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ABSTRACT

The catalog contains listings of 304 papers authored by graduates of the National Leadership Training Programs in the areas of the deaf and deaf blind over the years 1962-1980. Entries on the deaf are listed by year, alphabetically by author, and by the following subjects: administration/supervision, adult education, communication/communication devices, community services for the deaf, counseling, California State University-Northridge deaf students, deaf studies, education/educational evaluation, higher education, international/international trends, interpreting, laws and legislation, Leadership Training Program studies, media, minority deaf, multiple handicapped deaf, parent information, psychology/mental health, rehabilitation, religion, schools for the deaf, sign language/linguistics, total communication, and vocational training. FOREWORD

The National Leadership Training Programs (both in the areas of the Deaf and Deaf-Blind) have graduated over 325 trainees during the past twenty years. A graduate project has been a requirement of the program since the initial NLTP Class of 1962.

Originally organized as group endeavors, the graduate project has evolved to become an extensive individual project by each NLTP'er, requiring considerable data-gathering/research and writing skills.

From the beginning NLTP'ers prepared their projects with the anticipation that the projects would further the field of deafness. Many NLTP projects have introduced or reported on innovations to the field: total communication, community information and referral agencies, DAWN, TRIPOD, etc. Nevertheless, because projects were housed in the National Center on Deafness Library and basically familiar only to the Center staff, they have not found wide dissemination.

The American Annals of the Deaf and the Journal of Rehabilitation of the Deaf have both graciously used valuable publication space during the past three years in order to alert readers to the availability of projects by listing titles and authors. As a result, copies of many projects have been requested by professionals throughout the United States.

This current Catalog is intended to make available to the field all projects written since 1962. It is thereby hoped that the expectations of NLTP'ers will be realized in offering to the field of deafness these projects.
