 1). This is in line with this fall's 7% increase in regular student enrollment to total 20,807 students, the highest enrollment ever recorded for the community colleges.

However, the increase in course registration measures is not as great as that in student enrollment; most measures increased between 4% and 6%. This phenomenon largely reflects the growing number and proportion of part-time students attending the community colleges and the tendency of full-time students in carrying lighter credit loads.

The increase is due mainly to the increase in the general education course area, where the number of classes increased 7%, compared with less than one percent in the vocational education area (Table 5), and where the student semester hours (SSHs) generated increased 8%, compared with 2% in the vocational area (Table 6). However, individual campuses vary

with changes in the number of general education classes ranging from -3% (Windward) to +11% (Honolulu), and changes in the number of vocational education classes from -12% (Windward) to +14% (Kauai). Changes in SSHs generated range from -5% (Maui) to +9% (Kauai) in general education and from -6% (Kapiolani) to +9% (Leeward) for vocational education.

Average class sizes are about the same as last fall: 24 for the system, 17-27 by campus (Table 2). As in past years, the average class size in general education courses (25 students) is larger than that in vocational education courses (which dropped to 22 students after remaining stable for three years at 23). This holds true throughout the campuses.

The number and proportion of classes with ten or fewer students increased again for the system and at most campuses (Table 3). Many of these "low enrollment" classes are held because they are graduation requirements, or because there are accreditation requirements that must be met (especially in the health services courses).

#### SUMMARY

All course registration measures, in line with this fall's increase in student enrollment to a record high, are at their highest level in five years. Most measures increased between 4% and 6%. The increase is due mainly to the increases in the general education course area though there are also smaller increases in the vocational area. Average class size remains stable at 24.

APPENDIX A  
DEFINITIONS

1. COURSE: A unit of instruction consisting of recitations, lectures, laboratory sessions, etc., in a particular subject field, and identified by a designator consisting of a subject name and number.  
  
Example: English 100
2. CLASS: A section of one or more students formerly organized for instruction in a specific course under the supervision of an instructor.  
  
Example: Lecture section 39 of English 100
3. SEMESTER HOUR: Credit value assigned to each course. Credit value is either fixed or variable.  
  
Example: Three semester hours for lecture section 39 of English 100
4. STUDENT REGISTRATIONS: Number of students registered in each class, excluding students auditing the class.  
  
Example: 25 student registrations in lecture section 39 of English 100
5. STUDENT SEMESTER HOURS (SSH): Sum of semester hours taken in all regular credit courses, excluding audited semester hours.  
  
Example: 75 student semester hours taken by 25 students in lecture section 39 of English 100 which is a three credit course
6. AVERAGE CLASS SIZE: Total student registrations divided by total number of classes. (Auditors and registrations in Directed Studies and Cooperative Education classes are excluded from this calculation.)
7. EQUIVALENT CREDITS for Cooperative Education courses (catalog numbers 093, 193, 293):  
50 students = 15 semester hours
8. INSTRUCTOR CONTACT HOURS: The number of hours an instructor meets with a class during a given week, regardless of the semester hours assigned to the course. The instructor contact hours for classes on modular schedules (shorter than a semester) are adjusted to reflect equivalent contact hours.
9. STUDENT CONTACT HOURS: The number of students an instructor meets within a week in a face-to-face contact classroom situation. Student contact hours are obtained by multiplying the number of students in a class by the weekly instructor contact hours.
10. COURSE FTE: Total student semester hours (SSHs) summed across all course enrollments in regular credit undergraduate courses divided by 15. Also called Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Course Enrollment.
