ABSTRACT

This directory provides a guide to higher education institutions offering park and/or recreation classes and programs. The first section presents institutions, by state, with mailing addresses, department identification and chairs, telephone numbers, enrollment (1982-83 academic year), and available course options. Section 2 presents a listing of community colleges, by state, with the same information as in the first section. The third section is a compilation of institutions by degree programs (master's, directorate, or doctorate) offered. In the fourth section, institutions are listed by program options, including general recreation, general resource, commercial recreation, forest recreation, municipal recreation and parks, outdoor recreation, park and resource management, recreation administration, therapeutic recreation, and travel and tourism. PURPOSES OF THE AMERICAN ALLIANCE
FOR HEALTH, PHYSICAL EDUCATION,
RECREATION AND DANCE

The American Alliance is an educational organization, structured for the purposes of supporting, encouraging, and providing assistance to member groups and their personnel throughout the nation as they seek to initiate, develop, and conduct programs in health, leisure, and movement-related activities for the enrichment of human life.

Alliance objectives include:

1. Professional growth and development--to support, encourage, and provide guidance in the development and conduct of programs in health, leisure, and movement-related activities which are based on the needs, interests, and inherent capacities of the individual in today's society.

2. Communication--to facilitate public and professional understanding and appreciation of the importance and value of health, leisure, and movement-related activities as they contribute toward human well-being.

5. Public affairs--to coordinate and administer a planned program of professional, public, and governmental relations that will improve education in areas of health, leisure, and movement-related activities.

6. To conduct such other activities as shall be approved by the Board of Governors and the Alliance Assembly, provided that the Alliance shall not engage in any activity which would be inconsistent with the status of an educational and charitable organization as defined in Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or any successor provision thereto, and none of the said purposes shall at any time be deemed or construed to be purposes other than the public benefit purposes and objectives consistent with such educational and charitable status.

INTRODUCTION

If organized understanding of "who is doing what" is any indication of growth and maturity of a profession the presence of accurate and updated directories may be an indicator. Currently there is concern that we know who and what status our collegial peers have during these times of cutback and retrenchment. This Directory is a fourth edition of sorts, the inaugural (1969) listing 203 institutions of higher education, with subsequent issues in 1973 with 315 schools and 1981 with nearly 500 schools. The 1969 and 1973 directories were jointly published by NRPA and AAHPERD, the 1981 by NRPA and this 1983 edition, sponsored by the AALR of AAHPERD.

Emphasis here has been placed on offering a directory which is as accurate and complete as possible. The mail questionnaire, previous correspondence to the national office and referrals from AALR district representatives provided the basis for the listings.

This publication would not have been possible without the generous assistance, technical help and computer support of the University of Utah, Department of Leisure Studies. Dr. Taylor Ellis is responsible for the compilation and computerization of the information contained in this manuscript and supervised the verification of four year schools through catalogue comparison and phone calls. Special thanks also go to Dr. Dale Cruse, Chair of the University of Utah for his consistent support throughout the project. The University of Oregon, Center of Leisure Studies, now the Institute of Recreation Research and Service (IR²S) played a major role through the leadership of Dr. Larry Neal in both the 1973 and 1984 issues of the directory.

The publication was initiated in the spring of 1982. It is the third directory produced by AAHPERD/AALR of Curriculums in Parks and Recreation. The first and sec-

ondary directories in 1969 and 1973 were accomplished through the joint efforts of AAHPERD/AALR and NRPA. This publication updates the information available in previous directories.

The format for the directory has been maintained to provide a quick reference to institutions. The directory is divided into four sections: there are two listings, the first presents institutions by state with mailing addresses, department identification and chairs, phone numbers, population (1982/83 academic year), and available course options; the second presents a listing of the community colleges presented by state including mailing addresses, department identification, etc. The third section of the directory is a compilation of institutions by degree programs offered beginning with Masters, then Directorate and finally Doctorate. The fourth section presents institutions by options.

The purposes of the directory are threefold. First is to provide a telephone/ mailing directory for professionals and second, to provide a guide to students and prospective students for education exploration in the area of parks and recreation. This is to provide a source of information for trends in changes in training emphasis, changes in where curricula are housed, and changes in student population (undergraduates/graduate).

A word of clarification: the information comes from the best source possible — people in the field. The information found here is as good as the willingness of colleagues to respond by phone or questionnaire. Regarding the "options/specializations/ emphasis areas" respondents were asked to answer according to the following definition:

"a definitive area of study with several specialized courses complementing a required core of general park/recreation classes."

Added to this directory are the categories "general recreation, general resource and general cultural arts" for those schools moving away from the proliferation of emphasis areas, offering a more general studies program. As in past directories of this type the compilers offer the following disclaimer ... judgment of the quality of the programs listed is not a function of such a source since those programs listed here have not been evaluated, representatives were merely asked to respond to a brief questionnaire. A sense of quality is built in with the designation/recognition of those schools who are accredited by the NRPA/AALR National Council of Accreditation. However, at this early date many qualified programs not so designated are currently considering accreditation. An update of such schools appears in the January issues of Parks and Recreation and AALReporter.



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION A Bachelor of Science degree in Recreation Administration with options in Recreation and Park Administration and in Therapeutic Recreation and a Master of Science degree in Recreation and Park Administration are offered.

The Recreation and Park Administration option focuses on the management of recreation services and environments that span the spectrum from urban to wilderness area recreation. Students learn to use organizations and resources to facilitate the leisure experience of participants.

The Therapeutic Recreation option focuses on the provision of recreation services for people who are ill, disabled, or handicapped, and prepares students to be eligible for registration by the California Board of Park and Recreation Personnel as a Registered Recreation Therapist and by the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification as a Therapeutic Recreation Specialist.

The Master of Science program is designed to prepare advanced students for major responsibilities in the management of diverse leisure service systems. An educational experience is planned to provide core competencies, as well as career competencies to support the professional objectives of students.

FEATURES The Sacramento area provides many resources for recreation and leisure study. Thirteen progressive special recreation and park districts maintain close liaison with the Department. The City of Sacramento is expanding its leisure services, and the County Parks and Recreation Department operates the American River Parkway, a prototype in recreation and leisure services. Numerous state and federal agencies direct leisure services and facilities from offices located in the Sacramento area. National and state associations for recreation and park professionals maintain offices in Sacramento. Both the recreational resources of the mountains and the ocean are within a 90-mile radius. Major facilities for therapeutic, commercial, and institutional recreation add to the number of work and study opportunities which enrich the educational program of the Department.






